The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooreville met in a regular session on January 4, 1944, with all members present.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Quillen.

The Chairman then announced that the election of a President for the Board of Trustees for the year 1944 was next in order.

Mr. Ulrey placed the name of Leland Jessup in nomination. It was seconded by Mr. Fields. The Chairman declared nominations closed. As there was no other nomination, Mr. Jessup was declared elected by acclamation.

President Jessup took the chair.

The minutes of the meeting of January 1, 1944 were approved as read.

President Jessup then appointed the following committees:

The matter of the selection of an Attorney for the Town was brought up at this time. The names of Charles Foley and Gilbert Butler were placed in nomination. It was moved by Mr. Lawrence and seconded by Mr. Ulrey that the nominations be closed. The Board then proceeded to vote by ballot and Gilbert Butler was elected to serve as the Town Attorney for the year 1944.

It was moved that nominations be in order for Town Marshal. It was moved by Mr. Lawrence and seconded by Mr. Ulrey that George Wall be duly appointed Marshal to the Town of Mooreville, Indiana, to serve during the pleasure of the Board of Trustees of said Town. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Lawrence and seconded by Mr. Ulrey that Leonard Horton be duly appointed Deputy Marshal to the Town of Mooreville, Indiana, to serve during the pleasure of the Board of Trustees of said Town. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Lawrence and seconded by Mr. Ulrey that George Wall be duly appointed to serve as Fire Chief and Street Commissioner during the pleasure of the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooreville. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Quillen and seconded by Mr. Lawrence that Earl Morgan be appointed Sexton of the Cemetery for the year 1944. The motion carried. Mr. Morgan asked the Board for an increase of 10¢ on the hour in his wage and it was agreed that the Board would go over the Budget and notify Mr. Morgan. It was also agreed that whatever action was taken would be made retroactive.

It was moved by Mr. Lawrence and seconded by Mr. Quillen that all claims be allowed as read and the Clerk-Treasurer be instructed to issue warrants for same. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Ulrey and seconded by Mr. Lawrence that the following be approved as volunteer firemen: Bracy Burton, Alden Beall, George Killian, Ellis Chowning, Homer Monday, A. E. Allen, Paul Hunt, Ezra Fleener, Forest G. Rusie, Mearl Sawyers. Motion carried.

President Jessup announced that the Board of Finance should meet to organize the third Monday in January, which will be January 17, 1944.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooreville met in a regular session on February 1, 1944, with all members present. Mr. Gilbert Butler, Attorney for the Town, was also present.

The minutes of the meeting of January 4, 1944 were approved as read.

The Clerk-Treasurer read a copy of the letter written Slaymaker, Merrill, Locke and Reynolds, Attorneys-at-Law, by Charles H. Foley. (Letter attached following minutes of this meeting.) It was moved by Mr. Ulrey and seconded by Mr. Fields that Mr. Foley be instructed to proceed with the suit. It was decided that Mr. Foley should come to the next meeting with Mr. Butler for the purpose of discussing this matter.

A report from the various committees followed. Sewers, the sewage disposal plant and the repair and improvement of streets was discussed.

It was moved by Mr. Ulrey and seconded by Mr. Fields that the Street Committee make specific recommendations for street improvements. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Ulrey and seconded by Mr. Quillen that Mr. Morgan, Sexton of the Cemetery, should be paid at the rate of \$4.00 per hour (basis of pay to be retroactive as of January 1, 1944); also that he be given a guarantee of at least \$40.00 per month. The Board also agreed that Mr. Morgan should be permitted to do any outside work which did not interfere with his work as Sexton. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Ulrey and seconded by Mr. Lawrence that Paragraph Number Three of the Ordinance dated April 4, 1933 be amended to read as follows:

"All grave openings shall be at the uniform price of \$5.00 for a child; \$10.00 for a box grave; and \$12.50 for a vault. Undertakers are to be responsible for payments."

Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Ulrey and seconded by Mr. Lawrence that another amendment be added to Ordinance dated April 4, 1933 which reads as follows:

ORDINANCE AMENDMENT.

AMENDMENT OF ORDINANCE NO. _____
DULY ADOPTED BY THE TOWN OF
MOOREVILLE ON APRIL 4, 1933.

IT IS RESOLVED by the members of the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooreville that the ordinance heretofore entered and adopted by said town on April 4, 1933, be and the same is amended in the following particulars, to-wit:

That hereafter and in case of any purchase by any person of a cemetery lot in the town

at the office of the Clerk-Treasurer of said town. That a fee shall be charged by such Clerk-Treasurer for each and every assignment so made for any lot or any portion thereof of \$2.00 for each separate transaction. Said transfers shall be noted on the records in the office of the Clerk-Treasurer of the town.

BE IT RESOLVED, that said Clerk-Treasurer procure suitable forms for making such assignments and have the same available at all times.

