

AN ORDINANCE LICENSING PLUMBERS AND REGULATING THE MANNER IN WHICH PLUMBING MAY BE DONE IN THE TOWN OF MOORESVILLE, INDIANA.

Section 1. BE IT ORDAINED, by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, That hereafter it shall be unlawful for any person, firm, association, corporation or individual to carry on the business of plumbing in connection with the sewage disposal system of the Town of Mooresville until a license is obtained as hereinafter provided.

Section 2. Any person, firm, association, corporation or individual desiring to engage in the business of plumbing in connection with the sewage disposal system of the Town of Moores-ville shall make an application in writing to the Clerk-Treasurer setting forth the name of such person, firm, association, corporation or individual and the business address of the same, how long the applicant has been engaged in the plumbing business and such other information as may be prescribed by the Board of Trustees. Before said license shall be granted the applicant shall furnish a bond in the sum of \$300.00, payable to the Town of Mooresville with surety to be approved by the Board of Trustees and conditioned that said person, firm, association, corporation or individual will abide by all the rules, ordinances and regulations concerning, or pertaining to, plumbing in connection with the sewage disposal system of the Town of Mooresville.

Section 3. Upon the application being filed and the bond being furnished, the Clerk-Treasurer shall thereupon issue to such applicant a license which will entitle the holder thereof, to engage in plumbing in connection with the sewage system of the Town of Mooresville and in conformity with the rules, regulations and ordinances of the Town of Mooresville for a period of one year.

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Enorse said license shall be granted the applicant shall furnish a bond in the sum of \$500.00, psyable to the fown of Mooresville with surety to be approved by the Board of Trustees and conditioned that said person, firm, association, corporation or individual will shide by all the rules, ordinances and regulations concerning, or pertaining to, plumbing in connection with the sewage disposal system of the Town of Mooresville.

Sequion 3. Upon the application being filed and the bond being furnished, the Clerk-Treasurer shall thereupon issue to such applicant a license which will entitle the holder thereof, to engage in plumbing in connection with the sewage system of the Town of Mooresville and in conformity with the rules, regulations and ordinances of the Town of Mooresville for a period of one year.

Section 4. Every person, firm, association, corporation or individual shall pay annually, upon the issuance of such license, the sum of \$ 3.00 to the Clerk-Treasurer which shall be covered unto the general fund of the Town of Mooresville.

Section 5. Licenses shall be issued for a period of one year unless revoked as hereinafter provided.

Section 6. Said plumber shall make an application for a permit to the Clerk-Treasurer in all cases where taps are to be made into the present sewage system or any additions or extensions thereto.

Section 7. Any extension or alteration of any user of said sewage system shall be done only upon written permit from the Clerk-Treasurer and must be presented by the plumber engaged to do the work before any alteration, extension or any inlet can be made.

Section 8. No plumber or other person shall make any attachments to any existing sewers without the parties desiring such work to be done first having made an application and obtaining a permit for the same, nor shall any plumber or any other person make any alteration in any sewer pipe attached to the Town's sewage system to conduct sewage into the same, on the same, or adjoining premises, for any purpose whatsoever, without application having first been made, and a written permit obtained from the Clerk-Treasurer for each and every separate installation or modification in the present existing inlets.

Section 9. Each and every plumber shall make a full and complete return to the Clerk-Treasurer under which any permit for work is granted; said returns must be made by the plumber doing the work within twenty-four (24) hours of completion of said work.

Section 10. No plumber shall attach any sewer to the present sewage disposal system unless he has obtained a permit therefor, or the owner of the premises for whom he is working has

Section 4. Every person, firm, association, corporation or individual shall pay annually, upon the issuance of such license, the sum of \$ 5.00 to the Clerk-Treasurer which shall be covered unto the general rund of the Town of Mooresville.

Section 5. Licenses shall be issued for a period of one year unless revoked as hereinafter provided.

Section 6. Said plumber shall make an application for a permit to the Olerk-Treasurer in all cases where taps are to be made into the present sewage system or any additions or extensions thereto.

Section 7. Any extension or alteration of any user of said sewage system shall be done only upon written permit from the Clerk-Treasurer and must be presented by the plumper engaged to do the work before any alteration, extension or any inlet can be made.

No plumber or other person shall make any attachments to any existing sewers without the parties desiring such work to be done first having made an application and obtaining a permit for the same, nor shall any plumber or any other person make any alteration in any sewer pipe attached to the Town's sewage system to conduct sewage into the same, on the same, or adjoining premises, for any purpose whatsoever, without application having first been made, and a written permit obtained from the clerk-freasurer for each and every separate installation or modification in the present existing inlets.

Section 9. Each and every plumber shall make a full and complete return to the Clerk-Treasurer under which any permit for work is granted; said returns must be made by the plumber doing the work within twenty-four (24) hours of completion of said work.

Section 10. No plumber shall attach any sewer to the present sewage disposal system unless he has obtained a permit therefor, or the owner of the premises for whom he is working has presented to him a permit for the same, and in no case shall he make such connection unless the owner of the premises has paid the fee prescribed by ordinance for a new connection or for a tap-in connection.

Section 11. Any person, firm, association, corporation or individual doing services as a plumber that violates any of the rules or regulations governing the connection with the sewage disposal system of the Town of Mooresville, or who shall either voluntarily or at the request of any property owner, tenant or other person introduce any pipes, drain, hydrant, bath, water closet, urinal or other device or fixture into said sewage system without having first obatined a permit therefor, and the payment of a proper fee therefor, shall be prohibited from doing any business for himself or any other plumber in connection with the sewage disposal system of said Town and the license held by such plumber shall be revoked and the bond herein provided for, declared forfeited.

