
Allison moved and Shepherd seconded that grave openings and sale of lots be under direct supervision of the Clerk-Treasurer. The motion carried.



The Board of Trustees of The Town of Mooresville met in regular session in the Municipal Bldg. on Feb. 1, 1955 with all members responding to roll call. Their Attorney, Mr. Gilbert Butler, was also present as was the Brown Township Trustee, Mr. Claude Utterback and members of the Brown Township Advisory Board, namely, Mr/ Charles King, Mr. Gordon Whitaker and Mr. W.O. Denny.

The minutes of the meetings of Dec. 7, Dec. 28, and January 4th were read. Rushing moved and Gregory seconded that the minutes of Dec. 7 th and 28th be acceptable as read and the minutes of Jan. 4th, 1955 were accepted after being corrected. The minutes stated that Mr. Butler was present. This statement was in error.

The Treasurer's report, showing a balance of all funds to be \$38,572.63, was read. Rushing moved and Allison seconded that the Treasurer's report be acceptable as read. The motion carried.



(Minutes of the meeting of February 1, 1955, cont.)

The Brown Township Trustee and Advisory Board was present to discuss, with the Board, the problems concerning the Fire Dept. Wilson explained to the new members of the Advisory Board, the operations of the city and township Fire Department, as a unit. Then, a lengthy discussion was held concerning the different ways that the two units could operate a Fire Department. Mr. King explained that the Farm Bureau members had voted among themselves to maintain their own Department. Trustee Utterback made a report of the Trustee's expenditures on the Township Truck in the last 10 years. This was a rough estimate. Wilson, then made a comparative report of what the Town had spent on the 2 trucks in maintenance, men, insurance, etc. in the last 10 years. Fire Chief Monday then reported that in the last four years the Department had made 18 country ~~fires~~ and fire runs and 80 within the city limits. Allison next read ~~the~~ to the group, the contract that was drawn up when the Township was purchased about 10 years ago. He also explained to the new members of the Advisory Bd. the plans that were discussed at an earlier meeting. A plan was arrived at by the two groups whereby a flat sum of \$1000.00 ~~would be paid by the Township~~ up to 20 fires and \$50.00 per fire over 20, would be paid by the Township to the Town for the services of men and truck and equipment. The Advisory Board decided they would have another meeting and meet with the town at a later date.

Paul Michael then made a report to the Board on the specifications advisable for the needs of a Township Truck.

Ralph Bailey was present and discussed with The Board his availability for the vacancy created by the resignation of Wm Taylor. Since he was going to school and would be available for only two shifts, The Board decided that it would be unfair for him to assume either of the two shifts and try to go to school too and also unfair to the other three Marshals as they would like to keep the system of rotation as it is.

Dean Abbott and Harold Bridges discussed with the Board the possibility of ~~the Town~~ and The VFW sponsoring a 4th of July Fireworks ~~celebration~~ display and also a week long carnival. The 4th of July affair would be put on with some aid from the Town in exchange for Extra Police Detail at Old Settlers. They decided to discuss it ~~with~~ at their next meeting and report to the Board later.

Charles E. Dowell appeared before the Board in regards to the vacancy in the Police Dept. After discussing his qualifications, Mr. Dowell, who lives on East Main St., was told that he would be notified of the decision of The Board.

After a short discussion, ~~The Board~~ Shepherd moved and Allison seconded that Mr. Dowell be hired as Marshal of The Town of Mooresville to serve during the pleasure of The Board. The motion carried. The Clerk was instructed to notify Mr. Dowell of his appointment.

Shepherd moved and Allison seconded that Miss Elsie Record be appointed to The Library Board for a term of four years, beginning January 1, 1955 and ending December 31, 1958. The motion carried.

Allison moved and Gregory seconded that effective immediately, <sup>(the charge for)</sup> ~~all~~ opening of graves that require "boxcar vaults", which are oversize vaults, would be \$35.00 an opening and the regular size would remain \$25.00. The motion carried.

After discussing the difficulty of getting help on Sundays, Allison moved and Rushing seconded That, effective immediately, there would be no Sunday burials and none before 2:00 o'clock on Mondays. The motion carried.

Shepherd moved and Allison seconded that Marshals Kenworthy, Horton and Taylor be paid ~~extra~~ for the month of January, due to the absence of Marshal Rusie, at which time the three Marshals worked Rusie's shifts. Motion carried.

Allison moved and Rushing seconded that The Clerk-Treasurer's salary, that is taken from the parking meters, be raised from \$20.00 a month to \$25.00 a month effective January 1, 1955. This move was made in keeping with the fixing of the Clerk's yearly salary at budget making time in July, 1954. The motion carried.






The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooreville met in continued session on Monday March 7, 1955 in the Municipal Bldg. with all members responding to roll call.

The minutes of Mar. 1, and Mar. 9, were read and the Chairman declared them approved, as read.

The Treasurer's report, showing a balance of all Funds to be, \$34167.78, was read. Rushing moved and Shepherd seconded that the Treasurer's report be acceptable as read. The motion carried.

Mr. <sup>MITCHELL</sup> Michael Denny appeared before the board regarding the annexation of his subdivision ~~what her~~ or not the area included in the proposed annexation to the town was granted. After a discussion, he was advised to let the county and town attorneys confer. In the discussion it was brought out that the board favored his proposal, even if their suit for annexation should be defeated, provided (1) That the two attorneys approve (2) That Denny fix the bridge between the highway and said subdivision. ORDINANCE NO. 2-1955, 1955

ORDINANCE DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND AUTHORIZING  
ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE TOWN OF MOORES-  
VILLE, MORGAN COUNTY, INDIANA, FOR THE YEAR 1955.