This ammendment to be in full force and effect from and after its adoption.

ORDINANCE FOR APPROPRIATION

No. 1, 1944

AN ORDINANCE DECLARING AN EMERGENCY
AND APPROPRIATING ADDITIONAL FUNDS
TO MEET THE SAME, OVER AND ABOVE
EXISTING BUDGETS FOR CURRENT YEAR.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF MOORESVILLE,
INDIANA.

SECTION 1. That members of the Advisory Board of Brown Township, Morgan County, Indiana, together with the Township Trustee and various citizens thereof have proposed the purchase of cooperative fire fighting equipment, for use in both the said Township and the Town of Mooresville, which is situated therein. That at the present time said Town of Mooresville has only one piece of fire fighting equipment which has become old and somewhat obsolete, and would likely be ineffective in event of a fire of any considerable size, and likewise the property of the citizens of said Brown Township is without any protection from fires. That by the purchase of cooperative equipment, and provision being made for the joint maintenance thereof, a considerable saving would result to the Township and the said Town of Mooresville, and at the same time provide adequate protection to the property of both the citizens of the town and township.

SECTION 2. That by reason of the foregoing facts there is need to purchase such equipment at this time, and an extraordinary emergency exists for the expenditure of more money for the current year than set out in the budget.

SECTION 3. Be it therefore resolved that to meet such emergency, there be appropriated for such fiscal year from the General Funds of said Town, the following amounts, to pay for the estimated one-half costs of such equipment, to-wit:

SUPPLIES AND EQUIPMENT FOR FIRE DEPARTMENT,	
DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY	\$375.00

Said sum being in addition to all items and appropriations in existing budgets.

SECTION 4. Be it further resolved that due notice be given as by law provided, fixing therein the date when the same will be considered and determined.

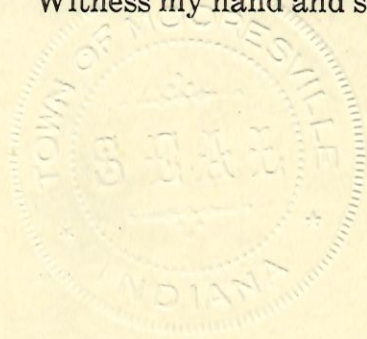

Be it further Ordained, by the Board of Trustees that the taxes as fixed and levied in Section I of this Ordinance be entered by the Auditor of Morgan County, Indiana on the tax duplicate, and the same be collected by the treasurer of said County as other taxes are collected, all as prescribed by the Laws of the State of Indiana.

Section III. Be it further Ordained by said Board of Trustees that whereas, an emergency exists for the immediate taking effect, of this Ordinance, the same shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and adoption, and the Town Clerk is hereby ordered to certify said levies and deliver the same to the Auditor of Morgan County, Indiana, and said Auditor is hereby directed to proceed with the same as by law provided.



CONTRACT

In consideration of the reciprocal covenants herein contained, the parties hereto, namely the Town of Mooresville, hereinafter called "Consumer", and Mooresville Public Service Co., hereinafter called "Company", do hereby agree as follows:

1. The Company agrees to furnish and the Consumer agrees to take from the Company for a period of four (4) years, beginning when the Company first supplies service hereunder, all electric energy required in connection with the lighting of streets, alleys and public places within the Town of Mooresville, Indiana.

2. The Company shall furnish for use in the performance of its contract, all the necessary materials, labor, plant, machinery and appliances, and construct, operate and maintain the same in such streets, avenues, alleys, sub-ways and public places in said Town of Mooresville, Indiana, in such manner as the Board of Trustees of Consumer may from time to time direct during the life of this contract - provided, however, that the number of lights to be operated and maintained by the Company shall not at any time be less than the amount set forth in this contract:

3. The work of construction or repair of the Company's plant as is located in streets, avenues, alleys and public places, including the cutting into and repair of streets, the location or relocation of lines, lamps and poles, and the construction of conduits shall all be subject to the approval of the Board of Trustees of Consumer. Right is hereby reserved by the Consumer to order any change or changes made from time to time in the location of standards or overhead lighting fixtures from their original location. Changes so ordered, by the Consumer, in the location of overhead lamps shall be made by the Company at no cost to the Consumer; changes so ordered by the Consumer in the location or relocation of ornamental or standard lamps shall be paid for by the Consumer at actual cost of labor and material plus fifteen per cent (15%) for overhead, provided however, that the expense of any such changes in said ornamental or standard lamps ordered or caused by any public improvement, shall be borne and paid for by the Company. The Company agrees that it will restore or cause to be restored all streets, avenues, alleys and public places to the same condition after the completion of its work as they were in before being disturbed; that it will at all times make or cause to be made, any and all repairs which may be necessary to any pavement, sidewalk, or any street, avenue, alley or public place by reason of the same having been excavated or disturbed by the Company in the prosecution of its work.

