The Minutes of the meetings of the 4th of December and the continued session of December 27th were read and approved as read.

Reports of the various committees of their activity during the past year and their financial status were given.

President Jessup declared the meeting open for re-organization for the coming year of 1946 and appointed the Clerk-Treasurer as temporary chairman of the meeting.

Clerk-Treasurer declared the meeting open for the nomination of chairman of the meeting.

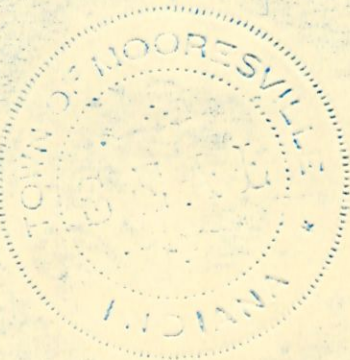

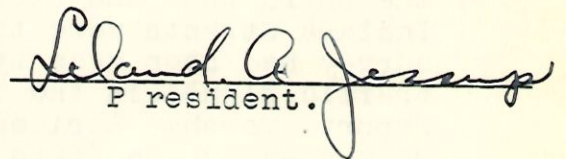

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, Indiana met in regular session in the Municipal Building on the 5th of February, 1946, 7:30 P.M. with all members present with the exception of Mr. Comer. Attorney Butler was present at this meeting.

The minutes of the meeting of January 1st and 8th were read and approved as read.

Moved by Ulrey and seconded by Fields that the Treasurer's report be accepted as read. Motion carried.

A communication from the State Highway Department was read informing the Board that the stop and go signs at the intersection of Main and Indiana Streets were to be discontinued. The Department stated a survey had been made by their representatives as to the need of a traffic signal in the Town and these representatives gave a negative report. Marshal Rariden was informed to mask the signal posts as requested by the State Highway Commission.

The State Board of Health in connection with our plans for Post war Sewer Survey informed the Board by letter of the availability soon of Federal funds to promote the construction of sewers and sanitary works and suggested the Board inquire of the Federal Works Agency the opportunity offered for borrowing of this loaning fund. The Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to write a letter to the Federal Works Agency in concern of the above matter.

A letter was recieved from Mr. F. E. Gooding of Gooding Amusement Company stating the Company would like to serve the rides at the Old Settler's Picnic to be held in the Town Park this year. The Park Board recommended that the Clerk-Treasurer answer the letter of Mr. Gooding's stating that the old contract used in former years would not be acceptable but a new contract calling for a rate of \$200.00 for ride priveleges and the Company assuming their own electricity bill would be acceptable by the Board. This recommendation was made in the form of a motion, seconded and carried unanimously by the entire Board.

Fields of the Street Committee reported the Street in the front of Russell Long's to be in very poor condition from the break-through of

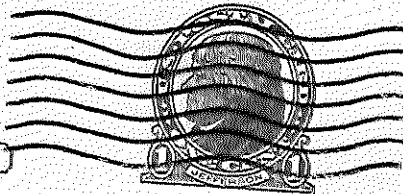

a sewer belonging to the Mooresville Public Service Company. He stated also that several sidewalks about Town were in need of repair in addition to the work already done by the Street Department.

The proposal submitted by the Russell B. Moore Engineering Company to the Board of Trustees for the purpose of sewer survey for a new sanitary system in Mo oresville was brought before the Board for discussion. It was decided that Attorney Butler should examine the proposal and make suggestions or recommendations on it and the Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to write Mr. Mark B. Owen of the R. B. Moore Co. inviting him to a meeting with the Planning Committee for discussion of items contained in the proposal.

O. Mills, owner of the ~~area~~ ^{area} in question and the suggestion met with very favorable approval by Board Members with their statement being that legal steps would be taken in the near future to complete Mr. Mill's plans. Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to inform Mr. Mills of the Board's action on his suggestion.

March 5, 1946

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooreville, Indiana met in regular session on the 5th of March, 1946 at 7:30 P.M. in the Municipal Building with all members and the Attorney present. Several citizens in the interests of the post-war sewer survey of the Town were also present.

The minutes of the meeting of February 5th were read and approved as corrected. The correction in the minutes concerned the exact whereabouts of a new proposed street submitted in drawing by Mr. W. O. Mills at the February 5th meeting.

The Treasurer's report was read and it was moved by Fields and seconded by Comer that the report be accepted as read. Motion carried.

