It was moved by Antrim and seconded by Thornberry that Sage be appointed Chairman of Board. Motion Carried.

Moved by Sage and seconded by Equels that meeting adjourn.
Motion carried.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met in regular session January 2, 1940.

Chairman Sage called the meeting to order. Roll Call: Sage - Present, Antrim - Present, Equels - Present, Thornberry - Present, Denny - Present.

Chairman then announced that the election of a President for the Board of Trustees for the Year 1940, was next in order.

Denny placed the name of Irvin Antrim in Nomination. Seconded by Thornberry. Chairman declared nomination closed. As there was no other nomination, Antrim was declared elected by acclamation.

President Antrim takes the chair.

The reading of the minutes of December 5th, 8th and 26th, and of January 1, 1940, were approved as read.

Moved by Sage and seconded by Equels that Treasurer's report be accepted. Motion carried.

Sage placed the name of Charles H. Foley in nomination as Attorney for Town for year 1940. Seconded by Denny.

President declared Nomination closed. As there was no other nomination, Foley was elected by acclamation.

Equels moved that R. O. Aldrich be appointed as Marshall for the year 1940. Seconded by Denny. Motion carried.

Sage moved that John M. Switz be appointed as Nightwatch for year 1940. Seconded by Thornberry. Motion carried.

Moved by Sage and seconded by Equels that Earl Morgan be appointed Sexton of the Cemetery for year 1940. Motion carried.

President intrim then appointed the following committees:

Board of Finance - All members of the Board of Trustees.

Streets and Alleys - Denny and Equels.

Sewer and Septic Tanks - Equels and Sage.

Park - Thornberry and Denny.

Cemetery - Sage and Thornberry.

Auditing - Sage and Thornberry.

President Antrim announced that the Board of Finance should meet to organize the third Monday in January, which will be January 15, 1940.

Members of the Board discussed the matter of hiring Milton Henderson, as a regular man to work. After some discussion the matter was postponed until later in the year.

Antrim asked about the State Highway moving the snow from the streets. Aldrich reported Mr. Sawyers, local Highway man, had advised that it would be moved as soon as it thawed enough for them to move.

Antrim reported that Mr. Allen, living in the new addition had reported that William Anderson had left old truck bed in front of his property. Aldrich was instructed to ask Anderson to have it moved.

Report of Committees:

Sewers: - Sage asked what could be do about the West Septic Tank fence, as it was in need of repair, and some boys had been playing around the Tank. Board instructed Aldrich to have the fence repaired as soon as weather permitted.

Streets - It was reported some signs were needed to show the dead end on Harrison Avenue.

Fire Department: - Summer A. Sellars resignation as a member of the fire department was accepted. Moved by Sage and seconded by Denny that Wendell H. Moore be appointed as regular firemen, to fill his place. Motion carried.

(Minutes of meeting of January 2, 1940, Continued)

FiremChief Aldrich reported that the appointment of Wendell Moore as Regular firemen, would leave them without a substitute firemen, and some one should be appointed as a substitute.

Moved by Denny and seconded by Equels that Cecil Bain be appointed substitute fireman. Motion carried.

Antrim asked the Fire chief to name the present firemen. Aldrich named the following: Regular firemen - Paul Hunt, Ezra Fleener, Forrest Rusie, Clyde Ferguson, Clarence Squires, Alden Beall and Wendell Moore. Substitute fireman - Cecil Bain.

Mr. M. O. Shrake was present with a list of names of residents on Carlisle and St. Clair streets who wanted the Town to have a fire hydrant placed at or near Carlisle and St. Clair Streets.

Moved by Equels that a fire hydrant be placed at the most convenient place at or near Carlisle and St. Clair streets. Seconded by Sage. Motion carried.

Cherk-Treasurer was instructed to reduce the amount of appropriation for Electricity to \$3,275.00 to comply with the amount of reduction made by the State Tax Board.

Aldrich reported some complaints had been received about having no parking on the main streets while waiting for the State Highway sweeper to come to sweep the streets.

