The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooreville met in their first meeting of the New Year with all members and their attorney present. The meeting was called to order with Trustee Roberson presiding. Opening prayer was by the Assistant minister of the Christian Church.

The minutes of the December meeting were read. Hawkins moved and Einfeldt seconded they be approved as read. Carried.

The financial statement showed a balance in all funds to be \$37,462.43. This is approximately \$3500.00 more than the balance December 1956. Einfeldt moved and Asbury seconded the report be accepted. Carried.

Einfeldt reported that Mr. Wraight of the State Board of Health had contacted him regarding the status of the sewers and urging that something be done. He offered to meet with the Board to try to come to some plan. A meeting was set for January 23rd.

The subject of the existing tax on Pool Rooms was discussed. After a discussion, Einfeldt moved and Asbury seconded the tax be left as is.

Correspondence from the Lion's Club and the Public Service Co. was read and filed.

The contract with Gooding amusement Co. was presented and the Clerk instructed to sign.

A letter concerning rabies was read in which the Town was informed that the quarantine is on for six months. Disposal of loose dogs is the present question.

Mr. Fulford reported that Judge Sedwick had ruled that due to the fact that he had been approached before the hearing, he could not conscientiously hear the Glendale case. Another Judge has been chosen but no date set.

A study of the ordinances of 1956 and 1957 showed that certain properties had not been transferred from the Township to the Town. However Mr. Fulford feels that he can correct this in time for the tax list.

Ordinances governing firemen's compensation and Clerk-Treasurer's salary were adopted.

The Clerk was instructed to write the State Highway Department asking them to paint the curbs at the intersections of the State Highway 67 and the Valley at the Church of God and the entrances to the D X Station.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooreville met in regular session February 4th at the Municipal Building. The meeting was called to order at 7:30 P.M. with all members and Mr. Fulford the attorney present. Opening prayer was by Reverend Carmichael of the First Methodist Church.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read. Hawkins moved and Einfeldt seconded they be approved as read. Carried. The Treasurer's report showed a balance in all funds to be \$ 37,408.47. Hawkins moved and Einfeldt seconded the report be accepted. Carried.

Mr Fulford reported that the properties discussed in the last meeting had been transferred to the town tax list resulting in approximately \$930.00 additional taxes. He also reported the Glendale hearing had been ~~tentatively set for February 13th~~ tentatively set for February 13th.

Since there are several more properties that should be in the Town, it was agreed that a list should be made and given to Mr. Fulford at the next meeting.

The need for more cemetery land was discussed. Mr Fulford advised the Board on condemnation procedure. Mr. Mendenhall will be contacted and asked to sell without this ~~if~~. If this can not be done, steps will be taken as advised.

The parking meters have been giving a lot of trouble and the Clerk was instructed to write the company and ask if they have another kind and the price.

Mr Chas. Hillman, proprietor of the Pool Room was present to ask why he was charged a license when no other business was assessed that charge. After a discussion, ~~the~~ Gibbs moved and Einfeldt seconded the matter be tabled until next meeting when they will consider the request. Carried.

The Clerk was instructed to write the Indiana Rating Bureau and ask for a new rating in view of the fact the water system has been improved. Also to contact the safety department and ask for a traffic survey of the Town.

Gibbs moved and Hawkins seconded to advertise for bids for street repairs. Carried.

Mr Fulford presented a map showing the need for a right of way at the new bridge to be constructed west of Town. Hawkins moved and Asbury seconded the right of way be granted. Carried. The necessary papers were signed.

Asbury moved and Hawkins seconded to have the firemen wash the streets on their practice run. Carried.

Hawkins introduced the question of having envelopes for courtesy notices on parking meters but the plan was not thought feasible.

Since a former action did not seem to cover fully the move needed to have the streets replaced after cutting them, Hawkins moved and Einfeldt seconded to have the party wishing to cut the streets for any reason other than sewer construction post a bond large enough to cover cost of resurfacing. After the repairs have been made, satisfactory to the street committee, the bond will be returned. This is in addition to the action taken before.

The Board of Truxtees of the Tpw n of Mooresville met in regular session April 1, 1958. The meeting was called to order by the Chairman at 7:30. All members and their attorney were present. Opening prayer was by Reverend Miller of the Church of God.

The minutes of the previous session were read and declared approved as read. The Treasurer's report showed a balance in all funds to be \$32,389.19.

The first matter of business was a request from the Calvary Methodist Church to hold meetings on the ~~street~~. It was ruled previously that such meetings would be better held on the Town lot. They will be so informed.

Frank Mendenhall was present to discuss the purchase of some ground for the Cemetery. He ~~agg~~ agreed to sell the Town an acre for \$1400.00. They will also have the first chance at any more he sells adjoining the Cemetery.

