

ORDINANCE NUMBER 11 - 1961

AN ORDINANCE
ANNEXING CERTAIN TERRITORY

Adler's

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, Morgan County, Indiana, THAT:

The following described territory be and the same is hereby annexed to and declared to be a part of the Town of Mooresville, Morgan County, Indiana:

Part of the west half of the southeast quarter, and part of the east half of the southwest quarter of section thirty-six (36), township fourteen (14) north, range one (1) east of the Second Principal Meridian, Morgan County, Indiana, bounded and described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning two hundred fifty and fourteen hundredths (250.14) feet south of the south line of a twenty (20.0) foot alley on the south side of Block 57 in Moore's Fourth Addition to the town of Mooresville, and eight hundred thirty and eight tenths (830.8) feet east of the east right-of-way line of the Indianapolis and Vincennes Railroad, run thence westerly and parallel to the south line of said alley in Moore's Fourth Addition a distance of eight hundred thirty and eight tenths (830.8) feet to the east line of said railroad right-of-way (said right-of-way line is thirty three (33.0) feet east of the center of said railroad); deflect 86 degrees and 58 minutes left and run southwesterly on said right-of-way line a distance of two hundred thirty two (232.0) feet; run thence southeasterly at a right angle to said right-of-way a distance of twenty two (22.0) feet; run thence southwesterly on said right-of-way line and fifty five (55.0) feet from and parallel to the center of said railroad a distance of five hundred seven and nine tenths (507.9) feet to the north and west right-of-way line of State Road #67 (said point is 87 feet from station 1937+30.5 on the centerline of State Road #67 as given in State Highway Plans, "F" Project 187(11); run thence northeasterly on said right-of-way line 87 feet from and parallel to the centerline of State Road #67 a distance of nine hundred fifty two (952.0) feet to a point that is at right angle to station 1946+75; run thence northeasterly on said right-of-way line a distance of eighty (80.0) feet to the intersection of the west line of a sixty (60.0) foot street (said point is 1.3 feet from an iron corner post and 2.6 feet from a concrete right-of-way marker; run thence northerly on the west line of said street a distance of one hundred sixty three and three tenths (163.3) feet to the place of beginning, containing 8.75 acres, more or less.

and that all of said territory shall hereafter form and be a part of said Town of Mooresville, and within the jurisdiction thereof.

The Board of Trustees met in regular session January 3rd at 7:30 P.M. with all members and their attorney present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved. No financial statement was given due to the meeting coming so close to the end of the month and the bank being closed.

Farmer moved and Holmes seconded to have all police present signed tickets for gas. Carried. The gas bids were opened and awarded to Carl's Crysta 1 Flash. This was by a motion by Farmer and a second by Holmes.

A.T. Coyle was present to discuss the operation of his laundries in town. He pointed out the dangers of operating unattended businesses. After a discussion and foreseeing what could happen, Farmer moved and Holmes seconded that an ordinance be drawn requiring all coin operated busines to be attended at all times when open. Carried.

Ordinance # 1 providing for the posting of a bond to the amount of \$75.00 before cutting the streets or alleys of the Town was read and adopted by a motion by Holmes and second by Farmer. Second reading was by title only by a motion by Farmer and a second by Holmes.

Ordinance # 2 Requiring purchase orders on major purchases was read. Farmer moved and Sparks seconded to adopt. Carried. Farmer moved and Holmes seconded to have second reading by title only. Carried.

Sherrill Edwards appeared concerning an unsightly situation in the neighborhood. He was advised the best thing would be to talk to the owner first and see if something could be worked out that way.

A resolution was made by Farmer and seconded by Sparks to transfer the funds in the construction fund of the sewer to the Sinking Fund. Holmes moved and Farmer seconded the adoption of the resolution. Carried.

The nomination was opened for Chairman of the Board for the year 1961. The name of Richard Newcomer was placed. No other nominations being named Mr. Newcomer was elected. He named the same committees as last year with the addition of Sparks and Holmes to serve on the sanitation committee,

seconded
Farmer moved and Holmes, that all unpaid sewer bills by March 1st be certified against the taxpayers at Martinsville and collected with the taxes. Carried.

Since a new typewriter has been purchased the Clerk Treasurer wished to buy the old one. A price of \$15.00 was set.

The claims were presented and ordered paid by a motion by Sparks and a second by Farmer.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met in regular session February 7th. The meeting was called to order by Chairman Newcomer at 7:30 P.M. All members and their attorney were present. Opening prayer was by Reverend Carmichael of the First Methodist Church.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and declared approved. The financial statement showed a balance in all funds to be \$35,713.36. The sewer fund was \$43,020.12. The sinking fund is \$10,451.69.

This being Boy Scout week, The Scouts took the chairs of the Board and Clerk Treasurer and opened the meeting. Danny Koenig presided with Walter Pearce as Clerk Treasurer. Mr. Riggan thanked the Board for allowing them this privilege, the Board resumed their chairs and business was carried on as usual.

A letter from the State Police concerning requested radar equipment was read. A communication from the Municipal League concerning a proposed bill in the legislature was referred to Representative Littell.