The Clerk-Treasurer read a letter of resignation, recieved from President Jessup, Trustee of the Fourth Ward, in which he stated that the duties of the President of the Board of Trustees had become so numerous that he did not have enough time to give the office the proper attention it required. He therefore asked an immediate resignation as President, but would still serve the Board from the fourth ward.

It was moved by Comer and seconded by Fields that the said resignation be accepted. Motion carried.

Moved by Fields and seconded by Comer that the Clerk- Treasurer be appointed temporary Chairman. Motion carried.

Clerk-Treasurer declared nomination in order to appoint a President of the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooreville, Indiana.

Moved by Ulrey and seconded by Comer that the Name of F. M. Quillen, Trustee of the First Ward, be placed in nomination as President of the Board. Motion carried.

Moved by Fields and seconded by Ulrey that the nomination be closed. Motion carried. As there was no other nomination, Clerk-Treasurer declared F. M. Quillen appointed as President of the Board of Trustees by acclamation.

Mr. Quillen then takes the chair.

A letter from the State Highway Commission was read stating they would place road stop signs for the intersection of the main part of Town, but they didn't think it necessary to resume the operating of the stop signals. They stated that another check would be made by the ~~the~~ department on our traffic conditions. A lengthy discussion followed the reading of this letter. The Board feel that the traffic lights should be in operation, and that the State Highway Department has not made a thorough enough check of our Town.

The citizens present, interested in a new sewer were from North Indiana Street. No definite answer was made of their question as to when a sewer might be placed along this street. The Post-war Planning Council of the Town and the Town Board are meeting with the Mr. Mark B. Owen of the R. B. Moore Co. to complete plans for the extension of various sewer lines, and the improving of old lines, but no definite plans are available at this time.

Raymond Kennedy and Michael Forrester were present in regards to the tearing down of the board fence around the old Ball Park. The Board stated that much of the fence had gone to ruins beyond repair and had been carried away without any permission whatever from anyone and in the future should the Board of Trustees find sale for the fence, the proceeds to be made to an organized and accepted Board of Ball Players. This action was of the approval of the entire Board of Trustees.

Reports were made by Chairmans of various committees. Fields of the Street Committee stated that plans should be started immediately for the patching of the streets which had become in poor condition during the winter months. President Quillen instructed Rariden, Street Commissioner to begin as soon as possible the work of patching the streets.

Mr. Comer of the Cemetery placed a suggestion of tiling a ditch in the Cemetery which could then be filled and the sale of lots be made thereof. The Board found this suggestion as being very favorable and the cemetery was to be inspected to see about the possibility of carrying out Mr. Comer's plan.

In concern of the Park Committee, a letter was read from the F. E. Gooding amusement Co. stating they thought the doubling of the contract for the privilege of placing rides at Old Settlers was too high, but they would assume a bill of \$25.00 and pay a privilege of \$175.00 for the rides. The Board of Trustees vetoed this proposal since they stated the ride privilege must be \$200.00 and the entire bill of electricity be assumed by the amusement company. The Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to write Mr. Gooding of this action of the Board.

From the Committee on Sewers came the plan for a called meeting with the Post war Planning Council and Mr. Mark B. Owens of the R. B. Moore Co. for the 12th of March at 8.00 P. M. in the Municipal Building. This meeting called for the purpose of accepting and signing the contract for field work of the sewer line in Mooresville, by the Russell B. Moore Co. The Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to notify the Secretary of the Planning Council, Mr. Friday Harvey, of this called meeting, Mr. Mark B. Owen, and the Board Members.

It was moved by Fields and seconded by Ulrey that the Claims be read. Upon reading of the claims it was moved by Jessup and seconded by Ulrey that the bill from the C. A. Vestal Garage not be allowed due to no appropriated fund for same and the bill for a country fire call placed by Ezra Fleener, Alden Beall, E. A. Allen, not be allowed since the obligations for paying a Township fire call rested with the Trustee of Brown Township. All other claims were allowed as read., with one exception. an order for payment for gasoline for the Town and Township fire truck by Burton's D-X Station was allowed in half since the bills for upkeep of the said truck are to be assumed jointly. Claims read are:

CONTRACT FOR ENGINEERING SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT, made this 19th day of March, 1946, between the Town of Mooresville, Indiana, acting by and through its Board of Trustees, hereinafter called the Town, and R. B. Moore, G. E. Hines and M. B. Owen, partners doing business as Russell B. Moore Company, of Indianapolis, Indiana, consulting engineers, hereinafter called the Engineers, WITNESSES THAT:

WHEREAS, the Town now desires to plan and prepare for the construction and installation of certain public works and improvements, including a system of sewers and a sewage treatment plant and street and drainage improvements, and

WHEREAS, the Town desires to employ the engineering services required in the making of the surveys, investigations, plans, specifications and estimates needed in order to enable it to proceed with such projects, and

WHEREAS, the Engineers are qualified and prepared to perform the services needed by the Town in such projects and are willing to undertake the performance of such services upon the terms and conditions herein stated, to all of which the parties hereto agree:

THEREFORE, It is agreed by and between the parties that the Town shall employ, and hereby does employ, the Engineers to perform the professional work and services specified herein and agrees to pay for such services the amounts determined as herein provided.

The services of the Engineers under this contract shall be:

1. The Engineers shall make all field surveys, investigations and studies necessary to lay out and design the proposed sewerage system and other improvements directed by the Town.
2. (a) The Engineers shall prepare plans, specifications and estimates of costs of all sewers and plant facilities, including facilities for garbage disposal if so directed by the Town, needed to provide proper sani-

tation facilities for the Town. All such plans and specifications shall be submitted to the Town for approval and shall be submitted to the proper State Agency for approval by said Agency. Six (6) complete sets of the approved plans and specifications will be delivered to the Town.

(b) The Engineers shall prepare plans, specifications and estimates of cost of all other public works and improvements, including street and drainage improvements, as directed by the Town. All such plans and specifications shall be submitted to the Town for approval and shall be submitted to the State Agency, if any, whose approval of such plans may be required. Six complete sets of the approved plans and specifications will be delivered to the Town.

3. The Engineers shall assist the Town in the preparation of ordinances affecting or regulating the collection of storm and sanitary sewage and the collection and disposal of garbage.

4. The Engineers shall advise with the Town for the purpose of determining the most advantageous method of financing the construction of each of said projects and facilities.

In return for the services so to be performed by the Engineers, the Town agrees to pay to the Engineers sums equal to 3-3/4% of the estimated cost of the project or facilities to which the services so performed relate. Payment of the amount so to be paid by the Town to the Engineers shall be made within sixty (60) days after delivery to the Town of the approved plans and specifications of the project or facilities to which the services then being compensated relate.

The Town further agrees to reimburse the Engineers for the actual expense incurred by the Engineers in any travel outside the State of Indiana relating to any such project or facility and undertaken with the consent and

approval of the Town.

By its execution of this agreement, the Town covenants that all conditions precedent to its right and capacity to execute and perform this agreement have been discharged and that sufficient funds for the payment of the fees payable to the Engineers hereunder have, by appropriate action of the Town, been made available for such payments.

Special Commitment of Engineers

The Engineers hereby further commit themselves, without any corresponding commitment on the part of the Town, to hold available to the Town a sufficient staff to perform, in the event the Town so requests, all the appropriate services of an engineer, in the event the Town elects to proceed with the construction of any of said projects or facilities, incident to the following matters:

1. The preparation of advertisements for bids and instructions to bidders.
2. The tabulation and analysis of all bids received and the preparation of a report and recommendation with respect to such bids.
3. The supervision and the laying out of the work undertaken in accordance with the plans and specifications supplied by the Engineers.
4. The preparation of additional working drawings required in the course of the work.
5. The inspection of workmanship and materials in the course of the work to determine compliance with prescribed standards.
6. The preparation of monthly estimates of work completed in the course of the construction.
7. The making of a final inspection of all completed construction to assure full compliance with the plans and specifications.

In the event the Town requests the performance of the services listed above in connection with its undertaking of the actual construction of any of said projects or facilities, the Town shall pay to the Engineers, in monthly

installments as the construction work is performed, a fee equal to 2% of the actual cost of construction of the project or facility to which such services relate.

Further, the Engineers, at the request of the Town, will furnish a full-time Resident Engineer to serve during the construction of any of said projects or facilities. Such Resident Engineer shall serve, under the direction of the Engineers, in the inspection of all materials and equipment installed on the project, in the inspection of all workmanship, and in the preparation and maintenance of complete construction and progress reports. It is recognized that the inspection of materials to be made by any such Resident Engineer shall be field inspections and not such as require laboratory tests. Any laboratory tests shall be made only at the direction or request of the Town and at its expense.