Aldrich said he had been advised that the State Highway Commission was supposed to furnish a man to help with the traffic in Mooresville, and to help keep the highway clean in town.

Moved by Sage and seconded by Equels that the Clerk-Treasurer be instructed to write Mr. Hallie Myers, Old Trails Building, Indianapolis, of the Maintenance department of the State Highway, asking for a man to help with the traffic and street cleaning, and to ask the State Highway Commission to pay for the electricity used in the Stop and Go Sign. Motion carried.

Sumner A. Sellars resignation as a member of the Library Board was accepted.

Moved by Sage and seconded by Denny that Fred R. Glidden be appointed as a member of the Mooresville Public Library Board to fill the unexpired term of Sumner a Sellars, ending July 1, 1941. Motion carried.

Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to issue a Certificate of Appointment to Mr. Glidden.

Clerk-Treasurer reported the receipt of a Legal Bulletin, No. 51, from the Gross Income Tax Division, relative to taxes payable by Municipalities on receipts from various sources, which included Park Concessions and Cemetery receipts. Attorney Foley advised that the Receipts from Park and Cemetery were taxable, and the Board instructed the Clerk-Treasurer to write to the Gross Income Tax Division for proper blanks for filing said report. Upon receipt of same to file the returns, enclosing with the report a claim blank for the Gross Income Tax Division to file covering the amount of taxes payable.

Antrim suggested the all members of the Board should make a tour of inspection of Streets, Septic Tanks, Park and Cemetery.

Moved by Sage and seconded by Denny that all claims be allowed as read. and Clerk-Treasurer be instructed to issue warrants for same. Motion carried: Claim #1 Oscar G. Couch, Official Bond Premium \$50.00

The Board of Trustees met in regular session, Tuesday, February 6, 1940, at 7:30 P. M., with all members present.

The minutes of the meeting of January 2nd, were read and approved as read.

Moved by Sage and seconded by Equels that the Treasurer's report be accepted. Motion carried.

Clerk-Treasurer read report of the Auditing Committee, which is hereto attached and made a part of these minutes.

Clerk-Treasurer read letter received from Mr. Hallie Myers, Director of Traffic of the State Highway Commission, advising they would make a survey of the Stop and Go Sign at the intersection of Indiana and Main Streets, as soon as weather conditions permitted, and if found to be necessary, it will be taken for maintenance, if not necessary, it will be removed. He advised he had referred the request for a man to help take care of the street on which the state highway is located, to the Maintenance Department.

Clerk-Treasurer read letters received from the Indiana Municipal League regarding the payment of Gross Income Tax by towns, advising a meeting to be held February 8th, at 1:30 in the Claypool hotel, Indianapolis, and requesting that the Town of Mooresville be represented.

Street Commission Aldrich reported he would have the Tree by Ben Cooper's property cut as soon as the westher permitted.

Aldrich was instructed to find out where the Postmaster wanted to unload the mail at the New Post Office and to mark the street according for no parking.

Equels reported that John C. Moore had asked permission to put step in front of the New Bost Office, on the side walk on North Indiana Steet. The Board told the Street Committee to advise Mr. Moore that he would be liable for any accidents that might occur on account of the step being placed on the side walk.

Mr. Weaver of the Hoosier Casualty Company was present, and explained to the Board their New Policy on Volunteer Firement which complies with the Law covering same passed in 1939. The premium on the New Policy being \$175.00 a year. He advised that it was not mandatory for the Town of Carry this type insurance on the firement. No action was taken by the Board.

Mr. McElwain and Mr. Dorsett, representing the Mooresville Public Service Co., were present in regard to the placing of a Fire Hydrant at the Alley on Wheeler avenue, between Carlisle and St. Clair Streets. After discussion of same the following motion was made.

Moved by Sage and seconded by Denny, that a Fire Hydrant be placed at the Alley on Wheeler Avenue, between Carlisle and St. Clair Streets. Motion carried, and the Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to advise the Mooresville Public Service Company regarding same.

