

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooreville met in regular session in the Municipal Building on Tuesday January 5, 1954 at 7:30 P.M. with all members responding to roll call with their Attorney, Mr. Gilbert Butler also being present.

The minutes of the meeting of December 29th, 1953 were read and bore a correction in the paragraph reading of the keeping of time for all street employees by Mr. Horton. The Board suggested that the word Street Commissioner be used in this stead. With the bearing of the correction, it was moved by Shepherd and seconded by Allison that the minutes be acceptable. This motion carried.

Due to the fact the Board of Trustees had not completed their organization for 1954, the Clerk-Treasurer stated that nominations were in order for the choosing of a Board President for the year 1954. Elvin Shpeherd placed the name of Harry Wilson. There were no other nominations and Harmon Allison moved the nominations be closed. Thus Harry Wilson becomes the new President of the Board of Town Trustees for the Year of 1954.

Mr. Wilson took the Chair and re-appointed all committees for service in the same capacity as 1953 with the exception of the Street Committee which had been acting under all the Board Members. Mr. Wilson appointed two members to serve the Street Committee as Herman Gregory and Roy Rushing.

Mr. Don Cooper and Mr. Loren Moore, visitors to the Board meeting were heard next in concern of any excavating problems which the town might be anticipating during the year. Their charges were \$15.00 for grave openings, 25c per running foot for sewer ditches providing the opening to be no more than 30" deep x 18" wide. All other excavating to come at the rate of \$8.50 per hour. The Board thanked the gentlemen for their interest and placed their name on file for future reference.

Mr. E. F. Hadley was heard next with the information that in considering plans for further development of the Hadley Additions, he had been advised by the State Board of Health that they were condemning the pollution of GooseCreek and Mr. Hadley was much interested that the new sewer program include all of the Hadley Additions. The Board advised Mr. Hadley that their plans would include the Hadley Additions and at this time the Board advised the Clerk-Treasurer to contact the Moore and Heger firm to be present at the February meeting to talk on further plans for the new sewer program. The Board further advised Mr. Hadley that he might assure the representative of the State Board of Health of the good intentions of the Town in the proceeding as soon as possible with the sewer extension program.

A Mr. William Price was invited next with his proposal of the erecting of a community mausoleum in the Mooreville Cemetery. Mr. Price wished to obtain an option to buy cemetery ground for a hillside mausoleum and the Board at this time did not deem it advisable to undertake a project of this nature and should they ever decide to assume a matter of this nature they would notify Mr. Price.

Different items were discussed at this time in consideration of the betterment of the Town for 1954 such as the expected advertising of the bidding for a dump truck, street repairing programs, cemetery improvement further sidewalk repairs, the sewer program for surface water on E. Harrison St. and other sewer problems. In the matter of the stopped sewers under the Pennsylvania R. R. Tracks, the Board instructed the Clerk-Treasurer to write the Sup't. of the Vincennes Division relative to the cleaning of these sewers.

There were a few claims on the table for consideration for payment which were read next. After hearing the claims, it was moved by Rushing and seconded by Shepherd that all claims be allowed as read. They were:

Mooreville, Indiana
February 2, 1954

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooreville, Indiana met in regular session in the Municipal Building on Tuesday February 2, 1954 at 8 P.M. with all members responding to roll call. Attorney Butler was also present at this meeting. Several visitors were present in addition.

The minutes of the meeting of January 5, 1954 were read and it was moved by Gregory and seconded by Rushing that the minutes be acceptable as read and this motion carried.

Next the Treasurer's report was read showing a balance of all funds to total \$33,989.82. Several items were discussed in the report and it was moved by Allison and seconded by Shepherd that the report be acceptable as read. This motion carried.

Mr. and Mrs. Campbell and Irma Barlow were heard first as representing the citizens on E. South Street. Mr. Campbell acting as spokesman stated their problem as wishing the alley running directly south from Madison St. crossing E. South Street, be included for oiling in the summer program. The Board assured these citizens that the alley would be included for oiling, as well as a repair to a bad situation created by a water installation by the Hoosier Water Co. The Board instructed the Clerk to write the Hoosier Water Co. with reference to this matter.