4. The Company and Consumer agree to continue the operation of the 95 - 250 candle power, overhead, suspension type units, and the 4 - 600 candle power and 18 - 400 candle power ornamental standards which are now installed and are now a part of the existing street lighting system, payments to be as specified in the next paragraph.

5. Additional ornamental standard lamps will be furnished, installed, operated and maintained upon the order of the Board of Trustees of the Consumer at such prices as shall be mutually agreed upon by the Company and the Consumer.

Prices for furnishing, operating and maintaining 600 candle power ornamental light posts now in service.

Per Post Per Year \$ 50.00

Prices for furnishing, operating and maintaining 400 candle power ornamental light posts now in service.

Per Post Per Year \$ 35.00

Prices for furnishing, installing, operating and maintaining 250 candle power overhead lamps on present system and additional such lights for 4000 burning hours per year.

Per Lamp Per Year \$ 25.00

Payments are to be made by Consumer to Company monthly, at one-twelfth (1/12) the annual prices herein listed.

6. The title to and in all property, and every part thereof covered by this agreement, shall be and remain in the Company.

7. All the above lamps shall be lighted at approximately thirty minutes after sunset and extinguished approximately thirty minutes before sunrise each day during the term of this agreement.

8. The Consumer shall have the right to discontinue at any time, certain lights after having given at least a thirty days' written notice to the Company; provided, however, that the total number of lamps to be paid for at any time shall not be less than 30 - overhead lamps and 20 ornamental lamps.

9. Rates, rules and regulations stated herein are at all times subject to approval, revision and change, modification and cancellation by the State of Indiana through authorized agencies for the regulation of public utilities, also in case of disagreement of parties on terms of contract said authorized agencies shall serve as arbitrator.

AVAILABILITY

Available to any customer for the supply of:

Flat rate service for the lighting of streets, alleys, subways and other public places whose minimum requirements are not less than those hereinafter set out in this rate schedule.

CHARACTER OF SERVICE

The Power Company in supplying flat rate service shall own all street lighting equipment, fixtures and appurtenances thereto, and shall furnish all labor, material and electrical energy for their maintenance and operation; under a schedule of use of 4000 burning hours per year.

The Power Company shall specify the voltage and character of the electric service to be supplied and may, at any time thereafter, change the characteristics of the service if it deems such change necessary to safeguard a regular and uninterrupted supply of electricity or to better the conduct of its business.

RATE

Flat Rate Service

Prices for the installation, operation and maintenance of all street lights installed prior to September 1, 1940.

Ornamental Standards.

- I. Single lamp ornamental standard, 12 ft. in height, including one (1) 6,000 lumen incandescent lamp with necessary fixtures, glassware, and including connecting cable and supplied from underground circuits:

\$50.00 net per year of 4,000 burning hours.

- II. Single lamp ornamental standard, 12 ft. in height, including one (1) 4,000 lumen incandescent lamp with necessary fixtures, glassware, and connecting cable and supplied from underground circuits:

\$35.00 net per year of 4,000 burning hours.

Overhead Lights.

- I. Single 2,500 lumen incandescent lamps with necessary fixtures and glassware now in service supplied from overhead circuits:

\$25.00 net per year of 4,000 burning hours.

MINIMUM QUANTITIES TO BE SERVED

The foregoing rates for flat rate service are contingent upon the regular supply of and payment for not less than 30 overhead lights and not less than 20 ornamental standards.

MONTHLY BILL

Flat Rate Service

The sum of one twelfth of the amount per year for each of the units detailed in the clause "Rate" of this schedule.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

1. Maintenance and Operation

Power Company will furnish all necessary electrical energy; will furnish a minimum of (2) lamp renewals per year; will paint ornamental standards once every (4) years; will maintain and make necessary repairs on all street lighting equipment; will patrol lights a minimum of twice a week and will clean globes and glassware a minimum of twice each year.

2. Additional Overhead Lights

Upon written order of customer additional overhead lights will be installed within a distance of 600 feet from any light already served.

3. Relocation of Equipment

All changes in location of street lighting equipment in connection with ornamental standard lights shall be made at the expense of the customer on the basis of Power Company's cost plus 15%.

4. Taxes and Assessments.

Any extra expense incurred by the Power Company in fulfilling its obligations under this schedule, due to any laws or ordinances; or due to any future special excise tax or sales tax levied on the Power Company by the United States Government, State of Indiana or any division thereof, for services rendered under this schedule shall be assumed by the Customer, providing such assumption is not contrary to law, and any reduction in expense which may effect the Power Company in fulfilling its obligations under this schedule by reason of any of the conditions as stated above shall be credited to the Customer.

PAYMENT

The above rates and charges are net and shall be due and payable in monthly installments. All bills shall be due and payable within (30) days from their date of issue.

TERM

Four years

Effective October 1, 1940.
