The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooreville, met in regular session with all members present except Bellows.

The Minutes of the Meetings of December 2nd and December 26, 1941, were read and approved as read.

Moved by Denny and seconded by Sage that Treasurer's report be accepted. Motion carried.

President Antrim announced that the meeting was now open for Reorganization, for the year of 1942, and appointed John M. Switz temporary Chairman of the Meeting.

Chairman Switz declared meeting open for nomination for President of the Board of Trustees for the year 1942.

Denny placed in nomination the name of Irvin Antrim for President of the Board of Trustees. Seconded by Thornberry.

Antrim place in nomination the name of Cal D. Bellows for President of the Board of Trustees. Seconded by Sage.

As there were no other nominations, Chairman Switz declared nominations closed.

Upon Vote, Antrim received three (3) votes and Bellows one (1) Vote, and Chairman Switz declared Antrim elected President of the Board of Trustees for the year 1942.

President Antrim takes the Chair.

Sage placed the name of Charles H. Foley in nomination for Town Attorney, Seconded by Thornberry. As there was no other nomination Mr. Foley was declared appointed by acclamation.

Moved by Sage and seconded by Denny that Orval King be re-appointed as Marshall., to serve during the pleasure of the Board of Trustees. Motion carried.

Moved by Thornberry and seconded by Denny that John M. Switz be appointed Nightwatch for the year 1942. Motion carried.

Moved by Denny and seconded by Sage that Clyde Ferguson be re-appointed as Firechief. Motion carried.

Moved by Sage and seconded by Thornberry that Earl Morgan be re-appointed as section of the Cemetery. Motion carried.

The President then appointed the following Committee to serve during the year 1942.

Street and Alleys - - - - -	Bellows and Denny
Sewer and Septic Tanks, - - - - -	-Bellows and Sage.
Park - - - - -	Thornberry and Denny
Cemetery - - - - -	-Sage and Thornberry
Auditing - - - - -	Sage and Thornberry.

President Antrim announced that the Board of Finance should meet to organize the Third Monday in January, which will be January 19, 1942.

It was reported that complaints had been received about people dumping ashes and having flower beds in alley between Indiana Street and Jefferson Street, running East and West.

King advised that Kelly Poe, who operates a sandwich shop on South Indiana Street, wanted the Town to put in a tile on the North side of the alley between Harrison and South Street, west of Indiana Street. The matter was left to the Street Commissioner.

Attorney Foley advised that it was necessary to report the amount of money paid to W. P. Rigdon, to the Gross Income Tax Division, of the State.

The Board appointed Mr. Bracy Burton to attend the Fire Service Training School, and agreed to pay his transportation and other expenses while attending the School.

Surveyor Gilbert was present in regard to surveying the West side of Clay Street, between Indiana and Washington Street. The members of the Board agreed to meet with Mr. Gilbert and decide where they wanted the line established.

Attorney Foley loaned the members of the Board books on Housing and Electric codes, which he had obtained from the Indiana Municipal League office, and asked that the same be returned to the League office, after they had been read.

Street Commissioner King brought up the matter of furnishing gas for his car, when used in doing street work. The Board agreed to furnish the same for two or three months.

Moved by Sage and seconded by Thornberry that all claims be allowed as read. Motion carried.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met in regular session, February 3, 1942, at 7: 30 P. M., with all members present.

Minutes of the meeting of January 6, 1942, were read and approved as read.

Moved by Bellows and seconded by Sage that Treasurer's report be accepted. Motion carried.

Clerk-Treasurer read letter from Fitzhugh Lee, Secretary of the Board of Trustees of the Christian Church, that the Board for the use of the Municipal Building for their Sunday School and Church service, while the Christian Church addition was under construction.

Mrs. Nina McHaffie was present in regard to using the Assembly Room of the Municipal building to hold her Kindergarden School. Moved by Bellows and seconded by Denny that permission be given Mrs. McHaffie to hold her kindergarden classes in the Assembly Room, for a charge of \$2.00 per week for coal and electricity. Motion carried.

A petition was presented petitioning the Board of Trustees to have a fire plug installed on North East Street, signed by sixteen property owners. Mr. Harvey Sellars was present in regard to the matter, and Mr. McElwain and Mr. Dorsett, from the Mooresville Public Service Company were also present, and had blue prints showing the location of the water main.

Moved by Bellows and seconded by Denny that a fire plug be installed on the North side of Northeast Street on the first alley west of the main highway, on the west side of the alley. Motion carried, and the Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to write the Mooresville Public Service Company, to install the fire plug as specified above.

After discussing the matter of a side walk on the west side Clay Street, between Main and Washington Streets, the Street Commissioner was instructed to get estimates of the cost for the side walk and submit the same to the property owners.

Bracy Burton, who attended the Firemen's School at Indianapolis, January 12th, 13th and 14th, was present and gave a report on same. The following men have volunteered to act as Auxilliary Firemen: - Richard Keller, Mearl Sawyers, Ear Morgan, Perry Keller, Russell Roberts, George Killian, B. F. Jones, Cal D. Bellows and Frank Puntenery.

Firechief reported the firehose which were ordered in November had not been received, and was instructed to write the Fabric Fire Hose Company regarding same.

Moved by Sage and seconded by Bellows that the expense of Bracy Burton, attending the Auxilliary Firemen School, be taken out of the Contingency Fund. Motion carried.

