


4 — Kenneth Fields, Trustee of the First Ward

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooreville, Indiana met in regular session in the Municipal Building on Tuesday January 1, 1952 at 8 P.M. with all members responding to roll call.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Fields.

The Chairman then announced that the election of a President for the Board of Trustees for the year 1952 was next in order. Nominations ready-

Mr. Albert Tutewiler placed the name of Elvin Shepherd in nomination to which he declined. Elvin Shepherd placed the name of Kenneth Fields in nomination. This motion was seconded by Mr. Gregory. Mr. Roy Rushing then moved that the nominations be closed. Motion carried. Thus Mr. Kenneth Fields was elected to serve as the President of the Board for 1952 by acclamation.

President Fields took the Chair.

The minutes of the meeting of January 1, Noon were read and approved as read.

President Fields then appointed the following committees:

Streets and ALLEYS- All members of the Board of Trustees, each trustee

giving special attention to his own Ward.

SEWERS and SEPTIC TANKS- All members

PARK COMMITTEE- Elvin Shepherd and Albert Tutewiler

CEMETERY COMMITTEE- Albert Tutewiler and Roy Rushing

Auditing COMMITTEE- Herman Gregory and Elvin Shepherd

The matter of the selection of an Attorney for the Town was brought up at this time. The motion as made by Elvin Shepherd and seconded by Albert Tutewiler was that Gilbert Butler of Martinsville be retained to serve as Attorney for the year 1952. This motion carried and the Clerk-Treas. instructed to so inform Mr. Butler of his re-appointment.

The consideration of Town appointments was brought forth next. It was announced the appointment were ready for the police officers of the Town. Moved by Tutewiler and seconded by Gregory that the Chief Marshal and 2 Deputy Marshals be reappointed making it thus: Marshal Rariden- Chief, Marshal Horton working the 4 P.M. to 12 P.M. Shift and Marshal Forest Rusie working the Mid-night to 8 A.M. Shift. All salaries to remain unchanged with every other Sunday off.

Next the appointment of the Cemetery Sexton resulted in the re-appointment of Earl Morgan by a motion made by Alvin Shepherd and seconded by Roy Rushing. Morgan rate of pay to remain at 75¢ per hr. This motion also made the inclusion of patrolling parking meters when any emergency arose and any special work which the Marshals had need of.

Since the Budget was already set up for working for the year 1952, the Board stated that all miscellaneous work would have to go at the rate of 75¢ as much as was possible. This includes street, park, sewers etc. unless other wise stated.

President Fields announced the appointment for Garbage Collector open. It was moved by Shepherd and seconded by Tutewiler that Horton Stanley and Chester King be re-appointed for the year 1952. This motion carried. President Fields stated that Mr. Stanley had contacted him prior to this meeting and was unable to collect the Garbage any longer at the \$3.00 rate for himself and the \$2.00 rate for his helper, Chester King. This matter was taken under advisement and discussion and it was moved and seconded that the proposal which asked for \$5.00 for Mr. Stanley and \$3.00 for Mr. King be accepted and the two men be given authority to do the collecting for 1952. Clerk-Treas. so instructed to inform the men respectively.

The matter of the town dump which has been at the Harry Schenck property for the past two years was taken up next. It was moved by Shepherd and seconded by Gregory that the contract which expires March 7, 1952 be renewed for this coming year. Motion carried.

A discussion followed on the operations of the local Fire Department. These appointments were made unanimously by the Board of Trustees. Firemen appointed to serve during the pleasure of the said Trustees were: E. A. Allen, Alden Beall, Lester Bales, Leland Connell, Richard Keller, Joe Mendenhall, H. B. Monday, Ancil Moore, Forest G. Rusie, and Charles Weaver. Further appointments in the Fire Dep't. were thus: Fire Chief- H. B. Monday with the Assistant of Forest Rusie. Day Captain as Richard Keller and Night Captain as Ancil Moore. Ancil Moore was also appointed as the maintenance man of the trucks at the rate of \$15.00 per quarter. Two regular drivers were appointed in the person of Ancil Moore and Richard Keller with E. A. Allen and Joe Mendenhall as alternate drivers. Only 1 fire truck will respond to a call until the Fire Chief gives the call for the second truck. Any call of distress for fire help is to be attended to no matter where the call may result from. All these appointments and rules made for termination indefinite by the Board of Trustees.