The matter was brought forward next wherein Mr. George Adams refusal to comply with the Trailer Ordinance was made known on the assumption that since Mr. Adams did own the lot upon which his trailer was located, he felt that he should not have to have the license due to the trailer being used as his own dwelling. Discussion by the Board and the opinion rendered by Attorney Butler resulted in the fact that Mr. Adams would be subject to the license because his dwelling could be considered only as a temporary dwelling and all such dwellings would come under the ordinance jurisdiction.

Paul Michael was present in the interest of the proposition of the town dump truck with an appropriated amount for 1954. The Board took this matter up at this time for a small discussion and decided that they would receive bids for the truck at their next regular meeting of March 2nd, 1954. The Clerk was instructed to have the legal published on this asking for 3 classifications of bidding in the manner of a truck chassis only, a truck chassis and bed and or a dump bed only. Truck to be of general purpose for use on the streets, alleys, cemetery and park of the Town of Mooreville.

Kenneth Dorsett inquired next as to what charges were made for a fire call answered outside the town limits to which the Board replied none, the expense being assumed by the Township.

Upon invitation by the Town Trustees to the meeting, Mr. Harold and Frank Heger appeared next offering their concern and advice in the forthcoming sewer expansion problems. Following a lengthy discussion it was moved by Allison and seconded by Gregory that the firm of Moore and Heger should proceed with revamping the present sewer plans for expansion and included the points of the town's anticipated expansion plus plans for

all preliminary costs. The Heger Bros. stated that upon the completion of their new work they would have figures of total cost per patron and include new recommendations for the entire progra. The total cost of this survey was made known to the Board at an amount of \$750.00 which was included with the making of the motion of Allison and Gregory. Letter confirmed \$500.00

Next the concern of a resolution between the State of Indiana and the Town of Mooresville was brought forward favoring the erection of a traffic signal at the intersection of High and S. Indiana Streets. It was moved by Shepherd and seconded by Rushing that the traffic light be installed and this motion carried. The resolution was passed for the signatures of the Board members for forwarding to the State Highway Commission. Different inquiries had been made relative to the erection of the signal and to date only one contractor had shown interest in taking the job; the electrical contractor being Arthur Lusty with a submission of \$350.00 or less. It was decided that Mr. Lusty should proceed with the erection of the signal upon receipt of same.

A review of the Police Department brought forth these suggestions: Police Car not to leave Town of Mooresville unless upon order of the Morgan Co. Sheriff or in an emergency call.

2. All Officers to drive Police Car with Mr. Shaw instructing Horton and Keller instructing Rusie. 3. In patrolling the Town, the car to return to the Municipal Building which is considered Headquarters every 15 minutes unless in case of emergency. 4. All officers after reporting for duty to remain in jurisdiction of the Municipal Building and to leave call with the telephone office when going to the restaurant for meals. The Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to post these suggestions in the Police Office along with an additional suggestion eliminating the hauling of school children in the Police Car.

Street repair problems were brought up next with a lengthy discussion on plans for the 1954 summer season. The Board members deemed it advisable to prepare legal notices calling for bids on repair materials and these bids to be received for the March 2nd, meeting and opened on this date. Oiling of alleys to be included in the bidding. Apart from the discussion on the street repair, but in concern of street improvement the Trustees instructed the Town Clerk to write the Pennsylvania Railroad Co. asking the repair of their crossings in the Town.

The claims were read next for consideration for payment. After hearing the claims read, it was moved by Shepherd and seconded by Rushing that all claims be allowed as read. They were:

Mooreville, Indiana
March 2, 1954

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooreville, Indiana met in regular session in the Municipal Building on Tuesday March 2nd, at 8 P.M. with all members responding to roll call with their Attorney Mr. Gilbert Butler. A number of visitors were also present.

Minutes of the meeting of February 2nd, 1954 were read which bore a correction in the indicated paragraph concerning the cost of the survey of the present sewer system with proposed additions now being made by the Moore & Heger Co. to the corrected amount of \$500.00 which is now verified. With this correction it was moved by Shepherd and seconded by Allison that the minutes be acceptable as read. This motion carried.

Next the Treasurer's report was read showing a total of all funds to be \$31,901.92. After hearing and discussing the report it was moved by Allison and seconded by Shepherd that the report be acceptable as read and this motion carried.

