A letter recieved by the Board from Mr. Bracy Burton stated that he wished to resign as Chief of the Mooresville Fire Department owing to a newly purchased business which required the greater part of his time. Moved by Ulrey and seconded by Quillen that the Board of Trustees accept Burton's resignation as Chief. Roll Call- Ulrey, Aye, Quillen, Aye, Comer-Aye, and Fields-Aye. President Jessup stated that Mr. Burton would however remain as Property Officer for the equipment until a later date.

It was moved by Ulrey that the name of Marshal Rariden be placed in nomination as Fire Chief with the name of Leonard Horton as the Assistant Chief. Seconded by Fields.

Moved by Ulrey and seconded by Fields that the nomination be closed, Motion carried. As there was no other nomination, President Jessup declared Clarence Rariden as Chief, and Leonard Horton as Ass't Chief appointed to the above offices by acclamation.

On the approval of the Board of Trustees, Elvin Allen and Ezra Fleener were named as Maintainance Supervisors of the Fire Fighting Equipment. The matter of Appointment of Captains for the Day and Night Firemen was deferred for the time being.

A revised contract concerning the Mooresville and Brown Township Fire Truck and the regulation thereof was presented at this time and met with the satisfaction of the Board and also the Advisory Board Members of Brown Township and Trustee Flater who were present at the meeting. Three copies of the contract were passed for signatures of each member of each Board. Discussion on different items concerning the truck followed.

William Anderson gave a report on the Town sewers and surface water disposal.

Mr. Kenneth Dorsett from Mooresville P ublic Service presented the proposal that to erect a fire hydrant at the corner of Bridge Street and State Road 67, which was so badly needed for the adequate protection for the new factories in that vicinity, his company would assume the cost of erecting the hydrant and the factories favored agreed to pay the rent on the above until January 1946 and after this time the Town of Mooresville to continue the rent. This proposal unanimously met with the approval of the Board. Moved by Ulrey and seconded by Fields the Clerk-Treasurer be instructed to write a letter to the Mooresville P ublic Service confirming the above agreements for our records. Motion carried.

A letter recieved from Mr. Harold Copeland complained of a condition of the sidewalk bulging from tree roots which grew in the front of his property. This letter was deferred for investigation of the situation.

President Jessup announced an F. B. I. Meeting to be held at Blooming-ton on April 4th.

A lengthy discussion followed on the Insurance and compensation of Town Employees and Firemen. Moved by Ulrey and seconded by Comer that the "Volunteer Firemen Policy" from Ridgeway and the Workman's Compensation as outlined by Hadley and Cook be purchased. Motion carried.

Fields reports of a communication from the Allied Bituminous Products Co. and their representative inspecting most of the streets in Town to give an estimate on the amount of work needed to be done to put them in good repair.

Moved by Ulrey and seconded by Quillen that the Town of Mooresville advertise for Bids for drainage Improvements and Street Repair, this month. Motion carried.

INSTRUCTIONS TO APPLICANTS

THAN A PUBLIC CONSTRUCTION PLANMING PROSEA

Definitions:

Applicant—the governing body of the county, city, town, township or school city, town or township making application for a state loan under the provisions of this act.

Planning Documents—the surveys, plans, specifications and cost and material estimates for the project.

Application—the Preliminary Application Form, IEC-3, properly executed by the applicant together with whatever appended sheets of information are necessary to describe the project.

Authorized Representative—the individual authorized by organic or municipal law or resolution to represent the applicant, the reviewing agency or the State.

Attach to each copy of this application a map of the area governed by the applicant, folded to $8\frac{1}{2}$ "x11", and indicate thereon the relationship between the present and proposed facilities. If the space allotted on the face of the form is not sufficient or if the applicant desires to submit information in addition to that requested, attach $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x 11" sheets to each copy of the application and list answers in the same order and identify by the same item number as on the face of this form.

Item 1—It is desirable but not mandatory that the description should include the following type of information and that such information be accompanied by sketches of the proposed project. Roads, streets, bridges and grade separations: width of shoulders, width of surfacing, type and thickness of proposed road or street; type, length, width between curbs, and special features of proposed structures; Buildings: capacity, number and general use of rooms, number of floors, approximate overall dimensions of the building, and type of construction; Water supply systems: population, number of homes, and area in acres to be served, proposed source of supply, approximate length in feet of proposed system, is project an extension of existing system; Sewerage and drainage systems: population, number of homes, and area in acres to be served, whether project is for sanitary, storm, or combined sewers or drainage, how and where the affluents will be disposed of, and approximate length in feet of proposed system; etc.

Item 2—The explanation of the necessity for the project and its relationship to the promotion of public improvement, health and safety should include the following types of information: Roads, streets, bridges and grade separations: width of surface, type and condition of existing road or street; type, length, width between curbs and condition of any structure over 20 feet that is to be replaced; any special or unusual conditions; traffic estimates if actual count is not available; Building and other projects: trends in population and use, facts about age, fire risk, danger to health or life, overcrowding and physical conditions or present facilities, etc.

Item 3—List the other participating governing bodies, if the application is for a joint project and any other bodies, authorities or agencies, if the application is being made for projects with which such bodies and authorities are specifically concerned.

