Marshal. Mooresville Public Service Co. and the Greenwood Office of the Telephone Company telling them of these conditions.

The Board of Trustees said that they had met and selected a site for the fire whistle and the Clerk-Treas. was to so inform the Mooresville Public Service Company since they had made their agreement yo help erect the whistle. Marshal Kariden stated that Mr. Mull, Gen. Mamager of the Telephone Company said the Company would resume the responsibility of blowing the whistle for a fire call.

At this time Marshals Rariden and Horton made their yearly report. Arrests included 53 for Public Intoxication, 42 Traffic Violations, 10 Drunken Driving, 7 Convictions there and 3 pending; 17 arrests for Stealing, 1 for Concealed Weapons, 2 for Forgery and 1 life was saved from drowning after his auto had overturned in a nearby creek.

Fields of the Street Committee reported the patching done on the streets during the past month to be very satisfactory,

There being no additional business it was moved by Comer and seconded by Fields that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.

Moved by quillen and seconded by Comer that Earl Morgan be reappointed as Sexton of the Cemetery for the year of 1947. The motion was carried. Remuneration to be 60% per hour with a guarantee of a monthly salary of at least \$50.00. from the Town of Mooresville.

Moved by Ulrey and seconded by Fields that Clarence Rariden be reappointed as Fire Chief of the Mooresville Fire Department for the coming year. Motion carried. Mr. Rariden stated his wishes to the Clerk-Treasurer to issue letters to each fireman requesting that they meet with him and the Board Members, Thursday January 23rd for inspection of the fire equipment and reorganization for the new year.

Mr. E. C. Mull, Sec-Treas. of the Union Telephone Company was present and gave a short talk before the Board concerning improvements which he he had planned for our telephone service in Mooresville. Mr. Mull's wishes were to also meet with the Fire Department and see if a more effective plan might be had with the members of the Fire Department and the employees of the Telephone Company at the switchboards in time of a fire.

In. Dorsett from the Mooresville Public service informed the Board that they were ready to help with the exection of the fire siren, and would be svailable at a convenient time for the Board.

Marshal Rariden reported the poor condition of the restrooms in the Municipal Bldg. Upon inspection by the Board their decision was to close these rooms and have them repaired. The Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to so inform the West Disinfecting Company which had been servicing the restrooms.

A letter was read from the Gross Income Tax Division which was requesting payment for gross taxable receipts of the years 1937-38-39. This amount being a total of \$51.01 for the three years. A period of sixty days was granted the Board. Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to consult the Town Attorney before payment was made. (Continued Minutes of the Meeting of January 7th, 1947)

A letter read from the Bloomington Crushed Stone Company gave the Cemetery Committee a price of \$1.30 per Ton for crushed stone at their plant or \$3.30 per Ton delivered. The Cemetery Committee are making plans for improvements to our Cemetery for the coming year.

The sewer and septic tank Committee requested the Clerk-Treasurer to write to Mr. Mark Owens inquiring as to plans he was making for the continuance of the progress of the pewer survey his Company had been making in Town during the past year.

The Claims were next read. Moved Ulrey and seconded by Quillen that all claims be allowed as read with the exception of a claim made by Mr. Oscar Couch for the continuance of a property custodian's bond for fire equipment belonging to the U.S. Gov. and the same of which remains in the hands of the Town of Mooresville, Ind. MEMORANDUM GOVERNING THE REPORTING AND HANDLING OF FIRE AND POLICE CALLS - MOORESVILLE, INDIANA

A meeting was held in the Town Hall at Mooresville, Indiana, on Friday, January 10, 1947, for the purpose of perfecting methods to be followed in reporting and handling telephone calls covering reports of fires and calls for members of the Mooresville Police Department.

This meeting was attended by Messers. L.A. Jessup and Clarence Rariden, representing the Town of Mooresville; Kenneth Dorsett, manager of the Mooresville Public Service Company and E.C. Mull secretary-treasurer of the Union Telephone Company. Mr. L.A. Jessup, Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, presided.

Following a general discussion of the situation, it was understood and unanimously agreed that the following plan would be followed in reporting and handling telephone calls covering reports of fires and calls for members of the Mooresville Police Department:

REPORTING FIRES

Anyone reporting a fire to the telephone company's switchboard operators will be expected to give the operator the street address or definite location of the fire.