The opening of bids took place next with the first being for the town truck with a dump bed. The first opened and read was that of the Mooreville Welding Shop placing four bids on truck beds only. The second opening was that of the Jessup-Buford Hdwe. Co. bearing 4 bids in the manner of 3 bids on a truck only and the other bid on a bed only. The last bid opened came from the Vestal Motor Co. bearing 4 bids in the following- 2 bids with truck only and 2 bids with truck and bed combined. After reading of all bids and recognizing the need for much discussion before decision, the Town Trustees deemed it advisable to hold the present meeting in continued session and the awarding of the bid to come at this time. President Wilson set the date of Monday March 15th for the continued session meeting date.

Mr. Paul Michael, representing the local Chamber of Commerce as its President expressed their approval and agreement with the Board of Town Trustees in the proposed sewer expansion program to which the Town Board extended their appreciation.

As the legal notice called for a second group of bids were on the table in preparation for opening at this time. Three sealed bids for the repairing and oiling of the streets and alleys for the 1954 season were opened in this manner: From the J. & J. Oilers of Indianapolis a bid for oiling only. The second bid being that of the Shumaker Bros. Industries carrying a complete bid using materials and equipment. The third was that of the Ralph Rogers Co. of Bloomington also complete in all materials and equipment charges. The exception to the last bid being no charge made for the use of equipment and carried the full charges in the cost of materials. All bids heard were held for further discussion and awarding in continued session.

(Minutes of the Meeting of March 2, 1954)

The next matter of concern was a discussion on a number of old and obsolete articles about the Municipal Building and the Fire Station which were only taking valuable storage space and the Board decided that proceedings should be started to abandon these articles. Attorney Butler advised the appointment of appraisers for the equipment named; i.e. 1 old tar-kettle, 2 bicycles, 1- 1924 Dodge Firetruck stripped of all equipment and sirens, and 1 lot of odd junk. With the establishment of the appraisal figures, the notice of sale of these articles to be given. Appraisers so named were H. B. Monday, E. A. Allen and William Hardcastle.

Many items of interest were brought forth next with the first being discussion of the proposed storm sewer bearing an appropriated amount of \$5000.00 in the 1954 budget. The Board of Trustees instructed the Clerk-Treasurer to write Mr. Canatsey, Co. Surveyor to establish some grade lines and prepare forms preparatory to any advertising for bids for work on this project.

The matter of the inactivity of the Sale Barn Ordinance was brought up next. Investigations of records revealed that the Town had been furnishing a special deputy each Saturday of the week to controll traffic during the time of the sale. Teh Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to write Mr. Parks and Mr. Vughn asking that they contact the Board of Trustees relative to making preparation for either a license as the Ordinance calls for or to care for the expense of the deputy.

In reviewing the problems pertaining to Old Settlers for 1954, note was made of the inaccessability of rides and other concessions if the date of the first Tuesday of August was maintained. Following discussion it was the unanimous decision that the date of Old Settlers for 1954 be the second Tuesday of August the same being the 10th and the contract for rides be made with the Gooding Amusement Co. of Columbus, Ohio.

In the matter of the parking meters, the need was cited for the extension of the meter system from the alley on N. Indiana St. on to Washington Street. To do this a curb must be installed on each side of the street and the Board decided to seek bids for this work and report at the April meeting before proceeding with any more plans for obtaining the meters. It was asked that a more rigid system of patrolling be had as there appeared to be more violations recently. The Board instructed the Clerk to have notice published of extra patrolling to begin immediately and the placing of tickets upon all cars showing violations.

A suggestion was brought forth next to rotate the shifts of the Police Department with Officer Horton and Officer Keller exchanging shifts to allow for betterment of conditions with the street work with Officer Horton taking charge of the street department now. Officer Keller advised the Board that he could work no other shift other than the 4 to 12 shift. Mr. Keller further advised the Board that he would continue in his present duties until the replacement came to work as the Board desired the organization of the Police Department to operate. The Board instructed the Clerk-Treasurer to issue requests for the receiving of applications for regular police duty for the Town of Mooresville and applications to be received until the 6th of April, 1954.