Section 12. This ordinance shall not be construed as repealing any existing ordinance, but shall be construed as supplemental to any existing ordinance.

Section 13. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.



Mr. P. M. Ross and Mr. K. R. Dorsett, representing the Mooresville Public Service Company, and several citizens were present.

Attorney Foley read the Report, after which there was a general discussion of the report and recommendations which were made. No action was taken on the matter.

Marshall King reported the W. P. Rigdon had promised to come down the next day to check on the work to be done on the streets.

Marshall King was instructed to order street signs.

Moved by Bellows and seconded by Sage that meeting adjourn. Motion carried.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, met in regular session Tuesday evening at 7:30, December 2nd, with all members present except Denny .

The reading of the minutes of November 4th and November 25th, were approved as read.

Moved by Sage and seconded by Bellows that Treasurer's report be accepted. Motion carried.

Bellows reported Earl Gilbert would survey the Alley between Main and Harrison Streets, East of Indiana Street and set stakes.

Street Commissioner reported Mr. Rigdon had been working on the streets, and had applied 2400 Gallon of Oil, and thought it would take 1200 gallon more oil to finish the work as planned.

Bellows reported that Mrs. Rose Swain Wheeler wanted to sell enough ground off her lot on West South Street to make the street striaght. No action was taken.

Firechief Ferguson reported that old fire hose could be reset and used on the streets and sewers, and the work could be done by a firm in Indianapolis. He was instructed to investigate the matter farther.

Firechief reported that Mr. Glazebrook, salesman for the Fabric Firehose Company said he might be able to sell the hose cart, which has been discarded. Board instructed the Firechief to advise Mr. Glazebrook they would sell the cart.

The Board instructed the Firechief to check up on all fireplugs that were obstructed in any way and the report the same to the Clerk-Treasurer, who was instructed to write the Mooresville Public Service Company, asking them to give the matter attention and see that the plugs were made accessiable. Also to request that all values on the water system have manholes, so they would be readily accessiable. Moved by Sage and seconded by Bellows that Clerk-Treasurer notify the Public Service Co., in regard to above. Motion carried. Firechief was instructed to have Fire truck serviced for winter.

Marshall reported they had set out six trees at the Town Park.

Mr. W. D. Anderson was present in regard to the burial of Mrs. Hettie Bardagallo, whom C. J. Poe said was buried on the lot of F. S. Miller. No action was taken until more definite information could be obtained.

In The matter of buying more ground for the Cemetery, the cemetery committee was instructed to look into this farther and report what they deemed advisable at the next meeting.

After discussing the matter of Christmas Lighting, it was moved by Thornberry and seconded by Bellows that the Clerk-Treasurer write the Mooresville Public Service $^{\text{C}}_{\text{Ompany}}$ to turn on the lights as soon as possible and that the Town would pay \$50.00 to the Company on the Electricity.

Clerk-Treasurer reported that all Barrett Assessment on Barrett #7, Morgan Addition had been paid and that all the Improvement Bonds on Morgan Audition had been paid.

Attorney Foley reported that he and Mr. Hammons, County Auditor were going into the Statehouse to see what could be done about the Suit which the Town has against Morgan County.

Ordinance No. 4, an Ordinance Declaring a Junk Yard a Nuisance and Froviding for the Abatement thereof, was given second Reading.

Moved by Sage and seconded by Bellows that the Ordinance be placed upon its passage. Motion carried.

Moved by Sage and seconded by Bellows that Ordinance be Adopted. Poll Call Vote: Antrim - Aye, Sage - Aye, Bellows - Aye, and Thornberry - Aye.

The Ordinance is hereby presented for signatures and made a part of this record.

AN ORDINANCE DECLARING A JUNK YARD A NUISANCE AND PROVIDING FOR THE ABATEMENT THEREOF.

Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, Indiana:

SECTION I

That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm, corporation or individual to use any building or space owned or occupied by such person, firm, corporation or individual for the purpose of collecting and/or dismantling automobiles, collecting old metals, scrap iron or used or damaged articles containing metal of any kind or character, and such as commonly known as a junk yard, within the corporate limits of the Town of Mooresville and to so conduct and maintain the same so as to be offensive to the sight, smell, or in any way interfer with the comfortable enjoyment of the property of the Citizens of the Town and the lives of the inhabitants thereof.

SECTION II

Any person, firm, corporation or individual so maintaining a junk yard as defined in Section I of this ordinance, is hereby declared to be the author and maintainer of a public nuisance.

SECTION III

Any person, firm, corporation or individual who maintains a nuisance as herein provided and the owner of the premises upon which the same is located shall, when notified by the Town from Marshal, remove the same/within the corporate limits of the Town of Mooresville and remove any such automobiles, old metals, scrap iron, articles containing metal of any kind or character from said premises; and upon the failure or refusal so to do, within ten (10) days after notification by said Town Marshal, the Town Marshal shall remove the same with such necessary assistance as he may deem advisable, and the costs thereof shall be returned by him to this Board and the Clerk-Treasurer shall

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certify such costs to the Auditor of Morgan County, Indiana, and the same shall be charged against such property and collected in the same manner as taxes are collected.

SECTION IV

In the event the owner of such premises is a non-resident of the State of Indiana before such removal shall be made by said Town Marshal, a notice thereof shall be published in a newspaper printed and published in the Town of Mooresville for ten (10) days prior to such removal.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption.