It was reported that complaints had been received about so many dogs running loose in town. And trim suggested that the Officers use judgement in killing of dogs.

The matter of making fire runs outside of the Corporation limits was discussed. Antrim said he did not believe it was right for the Property owners in the Town to pay for runs made outside the corporation. Foley advised there was a provision whereby the Trustee of the Township could pay for these runs, and suggested that the Board take the matter up with the Trustee.

It was reported that they had made a fire run to the Walter Smitherman home outside the corporation.

Moved by Denny and seconded by Equels that the Clerk-Treasurer be instructed to send Walter Smitherman an invoice for \$12.00 to cover the Compensation of the Firemen who made the fire run to his home, February 2nd.

Aldrich reported that the 12" fire hose received from the Fabric Fire Hose Company in January had the wrong threads on the couplings, and had been returned to the Company for replacement.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met in regular session, Tuesday, March 5th, at 7:30 P. M., with all members present.

Minutes of the meeting of February 6th were read and approved as read.

Moved by Sage and seconded by Denny that Treasurer's report be accepted, Motion carried.

Clerk-Treasurer read letter received from Indiana State Board of Health relative to Sewer Works Short Course given at Purdue University, March 25-29, 1940, invitiing the Board of Trustees to nominate one man from Mooresville sewage plant to attend this School. Clerk-Treasurer reported that Mr. Aldrich had already filed application of enrollment with the State Board of Health.

Mr. Antrim reported that he and Mr. Foley had attended the Municipal League Meeting at Indianapolis on February 8, 1940. At which meeting the league advised the municipalities not to pay the Gross Income Tax until some thing definite had been determined, and Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to withhold payment of the tax until farther notice.

A number of Citizens were present and presented two petitions for sewers to be constructed as W. P. A. Projects. Which are attached hereto and made a part of these minutes.

Mr. Harold Page, Representative of the Works Progress Administration was present, and explained how this could be worked out, and said that a survey/should be made to see whether or not these sewer projects would be feasible.

It was suggested by the memebrs of the Board that the citizens engage Mr. A. H. Moore, the engineer who made the survey for the sewer in Mooresville, to make a preliminary survey to determine how much it would cost and see whether or not they would want to go ahead with the project.

Some of the citizens were in favor of putting in these sewers under a Barret law, and Mr. Page advised that this could be done, by the Town letting a contract to an Engineer, who would be responsible to the Town. He said it would probably take 45 days for the project to go through after the plans and specifications had been approved by the State Board of Health.

The Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to write Mr. Moore, inquiring if he had a complete survey of the Town, and if in his opinion it would be advisable to connect these sewers to the sewer main.

Clerk-Treasurer reported that the F. E. Gooding A musement Company hadd signed a contract to furnish rides at the Old Settlers Picnic for \$100.00 and and the Electricity, and had paid the usual reservation fee of \$25.00.

Clerk-Treasurer reported she had received several inquiries about exclusively privileges at the Picnic, and the Board decided to grant no exclusive privileges, except for mechanical rides to the F. E. Gooding Amusement Co.

Mr. Antrim reported the eaves of the shelter house at the Park needed painting and instructed Mr. Aldrich to have them painted.

Mr. Aldrich reported they had made a fill on Harrison Street, and after discussing the matter with Miss Mary Scott, had made an approach to the street on the Scott s isters land so they could come on to the street, and later Miss Scott had complained that the approach was too soft to permit the delivering of sand from their land, and asked the Town to funish a man to help gravel the approach.

Mr. Aldrich was instructed to furnish a man to help gravel same.

Mr. Elmer Marley complained of water standing in front of his and Mr. Mowery's houses and asked that something be done about it. Mr. Equels said that in order to fill intthis low place, it would be necessary to put in a tile to carry the water away. It was decided to leave this matter to the Street Committee.

Several partially dead trees along the streets were reported needing removing, as they are hazardous. Mr. Aldrich was instructed to look into the matter and have the trees removed where necessary. Street Committee was instructed to help in this matter.