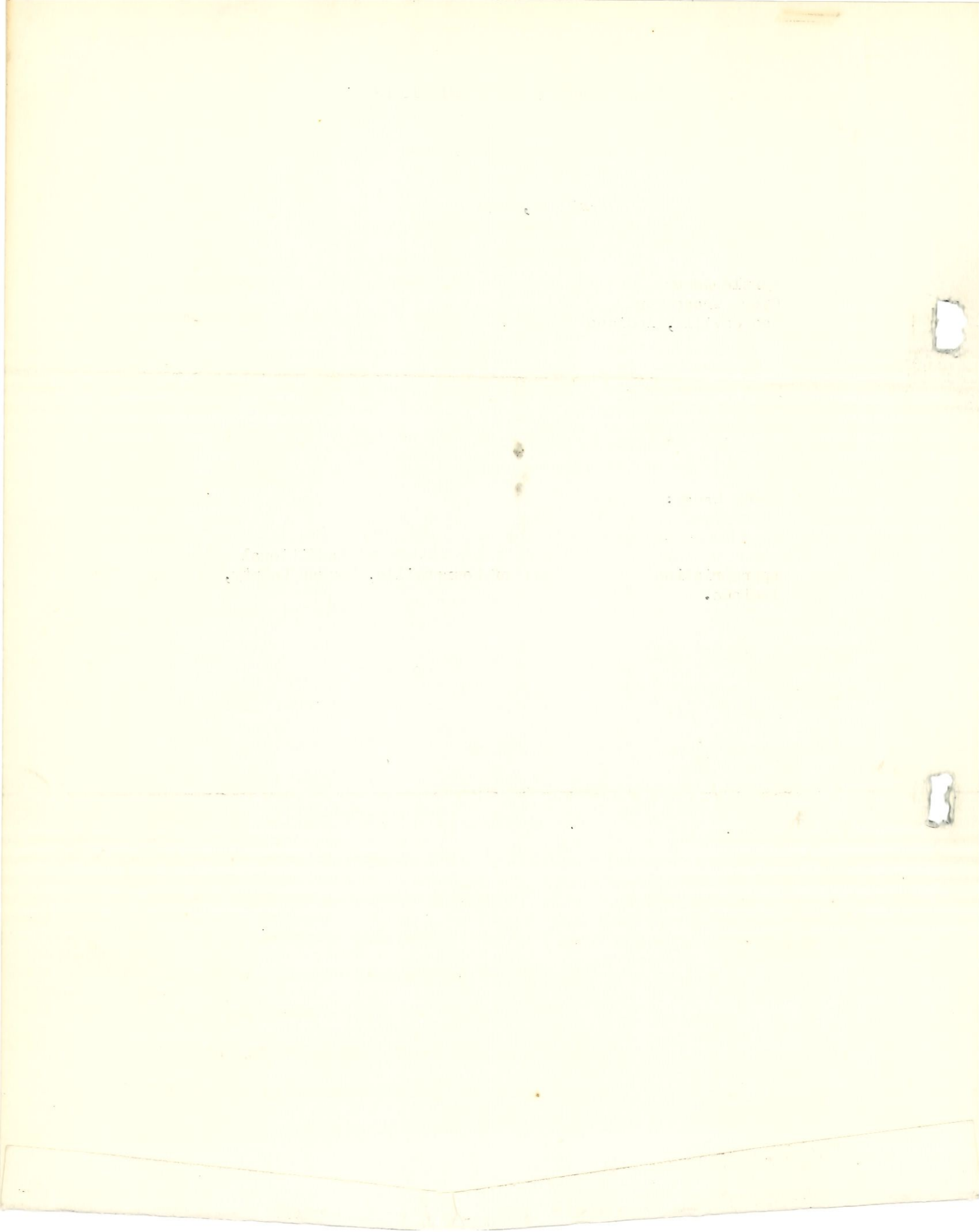

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooreville met in regular session October 7th with all members and their attorney present. The meeting was called to order by the chairmah and the opening prayer was by Reverend Shugart of the Friends Church.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and declared approved. The Treasurer's report showed a balance of \$34,667.37 in all funds.

Mr. Al Tutewiler was first to be heard. His concern was the condation of Goose Creek near his property. After examining an abstract which Mr. Tutewiler had, Mr. Fulford gave an opinion that this was the Town's responsivility. Mr William Bray had been contacted on this and had promised to see if Federal aid was available for this ~~1/2~~ purpose. *Mr. Tutewiler* He also cited a parking sign on Bridge Street which needed to be moved. Both matters were referred to the street committee. In addition to moving this ~~sign~~, the street commissioner was instructed to place a Stop sign at the intersections of Carlisle Street and St. Clair with the old Indianapolis road. This was by a motion made and properly seconded by Trustees Hawkins and Einfeldt.

Robert Dunn next presented a plat of the Harry Williams land which he has recently purchased. Quite a discussion was held which resulted in a diided opinion on a through street from Indiana street to the east line of Town. The ~~street~~ committee will meet with Mr. Dunn for further consultation on the matter.

