The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooreville met in regular session on January 2, 1945 with all members present. Attorney Butler Butler was also present.

A Certificate of Appointment was presented Mr. C. B. Comer, the incoming Trustee of the Second Ward which was signed and the Clerk-Treasurer administered the Oath of Office to Mr. Comer.

Minutes of the meetings of the 5th of December and continued session of December 27th were read and approved as corrected.

A report from the various committees of their activity during the past year and their financial status were given.

President Jessup declared the meeting open for re-organization for the coming year of 1945 and appointed the Clerk-Treasurer as temporary chairman of the meeting.

Clerk-Treasurer declared the meeting open for nomination of chairman the meeting.

Moved by Fields and seconded by Comer that Mr. Quillen take the chair. Motion carried.

Chairman declared the meeting open for nomination for President of the Board of Trustees for the year 1945.

Fields placed the name of Leland Jessup in nomination for President. Seconded by Ulrey. Moved by Comer and seconded by Ulrey that nominations be closed. Motion carried.

As there were no other nominations, the Chairman declared Mr. Jessup to be elected by acclamation.

President Jessup took the chair, and reappointed the following committees with the exception of Mr. Comer to fill Lawrence's chair.

Fields moved that the name of Gilbert Butler be retained as the Town Attorney to serve through the year 1945. Quillen seconded, and motion was carried.

It was moved that nominations be in order for Town Marshal. It was moved by Ulrey and seconded by Fields that Clarence Rariden be duly appointed Marshall to the Town of Mooreville, Indiana to serve during the pleasure of the Board of Trustees of said Town. Motion carried. Remuneration as of present salary. *This includes gasoline to conduct street work as Comm.*

It was moved by Quillen and seconded by Comer that Leonard Horton be duly appointed Deputy Marshall to the Town of Mooreville, Indiana to serve during the pleasure of the Board of said Town. Motion carried. It was agreed by the Board at this time to increase the pay of Deputy Marshal by \$10.00 per month, beginning the month of January.

It was moved by Fields and seconded by Ulrey that Earl Morgan be appointed Sexton of the Cemetery for the year 1945. The motion carried. It was moved by Ulrey and seconded by Fields that Earl be given an increase of 10¢ per hour in his wage and a guarantee of \$50.00 per month.

It was moved by Fields and seconded by Comer that Bracy Burton be reappointed as Fire Chief of the Mooreville Fire Department for year 1945. Motion carried.

It was moved by Ulrey and seconded that Fields that all claims be allowed and paid as read. Motion carried.

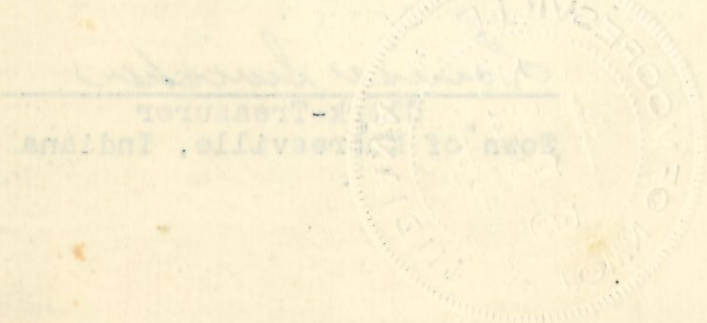

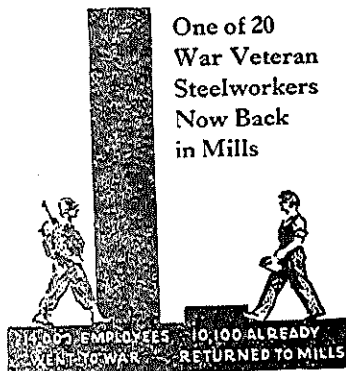

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooreville, Indiana met in regular session, February 6, 1945, 7:30 P.M. with all members and the Attorney present.

The minutes of the meeting of January 2, 1945 were read and approved as read.

Moved by Ulrey and seconded by Fields that Treasurer's report be accepted. Motion carried.

A communication from H. D. Coleman offering to pay half his bill for advertising at "Old Settler's Picnic" was read and rejected by the Board by unanimous vote. Mr. Gilbert Butler appointed to contact Mr. Coleman in regards to settlement of his bill of \$30.00.

Fields, of the street committee, reports a program planned in early Spring by the Pennsylvania Railroad Company to repair 4 crossings in the Town of Mooreville, which are in very poor condition at this time.

Announcement of a Board of Finances Meeting of Morgan County in the Auditor's Office on February 14, 1945 at 10 O'Clock was made. President Fields of the Board of Finance of the Town of Mooreville, to report at this meeting.

A discussion followed on the necessary repairs to be made to the Municipal Building to garage the new fire truck.

An Ordinance entitled "Ordinance for the Transfer of Funds from the Contingencies Fund to Municipal Building Repair Due to an Existing Emergency" was given second reading.

