Quillen Moved Milton Henderson be re-appointed Nightwatch. Seconded by Carpenter. Motion carried.

Moved by Carpenter that Earl Morgan be re-appointed Sexton of the Cemetery. Seconded by Quillen. Motion carried.

President Bellows re-appointed the following committees to serve during the year 1943.

President Bellows announced that the Board of Finance should meet to organize the Third Monday in January, Namely - January 18, 1943, to submit

Clerk-Treasurer reported the Heirs of Hannah Slaughter and Sadie McDaniel wished to have the East half of lot 15 in Block 4, transferred to E. F. Harvey, and to pay for Permanent Maintenance on the West half of said lot. Permission was granted to make the transfer upon the receipt of the necessary papers, signed by all the heirs.

The matter of raising the wages of the Sextion was discussed, and the Board agreed to pay Morgan \$40.00 per month, and extra for all time worked over that amount, at the rate of 30¢ per hour.

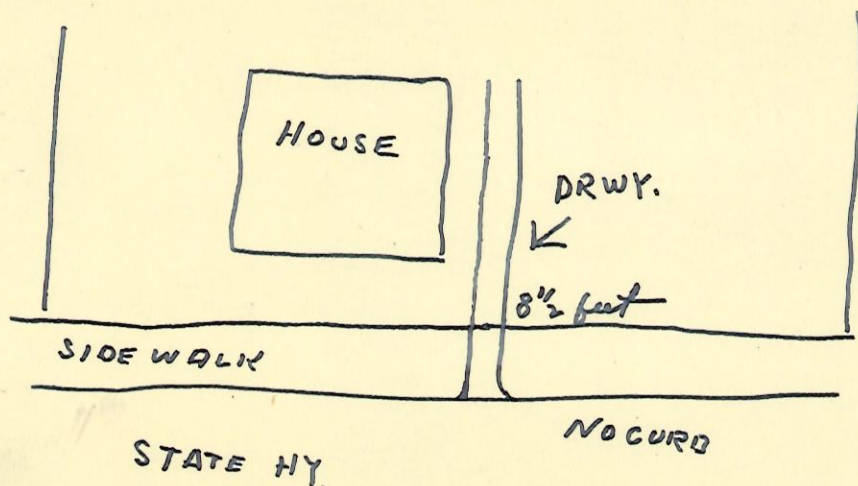

The minutes of the meetings of April 6th and 13th, were read and approved as read.

Moved by Quillen and seconded by Denny that Treasurer's report be accepted. Motion carried.

Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to renew subscription to the American City Magazine.

Marshall reported Mr. Milton Henderson was able to look after the Septic tanks.

Carpenter reported the Engineers of the Pennsylvania Railroad Co., had inspected the railroad crossings and said they would have them repaired as soon as weather conditions permitted. Denny reported the railroad company had repaired the switch at Washington and Scruggs streets.

Carpenter reported the sewer at High Street and Madison Avenue, seemed to be broken, and water was standing in the street. Water was reported to be standing in alley north of Washington Street, back of Freeman's green house. Street Commissioner was instructed to look in to the matter, and also to contact Mr. Spangle, manager of the D. X. Station on High Street in regard to washing cars on side walk.

Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to place a notice in the Mooresville Times in regard to accepting bids for patching and resurfacing the streets of Mooresville, and to advise Mr. Rigdon to return the Priority papers, as it was necessary to advertise for bids.

Clerk-Treasurer reported no bids had been received for the Garbage contract.

Clerk-Treasurer read letter from Eureka Fire Hose Co., advising the hose on which they quoted a price of \$1.05, was not a double Jacket hose, and the clerk-Treasurer was instructed to place the order for 100 feet 2½" double jacket hose with the Fabric Fire Hose Co., at \$1.10 per foot, after the priority had been received.

Attorney Polcy advised that according to the new ruling the Budget for the Town of Mooresville will have to be approved on the first meeting night in August, and published not later than August 12th, and the hearing must be held on the last Monday in August, which will be August 30th.

The sexton of the Cemetery asked about getting repairs for the hand mower at the Cemetery and was instructed to see Mr. Antrim about the repairs.

It was also reported that they needed a reel for the power mower, to be used at the Park, and the matter was left to the Park Committee.

Moved by Quillen and seconded by Denny that the following men be appointed as Auxiliary Police, in connection with the Civilian Defense Program. Motion carried: C. W. Squires, D. E. Carpenter, B. E. Perry, G. A. Ridgway, and Paul J. Marley, and the Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to administer the oath of office to them.