Three additional appointments were made next in one group by a motion made after the invitation of President Fields. Shepherd moved that those men serving in the capacity of Street Commissioner, Parking Meter Maintenance Man, and Park in Meter Clerk in the person of Leonard Horton, Clarence Rariden and Paul Swisher respectively be re-appointed at their regular salaries of \$25.00, \$25.00, and \$20.00 in the like manner. This motion seconded by Gregory with all in favor.

The Trustees next brought up a series of matters of which they felt a concern. It had been observed that the local theatre was without an emergency marking in the front of the building. The Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to inquire of the Attorney as to the State Law on this and favored the preparing of an Ordinance allowing the emergency opening if not a state law. Ordinance to be brought up February meeting. It was noted too that some of the busses had not been abiding by the Ordinance of one stopping station and the Board of Trustees instructed the Clerk-Treasurer to contact Attorney Butler and have him remind the two bus companies of the contents of the Bus Ordinance.

Another matter brought forward was a discussion of the work being done in surveying and drafting by Delbert Hobson in preparation of a new Town Map showing the correct boundaries. At this time a statement of work or plans made are not known, only the charges which were turned in for the December meeting on the 31st. It did seem advisable to the Board to dispense with the work which Mr. Hobson was on until sometime later when some definite plans could be had on the advancement of the project. Clerk-Treas. to so inform Mr. Hobson of this action of relief of the work at this time.

In interest of some much needed work on the town sewers, it was moved that the State Highway Dep't. be contacted for a plan of working with the Town in creating a better drainage system for Mooresville.

The claims were presented for reading at this time. After reading it was moved by Tutewiler and seconded by Gregory that the claims be allowed and warrants drawn for same. The claims read were:

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooreville, Indiana met in regular session in the Municipal Building on Tuesday February 5, 1952 at 8 P.M. with all members responding to roll call.

The minutes of the meeting of January Noon and January 1st at 8 P.M. were read and it was moved by Shepherd and seconded by Rushing that these minutes be acceptable as read. Motion carried.

Next the Treasurer's report was read showing a balance of all funds to be \$29,956.33. It was moved by Tutewiler and seconded by Gregory that the Treasurer's report be acceptable as read. Motion carried.

A number of citizens were present with their complaints which mostly concerned with surface water draining into their basements. Dewey Kirkendoll complained that the tile belonging to him was being flooded by town surface water and the Board promised an investigation into the situation there. Mr. Robertson from East Harrison St. inquired if anything could be done to enclose the large open ditch on E. Harrison St. which Mr. Robertson says is washing out from under the sidewalk near his property. This large ditch closing seemed like a too large project for immediate consideration.

The subject of acquiring the exact town limits was brought forth for discussion next. The Board reconsidered and thought it best to go ahead with plans and have Delbert Hobson complete his survey just as soon as possible. The Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to so notify Mr. Hobson of this action and inquire if Mr. Hobson would be available for a committee meeting with the Board on the following Tuesday being February 12.

A matter brought to the attention of the Town Trustees next was the idea of the employees of the town being covered by the Retirement Fund recently brought into use for more persons. The Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to contact the social security division at Bloomington and get information concerning this matter and have ready for the next Board Mtg.

A request was cited next for the erection of a street lamp at the end of Commerce Drive. The Board felt that the light was needed in this vicinity of new homes. The Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to so notify the Public Service Company of their action, providing the light was a \$25.00 one.

Mr. Taylor of the Hoosier Water Co. also stated that their company was laying the final water line in Hadley's Second Addition and would like the Board's consent to the placing of another fire plug near the center of W. Hadley St. The Board felt that this would be the cheapest and best time for the installation of this plug and so instructed the Clerk-Treasurer to inform the water company of this action.

President Fields next asked for reports of the various appointed committees.

Claims were read next for consideration of payment. After their reading, it was moved by Tutewiler and seconded by Rushing that all claims be allowed as read and warrants drawn from the treasury for the same. Claims:





A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES
OF THE TOWN OF MOORESVILLE, INDIANA.

Be it resolved by the Board of Trustees of the town of Mooresville, Indiana, that:

Whereas, a movie theatre is being operated at 21 East Main Street in the town of Mooresville, Indiana and, whereas, in accordance with the rules of safety and the regulations of the office of the State Fire Marshall, a free, open and accessible entrance of at least 22 feet should be provided in the front of said movie theatre and no automobile parking should be allowed in said space; and

Whereas, there is at the present time located one or more parking meters in front of said theatre.