Upon receipt of this information, the telephone operator will turn on the siren and proceed with calling each member of the Mooresville Fire Department according to a list of firemen, with their telephone numbers, to be supplied and kept up-to-date by the local fire chief. The Mooresville Public Service Company will also be notified at a telephone number to be designated by its manager.

The telephone operator will make these calls in the order as the names appear on the list. In case the called phone is busy or does not answer, the operator will proceed with calling the remaining names and numbers on the list, before attempting second calls to busy numbers or to a number which did not answer on first attempt.

The Telephone Company's switchboard operators are not expected and will not furnish information concerning the location of fires to anyone, excepting members of the Fire and Police Departments whose names appear on the list previously referred to.

A member of the Fire Department or Police Department requesting this information shall identify himself by name to the telephone operator. Otherwise this information will be denied.

The telephone company's operators will give preferred handling to these calls and will make every effort to complete them as promptly and accurately as possible.

The fire siren will also be blown by the telephone operators daily at 5:00 P.M. o'clock for testing purposes.

REPORTING POLICE CALLS

Upon receiving a call for the Town Marshall, the telephone operator will attempt to locate him at his telephone in the Town Hall or his residence. If she is unable to contact the Marshall, personally, at either of these places

A meeting was held in the Town Hell at Mooresville, Indiana, on Triday, January 10, 1947, for the purpose of perfecting methods to be followed in reporting and handling telephone calls covering reports of first and calls for members of the Mooresville Police Department.

This meeting was attended by Messers. L.A. Jessup and Clarence Rariden, representing the Town of Mooresville; Kenneth Dorsett, manager of the Mooresville Public Service Company and E.C. Mull secretary-treasurer of the Union Telephone Company. Mr. L.A. Jessup, Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, presided.

Following a general discussion of the situation, it was understood and unanimously agreed that the following plan would be followed in reporting and handling telephone calls covering reports of fires and calls for members of the Mooreaville Police Department:

EMPORTING FIRES

Anyone reporting a fire to the telephone company's switchboard operators will be expected to give the operator the street address or definite location of the fire.

Upon receipt of this information, the telephone operator will turn on the siren and proceed with calling each member of the Mooreaville Fire Department according to a list of firemen, with their telephone numbers, to be supplied and kept up-to-date by the local fire ohisf. The Mooreaville Public Service Company will also be notified at a telephone number to be designated by its manager.

The telephone operator will make those calls in the order as the names appear on the list. In case the called phone is busy or does not answer, the operator will proceed with calling the remaining names and numbers on the list, before attempting second calls to busy numbers or to a number which did not answer on first attempt.

The Telephone Company's switchboard operators are not expected and will not furnish information concerning the location of fires to anyone, excepting members of the Fire and Police Departments whose names appear on the list previously referred to.

A member of the Fire Department or Police Department requesting this information shall identify himself by name to the telephone operator. Otherwise this information will be denied.

The telephone company's operators will give preferred handling to these calls and will make every effort to complete than as promptly and accurately as possible.

The fire siren will also be blown by the telephone operators daily at 5:00 P.M.

REPORTING POLICE CALLS

Upon receiving a call for the Town Marshall, the telephone operator will attempt to locate him at his telephone in the Town Hall or his residence. If she is unable to contact the Marshall, personally, at either of these places

she will turn on the signal light provided for this purpose and await his call. The operator will not make a call to another number at the request of anyone answering the telephone at the Town Hall or the Marshall's home.

GENERAL

There are certain limitations as to the telephone company's responsibility in rendering this service, which is governed by its General Tariff of Rules and Regulations filed with and approved by the Public Service Commission of Indiana.

These are as follows:

"The Telephone Company does not undertake to transmit, or deliver, verbal or written messages but offers the use of its facilities for communications between customers, and any person, or employee, who assists a subscriber in a communication does so as the individual representative of the subscriber for which service the Telephone Company assumes no responsibility.

The liability of the Telephone Company for damages arising out of mistakes, omissions, interruptions, delays or errors, or defects in transmission occuring in the course of furnishing service, or facilities, and not caused by negligence of the customer, shall in no event exceed an amount equivalent to the proportionate charge to the customer for the period of service during which such mistake, omission, interruption, delay, etc. occurs. The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, Indiana met in regular session on the 4th of March at 7:30 P.M. in the Municipal Building with all members present with the exception of Mr. Kenneth Fields.