The amount to be paid by the Town to the Engineers for the services of a Resident Engineer shall be determined and agreed upon by the parties at the time of his employment.

The question of the severe traffic tangles from the discontinuation of the signal lights at main intersection was brought up again.

It was moved by Ulrey and seconded by Jessup that the Mooreville Public Service Co. make a check on repairs to the lights. When the lights are repaired the motion was made to have then again placed in working order to govern the traffic at the intersection of Main and Indiana Streets. The Motion carried.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooreville, Indiana, met in regular session in the Municipal Building at 8 P.M. on the 2nd of April, 1946 with all members of the Board and the Attorney responding to roll call.

The minutes of the meetings of March 5th, 12th, and March 19th, were read and approved as read.

It was moved by Jessup and seconded by Ulrey that the Treasurer's report be accepted as read. Motion carried.

Dr. C. H. White was present in concern of the coming sewer survey. The Board stated that Mr. Mark Owen was preparing a statement to be published in the local paper in the near future explaining what had been accomplished prior to this date in the sewer survey.

Mr. Bernard Stout complained of an unhealthful situation in the back of his property from a ditch containing sink drainage. The Board to appoint a committee to investigate this situation with Dr. White who stated that if he found the problem serious enough, he would submit plans to the State

Board of Health for improving the present condition.

Aaron Gibbs and Charles Hinshaw, Grocers were present in concern of a number of peddler's in Mooresville operating without a peddler's license. An Ordinance adopted May, 15th, 1928 concerning peddlers was read. No definite action was taken at this time but investigations are to be made of other cities charges since the above Ordinance's licenses called for \$3.00 per day, 10.00 per week, 25.00 per month, and \$150.00 per year, per person. Owing to various food shortages, these above licenses seem too high, for peddlers to service Mooresville.

Mr. Alber Tutewiler asked about the Bridge over Goose Creek being repaired for the advantage of the citizens in that community, President Quillen appointed Fields of the Street Committee to see to having the bridge repaired. Mr. Fields also stated that a grader had been used on the alleys during the past month and he suggested that West Main Street from the Friends Church west be sealed and North Indiana Street from Washington Street North sealed to repair the bad condition these two streets are in.

It was moved by Jessup and seconded by Ulrey that the Board contact a contractor to get an estimate bid on re-sealing West Main Street from Monroe Street west to corporation limits, and North Indiana Street North from Washington Street to the Corporation limits there. Motion carried.

Jessup suggested that the streets uptown in the business section be swept.

Fire Chief Rariden stated that Ancil Moore had been servicing the fire trucks every day and should be paid for such. It was moved by Ulrey and seconded by Fields that Ancil Moore be paid \$15.00 per quarter for checking the fire equipment. Motion carried.

The question of the renewal of the Firemen's insurance policy was brought up at this time. It was moved by Fields and seconded by Comer that the Board continue the Firemen Policy from Mr. Ridgeway.

Marshal Rariden stated that the State Fire Marshal had visited Mooresville and examined quite a few buildings. No buildings were condemned but existing conditions in some of them were to be corrected.

By a request from Forest G. Rusie, the Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to transfer the 2 north spaces in the East half of Lot #23 to Wanda Rusie, and the 2 south spaces in the East half of Lot #23 to Frank Myrick. Mr. Rusie retained the West half of Lot #24 for himself. Upon proper receipts for transfers deeds to be made for the above requests.

Owing to a large accumulation of Permanent Maintenance Cemetery Fund, it was moved by Jessup and seconded by Fields that the Cemetery Committee be instructed to purchase \$7500.00 in negotiable bonds of the Government. This action was of the consent of the entire Board.

Mention was made of survey work being done in the Cemetery on the East side by Delbert Hobson.

Ray Ulrey was appointed to start plans for the summer recreation program in the Town Park. Investigations to be made on playground equipment.

The appointing of a Zoning Committee was brought up at this time. Those appointed to serve this committee were, Elvin Shepherd, Cecil Hadley, Thomas Allen, Forest Wakeman, and Frank Brown. Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to notify these men of their appointments, and give notification of a Zoning Committee meeting with the next meeting of the Planning Council with the Town Board.

A question of storing kindergarten chairs in the Municipal Building during the summer months was mentioned and the Board advised placing of the chairs in a place other than the Municipal Building owing to a limited space for Town use.

Attorney Butler was instructed to prepare an Ordinance on 1 hour parking on the Streets of the business section of Town, and this Ordinance to be read at the next meeting.