Be it therefore resolved, that a space of 22 feet immediately in the front of said theatre on Main Street, at No. 21 be designated a no parking area and marked with appropriate signs.

Be it further resolved that all parking meters within said area be removed.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooreville, Indiana met in regular session in the Municipal Building on Tuesday March 4, 1952 at 8 P.M. with all members responding to roll call. Attorney Butler was also present at this meeting.

Minutes of the meeting of February 5th were read and it was moved by Tutewiler and seconded by Gregory that these minutes be acceptable as read. Motion carried.

The Treasurer's report was read next showing a balance of all funds to be \$28,320.21. It was moved by Rushing and seconded by Shepherd that the report be accepted as read. Motion carried.

The visitors present at this meeting were asked to present their problems next and Lawson Lawrence appeared asking that the Board enter into the matter of straightening W. Carter property from W. Morgan St. to the town limit line north. Mr. Lawrence stated that it was the wish of all the land owners in that vicinity to have the street straightened so that permanent fencing and landscaping might be had. The Board suggested that they would meet with the property owners and see if a suitable arrangement couldn't be worked out there. This suggestion was approved by Mr. Lawrence.

Paul Swisher appeared next stating that he had purchased lots 2 and 3 in the Trogden Addition and was making plans for the erection of a new store building and asked permission for entrance over the present sidewalks into the place of business. It was moved by Shepherd and seconded by Tutewiler that Mr. Swisher's request be granted with the provision that he keep the walk in a condition as good as the present walk and reinforce the walk if the truck traffic caused it to crack.

Committee reports were taken up next. Note was made at this time that no town work of any kind should be done without first consulting the committee in charge of the particular work to be done. From the street committee came the urgency for getting the streets patched. It was noted that the streets and alleys needed a better drainage system too before any permanent work was started.

From the Park Committee the need was cited for the removing of two dead trees as soon as possible, and Milt Henderson was to be contacted to go ahead with this matter.

H. B. Monday, Firechief presented the Board with a request for supplies badly needed in the Fire Department consisting of 2 raincoats, boots and helmets, 2 first aid kits, 2 gas masks, canvas for hose compartment, fog nozzle for 3/4" hose on new truck, suction hose for the pump and repairing of the 2 1/2" bursted hose. It was moved by Shepherd and seconded by Tutewiler that the balances in these respective funds be examined and then as many as possible of these badly needed supplies be obtained.

A letter was read from Mary Katherine Anderson suggesting the idea of a lounge room for ladies to be located in the Municipal Building. The Board expressed their appreciation for her interest and advised the Clerk-Treas. to make answer to Miss Anderson. No action was taken at this time.

A new law recently passed which would enable town employees to participate in the Old Age and Survivors Insurance brought the next action. The majority of the town employees expressed a desire to pay into this fund, so it was moved by Tutewiler and seconded by Gregory that the preparatory papers sent from the State Office for this purpose be executed and filed with Mr. Teckemeyer so that the Town of Mooreville and it's employees might be included beginning with the 1st day of January, 1952. Further instructions were given for the preparing of an additional appropriation request which would cover the Town's share of the tax.

The claims were read next for consideration of payment. After hearing them, it was moved by Gregory and seconded by Shepherd that all claims be allowed as read. Motion carried. The claims were:

ORDINANCE NO. 1

AN ORDINANCE DECLARING EMERGENCY AND
AUTHORIZING ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATIONS
FOR THE TOWN OF MOORESVILLE, MORGAN,
COUNTY, INDIANA, FOR THE YEAR 1952.

Be It Ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Moore-
ville, Indiana:

Section I.

By reason of extraordinary emergency existing requiring the
expenditures of additional funds of the General Fund due to the
subscription of the employees of the Town of Mooreville, Indiana
to the Federal Old Age and Survivors Insurance, the situation has
occurred which necessitates the appropriation of a new fund to
include the portion of tax to be withheld from each employee's pay-
ment in the amount of 1% of the total taxable payment made each
month to each employee.

Section II.

Be it further Ordained that to meet the emergency as hereto-
fore defined, for the current year, the following sum of money
be appropriated and ordered set out of the funds of said municipality,
subject to the laws governing the same,

1. \$150.00 for Old Age and Survivors Insurance Fund

Be it further Ordained that the said fund being stated in the
total amount for the year 1952 be hereby appropriated and transferred
to the newly created fund, as stated above.