Resolution No. 1 of 1954 was given its first reading wherein the Town of Mooresville stated its wishes of operating the zoning of the entire town under the auspices of the County Planning Commission and the jurisdiction of said operation to coincide with the inspections to be made by the County Planning Commission Officials. It was moved by Gregory and seconded by Allison that the Board of Town Trustees pass this resolution. This motion carried. Due to an emergency it was moved by Shepherd and seconded by Allison that the rules be suspended and the resolution given a second reading. The Resolution was read the second time. It was moved by Rushing and seconded by Gregory that the Board pass and adopt this resolution. This motion carried.

Next an Ordinance defining the entire corporate Boundary of the Town of Mooresville and annexing all territory within said boundary not now a part of said Town of Mooresville, Whether platted or unplatted and Contiguous to the present corporate limits of said Town and Providing notice to all citizens of this Ordinance was given its first reading. It was moved by Shepherd and seconded by Allison that the Ordinance be passed by the Board. This motion carried. Due to an emergency which exists at the present time for the passage of this Ordinance it was moved by Gregory and seconded by Rushing that the rules be suspended and the Ordinance given its second reading at this time. This motion carried. The Clerk proceeded with the second reading of the Ordinance so defined above defining the entire corporate boundary of the Town of Mooresville and annexing all territory within said boundary not now a part of said Town of Mooresville, whether platted or unplatted and contiguous to the present corporate limits of said Town and providing notice to all citizens of this Ordinance . It was moved by Greory and seconded by

Allison that the Board of Town Trustees pass and adopt this Ordinance. Roll Call resulted in 5 ayes favoring the passing and adopting of this Ordinance.

The Claims were read next for consideration of payment. After hearing the claims it was moved by Shepherd and seconded by Allison that all claims be allowed as read and warrants drawn from the Treasury for same. Claims read were:

RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF MOORESVILLE
DESIGNATING MORGAN COUNTY PLAN COMMISSION AS THE PLAN COMMISSION OF THE
TOWN OF MOORESVILLE, INDIANA

WHEREAS, the Morgan County Plan Commission has been duly established and is now planning and recommending to The Board of Commissioners of the County of Morgan a Master Plan and Zoning Ordinance for Morgan County, Indiana; and

Section 2.5
WHEREAS, Chapter 174 of the Acts of the Indiana General Assembly for the year 1947 provide that the County Plan Commission may be designated as the Plan Commission for an incorporated Town;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, Morgan County, Indiana, that the Morgan County Plan Commission be, and it is hereby, designated and authorized as the Plan Commission for the Town of Mooresville.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooreville, Indiana met in con't session in the Municipal Building on Monday March 15, 1954 at 8 P.M. with all members responding to roll call.

President Wilson stated the meeting resumed for business and the first matter to be brought forward was a second reading of the bids placed for the letting of the town dump truck. Numerous comparisons were made and at length the Board decided that their needs could best be suited with a 1½T. truck with an all purpose dump bed and the lowest and best bid submitted in this class was made by the Vestal Motor Co. The truck as decided upon was to be equipped with 10 ply duals on the rear, and an oil filter, heater and defroster to come extra also, making the total cost of the truck and 2½ yd. Anthony Model 18 dump body the sum of \$2427.40. It was made in the form of a motion by Gregory with a second by Allison that the Vestal Motor Co. be notified of the decision of the Board. This motion carried.

Mr. Marcus Park and James Vaughn were present and heard next in concern of a suitable working arrangement for patrolling of the streets near the Sale Barn on Saturdays. Parks and Vaughn felt the Ordinance on the Sale Barn to be too old and not suitable to conditions of today and suggested that if the Town would grant the continuance of the present patrollman, then they would assume the remuneration which the patrollman had been receiving from the Town funds. This met with the approval of the Town Trustees and it was moved by Shepherd and seconded by Rushing that this particular business be handled in this matter mentioned above. This motion carried.

A second group of bids were taken up next in concern of street repair to be done this summer. A second reading was given to the bids of Shumaker Bros., J. & J. Oilers, and the Ralph Rogers Co. of Bloomington. The lowest and best bid in the estimate of the Board finally rested with the Ralph Rogers Co. of Bloomington and it was moved by Rushing and seconded by Gregory that the Board accept this bid. This motion carried and the Clerk-Treas. so instructed to notify the Company that they expected work to begin by the 1st of May as explained at the time of the placing of the bids.

Street lighting problems were dealt with next and suggestions were made as to having the trees trimmed again to let more light be shown and discussion brought forth the need for some additional lights especially at St. Clair St. and Indianapolis Rd., another on South Street and the alley at Barlows and another at Jefferson St. and 1st alley ^{South} of Wash. St.