Minutes of the meeting of February 4th were read and it was moved by Fields and seconded by Ulrey that the minutes be accepted as read. Motion carried.

The Treasurer's report was read showing a balance of \$13,812.59 as a total of all funds. Moved by Ulrey and seconded by Comer that the report be accepted as read. Motion carried.

A letter of demand was read from the Gross Income Tax Division requesting payment of gross tax from the Town of Mooresville for the years 1937-1939 inclusive. It was decided that an investigation and consultation should be made with the State Board of Accounts before allowing payment. Clerk-Treasurer instructed to write a letter requesting additional time for payment to the Gross Income Tax Division.

A letter recieved from the Pennsylvania Railroad Company by Mr. Gilbert Butler was reported as saying that the height of the siding serving the Mooresville Coal and Cement Company would be lowered approximately 21 inches or the original level, just as soon as the weather permits.

A Bill of Sale from the Mooresville Public Service Company to the own of Mooresville, Indiana was read showing the transfer of one electric fire-alarm siren and one Magneto switch from the Public Service Company's possession to that of the Town's. Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to write a letter of acceptance to the Mooresville Public Service Company.

The Clerk-Treasurer was also instructed to write a letter to Mr. E. C. Mull, Sec. of the Union Telephone Company asking his approval of having the Telephone girls blow the fire whishtle after the calls had been made to the firemen isntead of blowing the whistle and then calling the firemen as is the case now. This new method would allow the firemen to attend to the distressed before citizens would have time to report to the fire scene.

Reports from the Street Committee stated that home owners from the V. D. Macy home east to Indiana wished to have a curb placed along their street. They stated their wishes of furnishing materials and the Town furnishing labor. This request taken under advisement. Complaints have been received from the parking of employees of the factory district on both sides of Bridge Street. Marshal Rariden was instructed to see the Managers of the factories and ask their employees to park on one side only of Bridge street out to the State road.

Joe Stout, present as a representative from the American Legion Post gave an idea the Legion had of sponsoring a program to purchase a new fire truck which in turn would be presented as a gift to the Town if the Town would allow them the Old fire truck for a vehicle to be used by the Post for convention purposes and also as an auxiliary if needed by the Town in case of serious fires. The Board had no objection to their plan, however they could not definitely promise them the sale of the old fire truck as a sale of this kind would have to be made by a bid method.

The Park Board suggested that a meeting date to discuss plans for the coming Old Settlers picnic be made for the 18th of March. This suggestion made in the form of a motion was carried.

Resolution No. 1 of 1947 was read which stated that the plans and specifications for sewers and sewage treatment works, prepared for said town, by the firm of Moore & Owen, of Indianapolis, Indian persuant to contract dated March 19th, 1946 now on file with this board which said plans and specifications have been heretofore approved by the Indiana State Board of Health and Pollution Control Board of Indiana as of December 17, 1946, and the Mooresville Planning Committee be and the same are now approved by said Town of Mooresville, and the Board of Trustees, therof and adopted as a part of the permanent records of said town. To help meet the greater costs in putting on the picnic, the committee approved an increase of 50% per foot in rental fees to concessions and stands. The increase puts the fees at \$1.50 and \$2.00 per front footage, this price being dependant upon their location.

A decrease in electric rates was also approved amounting to a reduction of approximately fifty percent. New rate stands thus: \$1.00 for a "cut in" and one bulb plus twenty -five cents per additional bulb with the wattage of each bulb at 100 watts.

Lotteries concerned with the selling of chances and the raffling of prizes are not to be permitted this year, nor will loud speakers be allowed to operate from any stands.

The Park Board expressed a new idea of obtaining some free-act artists to entertain the crowd in the place of the usual bands.

The contract for rides was made in decision for the same as furnished last year. A deposit of \$100.00 was received from James Chanos along with the signed contract on the 6th of February, 1947. Balance due at time of Old Settlers-\$150.00 plus electricity bill.

There being no further business at this time, the Board members adjourned.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, Indiana met in regular session in the Municipal Building on the 1st day of April, 1947 with all members being present with the exception of Mr. Quillen. Attorney Butler was present.

Minutes of the meeting of March 45h were read and a correction was made concerning the proposed curb of the citizens from the V. D. Macy property on West Harrison Street east to Indiana St.. The citizens were to furnish both material and labor and the Town was to grade the street side to the curbing after the project was completed. With this correction Mr. Ulrey moved the minutes be accepted with a second from Mr. Fields on this motion. Motion carried.