Section III

Be it further Ordained that notice be given by publication as
by law provided fixing the date when the same will be heard, con-
sidered and determined and at which time and place taxpayers will
be heard.

Section IV.

This ordinance to be in full force and effect from and after its passage and the notice and hearing thereon.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooreville, Indiana met in regular session in the Municipal Building on Tuesday May 6th at 8 P.M. with all members responding to roll call with the exception of Kenneth Fields. Mr. Elvin Shepherd served as the President Pro Tem in the absence of Mr. Fields. Mr. Butler, Town Attorney was also unable to attend this meeting due to the election, serving as County Election Commissioner.

The minutes of the meeting of April 1st were read. It was moved by Gregory and seconded by Tutewiler that the minutes be acceptable as read. Motion carried.

The Treasurer's report was given next showing a balance of all funds to be \$30,953.61. It was moved by Tutewiler and seconded by Rushing that the report be acceptable as read. Motion carried.

A report came from the cemetery committee next saying that Mr. Fields, Rushing and Tutewiler had inspected the drives and found a great need for a more uniform method of entering and leaving the cemetery. The cemetery committee proposed a plan of cutting a new drive to the south of the chapel which would join the present drive just east of the chapel now. The entire Board found favor with this plan and it was motioned and approved to have this new drive made just as soon as possible, by Memorial Day if it can be had.

The Park Committee reported that the drives had been graveled there with fine stone and also the new mower had been secured and Mr. Henderson had the park in good order.

Marshal Rariden stated that he had inspected the street crossings as requested by the Street Committee and had found the need for 22 "Stop Signs". A discussion followed and it was moved by Rushing and seconded by Gregory that the Clerk-Treasurer be instructed to issue a purchase order to the State Industrial Ass'n for 24 signs and posts which would allow for the signs which might become damaged by motorists. This motion carried.

Mrs. Mary Jane McGuire was present representing the Mothers Club of the Mooreville Public School Corp. She presented a letter stating the need the Club had discovered for street patrol in the front of the school when the children were entering and leaving school. The Board felt the request to be a good and justifiable one and instructed Mr. Clarence Rariden to meet with Mr. Laughlin, Sup't. of Schools and discuss their need there and report back to the Town Trustees at their next meeting.

Next the street repair program for 1952 was brought up. It was moved by Gregory and seconded by Tutewiler that the Clerk-Treasurer be instructed to place legal notices for bidding in the newspapers and calling for unit bids from the Road Construction Co. only. This motion carried.

A request was read from Trustee Glidden asking for the privilege of using the old park mower for work in the cemeteries which were kept by Township Funds. It was moved by Gregory and seconded by Tutewiler that Mr. Glidden have the use of the mower. This motion carried.

Another request was read from Walter Weakley in concern of a large tree in the front of his property which had partially fallen in his yard and across the walk. Acting Pres. Shepherd instructed Mr. Horton, St. Comm. to see to the removing of the tree. This found favor with the Board.

A citizen's petition was brought forth next in concern of the proposed skating rink to be located at the corner of W. South St. and S. Indiana St. The petition was signed by approximately 90% of the residents in this vicinity. The petition was placed on file for further reference, but the Board took no action or stand since the skating rink was a proposal only and not a reality.

Tutewiler reported that the foot-bridge over GooseCreek had been washed away and it was moved by Gregory and seconded by Tutewiler that the bridge be replaced. Motion carried.

Complaints from disturbed citizens and the Board's investigation thereof resulted in the request of letters by the Clerk-Treasurer to Joe Mann and his brother for the removal of junked cars from the alley in the rear of the Mann property. A letter to each Wallace and Ollie Spoon for the removal of junk and personal property from the extreme west end of St. Clair St.

A letter of appreciation was requested to Charles Sawyer of the St. Highway Dep't. for his improvements on the highways in Mooresville.

Ordinance No. 1 calling for an additional appropriation of \$150.00 from the General Fund to be made into a fund to be known as the Old Age and Survivors Insurance Fund was given its second reading. no protests were made and it was moved by Tutewiler and seconded by Rushing that the Ordinance be passed and adopted by the Board of Town Trustees. Motion carried.

The claims were next read for the consideration of payment. After hearing them it was moved by Gregory and seconded by Tutewiler that all claims be allowed as read and warrants drawn from the Treasury for the same. They were:



The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, Indiana met in regular session in the Municipal Building on Tuesday June 3, 1952 at 8 P.M. with all members responding to roll call. Attorney Butler was also present at this meeting.