Mention was made next of the numerous complaints being made by the matter of farm machinery being parked about the business place of the Latta Equipment Co. on W. Main St. The Board instructed the Clerk-Treasurer to write Mr. Latta and request that the machinery be removed from the Town streets and be placed on the lot which he has rented for his machinery.

Matters pertaining to the police department were brought up next. President Wilson expressed some dissatisfaction with the present operations in some ways and stated that he felt a re-organization program should be instuted in this department. Mention was especially noted of the absence of parking meter violation tickets which were not being put out by any of the police and instruction was given for a close watch on violators and tickets to be placed on all cars showing violations after March 22nd. Notice of such action to be posted in the local newspaper. Chief Shaw expressed concern in better patrolling of the meters, but quoted a need for leniency due to meters becoming unworkable at intervals and mentioned that leniency in this matter would bring a feeling of goodwill from the citizens of the community. A further dissatisfaction was mentioned by the Board in the overtime parking which was being noted by the members in the use of the 5 min. parking zone to be used by bank depositors only. All violators were to receive tickets henceforth were instructions given to the police. Officer Keller was asked to make a report of his shift next. The Board next stated that they were wishing a rotation of officers for the betterment of conditions and Mr. Keller informed the Board that he would be unable to continue working if the rotation plan would be used. To this the Board asked that legals be prepared for applications to be received for police duty with the Town of Mooreville, and such applications to be received until the 6th day of April, 1954. Officer Keller stated that he would remain with the department until such time as the Board hired another to take his place or the reorganization took place.

The Clerk-Treasurer stated that she had one claim which she would like to read at this time for consideration for payment. That of Claim #4777 payable to the Mooresville Public Library as reimbursement of \$66.49 which was the amount of O.A.S.I. taxes paid by the Town of Mooresville in 1953 for the Public Library. This amount had been paid through error by the Library to the Town who in turn reported this amount to the Public Employees Retirement Division handling the O.A.S.I. matters. A letter was received from Mr. Bolinger head of the O.A.S.I. stating that a credit of \$66.49 had been made to the Town for the first quarter of 1954 tax now becoming due and instructed the Library to file the claim for the return of their tax to the Town. This claim was allowed for payment.

Therebeing no other business to come before the Board at this time, it was moved by Gregory and seconded by Allison that the meeting adjourn. This motion carried.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, Indiana met in regular session in the Municipal Building on Tuesday April 6th, 1954 at 8 P.M. with all members responding to roll call. Attorney Butler was also present with the Board. Several visitors prevailed at this meeting and Robert Kendall of the Martinsville Reporter was among the number.

Minutes of the meetings of March 2nd and 15th respectively were read and Mr. Allison made mention of an error in reporting the exact --- location of a proposed street light as being in the alley south of Washington St. on Jefferson instead of being north of Washington St. The minutes bearing this correction stand approved as read.

The Treasurer's report was read next showing a balance of all funds to be \$29, 911.27. It was moved by Allison and seconded by Gregory that the Treasurer's report be acceptable as read. This motion carried.

Among the first citizens heard were Mr. Kopp and Harry Mitchell desiring to erect a Fruit and Vegetable Stand opposite the Dairy Queen on S. Indiana St. After hearing the plans the Board advised the gentlemen that they had no objections, but cautioned them on the State's compliances along Highway #67.

Charles Weaver representing the Bell Telephone Co. presented the matter of the question as to whether the Town expected the trucks and service cars of the Telephone Co. to adhere strictly to the parking meter system of the Town. In exchange for the services rendered by the Bell Co. to the citizens of the Town of Mooresville, Mr. Weaver revealed the precedents of other towns in allowing the service trucks given time where there were no Company parking lots such as in Mooresville. The Board of Trustees advised Mr. Weaver that they would not be able to comply thus in order that each and every business be placed under the same ruling in Mooresville. A suggestion of a flat rate either on a yearly or semi-annual basis was made. A decision is to be made by the Board at the next regular meeting in May.