John Madge was present and reported the Sanitary Container Co., in the Northeast part of town, were burning paper between the building and it was a fire hazard. Marshall was instructed to contact the manager of the factory concerning same.

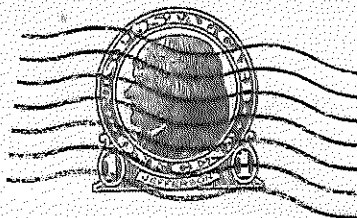
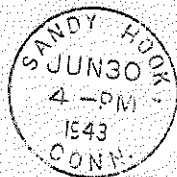
Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to Write Mr. Bowman, asking that he send a representative to meet with the Board at the next regular meeting, July 6th.

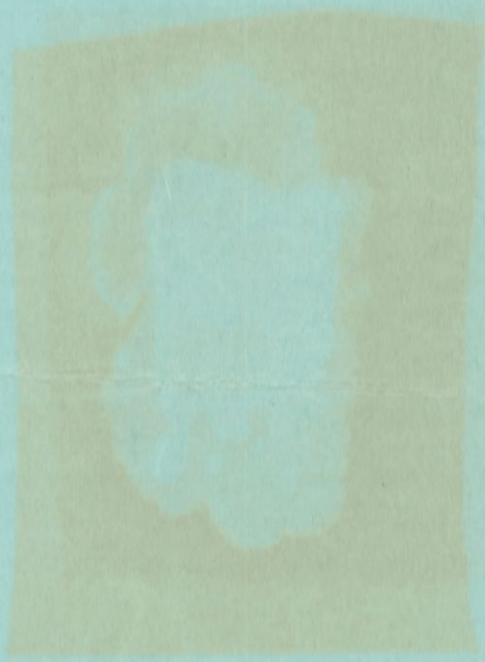

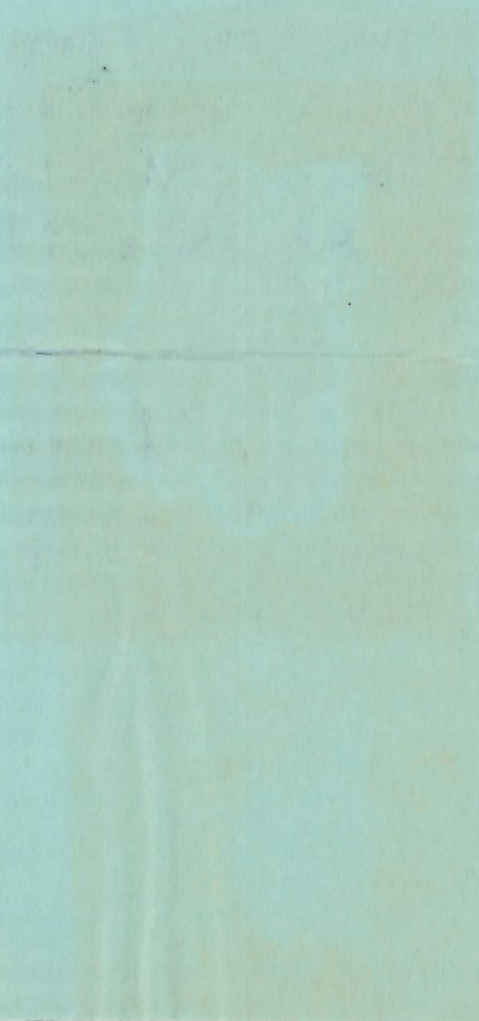

Permission was given for the Convoy of soldiers to park at the Town Park, whenever the desire to do so.

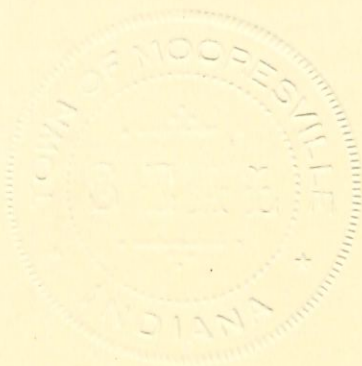

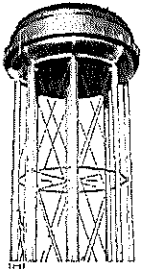

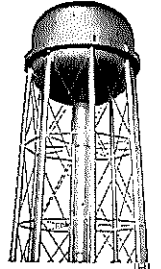