Minutes of the meetings of May 6th and 27th were read. It was moved by Tutewiler and seconded by Rushing that the minutes of May 6th be acceptable as read. Motion carried. Moved by Tutewiler and seconded by Shepherd that the minutes of May 27th be accepted also. This motion carried.

Mr. E. F. Hadley was present being concerned with some badly needed graveling of Hadley St. Mr. Hadley further stated that it seemed that approximately 150 yds. of gravel would be needed and invited the inspection of Mr. Horton of the condition of the street. It was moved by Tutewiler and seconded by Gregory that Mr. Horton inspect Hadley Street and see to making some improvements there. Motion carried.

Raymond McDaniel, Commander of the local V.F.W. Post along with a number of fellow-members was present being concerned as to the continuance of the holding of fish-frys on the town streets. A previous informal discussion of the Town Trustees had produced a suggestion as allowing the old fire station for the local clubs projects instead of the uptown street corner. The V. F. W. protested against using the fire station. Round table discussion followed by each member present and it was finally suggested that the fish-frys might be had uptown trying the opposite side of the street and being more cautious in cleaning up after each affair, to which the V. F. W. found agreement. Other clubs were to be notified of this suggestion with each reservation made in the future.

As stated at the May 27th meeting, the contract for the repairing of the town streets for the summer was brought up next. The bids as submitted were again read and after discussing them it was moved by Shepherd and seconded by Tutewiler that the Board of Town Trustees accept the bid of the W. C. Hargis Co. of Terre Haute which was the lowest of the 3 bids. This motion carried.

A proposal in the form of diagram was presented next for the proposed opening of a new street to be known as Mills st. to be located between W. High St. and W. South St. from the St. Road west to the first alley east of Lockerbie St. The Board did not find favor with this proposal due to the fact the street would have no outlets other than alleys.

President Kenneth Fields next stated that as the term of School Board Member Walter Smitherman would be expiring with the first day of August, as set out previously, the new appointment or re-appointment must be made at the June meeting of the Town Board. Mr. Fields stated that nominations were in order for this office at this time. The name of Alvin Scott was placed in nomination by Albert Tutewiler. President Kenneth Fields placed the name of Walter Smitherman. Elvin Shepherd moved the nominations be closed with a second by Roy Rushing. Balloting for the candidates was done secretly in handwriting. Ballots collected and opened by Attorney Butler with each member and Clerk-Treasurer keeping tally; resulting in 3 votes for Alvin Scott and 1 vote for Mr. Smitherman. Thus Mr. Alvin Scott to become the new School Board member as of August 1, 1952 for a period of two years.

Immediately after this appointment a letter was presented by President Kenneth Fields from Mr. Walter Smitherman tendering his resignation from the present School Board membership as of the meeting date of the 3rd day of June, 1952. It was moved by Gregory and seconded by Rushing that the resignation of Mr. Smitherman be acceptable at this time. President Fields stated that nominations were in order for the appointing of a person to fill the vacancy made thus by the aforesaid resignation of Mr. Smitherman. It was moved by Gregory and seconded by Shepherd that Alvin Scott be appointed to serve the unexpired term of Mr. Walter Smitherman as of June 3, 1952 to August 1, 1952. This motion carried unanimously by roll call. Clerk-Treasurer so instructed to notify these men of the actions of the Town Trustees.

Marshal Rariden stated that he had contacted Mr. Laughlin, Sup't. as instructed at the May meeting in concern of the congestion of traffic at the school. Mr. Laughlin suggested that a plan be worked on this summer and initiated with the start of school again in September between the town and school officials. The Town Board found favor with this plan and instructed the Clerk-Treasurer to so inform the Mother's Club of the suggestion.



The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, Indiana met in regular session in the Municipal Building on Tuesday July 1, 1952 at 8 P.M. All members responded to roll call with the exception of Albert Tutewiler. Attorney Butler was also present at this meeting.

Minutes of the meeting of June 3rd, 1952 were read and it was moved by Gregory and seconded by Shepherd that the minutes be acceptable as read. Motion carried.

The Treasurer's report was read showing a total of all funds to be \$40,748.86. It was moved by Rushing and seconded by Shepherd that this report be acceptable as read. Motion carried.

President Fields next declared that the 4th Ward of the Town was vacant of a Trustee due to the fact that Mr. Albert Tutewiler had moved to the country during the past month. Mr. Fields further stated that nominations were in order for the filling of the vacancy created by Mr. Tutewiler.