Ordinance No.1 of 1946 was given a first reading. It was moved by Jessup and seconded by Fields that the Ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE TRAFFIC UPON CERTAIN STREETS OF THE TOWN OF MOORESVILLE, INDIANA AND FIXING PENALTY THEREOF", be adopted. Roll Call: Fields-Aye,

ORDINANCE NO. 1 1946.

Section I

Be it ordained by the town board of the town of Mooresville, Indiana that by reason of congestion of certain streets on certain days these streets have become impassible so as to render the situation a hazard to the owners of property, that the prevention of fires is hampered, and the free flow of traffic on certain streets is impaired.

Section II

Be it further resolved that no parking on the North side of East Washington Street from Franklin Street to Indiana State Highway #67 in the city of Martinsville, Indiana shall be permitted on each Saturday of each week from and after the taking effect of this ordinance.

Section III

Be it further ordained that it shall be a violation of this ordinance upon and by any person, firm or corporation who shall violate the terms thereof.

Section IV

All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section V

Any person, firm or corporation convicted of violation thereof shall be fined upon such conviction in any sum of not less than \$1.00 nor more than \$10.00 together with costs

At this time the old law suit of Sartor and the question of its dismissal from the court records was brought up. Chairman Quillen stated that the State Board of Accounts had given him the information that the bill which Mr. Charles Foley, the lawyer on the case, would present the Town for his services should be taken from the Contingency Fund when Mr. Foley made his claim.

An Ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING TRAFFIC UPON CERTAIN STREETS OF THE TOWN OF MOOREVILLE, INDIANA AND FIXING PENALTY THEREOF" was given second reading and it was moved and seconded that the ordinance be adopted and placed upon its passage. Roll Call- Fields, Aye, Jessup, aye; Comer, Aye and Ulrey-Aye. Motion so carried.

Mr. Ulrey stated at this time that he had met with the Mooreville School Board to make plans for a recreational program for the children of the Town during vacation. Mr. Ulrey gave the information that the School Board said that in addition to the school grounds being prepared for playing games, the use of the gymnasium would be available at different intervals, and all the recreation to be under supervision. Mr. Ulrey and Mr. Comer were appointed to meet with the School Board in the near future

to further plans for the program.

It was moved by Jessup and seconded by Fields that Resolution No. 1 of 1946 be read. This Resolution resolves that the Clerk-Treasurer and the Chairman of the Cemetery Committee be given access to the lock-box rented by the Town from the Citizen's Bank. Such entry to the box be made ~~dual~~. Moved and seconded that this resolution be adopted. Motion carried and resolution passed for signatures. *No single entry to be made at any time.*

Mr. Lawrence V. Sheridan, a Zoning Consultant was present to discuss some problems of zoning. His talk to the Board Members stated that the first step to zoning was to prepare a land use map, next to secure the possible needs of the Town; now and in the future. A third pointer was to establish approximate new boundaries of the Town and lastly after the zoning ordinance was arrived at it should be adhered to in the strictest sense. Mr. Sheridan stated he would contact the Town Board in the near future and give his estimate on the cost of his services to the Town, should they wish them.

There being no further business to come before the Board, it was moved by Ulrey and seconded by Fields that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooreville, Indiana met in regular session on the 4th of June, 1946 in the Municipal Building at 7:30 P.M. with all members present with the exception of Mr. Fields. Also present at this meeting was Attorney Butler and Mark Owen and Mr. Cox from the Moore and Owen Engineering Company.

The minutes of the meeting of May 7th was read and it was corrected concerning the resolution No. 1 of 1946 giving the Clerk-Treasurer and the Chairman of the Cemetery Committee access to the lock-box in the Citizens Bank. Careful observation to be made on this resolution is that at no time is the lock-box to be entered into separately. Control of the box must be dual. Both parties being present at time of entry. The minutes were approved as corrected.

It was moved by Jessup and seconded by Ulrey that the Treasurer's report be accepted as read. Motion carried.

At this time a note of appreciation was read to the Board from Milton Henderson expressing his gratitude for remembrance of him at the passing of his wife.

Mr. Mark Owen presented a drawing made by his Company relative to improvement of the sewer system in Mooreville. The map showed his methods of relieving overloaded lines on the Franklin Street area and Harrison Street. It was the decision of the Board to have Mr. Owen make an addition to this map giving relief to the distressed area on South Street. No action was taken on the plans at this time. This will be decided upon as soon as Mr. Owen prepares the map for this 3rd area.