Moved by Quillen and seconded by Comer that the Ordinance be placed upon its passage. Motion carried.

Moved by Ulrey and seconded by Fields that the Ordinance be adopted. Motion carried.

Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to transfer the Cemetery lot 38, in Block 8 in the Mooreville, Cemetery in the name of Jack Thompson to Mr. O. C. Thompson.

Different outlets for sewer overflows was the subject for discussion which followed.

Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to write to the Office of the State Fire Marshall in regards to a building at the corner of Indiana and Harrison Streets which is unoccupied and in very poor repair which endangers the business sections of Mooreville.

Moved by Ulrey and seconded by Fields that all claims be allowed as read, except the claim of Darley & Co. and Spangles D-X Station, which be paid in half only; the remainder to be assumed by the Trustee of Brown Township as per contract. Motion carried.

A discussion of relief for surplus water in the sewage system followed.

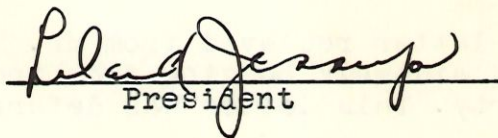
Marshal Rariden was requested to inquire of Harry Wilson as to storage for the fire truck.

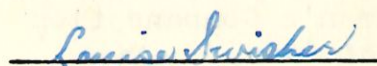

The minutes of the meeting of March 6, 1945 were read and approved as read.

Moved by Ulrey and seconded by Fields that Treasurer's report be accepted. Motion carried.

A letter recieved by the Board from Mr. Bracy Burton stated that he wished to resign as Chief of the Mooreville Fire Department owing to a newly purchased business which required the greater part of his time. Moved by Ulrey and seconded by Quillen that the Board of Trustees accept Burton's resignation as Chief. Roll Call- Ulrey, Aye, Quillen, Aye, Comer-Aye, and Fields-Aye. Three copies of the contract were passed for signatures of each member of each Board. Discussion on different items concerning the truck followed.

William Anderson gave a report on the Town sewers and surface water disposal.

Mr. Kenneth Dorsett from Mooreville P ublic Service presented the proposal that to erect a fire hydrant at the corner of Bridge Street and State Road 67, which was so badly needed for the adequate protection for the new factories in that vicinity, his company would assume the cost of erecting the hydrant and the factories favored agreed to pay the rent on the above until January 1946 and after this time the Town of Mooreville to continue the rent. This proposal unanimously met with the approval of the Board. Moved by Ulrey and seconded by Fields the Clerk-Treasurer be instructed to write a letter to the Mooreville P ublic Service confirming the above agreements for our records. Motion carried.

A letter recieved from Mr. Harold Copeland complained of a condition of the sidewalk bulging from tree roots which grew in the front of his property. This letter was deferred for investigation of the situation.

A lengthy discussion followed on the Insurance and compensation of Town Employees and Firemen. Moved by Ulrey and seconded by Comer that the "Volunteer Firemen Policy" from Ridgeway and the Workman's Compensation as outlined by Hadley and Cook be purchased. Motion carried.

Fields reports of a communication from the Allied Bituminous Products Co. and their representative inspecting most of the streets in Town to give an estimate on the amount of work needed to be done to put them in good repair.

Moved by Ulrey and seconded by Quillen that the Town of Mooreville advertise for Bids for drainage Improvements and Street Repair, this month. Motion carried.

Attach to each copy of this application a map of the area governed by the applicant, folded to 8½"x11", and indicate thereon the relationship between the present and proposed facilities.

If the space allotted on the face of the form is not sufficient or if the applicant desires to submit information in addition to that requested, attach 8½" x 11" sheets to each copy of the application and list answers in the same order and identify by the same item number as on the face of this form.

Item 1—It is desirable but not mandatory that the description should include the following type of information and that such information be accompanied by sketches of the proposed project. **Roads, streets, bridges and grade separations:** width of shoulders, width of surfacing, type and thickness of proposed road or street; type, length, width between curbs, and special features of proposed structures; **Buildings:** capacity, number and general use of rooms, number of floors, approximate overall dimensions of the building, and type of construction; **Water supply systems:** population, number of homes, and area in acres to be served, proposed source of supply, approximate length in feet of proposed system, is project an extension of existing system; **Sewerage and drainage systems:** population, number of homes, and area in acres to be served, whether project is for sanitary, storm, or combined sewers or drainage, how and where the effluents will be disposed of, and approximate length in feet of proposed system; etc.

Ordinance No. 4

ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF MOORESVILLE, INDIANA REGULATING TRAFFIC

Section I. Whereas by reason of traffic conditions and for the purpose of providing for community safety and in order to assure ample passageway for municipal fire fighting equipment, the parking of vehicles along and on certain of the public streets of the Town of Mooresville is hereinafter prohibited.