Leo Holland asked about a place to dump trash. Mr. Coyle, announced he had a place in the country on which he would allow dumping. This will be taken up with the Plan Commission.

Mrs. Pence appeared regarding vacant apartments. A resolution was introduced that where there is no separate water meter, the Town will accept a statement from the Public Service Co. to the effect that the power is off. Holmes moved and Harris seconded to adopt Carried.

It was brought up that some businesses, namely Beauty Parlors, were not paying business rates. They will be so billed.

Ordinance # 3 prohibiting the operating of unattended business was given first reading. Holmes moved and Harris seconded to adopt. Carried. Second reading was by title only.

Ordinance # 4 regulating parking on the east side of the Post Office was read and adopted.

Ordinance # 5 governing salaries was read and adopted.

Ordinances # 6 & 7 annexing certain contiguous territory were read, passed and adopted.

Ordinances # 8, 9, 10 ^{concerning contiguous territory being annexed} were read, passed and adopted. All were prepared for publication.

Contract between Town and Township Fire Dep't was read and signed,

Ordinance # 3 was given third reading.

A plan to issue permits at a cost of fifty cents per load, to dump trash on Mr Coyle's land was made. Permits will be issued at the Clerk's office.

Mr Pennington, representing the Church of Christ asked that their land recently purchased, be annexed to the Town. The ordinance will be prepared.

Sherrill Edwards again asked the Board to try to remedy the situation in his neighborhood where cars are being parked. The Police will investigate.

Mr. Gill of the Dual Parking Meter Co. was present in the interest of replacing the worn meters.

placing worn out meters. Farmer moved and Sparks seconded that fifty new meters be bought and we pay for them at the rate of five cents per car space per day. Carried.

Complaints were received of holes in the alley at the new Telephone Building.

The Fire Chief announced the appointment of Edward Spears and George Bryan to the Fire Department.

It was suggested that the County Commissioners be contacted to see if they would do something about repairing North Indiana Street.

A letter of approval from the State Highway Department for a four way Stop sign at Rd. 267 and Monrow St. was read.

Leonard Horton submitted his resignation from the Police force after serving nineteen years. The Board expressed appreciation for his years of work and asked if he would be willing to work extra if needed. He said he would do anything to help.

The Bell Telephone Company asked permission to place some underground cables in their construction work. This was granted.

The notice to bidders for street repairs was given for publication.



The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met in regular session April 4, at the Municipal Building at 7:30 P.M.. All members and their attorney were present. Opening prayer was by Erus tee Holmes.

The minutes of the March meeting were read and declared approved. The financial statement showed a balance in all funds to be \$ 34,837.12 and in the sewer fund \$54,021.11. Tom Duncan of Scout Troop # 26 was present to get information for a merit badge.

An application for a trailer by Joseph Farmer was read and approved.

A communciation from Mrs Emerson concerning sewer connection was read and placed on file. A communication from Bell Telephone Co. Concerning a public hearing on the new system was read,

The agreement between the Town and the Lions Club concerning Old Settlers was read. Harris moved and Holmes seconded to accept the terms. Carried.

The Jcc's requested the right to place a van "Atoms for Peace" on the street. Farmer moved and Sparks seconded to allow this to be done. Carried.

Sara Jayne Hogue and Mary Gray appeared in the interest of the Beauty operators concerning their sewer assessment. They were advised it would be taken under advisement.

Wm. Cole submitted a plat of seventeen lots for annexation and approval. He was advised it would be approved depending on his correction of existing sewer problems. He agreed to have the sewers repaired within sixty days. On this promise the Board signed his plans.

George Fields was present to confer with the Board concerning the annexation of land on W. Carlisle St. They were afraid the street would not be improved since the Town had annexed only to the edge of the street. The School Board and the Toen Board will meet with the County Commissioners to try to get the street improved.

The street bids were opened and laid aside for further study. An estimate on some tree cutting was next submitted. Farmer moved and Sparks seconded that these be cut. Carried.

The letters for the Welcome Wagon have all been used. It was agreed to have 500 more printed.

Chairman Newcomer announced that the Zoning ordinance will be in effect after April 15, 1961. The date for the buffer zone will be announced later.

The Clerk Treasurer was instructed to write Maurice Fulford asking him to give a written report on his progress with the suit against Morris Prosser.

Robert Johnson showed plans for landscaping the grounds at the Disposal Plant. Farmer moved and Harris seconded these be used at the cost shown. Carried. He also made a report showing the enormous amount of water going through the plant. A large part of this is due to the downspouts being in the sewer. Some of the businesses are using many times the amount of water that others are using. It was felt there should be an adjustment made. As it stands a large laundry or packing plants are paying the same as a business operated by one person. The ordinance reads that this may be adjusted by the Board.

After a comparison of bids, Farmer moved and Sparks seconded to accept the bid of Ralph Rogers Company. Carried.

It was agreed that the Municipal Building should be used for local groups ~~for~~ only for rummage sales etc.


Robert Johnson presented a plan for running the sewer to five houses on East High street not served at present. This can be done for approximately \$700.00.