Be It Ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Moores-  
ville, Indiana:

SECTION I

Whereas, a contract and agreement made between said Town and Brown Township, in which said Town is located, for the joint ownership and maintenance of fire fighting equipment, has been terminated and the Township has acquired the equipment heretofore jointly owned, leaving said town with inadequate fire fighting equipment and by reason thereof an extraordinary emergency exists requiring expenditure of additional funds of the General Funds of said town to purchase additional fire fighting equipment.

SECTION II

Be It Further Ordained that to meet the emergency heretofore defined for the current year, the following sums of money be appropriated and set out of the funds of said municipality, subject to the laws governing the same:

1. Properties - Fire Truck Equipment and alteration, \$2700.00

The source of said funds being as follows:

- (a) Proceeds sale of old fire truck \$ 500.00
- (b) Parking Meter Funds, heretofore transferred to the General Fund 2000.00
- (c) Unexpended balance of Fire Hose and Equipment Acct. 2-25(252) 200.00

SECTION III

Be It Further Ordained that notice be given by publication fixing the day when the same will be heard, considered and determined and at which time and place taxpayers may be heard.

SECTION IV

This ordinance to be in full force and effect after its passage, due notice and hearing thereon.



Shepherd moved and Denny seconded the nomination of Mr. Park to succeed himself. Since there were no other nominations, he was elected by acclamation, his term to expire July 31, 1957.

A group of citizens were present to speak in the interest of a clean up campaign. Mr. H. D. Coleman cited the need for cleaning back yards, alleys and named some undesirable places that needed attention.

Mr. & Mrs. Ray Ulrey spoke of conditions in their neighborhood where animals were kept. Mr. Forest Gray spoke on the same subject. They inquired about ordinances prohibiting the keeping of animals within the city limits.

Mr. Harvey Richer and several others spoke of conditions in the north east part of town where rabbits, pigeons, etc. are being kept and of the unsanitary side of it. They asked the Board's co-operation in cleaning this up. They also complained of some of the activities of children in the neighborhood and asked about a curfew law.

Mr. Rebecca Shields spoke on the bus situation regarding some buses being removed from schedule. Since the town has no control over the bus line, no action was taken. She asked if the Greyhound Line would come through here, if they could stop at the Municipal Building. She was told they could.

After some discussion Allison moved and Rushing seconded that a letter be sent to both the State Board of Health and State Fire Marshal's Office, asking them to send a representative of their departments to meet with members of our Board on July 13th. The Board would take them on inspection trips to different parts of the town and if this date is not satisfactory ask them to set a date. This motion was carried.

The publisher of the Times was asked to publish notices of weed cutting and to prepare hand bills concerning all these conditions to be distributed to each house in town.

Mr. Eugene Antrim then asked permission to tap on to the city sewer. He also asked permission to level the alley near the home he is building. This was referred to the street committee.

Walter Smitherman appeared and asked permission to cross West Harrison Street with the sewer in improving the property he has recently purchased. This was granted.

Mr. Dixon next reported on some street conditions near his home where the new black topping is being carried away on cars. The street commissioner was instructed to fix these places, Mr. Kendall was also told that in his repairing sewers, to block off any place where raw sewage is coming into a street sewer until the source is discovered. The drain on the west side of North Indiana Street was next discussed. Rushing moved and Allison seconded that the street commissioner proceed with this replacement.



The farm machinery being kept on the street on West Main and North Jefferson was brought to the attention of the Board. They were advised by their attorney, that they had a right to ask that these be moved from the streets.

Rushing asked if the ball diamond at the Park was under supervision of the Recreation Committee. He was told that it was. Three men namely Mr. Warren Armstrong, Mr. James Wood, and Mr. William Altman were named to work with Mr. John Moore. They are to be notified that they have been named. Also letters are to be sent to James Beasley and Garland Keck giving them this information.

The roof on the Municipal Building is in need of repair and it is to be investigated and work done on it.

The alley west of the Public Service Company was brought to the attention of the Board. It was suggested this be included in next year's budget.

The Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to get letters to Pennsylvania Railroad and to Stikely-Van Camp Company asking them to cut the weeds on property belonging to them.

Trailer permits were presented and Mr. Kendall instructed to inspect them, including one back of Leland Jessup's.

A large fan was placed in the room for approval and the Board agreed to purchase this.

Leonard Horton was named to be in charge of police at Old Settler's.

The Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to write to Moore & Hager, Engineers & Designers and ask them to come to a Board meeting with their plans and specifications.

Whereas, by reason of the location of said street, adjacent to the Mooresville public schools and the memorial dedicated to members of the armed services who served from said community, there has been public demand that the name of said street be changed to Memorial Drive.

Be it therefore ordained that the name of Kelly Street in said town of Mooresville be changed to Memorial Drive.

Be it further ordained that the Clerk-Treasurer be authorized to give notice to the public and file for record certified copy of this ordinance with the Recorder of Morgan County and be it further ordained that the Recorder of Morgan County, Indiana be authorized to note upon the plat on file in her office the change in the name of such street.

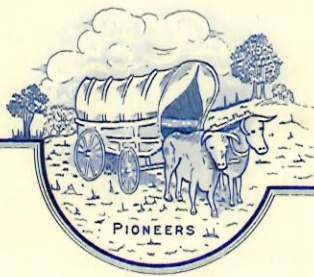