The Township Advisory Board with the Township Trustee Jesse I. Wilson were heard next in the question as to the inadvisability of Brown Township assuming complete ownership of the Town-Township Fire truck. After clearing up a few misunderstandings, Mr. James Clem representing the Advisory Board felt that this plan of Brown Twp. taking charge of the jointly owned truck after the first of June would be a good and workable item for the citizens of the Township. A storage for the truck seemed to be the main issue and it was agreed by all members of the Board of Town Trustees that the present fire station be made accessible to the Township for housing their firetruck and they in turn paying a small fee to the town for the use of heat and lights throughout

the year. This found favor with both parties.

Jack Mackenzie presented new maps of the Mooresville Cemetery to the Board which had been ordered made earlier in the year. The Board expressed a note of commendation upon the fine workmanship in the map system which included permanent records and maps for recording.

Paul O. Michael officially presented the new town dump truck to the Town at this meeting according to contract dated March 15th, 1954. Insurance on the Truck was discussed and a survey of the agencies were made as to the Town's policies and it was decided by unanimous consent that the Dorsett Agency be notified of the Board's decision in their selection of his agency for insuring the town truck.

An order was made next to having Mr. Horton attend to having the posts put back around the east septic tank which had been burned away and another issuance was made at this time also of the dog burial ground being changed to the east septic tank grounds.

A letter of resignation was read next from Police Chief Folie Shaw. The letter was unsigned and bore no definite resignation date. It was moved by Allison that the resignation be accepted. In view of the build-up of the local department under Mr. Shaw's guidance and much favorable comment thus from local organizations and citizens, the Clerk-Treasurer begged of the Trustees to give consideration to the resignation. Pres. Wilson informed the Clerk-Treasurer that Herman Gregory made a second to the motion of accepting Shaw's resignation which he considered to make the matter final.

As called for in a legal invitation during the pst month for sub mission of applications for police duty in the Town of Mooresville, 11 applications were read at this time and from this group, 4 were reserved in the person of William Taylor, Harold Kenworthy, Noel Lowery and Charles Dowell who President Wilson would be called for a personal interview on the 13th of April which would be this meeting in continued session. The Clerk-Treasurer was so instructed to notify these applicants of the Boards action.

The claims were read next for consideration for payment. After hearing the claims it was moved by Rushing and seconded by Allison that the claims be allowed as read. They were:

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, Indiana met in regular session in the Municipal Building on Tuesday May 4th, 1954 at 8 P.M. with all members responding to roll call and Attorney Butler being present also.

The minutes of the meetings of April 6th, 13th and the Special Called Meeting of April 28th were read and it was moved by Allison and seconded by Shepherd that each of these minutes be acceptable as read and this motion carried.

Next the Treasurer's report was read showing a total of all funds to be \$28,718.08. The Clerk made mention of the near depletion of the Cemetery Fund suggested some action for the support of anticipated expense in the next three or four months of cemetery maintenance. No action was taken. A suggestion came from the Board that the Clerk contact the State Board of Accounts by letter in reference to the bill paid from the operating fund for the making of the Cemetery Maps recently. Earlier contacts made with the State Board were verbal only.

Correspondence from the State Aeronautics Board inviting the Town of Mooresville to participate in an "Air Marking Program" was read and due to the lack of an appropriation for this matter, the letter was referred to the local Chamber of Commerce.

A letter of resignation was read next from Louise Swisher, Town Clerk-Treasurer with the said resignation becoming effective as of the 31st day of May, 1954. It was moved by Shepherd and seconded by Rushing that Mrs Swisher's resignation be accepted. This motion carried.

The Board further instructed Mrs Swisher to issue an application "Legal" calling for those interested in applying for the position of Clerk-Treasurer to fill the vacancy created by the above resignation, to be published in the local "Times" and the applications to be received by May 15th.

Discussion fell next in reference to the forthcoming Old Settlers Picnic. President Wilson asked Mrs. Johnson of the local paper to give special emphasis of the return of Old Settlers to the second Tues. in August. Mrs. Swisher stated that she had gone ahead with plans as usual for the Picnic to date and had contacted Harvey Gilbert of Brazil to do the wiring of the concessions and grounds. This was favorable with the Board of Town Trustees.

The Advisory Board of Brown Township, namely Charles King, Walton Keys and James Clem their Chairman were present at this meeting for the purpose of working out with the Town Board a suitable date for meeting to appoint a school board member to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Alvin Scott. An agreement was reached for the 10th day of May at 8 P.M. in the Municipal Building.