Thornberry brought up the matter of side walks on West Washington Street being in bad condition and should be repaired. Equels reported a portion of the walk on East Washington Street near Goose Creek had the dirt washed out from under one side and should be looked after.

Aldrich asked about placing a Red Reflector on the gate at the Dead End of Harrison Avenue, but it was decided to put up the gate and decide later about the reflector.

Clerk-Treasurer reported that Franklin Jones had inquired what he would be required to pay to connectisewer on Part Lot 16 in Moores Addition, where no assessment had been paid on the lot, and advised he would like to connect to the old connection, which had been put in for the old sanitarium. As it was reported three houses were to be built on Part lots 15 and 16, it was decided by the Board that only one connection could be made for \$3.00 inspection fee and the other two connections would be required to pay the \$25.00 fee for connecting and the \$3.00 inspection fee, and the Clerk-Treas. was so instructed to advise Mr. Jones.

Mr. Aldrich reported on the Fire Inspection School given by the Purdue University and said the State Fire Marshall advised that Talc should be used to put out fire caused by burning oil, and the Board instructed Aldrich to place an order for two 50 lb. bags to have in case it was needed.

Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to give notice by publication in the Mooresville Times, March 7th and 15th, that on April 2, 1940 at 7:30 P. M. at the Municipal Building the Board of Trustees will receive bids and award a contract for the removal of Garbage from within the Coporate limits of the Town of Mooresville, from the 15th day of May, 1940 and until the 31st day of October, 1940, in accordance with specifications provided by Ordinance C, 1936. The Board of Trustees to reserve the right to accept or reject any and all bids.

Mr. Page, the W.P.A. representative explained that different phaces had come up regarding the project which the Town has been working on for some time, and it would be necessary to revamp all the papers and have them signed again, and as the maps of the Town and the cross sections had been misplaced it would be necessary for the town to furnish more maps, and Mr. Aldrich was instructed to have Mr. Earle Gilbert make new maps of the cross sections.

Moved by Sage and seconded by Thornberry that all claims be allowed as read. Motion carried.

Mr. Antrim reported that members of Women's clubs had asked that the Board of Trustees put enforce the Ordinance providing for a Curfew for Children to retire from the streets and public places of business.

Attorney Foley advised that in 1915 a law was passed to take the place of the Curfew in towns, and make the parents res ponsible for the behavior of their children.

After a general discussion it was decided by the Board of Trustees to take no action on the matter at this time.

Moved by Sage and seconded by Denny that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met in regular's session, Tuesday, April 2, 1940, at 7:30 P.M., with all members present.

The Minutes of the meeting of March 5th, were approved as read.

Moved by Sage and seconded by Denny that Treasurer's report be accepted. Motion carried.

Clerk-Treasurer gave a report of the meeting held in the Municipal Building, Tuesday evening March 26, 1940, with reference to the sewer project on North Indiana Street and the North East part of Town, as follows:

The members of the Board of Trustees and several Citizens met at the Municipal Building, Tuesday evening, March 26th to discuss the sewer project. Mr. A. H. Moore, an engineer from Indianapolis was present, and submitted estimates on the proposed sewer, which totaled approximately \$15,300.00. The estimated cost per foot was \$2.20. No action was taken in the matter. Same being postponed until the next regular meeting.

Several citizens were present at this board meeting, April 2nd, who were interested in the sewer project, some were for the project and several were against the project. After a general discussion and several of them had expressed themselves as being against the project, as they were unable to pay for the sewer, Mr. Equals suggested that they get up petitions both for and against the project. The general opinion of the Board was that under the circumstance it would not be fair to impose this burden on the peoples who are not in position to pay it.

Moved by Equels and seconded by Denny that the property owners both for and against the project present petitions to the Board at the next meeting of the Board. Motion carried.