Moved by Bellows and seconded by Denny that Firechief be instructed to buy three Firemen's raincoats. Motion carried.

President Antrim appointed Thornberry, Denny and Marshal King as a committee to see about putting up a flag pole.

President appointed Denny and Sage to talk to James Thompson, and the Property owners near the Junk Yard, and see what could be worked out in regard to moving the junk yard.

After discussing the Daylight Savings Law, it was decided that no action by the Board was necessary.

Moved by Bellows and seconded by Thornberry that all claims be allowed as read. Motion carried.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, Indiana, met in regular session March 3, 1942, with all members present, except Bellows;

The minutes of the meeting of February 3rd, were read and approved as read.

Moved by Denny and seconded by Sage that Treasurer's Report be accepted. Motion carried.

Clerk-Treasurer read communication from the State Highway Department, in regard to resolution passed at the regular session on the 24th day of February, as follows:

"Route No. 267 from State Road 67 in Mooresville to U. S. 40 in Plainfield, Exceptions:

- No. 1. Northbound at junction of U. S. 40.
- No. 2. Southbound at Main Street in Mooresville.

All Northbound and southbound traffic at this intersection shall stop and Main Street traffic, entering from east and west, shall have preference."

Clerk-Treasurer read an estimate of the cost of putting in sidewalk on east side of Clay Street, between Main and Washington Street, submitted by H. E. Wilson. No action was taken in the matter.

Clerk-Treasurer presented the Bond of Orval King, in the amount of \$1,000.00 as Marshal, with the Ohio Casualty Insurance Company as surety. Moved by Sage and seconded by Denny that Bond be approved. Motion carried.

Bragy Burton reported they had had 12 regular Firemen meeting and two auxiliary firemen meetings, with 13 present and 19 enrolled. The auxiliary firemen will meet every Monday and Thursday evenings at 7:30 P. M., for instructions.

Firechief Ferguson reported there was a different rate of insurance on auxiliary firemen, and Attorney Foley was asked to investigate the same.

Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to advertise for bids for the removal of Garbage in the Town of Mooresville, for two consecutive weeks.

Marshal reported the electric wires were down at the Park, and President Antrim instructed the Park Committee to look after the matter.

Special Committee on Junk Yard, had nothing to report on same.

Special Committee on Flag Pole reported it would cost about \$21.43 to get the pipe for the pole and after discussing the matter President Antrim instructed the Committee to see about putting a flag on the pole on the Bank Building.

The minutes of the meeting of March 3rd, were read and approved as read.

Clerk-Treasurer read letter received from Indiana Traffic Safety Council, regarding meeting and banquet to be held on Wednesday evening, at the Athletic Club, Indianapolis, to award trophies and awards to the different towns. An honor Certificate was awarded to the Town of Mooresville, for having had no fatal traffic accidents in 1941.

Clerk-Treasurer read letter from Federal Works Agency in regard to number of miles of the different kinds of streets in Mooresville. The Marshall reported the following figures to be submitted to the Federal Works Agency.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, met in regular session Tuesday evening, May 5th, with all members present.

Minutes of the meeting of April 7th, were read and approved as read.

Moved by Sage and seconded by Denny that Treasurer's report be accepted. Motion carried.

Clerk-Treasurer read card received from Mrs. Katherine Roberts regarding opening a street from High Street to South Street. Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to acknowledge the receipt of the card and advise that the Board would be glad to hear from the property owners in regard to same.

Clerk-Treasurer read letter received from Mr. C. F. Flater, in regard to land belonging to Minnie May Thayer, being assessed in the Town, and she says it is outside the corporation line. Mrs. Thayer was present and Attorney Foley advised her to have the ground surveyed and then take the matter up with the County Auditor.

Clerk-Treasurer read the Bid of Howard Duhamell for the removal of garbage, which was in the sum of \$125.00. This being the only bid received.

Moved by Bellows and seconded by Sage that the Clerk-Treasurer renew the subscription to the American City Magazine for one year. Motion carried.

Clerk-Treasurer read letter received from the Baltimore Fire Works and Specialty Company, advising they could not ship the order for bombs, before receiving a Certified Copy or photostat of Purchaser's License, required by the Federal Explosive Act. Mr. Burton advised that Mr. Claire G. Cook had been appointed to look after defense here and thought they could get the incendiary bombs at Indianapolis.

The following Resolution was read.

" RESOLUTION NO. 1, 1942 .

A Resolution to transfer funds from the Contingencies Fund to the Garbage Disposal Fund.

Moved by Sage that Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Bellows. Roll Call Vote: Antrim - Aye, Thornberry - Aye, Sage - Aye, Bellows - Aye, Denny - Aye. Motion carried.

Moved by Denny that the bid of Howard Duhamell of \$125.00 for the Removal of Garbage be accepted. Seconded by Bellows. Motion carried.

Comes now Howard Duhamell and presents Bond in the sum of Three Hundred (\$300.00) Dollars, signed by Frank Mendenhall as Surety, which is inspected and approved by the Board of Trustees and filed with the Clerk-Treasurer.

After discussing the matter of buying oil and patching the streets, it was moved by Thornberry and seconded by Denny that twenty (20) barrels of Oil be purchased. Motion carried.

President Antrim said to leave it to the Street Committee and Street Commissioners to see about buying the oil.

Clyde Ferguson reported that the sewers needed flushing out, and the Board instructed him to have them flushed out.