Notation of the bad condition of North Indiana Street and West Main Street was made at this time. Mr. Jessup was appointed to contact Delbert Hobson to make a survey of these streets so a bid for resealing could

be drawn up.

A program to repair broken and damaged sidewalks was discussed. Mr. Charles Comer was appointed to attend to getting this underway.

The Board of Trustees have a problem of securing a city dump. Several sites were suggested. Ray Ulrey was appointed to see Willis Richardson about this matter and Charles Comer was appointed to contact Mr. Charles Kellum about dumping in the old gravel pit on his farm if some arrangements were made for supervising such. These reports to be made next meeting.

A letter from Mr. Lawrence V. Sheridan, a Zoning Consultant, was read. His proposal to supervise a Zoning program in Mooresville was stated in this letter and the cost of same to amount to approximately \$750.00. The decision of the Board was to table the letter and the Clerk-Treasurer to so instruct Mr. Sheridan. This motion made by Mr. Jessup and seconded by Mr. Comer was carried.

At this time the Claims were presented for payment. It was moved by Ulrey and seconded by Comer that all claims be allowed as read and warrants be drawn on the Treasury for same with the exception of a bill for services rendered to the Town of Mooresville by Attorney Charles Foley on the Sartor Case. This bill to be held pending information from the State Board of Accounts since there is no appropriated fund from which to pay this. The case of Town of Mooresville against the estate of Sartor has been withdrawn from the court records. A check from the Auditor and Treasurer of Morgan County was presented to the Town of Mooresville at this meeting which was the final distribution of funds to Mooresville from the Martinsville Trust Company which closed in 1932. This check to be credited to the Town General Fund.

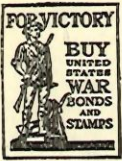

Claims were next read. It was moved Ulrey and seconded by Comer that the claims be allowed as read and warrants be drawn from the Treasury for same. Motion carried.

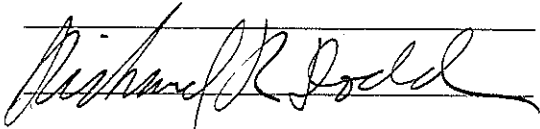

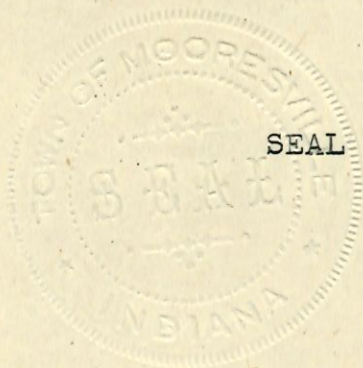

Minutes of the Meetings of August 2nd, 6th, 14th, and 26th were read and approved as read.

Moved by Ulrey and seconded by Comer that the Treasurer's report be accepted.

At this meeting it was decided that since there had been so much inquiry from different citizens about Town concerning the proposed new sewer lines, a special meeting would be held the 9th of September in the Municipal Building for the purpose of having citizens present with Mr. Mark Owen to discuss matters on this subject with them.

Some complaints were reported by the Street Department from citizens on Monroe street from surface water coming from High street down Monroe Street and into their lawns and gardens. An investigation is to be made of this.

Denny and William McNabb of the Planning Commission met the 16th of September, 1946 at 8 P. M. in the Municipal Building for the purpose of discussing and approving or disapproving plans of sewer surveys of the Moore and Owen Company.

The Question was asked of Mr. Owen to explain the additional cost from the original estimate of \$132,000.00 for construction plans to that of \$321,000.00. Mr. Owen stated that their Company had missed the estimate by such a difference because so many items had come up which use additional funds when they conducted their survey recently of the Town. Such items he explained which their company did not anticipate at all. He furthered his talk with the explanation of how his set of maps including thirty seven could be used as a whole project or each map in itself led to one smaller project. Each map was usable and did not depend on any other map in the group for completion. Mr. Owen also stated that before revenue bonds would be acceptable with any concern, the Town of Mooreville would have to have a sewage disposal plant of which he had drawn plans.

After much discussion, the Boards arrived at a project which they thought would result in the most relief to the Town and one which could be better financed according to a Town of our size. This plan carries the main trunk lines of all sewers over Town, going up into the New Addition area of the Town, a sewage disposal plant, and pumping station for the West sections of the Mooreville. Mr. Owen estimated this project as amounting to approximately \$200,000.00.