Mr. Burton; plant man of the Union Telephone Company and Mrs. E. C. Mull of Greenfield, Auditor of the Union Telephone ompany, were present regarding the telephone operators giving out information about fires, when the fire whistle blows. Mr. Dorsett and Mr. McElwain, representatives of the Mooresville Public Service Company were present in reference to the operation of the fire whistle, etc. Mr. McElwain explained how the water force was operated during fires.

Moved by Denny and seconded by Sage that the Board of Trustees cooperate with the telephone company in eliminating the extra work imposed on the operators of the telephone company at the time of a fire. Motion carried.

Mr. Ridgway, Agent for the Hoosier Casualty Co., was present in reference to insuring the Volunteer Firement, under the New Form of policy, as prescribed by Law. He presented a letter to the Board from the above company in which they agree to write insurance covering the firement for a period of six months, at a premium of \$75.00.

Moved by Sage and seconded by Equels that the Board insure the firemen for a six monthsi period. Motion carried.

Moved by Sage and seconded by Equels that the Group Occupational Accident policy on the Marshall, R. O. Aldrich and Nightwatch, John M. Switz be renewed for one year. Motion carried.

Mr. Aldrich made a report of the Short Term at Purdue University, which he attended from March 25th to 20th inclusive, regarding operation of sewers and septic tanks. He said much valuable information was obtained at the school.

Equels reported sonsiderable work had been done on the streets by cleaning ditches, and that the sewer near the Protection Steel and Chemical Company factory was stopped up with tar, paints and so forth and that the Company had agreed to take care of it. The Company was having a ditch dug beside the old sewer and intended to put in new tile.

Denny reported water standing in the street between H.L. Townsend and W.J.S tangles property and same should be divained. Equels reported that Elmer Marley had agreed to buy the tile to carry the water away from the front of his house, if the Town would put it in.

It was reported that if the light on Harrison Street, near the Alley east of Indiana Street was moved a short distance, it would light the alley much better. Antrim suggest that the street committee take this matter up with the Public Service Co.,

Aldrich reported that Chester Edwards had agreed to furnish the material if the Town would put in another fence showing the blockage on Harrison Avenue, and he would plant cedar trees at each corner. It was decided to leave the matter with Mr. Aldrich to work out. It was decided it would be better to paint the picket fence alternating black and white.

Clerk-Treasurer reported and Jeanette Watson had applied for a permit to make an appoach to her property on Morgan Street. The clerk-Treasurer was instructed to isue the permit for same, to be put in according to Ordinance covering same.

Fire Chief reported they need charges for the hand apparatus. used in fighting fires. Laga raported

Clerk-Treasurer reported a Mrs. Gladys Wilson, head of Girl Scouts in Indianapolis, had asked how much the town would want for tental on the Town Park for two weeks in June, Beginning June 9th. Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to write Mrs. Wilson that owing to the expense which would be incurred in this matter, they believed a nominal charge of \$20.00 would be charged.

Mr. Quinn, head of the recreational center here in Mooresville was present and asked the privilege of putting up Basket Ball goals on west end of Ball Park. Goals to be portable, so they could be taken down for other activities.

Moved by Denny and seconded by Equels that the Recreational boys be permitted to use the Park grounds, providing they would take good care of the property. Motion carried.

Clerk-Treasurer read the Bid received on the Garbage contract, which was made by Mr. Ben Gregory in the sum of \$96.00.

Moved by Equels and seconded by Denny that the Board accept the bid of Mr. Gregory. Motion carried.

Attorney Foley read a portion of the law in reference to the Township Trustee helping buy fire trucks in connection with the Town to fight fires in the Township, outside the coporate limits. It was decided to take the matter up with Mr. Flater, Trustee of Brown Township.

The Board consented to allow Mr. W. A. Cox, Justice of the Peace to hold his Court in the Municipal Building and Mr. Aldrich was instructed to give him a key to the building.

Antrim reported that an ex-volunteer firement some two years ago made a fire run to Brooklyn to help fight fire at the Brooklyn Brick Plant, when he was not called to do so, and the former Board had not allowed his claim for same. Attorney Foley said his only recourse would be to appeal his claim to the Court.