At this time the Treasurer's report was read. Moved by Ulrey and seconded by Fields that the report be accepted as read. Motion carried.

Resolution No. 1 of the Town of Mooresville, Indiana, approving the plans on the sewers and sewage treatment works as submitted by the Moore and Owen Company of Indianapolis, and the adoption of these plans for permanent record of the Town were given second reading.

It was moved by Fields and seconded by Comer that the said Resolution

l be passed and adopted. Roll Call- Comer, Aye, Fields-Aye, and Ulrey-Aye.

Mr. Fields reporting from the street committee suggested that all the streets in Town be given attention for a clean-up program. Recent storms have left quite a lot of debris on the streets. Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to write Mr. Spencer, Tup't of the State Highway system of the Greencastle district asking him to give attention to the conditions of trash on the highways under his jurisdiction in Mooresville. John Madge was present at the meeting in question of surface water from the town crossing the state road near the factory section at-th. Also Mr. Frank Mendenhall complained of this same situation from water crossing the highway and damaging his fields. The Board stated that they would investigate and see if the matter could be remedied.

The bids for the repair of North Indiana street as submitted by the Allied Bituminous Products Company and Shumaker Bro's. were again discussed and since the costs of repair had arisen approximately 40% since Fall of 1946, both bids were rejected and the Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to so inform the bidders. Plans were made to remove the trees on North Indiana street during the month and the street to be repaired by Town help at much less expense and omit the resurfacing at this time.

Mooresville, Indiana August 5, 1947

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, Indiana met in regular session in the Municipal Building at 8 P.M. on the 5th day of July, 1947, with all members and some visitors present.

Minutes of the preceding meeting were read. Moved by Fields and seconded by Comer that the minutes stand as read. This motion carried.

Next the Treasurer's report was given showing a total of all funds to be \$19,514.88. Moved by Quillen and seconded by Fields that the report be accepted as. Motion carried.

At this time the citizens were called upon, at which Lee Smith appeared to make complaints about an alley in the rear of his property remaining unoiled. It was the opinion of the Board that since this alley was unused and had grown over with grass and briars, the need for oiling no longer remained. Mr. E. F. Hadley brought forth his problem of preparing certain drainage systems in the Hadley Addition which were of Town usuage and for the public, and he wished partial remuneration to himself from the Town of Mooresville for the completion f the drainage project. The Board sanctioned this project as being necessary to the Hadley Addition, but informed Mr. Hadley that the funds appropriated for the allowing of this bill were exhau sted and would be taken care of as soon as possible in an appeal to the State Board of Tax Commissioners as will be heard in the reading of Ordinance No. 4 to come further in the business of the evening.

Next Ordinance No.3 proclaiming the Budget set up for the Civil Town of Mooresville, Indiana, for all funds for the coming Year of 1948 was given a first reading. It was moved by Fields and seconded by Comer that the Budget be accepted as read. This motion was carried. Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to post two notices of this Ordinance in the paper, with the first publication being made by the 7th day of August, 1947.

Following this business, a motion was made by Ray Ulrey with a second by Fields that the contracts of the Marshal and the Deputy Marshal of the Town

Of Mooresville, Indiana be terminated and new contracts be made granting them additional salary to meet the rise in prices. This amount not to exceed the fund appropriated for this purpose in the budget of last year. The Marshals to receive their warrants with this addition as of the 1st day of August, 1947, payable in September. At this time they were served with their re-appointment and repeated the oaths of their offices, which will be found in the pages following.

Next Ordinance No. 4 of the Civil Town of Mooresville, Indiana giving the Taxpayers notification of the re-appropriation of funds from the Gameral and General Street funds was given a first reading. Moved by Quillen and seconded by Ulrey that this Ordinance be accepted. Motion carried. A verbal vote was called for approval with all answers being in the affirmative.

A discussion followed on the advisability of the purchasing of the Water System from the Public Service Company to be owned by the Town of Mooresville. Quite a lengthytime was given to this question. The decision of the Board will go on record as to the effect of asking for a public vote before the citizens of Mooresville, before any action will be taken either way in this matter.

Ulrey and comer reported that no meeting had been called by the Women's Clubs in concern of the organizing of a Teen Canteen and they had nothing to report at this meeting.