It was moved by Jessup and seconded by Ulrey that we consider this \$200,000.00 project and turn the plans for such over to the entire Planning Commission for their approval.

RESOLUTION

Whereas the Trustees of the Town of Mooresville have made application and received approval of a loan for \$5,000 to be used in preparation of plans for a sewerage system, pumping station and a sewerage treatment plant, which at first, it was considered that the cost of completion would run approximately \$132,000; and whereas the estimate made by the Russell B. Moore Company following preliminary survey, indicates a total cost of \$321,000, which amount is substantially higher than we considered could be financed.

And whereas the Russell B. Moore Company suggested that the cost of complete plans would run \$9,100 and in giving consideration to the matter at several meetings of the Board of Trustees of said Town, which has been attended by members of the Mooresville Planning Committee, it has been suggested that the scope of the proposed improvement be modified and reduced.

We hereby recommend the elimination of certain portions of the plans as outlined by Mr. Owens of the Russell B. Moore Company *(now Moore and Owen)* reducing the estimated costs of improvements to approximately \$200,000 — and hereby approve the application for an additional loan of \$2000 — to be applied for at this time to provide funds for the preparation of said plans.

1. That an application be submitted to the Bureau of Community Facilities of the Federal Works Agency for an advance of funds to prepare plans and specifications for a sewerage system;

Upon the question of the erection of the fire whistle which had been repaired Mr. Dorsett of the Mooresville Public Service Co. stated that their Company would help set the pole for the whistle and with wiring the controls, but after that their responsibility would stop. Members of the Board of Trustees were to meet in the near future to decide upon a suitable place for the erection of the fire whistle so that it might be put into use as soon as possible.

Marshal Rariden stated that Mr. Horton Stanley had informed him that during the winter months he would only make one garbage collection each week, and the day for collecting to be on Fridays. This notice to be published in the Mooresville paper.

Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to issue letters to Mr. Charles Plummer regarding an unsanitary condition in sewerage disposal of his property on West High Street and to Mr. Howard Johnson regarding the poor condition of the alley running longside his property and this condition resulting from his construction work.

Mr. John Bunch was next invited to give his talk which concerned the operation of the traffic signals at the intersection of Main and Indiana streets. Mr. Bunch stated that the Town of Mooresville was operating the signals against the wishes of the State Highway Commission. He stated that the two main factors regarded by their department for the continuance of lights was a volume count of traffic and the street layout. He said surveys had been made by engineers from their department concerning our problem and he did not think we had need for the continuance of operation of the traffic signals. Several citizens of Mooresville were present to make remonstrances to Mr. Bunch on this question. Every citizen present felt that the checks made in Mooresville were not applied fairly nor did Mr. Bunch give an open mind to the situation. His talk ended with no apparent results toward either the continued operation of the signals nor the non-operation of them.

The claims were read. Moved by Jessup and seconded by Fields that the claims be allowed as read with the exception of claims presented by Mr. Couch for officials Bonds and a portion of a claim made by G. G. Buford Hdwe. Co. due to exhausted funds. Motion carried.

Clarence Rariden, Firechief reported that with the occurrence of a fire at the Sanitary Container Corp. during the past month, it required 7 minutes for the Telephone Company to notify him of the fire call, and after the Fire Department reached the scene there was no water pressure to fight the fire. Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to issue letters to the State

Marshal, Mooresville Public Service Co. and the Greenwood Office of the Telephone Company telling them of these conditions.

The Board of Trustees said that they had met and selected a site for the fire whistle and the Clerk-Treas. was to so inform the Mooresville Public Service Company since they had made their agreement to help erect the whistle. ~~Marshal Rariden~~ ^{Pres. Quillen} stated that Mr. Mull, Gen. Manager of the Telephone Company said the Company would resume the responsibility of blowing the whistle for a fire call.

At this time Marshals Rariden and Horton made their yearly report. Arrests included 53 for Public Intoxication, 42 Traffic Violations, 10 Drunken Driving, 7 Convictions there and 3 pending; 17 arrests for Stealing, 1 for Concealed Weapons, 2 for Forgery and 1 life was saved from drowning after his auto had overturned in a nearby creek.

Fields of the Street Committee reported the patching done on the streets during the past month to be very satisfactory.

There being no additional business it was moved by Comer and seconded by Fields that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
