

In case the State Board does order pollution of the streams discontinued, a reasonable length of time will be given to remedy this situation. He suggested the Town enforce the law governing the connection of down spouts to the sanitary sewer by police action. This would remedy the flooding of base ments to some extent.

Mr. H.D.Coleman appeared before the Board and ontroduced Mr, A.H.Lusty and Mr.W.R.Gentry.Mr. Lusty as President of the Mooresville Development Corporation told the Trustees that they had purchased the tract of land north and east of Mooresville known as the Wheeler land. They asked that the Town give them the assurance that they will annex this land when it is properly developed.Mr. Gentry who is the contractor explained their plans. The plot will be laid out in lots.streets finished, sidewalks in landscaped, houses finished and every thing approved by F.H.A. before the Town will be expected to annex it. He also said it is their plan to put in their own sewer system to connect with the Town'S main line. With this understanding the Tristes, Gibbs and Einfeldt seconded that the Town consider and approve this annexation when the Corporation has completed their proposed plan and presented them for approval. Motion carried.

Mr.Chas Lee of Dual Parking Meters was called to speak next. He proposed the purchase of a coin counter and sorter by the which a considerable length of time could be saved in handling the parking meter money. He also brought the Board up to date on the installation of meters etc. He was told the Board would take the matter under consideration and would contact him later.

After a report on conditions of streets coming under jurisdiction of the State Highway, the Clerk Treasurer was instructed to write the Highway Department asking their cooperation.

Mrs. Walter Thompson was present to hear the decision about the alley south of her house. Mr. O'Briem explained to her that the records show it to be an a public way, therefore belonging to the Town.

Mr. Flarence Gregory appeared to speak against the Junk yard near his home: Mr. Clarence Squires also spoke about this. An ordinance was preduced showing the keeping of a junk yard to be against the law of the Town. This was adopted in 1941 and the records will be examined to see if t is has been repealed. Mr. Asbury reported having talked to the owners and they had said they were going to eventually use the building for their cars instead of the lot.

Mr. William Cox was present as a visitor and introduced Mr. Todd, the General Manager of the Public Service Co.

Mr. Hite and Mr. Williams were present to speak of the condition of Maple Lane. Trustee Einfeldt reported they had investigated and promised work on it as soon as possible.

A letter from Mr.Berkey of B & K Hardware Co.was read requesting the moving of one meter from in foont of his place of business. The Clerk-Treas was instructed to write him granting his request providing he does not interfere in any way with the parking of cars or at any time ask a car to move.

Mr. Dewey Coleman appeared regarding some posts which Harlan Ozment had set which he thought was on Town property but which Mr. Ozment claims is on his ground. He was advised to find out for sure which was right.

Fire +heif Monday explained a letter from the rating Bureau. He stated they had part of the needed equipment for the Fire Department. He also provided that the Kroger Manager had built fires against regulations. A letter was ordered sent to the main office advising them of this.

The unsightly cluttering of the rest rooms by the Publicwas noted and it was decided to lock the door and leave a sign on the door telling them to call for the key in office.

Chas. Nelson was present and asked the Board to consider turning the meters off at six o'clock on Saturday night. He was speaking for the C ofC. The Board that if the meters were shut offf they would be used in such a way that it would not benefit the public in shopping. When the stores close at six the meters will be shut off.

Mr. Nelson asked if there was any way the Chamber could help. Mr. Hawkins suggested they might consider the needs of a modern building at the Town Park.

The need for a hoist for the Town truck was brought tont the attantion of the group. Since there is no fund available at this time for it Mr. House or some like shop will be contacted to see if they will wait for their money until an additional appropriation can be requested.

After a discussion of the sewer conditions Asbury moved and Roberson seconded that Einfeldt contact H B Monday and Sam Wade to see if they will act as sewer inspectors.

Mr. Hawkins asked the group to bring names to the next meeting to be considered for appointment to the School Board.






The application of Chas, Hinshaw, to serve as extra policeman was presented and approved.