Plans were completed for the coming Old Settlers. Marshals Rariden and Horton stated that all Special Deputies had been arranged for and a special meeting was called for Friday, August 8th, to administer the oaths of their offices to them and appoint them to their respective stations.

Dear Ray:

In response to your telephone call in regard to the attitude of law enforcement authorities in this County in regard to the operation of bingo games, raffles, lotteries or other gaming devices and schemes at carnivals, picnics, and otherwise, you are advised that from the outset these are unlawful, and make any participant subject to the penalty of the criminal law of the State of Indiana.

As to the policy of enforcement, you are advised since September 1946, prior to the time of my taking office all of such devices or games have been stopped either by the Sheriff's request or by the prosecution of the participants. This policy was adopted at the Paragon Home Coming on Labor Day and so far as I know these will not be changed. In the spring of this year anticipating that certain persons might want to operate such devices or games, a series of conferences were held by the Mayor of the City of Martinsville, the Judge of the Morgan Circuit Court, the Chief of Police of the City of Martinsville, the Sheriff of Morgan County and myself, in which it was decided that such games or devices would not be permitted to be operated at any of the carnivals held in Martinsville.

In regard to the situation at Mooresville, I have again conferred with the Judge and the Sheriff and we see no reason why such a policy should not apply in Mooresville as well as the rest of the county. I hope I make our position clear as all of these schemes are unlawful, and we wish to make no exceptions as to their operation.

The Board of Trustees met in continued session for the purpose of discussing problems arising from the Old Settlers Picnic and to allow the bills pertaining from the holding thereof.

Much unnecessary publicity is being made from the closing of a game stand operated by the local Kappa Sigma Sorority and the American Legion which was played in a like manner to the game of Bingo. Upon several inquiries made from the V.F. W. locally for the operation of a stand of this nature, the Clerk-Treasurer consulted the Prosecutor of Morgan County. The game was to be played by iveng every person who participated in the game a prize as he seated himself in addition to the prize he might be entitled to in further playing the game. Since twas not a bingo game, the title was not to be called thus. With this knowledge the Prosecutor instructed the Clerk-Treasurer he would consult the Judge of Morgan Co. to the rules of the game. After confering with the Judge as he stated he had, the Prosecutor informed the Clerk-Treasurer that personally, he had no objection to a bingo game and at the meeting with the Judge, no decision was made as to whether the game described in the likness of bingo was unlawful. The Prosecutor further stated, that the decision would be left up to the local Town Board and Peace Officers, and the Prosecutors decision would remain in an affirmative inclination. With this knowledge the Clerk-Treasurer allowed the Sorority and the Legion to proceed with their stand only to be closed by the County Sheriff, directed by the Judge who stated a complaint from a citizen from Mooresville had forced the action. During this affair the Prosecutor could not be located, nor at any later date was any acknowledgment of his decision as made to the Clerk-Treasurer stated. If at any time had the decision been of a suggestive negative nature, no allowance of this game would have been granted.

At this time Ordinance No. 4 of the 'ivil Town of Mooresville, Indiana giving the Taxpayers notification of the re-appropriation of funds from the General and General Street funds was given the second reading.

Moved by Fields and seconded by Ulrey that the Ordinance be passed and adopted his motion was carried, and roll call was had for this motion with all answers being in the affirmative. The Ordinance was passed for signatures of the Board Members.

From the Street Committee came the advisement of having the weeds about Town cut and all lot owners who had allowed weeds to gather be notified to remove them. The Committee also stated that some complaints had been received by them against the parking of cars across the sidewalk at the Farm Bureau Burlading. Marshal Rariden said that he had previously contacted the Farm Bureau on this matter, but he would see them again and see if a satisfactory method of loading feed could be made without blocking the sidewalk.

Chester Keller was heard at this time on the subject as to whether the local Saddle Club might be permitted to have a fish fry and a square dance in conjunction with this and preceding the affair to have a parade through the main part of Town. He also inquired as to whether the Town Board would contact the State Police for traffic reasons while the parade was going on. The Town Board gave their consent for the fish fry and dance and instructed the Clerk-Treasurer to write Lt. St. John of the Putnamville Post in regards to the above matter and so instruct Mr. Keller.