Mr. Antrim asked the City Officers to keep a closer watch on boys seen loafing around town at nights, and to ask the business men to be more careful about leaving anything outside to tempt the boys.

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

Minutes of the Meeting of June 4, 1940, were read and approved as read.

Moved by Denny and seconded by Sage that Treasurer's report be accepted. Motion carried.

Street Commissioner reported he had written Mr. Rigdon about oiling the streets, but had not heard from him. After discussion on oiling the streets and alleys, it was decided to leave the matter to the street committee.

Complaint was reported about a light pole setting too far out on Franklin Street, and Mr. Ross being present, was asked to look after the matter.

Antrim reported having received complaints about people keeping hogs in Town. Dr. White, the County Health Officer, was present, and after discussing the situation asked the Board of Trustees to have Ordinance governing the keeping of hogs in town published two or three consecutive weeks in the Mooresville Times, and then allow the citizens who have hogs a reasonable length of time to remove them.

Mr. Ross was present regarding the renewal of the Street Lighting Contract. He presented copies of the Contract, which is in substances the same as the Town is now operating under. The Contract was referred to Attorney Foley. No action was taken at this time.

Antrim reported to Mr. Ross that the insolation was worn off light wires in many places in Town, and Mr. Ross advised they were planning to do considerable amount of work in the Town in the next 18 months. THIS AGREEMENT entered into this lst day of September, 1940, by and between the Town of Mooresville, hereinafter called the Consumer and the Mooresville Public Service Company, hereinafter called the Company, whereby the Company agrees to furnish and the Consumer agrees to take from the Company for a period of four (4) years, beginning when the Company begins to supply service hereunder, all electric energy required in connection with the lighting of streets, alleys and public places within the Town of Mooresville.

MOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, the electric energy to be delivered, the sums of money to be paid and other valuable considerations, the parties hereto have mutually agreed and do hereby agree with each other as follows:

The Company shall furnish for use in the performance of its contract, all the necessary materials, labor, plant, machinery and appliances, and construct, operate and maintain the same in such streets, avenues, alleys, sub-ways and public places in said Town of Mooresville, Indiana, in such manner as the Board of Trustees of Consumer may from time to time direct during the life or this contract - provided, however, that the number of lights to be operated and maintained by the Company shall not at any time be less than the amount set forth in this contract:

The work of construction or repair of the Company's plant as is located in streets, avenues, alleys and public places, including the cutting into and repair of streets, the location of relocation of lines, lamps and poles, and the construction of conduits shall all be subject to the approval of the Board of Trustees of Consumer. Right is hereby reserved by the Consumer to order any change or changes made from time to time in the location of standards or overhead lighting fixtures from their original location. Changes so ordered, by the Consumer, in the location of overhead lamps shall be made by the Company at no costs to the Consumer; changes so ordered by the Consumer in the location of ornamental or standard lamps shall be paid for by the Consumer at actual cost of labor and material plus fifteen per cent (15%) for overhead, provided however, that the expense of any such changes in said ornamental or standard lamps ordered or caused by any public improvement, shall be borne and paid for by the Company. The Company agrees that it will restore or cause to be restored all streets, avenues, alleys and public places to the same condition after the completion of its work as they were in before being disturbed; that it will at all times make or cause to be made, any and all repairs which may be necessary to any pavement, sidewalk, or any street, avenue, alley or public place by reason of the same having been excavated or disturbed by the Company in the prosecution of its work.

The Company and Consumer agree to continue the operation of the 94 - 250 candle power, overhead, suspension type units, and the 4 - 600 candle power and 18 - 400 candle power ornamental standards which are now installed and are now a part of the existing street lighting system, payments to be as specified in proposal.

The title to and in all property, and every part thereof covered by this agreement, shall be and remain in the Company.

All the above lamps shall be lighted at approximately thirty minutes after sunset and extinguished approximately thirty minutes before sunrise each day during the term of this agreement.

The Consumer shall have the right to discontinue at any time, cortain lights after having given at least a thirty days!