Herman Gregory presented the name of Harmon Allison. There were no other nominations so Elvin Shepherd moved the nominations be closed with a second to the motion being made by Roy Rushing. Thus President Fields declared Mr. Harmon Allison appointed by acclamation to the office of Trustee of the 4th Ward of the Town of Mooresville.

Mr. Allison was present at the meeting at the meeting and was administered the oath of the office of Trustee at that time by the Clerk-Treasurer. Mr. Allison's Trusteeship to become effective as of this meeting.

Several visitors were present among whom was Mr. James Blythe of the Mooresville Public Service Co. who explained to all present of a joint petition of the Mooresville Public Service Co. and the Indianapolis Power and Light Co. to the Public Service Co. of Indiana for the right to improvements in the lighting systems of the Town of Mooresville. Mr. Blythe had brought along with him, a new lamp of the type to be installed in the town which was of the very newest and carried an automatic system of turning on and off with the lightness and darkness of the hour. Mooresville now has 104 open type lights costing \$25.00 per light, 19 larger lamps costing \$35.00 and 4 large post lights costing \$50.00. Under the new lighting there would be 23 lights costing \$35.00, 90 lights costing \$35.00 and the immediate lights uptown to remain as they are and cost the town the amount of \$45.00 or an increase of \$1120.00 per year for a new modern lighting system provided no additional lights were added, however Mr. Blythe explained that the addition of more lights during the period of installation would be very small in cost and should be made at this time. It was moved by Gregory and seconded by Rushing that the Board of Town Trustees favored the improvement of the lighting system, to which a unanimous consent was made. Since the old contract of lighting does expire with the 1st day of October, 1952 it was suggested by Mr. Blythe that perhaps the new contract would be presented near the 1st of September at which time, it was hoped

that 90% of the new system would be installed and operating.

Dr. Van Bokkelen, Pres. of the Chamber of Commerce was presented next with a proposal which was one which has been discussed at numerous intervals before; that of the Town adding the costs in their budget now being prepared for a police car. Mr. Bennett present with Dr. Van Bokkelen stated that they would take the responsibility of making ballots which would be distributed to every citizen for voting as to whether they favored the purchasing of a police car and report the findings of the ballots to the Board in time for the completing of the budget. It was moved by Rushing and seconded by Gregory that the balloting system be used. Motion carried and Mr. Bennett and Dr. Van Bokkelen stated that they would see that the ballots were printed and distributed immediately.

Gene Elkins was heard next with a complaint of the bad condition of drifts and debris in GooseCreek running to the rear of his property. He asked that if it be possible that the willows be cut and the drifts be cleaned out along with the removing of old bridges which had been washed away. President Fields stated that the Board would send a representative to look over this matter and attend to it as soon as possible.

The Clerk-Treasurer stated that she had contacted the W. C. Hargis Co. in respect to commencing some street work and presented the representative of the Hargis Co. who was present at this meeting and he stated that they would begin oiling of the alleys immediately if the Town so desired, to which they asserted that they did and also wished the completion of the entire work at that time if possible. It was stated by the Hargis Representative that the trucks for oiling would be in Mooresville the next day.

Next the claims were read for consideration of payment. It was moved by Allison and seconded by Shepherd that the claims be allowed as read and instructed the Clerk-Treasurer to issue warrants for the same. The claims were:

The claims were read next for the consideration of payment. After hearing them it was moved by Gregory and seconded by Shepherd that all claims be allowed as read. They were:



Fields explained that temporarily this work had been put aside due to the resurfacing of the town streets, but that this work had been completed and the work on Goose Creek would begin immediately.

Rev. John Suttentfield was present stating that he wished to resign as the president of the Recreation Program due to the fact that he would be away for at least a 9month period for an operation and he felt that his absence would hinder the work of the Recreation group. It was moved by Shepherd and seconded by Rushing that Mr. Suttentfield's resignation be accepted. This motion carried. Rev. Suttentfield stated that he would help in any way in the selection of a replacement. The appointment of a new Recreation Board member was tabled for the time being with investigations to be made during the month.

Chester Edwards was heard with the interest of the improper approach of a county road being made onto Harrison Street in the front of his home. Mr. Edwards explained of the observance of several near accidents and feared for the safety of the citizens. This road comes up a steep incline and squarely and directly onto Harrison St. without any method of being able to see an approaching car from any angle from either street or road. An motion was made by Harmon Allison and seconded by Roy Rushing that the County Commissioners be contacted on a more safe plan for this street entrance. Motion carried. President Fields appointed Mr. Allison to contact Mr. J. Everett Hadley, Pres. of the Board of County Commissioners.