Another citizen Mr. Joe Stout was also heard in relationship to a complaint he had on the remaining congestion of traffic at the intersection of Main and Indiana Streets, even though the traffic signals were in operation. The Board stated to Mr. Stout that they had contacted the State Highway Commission at several different times in regards to some help on the situation, but as yet they had done nothing to relieve the congestion and since the State has the jurisdiction on Main and South Indiana Street, the Town would have to act upon their orders. The Board thanked Mr. Stout for all his helpful suggestions made on this subject however.

Marshal Rariden stated the need for the re-routing of the busses through fown for the sake of the safety of the passengers getting on and off the bus. Each time the passenger alights the case most generally arises for the individual to cross the heavy trafficed highway and several times Marshal Rariden has noticed some very narrow escapes from accidents. A plan was suggested for the busses to leave East Main St. at Clay Street as they came into Town and thus proceed to Harrison Street coming west to South Indiana Street, turning North here and stopping directly in frontof the Bus Stop at Gray's Restaurant where a special place for the passengers would be made. The Clerk-Treas. was instructed to issue a letter to Mr. Elmer Weddle, manager of the buslines informing him of the suggestions made at this meeting and have him contact Mr. Rariden and seeif this plan might be made satisfactory with him.

Observation made on North Indiana Street by the Board Members of the very unsatisfactory condition of the newly surfaced job caused their instructions to the Clerk-Treasurer for the writing of a letter to Mr. Becker of Roadways Inc. to inspect their project and report to Mærshal Rariden their method of making this street satisfactory.

Mr. Richard Dodd was commended for his write-up on the affair made from the closing of the local Zingo stand at Old Settlers which righted some of the mis-stated facts found in the county and Indianapolis newspapers.

Mooresville, Indiana October 7, 1947

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, Indiana met in regular session in the Municipal Building on the 7th day of October, 1947 at 8P.M. with all members and the A ttorney present.

Minutes of the meeting of September 2, 1947 were read and it was moved by quillen and seconded by Fields that the minutes be accepted as read. Motion carried.

Next the Treasurer's report was read showing a balance in all funds to be the sum of \$13,545.56. It was moved by Comer and seconded by Fields that the report be accepted as read. This motion carried.

Mrs. Robbins from the American Legion Auxiliary was present to request the use of the Municipal Building on the first and third Thursday evenings in which to hold their meetings. The Board granted her wishes.

In regards to the need for closing the rear door of the local tavern due to the destruction and loitering in the alley behind the tavern, the State Fire Marshall and and the Alcoholic Berverage Commission were contacted on this matter and at this time each of their replies were read. The State Fire Marshall stated that it would be impossible to close up one door as the rules laid down by the Alcoholic Beverage Commission requires two means of egress from taverns. The reply from the A.B.C. stated the same idea.

Mr. Meek from the firm of Moore and Owen was present bringing with him the second group of sewer plans, which were examined by the Board of Trustee This brought forth the reading of Resolution No. 4 of 1947 of the Town of Mooresville resolving that the plans and specifications for the second section of sewers be adopted as a part of the permanent records of said Town. This action was in the form of a motion made by Comer and seconded by Fields.

ORDINANCE NO. 5 Of the Town of Mooresville regulating the operation and Route of public passenger buses and establishing parking facilities for receiving and discharging passengers, was given second reading. It was moved by Fields and seconded by Quillen that the Ordinance be passed and adopted. This motion carried and the Ordinance was passed to each Trustee for his signature.

The question of the operation of the local diquor store was brought forth for discussion. Letters from the Alcoholic Beverage Commission stated that a license had been granted to Mr. Alexander on the basis of a plat submitted by himself showing the business and residental layout of the Town in the vicinity of the liquor store. The A.B.C. also stated that their countries would review Alexander's case and allow the Town Board a voice in the situation in view of the fact that the plat submitted by Alexander gave the layout of the street floor only in his statement. The Clerk-Treasurer was also instructed to issue a letter to the State Fire Marshal in regards to the continuance of the business to operate in this building which had been condemned so very many times by his office.

Attention was called to the silence of Roadways Inc. in regards to several letters, tleephone calls and the like in regards to the work done by their company on North Indiana St. This past summer and the terrible condition with which they left it. The Board's suggestion was for the Attorney to contact the Company on this matter.

The street committee also stated that they wished a program of repairing the worn places in the streets about town would be taken care of before bad weather set in. Mr. Rariden, the St. Commissioner stated that this work would be begun in a very few days.