Homer Monday was called to the discussion table next with matters concerning the fire department. The Town Trustees suggested to Mr. Monday that a practice run should be had each month no fire calls were answered to which Mr. Monday agreed the Department would comply. Due to serious complications resulting recently from citizens following the fire truck to fires, the Board asked Mr. Monday to take license numbers of the cars violating this State Law and report them to the local Police Department.

The matter of the Bell Telephone Trucks paying the meters while they were on duty was brought up next and the Town Trustees expressed their view as allowing the Telephone Co. the use of the meters in exchange for the services rendered to the Town.

A "Notice to Contractors" Legal was called for preparation of receiving bids on the next regular meeting date of June 1st for the laying of 625 feet of drain tile on East Harrison Street Further specifications on file in the Clerk's office.

Quite a lengthy discussion followed in concern of the re-vamping of the Police Department. Roy Rushing made mention that no action had been taken for the appointing or re-appointing of two Marshals as the old appointments ended as of the 1st day of May, 1954 as stated in the April 6th meeting. These mentioned appointments have no concern of the recent appointment of William Taylor and Harold Kenworthy at the Special Called Meeting of April 28th. It was moved by Gregory and seconded by Shepherd that Mr. Leonard Horton and Forest Rusie be re-appointed to serve as Town Marshals to serve during the pleasure of the said Board of Trustees. All Marshals to serve at a remuneration of \$225.00 each. This motion carried unanimously. The Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to have the bonds attended to in reference to the Marshals. Mention was made too of the "Swing-Shift" to begin on the 15th of May and occurring at 6-Week intervals, with the lay-out being made by the Marshals.

The Treasurer's report, as read, showed a balance of all funds to be \$35771.50. It was moved by Rushing and seconded by Allison that the Treasurer's report be acceptable as read. This motion carried.

H. V. Johnson appeared before the Board on behalf of a number of citizens on West High St. in regards to a house trailer owned by Mr. Howard Rairdon that has been placed on a lot that has been purchased by a Mr. Hankins from Mr. W.O. Mills and adjacent to several property owners on W. High St. A lengthy discussion was held in that the property owners objected to a house trailer or trailers being placed on lots in the residential section. A discussion was held in regards to sewer connections for said trailer. The Board pointed out that as long as Mr. Rairdon abides with the Town Ordinance regarding the location of trailers in the limits of the Town, he was within his rights to go ahead and locate on said lot. The clerk-treasurer was instructed to call in two special police badges now in possession of Mr. Hilt and Mr. Chowning.

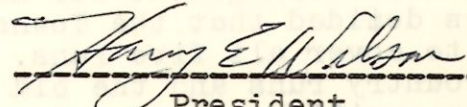

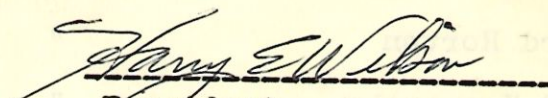

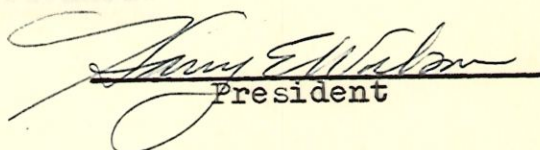

Next, some claims that had come in since the last regular meeting, were presented for reading and consideration of payment of each.

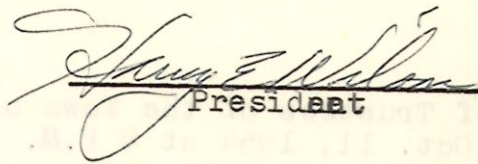

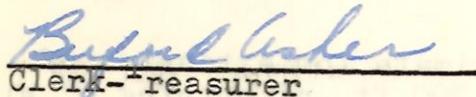

Next the claims were presented for reading and consideration of payment of each. Gregory moved and Rushing seconded that the claims be acceptable as read and warrants drawn for them.

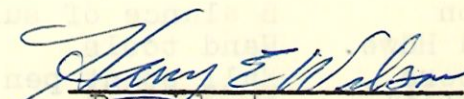

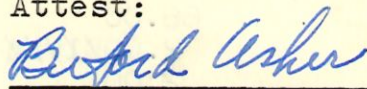