The matter of the consideration of a new police to replace Clarence Rariden was brought up next. Applications having been received all during the last two weeks in August were placed before the Board and each and every application was read and given due consideration. From the group of applicant the Board of Trustee agreed by unanimous decision that three persons be called for special interview who were namely Mr. Andrew Noel of 45 N. Mount St., Indpls., Mr. Folie Shaw of Brooklyn, Ind. and Mr. Richard Keller of Mooreville. This interview to be by special meeting on the 9th of September at 8 P.M. by request and special call of President Fields.

Ordinance No. 3 of 1952 was given first reading showing the resolution of the Board of Town Trustees to instruct the Clerk-Treasurer to transfer the sum of \$1000.00 from the Park Fund to the Recreation Fund set up by an earlier Ordinance. Due to a depletion of funds for operating expenses within the Recreation and due to a substantial balance in the park fund in excess of expenses was this made. It was moved by Rushing and seconded by Shepherd that this Ordinance be passed. The existing of an emergency has been created and calls for the second reading of this Ordinance which was had and it was moved by Gregory and seconded by Allison that this Ordinance be passed and adopted. This motion carried.

Ordinance No. 4 of 1952 was given its first reading at this time showing the need for additional appropriations in the amount of \$3625.00 in the street fund from unexpended balances, \$1000.00 in the Recreation Fund from excessive expense funds of the Park Fund, and \$275.00 from the General Fund from unappropriated balances of this fund. It was moved by Shepherd and seconded by Allison that this Ordinance be passed. Motion carried. Clerk-Treasurer instructed to proceed with proper legal procedure of printing of these Ordinances and Notices to Taxpayers.

Another Ordinance was read amending and Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance creating a Fund to be Known as a "Permanent Maintenance Fund" for the Cemetery of the Town of Mooreville and Providing for the Making of Mortgages Loans

Therefrom and Prescribing certain Duties of the Clerk-Treasurer in Connection Therewith and Providing for Certain Charges and Fees and the Sale of Lots in Said Cemetery" amended to read that hereafter the sale of each grave space to be \$40.00 each. Baby Graves to be set by the cemetery Sexton according to the size of grave. It was moved Allison and seconded by Rushing that this Ordinance be passed. Motion carried.

Next the claims were read for consideration for payment. After hearing them it was moved by Gregory and seconded by Shepherd that the claims be allowed as read. Motion carried. The claims were:


There being no further business at this time it was moved by Allison and seconded by Shepherd that the meeting adjourn in continued session until the 9th of September, 1952. This motion carried.

It was moved by Gregory and seconded by Rushing that this ordinance be passed. Motion carried. Clerk instructed to publish Ordinance properly.

Ordinance No. 7 of 1952 was given its first reading next fixing the salaries of the police officers and calling for an additional appropriation from unexpended balances of the General Fund to cover the remainder of the salaries for the balance of 1952 in the amount of \$875.00. It was moved by Shepherd and seconded by Allison that this Ordinance be passed. Motion carried and the clerk was instructed as to publication on this matter.

President Fields stated that nominations were in order for the appointment of the third police officer, since there would be a vacancy by the shifting of the officers by the death of Clarence Rariden. It was moved by Harmon Allison and seconded by Herman Gregory that the name of Richard Keller be placed in nomination. President Fields called for additional names, and there were none. President Fields further stated that the nominations be closed with a second by Elvin Shepherd. Motion carried. Thus Richard Keller was appointed to his office by acclamation, to serve on the second shift. Mr. Keller had been previously interviewed at the September appointment and was also present at this meeting. Mr. Keller was called forward where he received the oath of his office and the certifying of his appointment.

Mr. Delbert Hobson was present at this meeting as a response to an invit-

from the Board of Trustees to give an accounting as to the progress of the survey work in establishing the town boundaries. Mr. Hobson stated that he had been working at various intervals most of the summer and had accomplished quite a bit, but he had much work yet to do before he could start drawing any definite lines. The Trustees asked that he continue on his work.

Mr. William Cox representing the Mooresville Public Service Co. was present to offer the contract for town lighting for a five year period until September 1, 1957. After examination of the contract it was moved by Allison and seconded by Shepherd that the Town of Mooresville accept the contract offered by the Mooresville Public Service Co. and it was passed for the signatures of the members.

