



Mooresville, Indiana, October 5, 1943.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met in their Regular Session, Tuesday, October 5, 1943, at 7:30 P. M., with the following members present: Bellows, Quillen, Denny and Carpenter.

The minutes of the meeting of September 7th were read and approved as read.