Item 4—Although loans are specifically restricted to the governing bodies of the units of government named in the Act, the Indiana Economic Council desires that where specific agencies within the eligible unit exist, the names of the agencies approving the project be listed. When units of government are within the jurisdiction of planning commissions established under the laws of Indiana, applications should be reviewed by them.

Item 5a—Check the statement which most accurately represents the status of the planning documents.

Item 5b—State the time in months required to complete the planning documents, after formal notification that the application for loan is approved.

Item 5c—When the estimated costs for preparing the surveys or the estimates exceed the amount which is normally a part of the professional services furnished by the architect or engineer in preparing plans and specifications for a specific project, such costs should be shown separately under "surveys" or "estimates." Under no consideration should costs accrued prior to March 3, 1945, be included in any of the amounts under Item 5c.

Item 6a-Check the expected method of having the work done.

Item 6b—If the work is to be done by contract, insert the name and address of engineer or architect to be employed.

Item 7-The amount of the loan cannot exceed the sum of the items in 5c above.

Item 8—Insert the amount of outstanding indebtedness of the applicant and the amount of the applicant's statutory debt limit.

Item 9a—Describe briefly if the acquisition of the land or right-of-way will delay construction because of condemnation proceedings or other unusual circumstances.

Item 9b—Construction costs shall be estimated by using the average costs for 1940, as established by the local building or construction industries, plus the percent of increase in the average cost indexes for such industries for 1944 over 1940, as established by the Engineering News-Record. Estimate the time required for the normal construction of the project, assuming that the required labor (40 hours/week), material and equipment are available.

Item 9c—If it is not feasible to locally finance the construction of the project, briefly outline the restricting circumstances.

The money in the sum of \$5000.00 to be borrowed from the State of Indiana will become an obligation of the Town of Mooresville to be repaid in five years by either placing a lien upon property owners profiting from the proposed improvements or by being financed by Revenue Bonds. Ordinance No. 6, making proper obligations to secure and repay this lean from the State Government will be drawn up and presented at the next meeting, unless otherwise stated.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, Indiana met in continued session on the 27th day of December, 1946 in the Municipal Building with all members present. This meeting was for the general purpose of closing the Town's business for the year 1946.

The order of the meeting was reversed with unanimous consent, and at this time the claims were read. Moved by Jessup and seconded by Comer that all claims be allowed as read and warrants drawn on the treasury for sam e with the exception of a bill for \$5.00 submitted by Oscar Couch for the continuation of the property custodian Bond of Bracy Burton. The only articles which the Town of Mooresville has in its possession belonging to the U.S. Government are 5 gas masks and the Clerk-Treas. was instructed at this time to write the Chief O.C.D. Property Officer at Cincinnati asking a release for the Town on these items, thus relieving the need for a Custodian Bond. Claim No.1191 was allowed for the sum of \$2000.00 to Allied Bituminous Products Co. to be applied to the bill made in 1945 by a motion made by Ulrey and seconded by Fields. Examination of the records of the Street department rendered this decision. This leaves a debt of \$2330.68 remaing yet to the Allied Bituminous Products Co: Clerk-Treas. was instructed to issue a letter of Chanks to this Company for their holiday remembrance.

In concern of claim No. 1188 to Sam Sellars for gravel and street repair work; most of this claim arose from damage done to the Town streets by the Mooresville Public Service Company. Moved by Jessup and seconded by Comer that the Public Service be billed for their share of this bill. The Clerk-Treasurer was instructed thus.

Clarence Rariden, Firechief reported that with the occurrence of a fire at the Sanitary Container Corp. during the past month, it required 7 minutes for the Telephone Company to notify him of the fire call, and after the Fire Department reached the scene their was no water pressure to fight the fire. Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to issue letters to the State

Marshal, Mooresville Public Service Co. and the Greenwood Office of the Telephone Company telling them of these conditions.

The Board of Trustees said that they had met and selected a site for the fire whistle and the Clerk-Treas. was to so inform the Mooresville Public Service Company, since they had made their agreement yo help erect the whistle. Harstell Rariden stated that Mr. Mull, Gen. Mamager of the Telephone Company said the Company would resume the responsibility of blowing the whistle for a fire call.

At this time Marshals Rariden and Horton made their yearly report. Arrests included 53 for Public Intoxication, 42 Traffic Violations, 10 Drunken Driving, 7 Convictions there and 3 pending; 17 arrests for Stealing, 1 for Concealed Weapons, 2 for Forgery and 1 life was saved from drowning after his auto had overturned in a nearby creek.

Fields of the Street Committee reported the patching done on the streets during the past month to be very satisfactory,

There being no additional business it was moved by Comer and seconded by Fields that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.

Clerk-Treasurer declared the meeting open for the nomination of chairman of the meeting.

It was moved by Comer and seconded by Fields that Mr. Ulrey take the chair. Motion carried.

Chairman Ulrey declared the meeting open for the nomination for President of the Board of Trustees for the year 1947.

Fields placed the name of Leland A. Jessup in nomination for Pres. Mr. Jessup placed the name of Ray Ulrey in the same position. Quillen seconded these motions and moved the nominations be closed with a second by Fields.