Section II. From and after the effective date of this ordinance it shall be unlawful to park automobiles or vehicles of any kind along and on the North side of East Washington Street within the town of Mooresville from a point of 100 feet West of the bridge over Goose Creek to a point where said East Washington Street intersects State Highway No. 67 in the town of Mooresville, Indiana.

Section III. The Peace Officers, Town Marshal and other law enforcement agencies are hereby required and directed to enforce and regulate the parking of vehicles as heretofore described in the preceding sections of this ordinance.

Section IV. All Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict with this ordinance will hereby be repealed.

Section V. Any person convicted of a violation of this ordinance shall be fined in a sum of not less than \$1.00 nor more than \$10.00 together with the costs of the proceedings.

Section VI. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effective after its passage, adoption and publication.

The money in the sum of \$5000.00 to be borrowed from the State of Indiana will become an obligation of the Town of Mooresville to be repaid in five years by either placing a lien upon property owners profiting from the proposed improvements or by being financed by Revenue Bonds. Ordinance No. 6, making proper obligations to secure and repay this loan from the State Government will be drawn up and presented at the next meeting, unless otherwise stated.

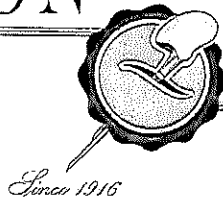

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooreville, Indiana met in continued session on the 27th day of December, 1946 in the Municipal Building with all members present. This meeting was for the general purpose of closing the Town's business for the year 1946.

The order of the meeting was reversed with unanimous consent, and at this time the claims were read. Moved by Jessup and seconded by Comer that all claims be allowed as read and warrants drawn on the treasury for same with the exception of a bill for \$5.00 submitted by Oscar Couch for the continuation of the property custodian bond of Bracy Burton. The only articles which the Town of Mooreville has in its possession belonging to the U.S. Government are 5 gas masks and the Clerk-Treas. was instructed at this time to write the Chief O.C.D. Property Officer at Cincinnati asking a release for the Town on these items, thus relieving the need for a Custodian Bond. Claims read and allowed were:

Claim No. 1191 was allowed for the sum of \$2000.00 to Allied Bituminous Products Co. to be applied to the bill made in 1945 by a motion made by Ulrey and seconded by Fields. Examination of the records of the Street department rendered this decision. This leaves a debt of \$2330.68 remaining yet to the Allied Bituminous Products Co. Clerk-Treas. was instructed to issue a letter of Thanks to this Company for their holiday remembrance.

In concern of claim No. 1188 to Sam Sellars for gravel and street repair work; most of this claim arose from damage done to the Town streets by the Mooreville Public Service Company. Moved by Jessup and seconded by Comer that the Public Service be billed for their share of this bill. The Clerk-Treasurer was instructed thus.

Clarence Rariden, Firechief reported that with the occurrence of a fire at the Sanitary Container Corp. during the past month, it required 7 minutes for the Telephone Company to notify him of the fire call, and after the Fire Department reached the scene there was no water pressure to fight the fire. Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to issue letters to the State

Marshal, Mooresville Public Service Co. and the Greenwood Office of the Telephone Company telling them of these conditions.

The Board of Trustees said that they had met and selected a site for the fire whistle and the Clerk-Treas. was to so inform the Mooresville Public Service Company since they had made their agreement to help erect the whistle. ~~Marshal Rariden~~ ^{Pres. Quillen} stated that Mr. Mull, Gen. Manager of the Telephone Company said the Company would resume the responsibility of blowing the whistle for a fire call.

At this time Marshals Rariden and Horton made their yearly report. Arrests included 53 for Public Intoxication, 42 Traffic Violations, 10 Drunken Driving, 7 Convictions there and 3 pending; 17 arrests for Stealing, 1 for Concealed Weapons, 2 for Forgery and 1 life was saved from drowning after his auto had overturned in a nearby creek.

Fields of the Street Committee reported the patching done on the streets during the past month to be very satisfactory.

There being no additional business it was moved by Comer and seconded by Fields that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.

The minutes of the meetings of December 3rd and 27th were read and approved as read.

The Treasurer's report being read giving the proper balances as of December 31, 1946, a motion was made for acceptance, with a second by Fields. Motion carried.

Reports of the various committees of their activity during the past year were given. Inventories of Town properties were reported from Earl Morgan, Cemetery Sexton, and Clarence Rariden, Marshal, St. Commissioner, and Fire Chief. Reports will be found in the following pages.

President Quillen declared the meeting open for re-organization for the year 1947 and appointed the Clerk-Treasurer as temporary chairman of the meeting.

Clerk-Treasurer declared the meeting open for the nomination of chairman of the meeting.

It was moved by Comer and seconded by Fields that Mr. Ulrey take the chair. Motion carried.

Chairman Ulrey declared the meeting open for the nomination for President of the Board of Trustees for the year 1947.

Fields placed the name of Leland A. Jessup in nomination for Pres. Mr. Jessup placed the name of Ray Ulrey in the same position. Quillen seconded these motions and moved the nominations be closed with a second by Fields.