Mooresville, Indiana December 2, 1947

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, Indiana met in regular session with all members and the Attorney responding to roll call. The meeting was held in the Municipal Building on the 2nd day of December 1947 at 7:45 P.M. Also present at this meeting were three new board members elect for 1948 namely Edward Fields, Paul Michael and Manley Brown.

Minutes of the meeting of November 4, were read and it was moved by Fields and seconded by willen that the minutes be accepted as read. This motion was carried.

Next the Treasurer's report for the month of November and a review on October's report were given. It was moved by Ulrey and seconded by Fields that these reports be acceptable as read. Motion carried.

Much discussion followed on the procedure of operation of the local liquor store on East Main et. It was decided that the Board of Trustees would meet in a body on Friday December 5th for the purpose of going to the offices of the A.B.C. to see if an investigation might be made for the allowance of this liquor license.

Next the Board explained some items concerning the sewer plans prepared by the Moore and Owen Co., methods of financing, and a general overall discussion to the 3 new Board members.

Present at this meeting was Mr. Edward Becker and the Sup't of Construction from Roadways Inc. who had been asked to be present in concern of the unfavorable condition of North Indiana Street recently repaired last summer. These men stated that they had inspected this street prior to coming to the meeting and found the street all the Board of Trustees had

reported. They agreed to tear up the street again in the spring of 1948 and fix it in a satisfactory condition. Since the weather was too dold now for any extensive repair, it was agreed that they would send a grader and scrape the large bumps off in the street and let it remain in this condition until the spring repair. The Board voted as to whether they would allow the remainder of the repair bill of \$442.99 to Roadways Inc.. It was moved and seconded that the bill be allowed and the Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to issue the warrant after a suitable claim had been filed. At this time also since Mr. Becker is also a representative of a portion of Allied Bituminous Products Inc. with whom the Town of Mooresville still owes an amount of \$2330.68 for extensive repairs made to streets in the town in the summer of 1945, a discussion followed on this matter. Since the case being that the A llied Bituminous Products Co. Carried out a much larger program than agreed upon by the Board of Trustees at that time, some compensation should be made by the road repair company and the bill settled for at this time. After a number of suggestions it was finally agreed upon by both parties that Mr. Becker would confer with Mr. Murphy, a co-partner as to making a setilement for the amount of \$2,000.00

Kenneth Fields made a motion that the entire join in the audit of the Clerk-Treasurer 's books early in January. This motion carried and seconded.

Clerk-Treasurer stated that she had the request of Mr. Ralph Moon for a transfer of 3 grave spaces from a lot of 5 spaces now owned by himself and wife to be made to Mrs. Nellie Allison. 2 spaces he wished reserved for himself. The proper fees have been made for this transaction.

TOWN OF MOORESVILLE, COUNTY OF MORGAN, STATE OF INDIANA.

An Ordinance of the Town of Mooresville, Regulating the Operation and Route of Public Passenger Buses and Establishing Parking Facilities for Receiving and Discharging Passengers.

Be It Ordained by the Town Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, County of Morgan, State of Indiana:

Section I

That by reason of the congestion of certain of the public streets and in order to afford safety to pedestrians, vehicles and passengers upon public passenger buses, and to promote the public safety and to assure a free flow of traffic upon the streets of said Town, all public passenger buses shall be required to operate the same in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance.

Section II

Be it further resolved, that a space of thirty (30) feet, extending North from the alley on the East side of Indiana Street between Harrison and Main Streets, in the Town of Mooresville, Morgan County, Indiana, shall be marked and designated by appropriate markings as a "bus stop".

Section III

Be it further resolved, that it shall be unlawful for any other vehicle to park in the space or zone described and mentioned in Section II of this ordinance.

Section IV

Be it resolved by said Board of Trustees of said Town, that from and after the taking effect of this act all public passenger buses operating within the Town of Mooresville and receiving and

discharging passengers for hire, shall be so operated upon said public streets as to at all times when receiving or discharging passengers from the "bus Stop", designated in Section II, to approach the same in a general direction from South to North and to cause said vehicles to stop within the space so designated parallel and adjacent to the East curb line of Indiana Street in said Town.

Bection V

Be it further resolved, that when more than one public passenger bus shall approach said "bus stop" at approximately the same time, said vehicles shall be operated in such a manner that second or subsequent vehicles shall follow immediately to the rear of the first vehicle.

Section VI

All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance, are hereby repealed.