At this time Ordinance No. 5 calling for Additional appropriations in the street fund in the amount of \$3675.00, \$1000.00 in the Recreation Fund and \$275.00 in the General Fund was given second reading and it was moved by Rushing and seconded by Gregory that this Ordinance be passed and adopted. Motion carried.

The Clerk-Treasurer stated that the State Tax Board had called a meeting in Martinsville and had cut the town budget for 1953 by 17¢ in the street fund due to an excessive working balance. The General Fund and Bond fund remained as the Town Board had created it.

It was moved by Gregory and seconded by Shepherd that this Ordinance be passed and adopted by the Board of Town Trustees. This motion carried.

Business being completed for the evening it was moved by Shepherd and seconded by Rushing that the meeting adjourn in continued session which had previously been requested by President Fields for the public hearing on the additional appropriation of the \$875.00 until the 18th day of November, 1952. This motion carried.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooreville met in continued session as per request of President Fields on Tuesday, November 18, 1952 at 8 P.M. in the Municipal Building with all members responding to roll call. Also present at this meeting were a number of visitors.

There were no citizens present however complaining against the \$875.00 additional appropriation to complete the payments in the police dep't. for the remainder of 1952.

The clerk-treasurer stated that she had received a billing from the Times in the amount of \$10.26 which was for legal publication on the changing of G. I. Avenue to Maple Lane. The citizens on the former G. I. Ave. had been contacted on the amount which they agreed to assume, but to date no payment had been made to Mr. Bennett of the Times. It was moved by Gregory and seconded by Allison that the Town of Mooreville allow this bill of \$10.26 to the Mooreville Times if the citizens continued to let the bill be delinquent. This motion carried.

Mr. Chester Francis, Trustee of Madison Twp. and Mr. Horace Hypes a neighbor were present and wished to be heard on the proposal of a plan whereby a system could be worked out for the fire protection of all the citizens in Madison Township. Mr. Francis suggested that a flat fee might be paid to the Town of Mooreville, or the joint ownership of a firetruck or a third method of a small flat fee with another payment with each fire call answered. The Board of Town Trustees were quite interested in aiding Madison Township with their fireprotection problems and suggested that a joint meeting of the Madison Township Advisory Board with the Trustee as well as the Advisory Board of Brown Township and Trustee Fred Glidden along with the officials of the Town of Mooreville and see if a definite conclusion might be reached in regards to this matter. The said meeting to be called in the very near future.

Mr. Gene Elkins and Mr. Albert Tutewiler were heard next with a complaint on the drainage of Goose Creek. Mr. Tutewiler stated that a large willow tree had grown from the center of the bed of Goose Creek and had thus caused the creek to fork and the water was eating away his ground. Mr. Tutewiler presented his abstract to his property through which Goosecreek runs and showed the Board where an agreement had been made and recorded in his abstract whereby each year the Town of Mooreville was to assume the obligation of cleaning out GooseCreek and keeping it under control. Mr. Elkins was present for the same situation of damage by Goosecreek to his property. The Trustees assured Mr. Elkins and Mr. Tutewiler that the matter would be taken care of just as soon as possible.

Charles Hillman owner of the local Recreation Room on East Main Street wished to present his request next in a matter of keeping his business open on Sunday. Mr. Hillman stated that he would keep hours only after church in the morning and close before church met on Sunday evening. Since the presence of pool tables might be the question, the Board of Trustees asked that they be allowed a two weeks period on this answer and promised that they would consult Attorney Butler on this matter.

A change in the street lighting in one place was brought up next. It was discussed by the Board and a motion was made by Harmon Allison that the street lamp over the entrance of the old cemetery on West Wash. St. be removed and placed in the center of the block on Morgan Street from Jeffers to N. Indiana near the John Thomas property or the intersecting of the alley and Morgan Street. This motion was seconded by Shepherd and carried unanimously.

Mr. Shepherd presented a request from Mr. E. F. Hadley for some additional gravel to be placed on the east end of Hadley street near where some new homes were being completed. Mr. Hadley stated that there was practically no gravel on the street in this vicinity. Approximately 6 loads was requested. It was decided that the appropriations for gravel should be consulted before the granting of this request.

Requests have been made too for the improving of the alley leading from the Legion Building onto Monroe Street and it was decided that Mr. Glen Latta should be contacted to grade the alley first of all.