Roy Rushing was concerned with the drainage on west Main street near his property and suggested that while work was being done on the Greencastle Bridge would be a logical time to take care of this.

Chairman Roberson read resolutions from the C. of C., the Lion's Club and the J.C.C.'s in which each organization pledged its support on the sewer program as it is revised. Their steps had been taken as result of a poll of their membership which resulted six to one in C. of C. and seven to one in Lion's Club in favor of this move. Einfeldt moved and Asbury seconded to have Mr. Fulford advise Moore & Heger take the necessary steps to begin on the plans. A roll call vote was taken on the motion resulting unanimously in favor. Hawkins moved and Einfeldt seconded to have a committee of three from each group meet with the Board at each meeting which concerns the sewer. Carried.

Gibbs proposed the following resolution due to change of time,

That the Board meet at 6:30 C.S.T.

Einfeldt moved and Asbury seconded to adopt the resolution. Carried.

Roberson reported on the work of the committee to improve some of the hazards etc. in the Town. As a result some places were found to be fire hazards and the Fire Marshal will be notified of these.

A letter eas read from the Public Service Company saying the requested installation of street lights had been made. The company requested the Board to instruct them as to the wattage ~~on~~ the light near the parking lot. Einfeldt moved and Asbury seconded that 189 watts was sufficient. Carried.

The condition of Morgan Street following heavy truck traffic was presented. Gibbs moved and Asbury seconded to place signs prohibiting trucks on Morgan and Washington ^{West 2nd} streets. Carried. The Police will be instructed to enforce this law.

The parking all day on Memorial Drive at the school house was brought to the attention of the Board. A letter will be written to Mr. Hert asking his cooperation in correcting this situation.

A fence on Clay Street presumed to be in the street was discussed. As soon as convenient this will be surveyed and the fence removed if found to be in the street.

A building at the Cemetery has been remodeled for a tool house.

The claims were presented for payment. Gibbs moved and Einfeldt seconded they be allowed and order deawn on treasury for the amounts. Carried.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooreaville met in regular session November 4th at 8:30 CST. All members and their attorney were present. Opening prayer was by Reverend Carmichael of the First Methodist Church.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and declared approved. The financial report showed a balance in all funds to be \$33,695.32.

The Clerk-Treasurer reported that the State Examiner had separated the Library account from the main Town account. It will be on the books as two accounts.

Mr. Norman Keith of W. Washington st. was present with the problem of draining the water from his property. On investigation, the street committee agreed to ditch it to the storm sewers on Washington Street. Mr. & Mrs. Keith will grant an easement across their property. Robert Dunn & Delbert Hobson presented two plats to the Board for consideration. One was a part of the Wheeler estate which is already in the Town. At this time he has platted the first section and wished it approved. This is called Crestwood Hills. Einfeldt moved and Asbury seconded approval. Carried. They next showed the fifth section Highland Meadows for annexation and approval. After a study, Hawkins moved and Einfeldt seconded the annexation and approval. Carried.

Request for street lights at Maple Lane and Greenwood Drive; In middle of Center Lane between Holliday Lane and North Drive; Sunset Manor and Morningstar Drive; Church and Indiana and Highland Drive and Indiana. Hawkins moved and Asbury seconded the request be granted and Clerk notify Public Service of same. Carried.

Several representatives from the civic organizations were present and heard Mr. Fred Heger of Moore & Heger present the revised plans for the sewer. After a careful study Hawkins moved and Einfeldt seconded to approve the revised plan suggestion on repairing the streets after the sewer is laid. This consists of relieving the contractors of replacing pavement with anything other than compacted crushed rock. Also that specifications include alternated for four pipes and joints. Carried.

Mr. Fulford reported that he had been asked to submit a new application for Federal aid. Minutes concerning this are attached.

Since the amount of gas bills has reached the sum of over one thousand dollars it will be necessary to submit bids for it for the coming year. Bids for this and also for a Police car were prepared for publication. *They will be opened Dec. 2nd*

A report from the State Fire Marshal's office showed that one building had been disposed of.

Since H.B. Monday, fire Chief, is in poor health, Einfeldt moved and Gibbs seconded that William Potter be appointed acting Chief until Mr. Monday has recovered. Carried

The Street Commissioner will be asked to place "No Parkings signs on the west side of alley east of Library.

Since there are a few places in town that need the attention of the State Board of Health, the Clerk was instructed to contact the State to find what day they could investigate.

WHEREAS, Form No. PHS 2654 entitled Application For Federal Grant For Sewage Treatment Works has been prepared and is ready for transmission to the State Board of Health, requesting federal grant in the amount of \$250,000.00 in the present sewer construction program; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Board of Mooresville, Indiana, that the matters contained in said application form are true and correct and are hereby approved by the Board and that Ralph Roberson, Jr., is hereby authorized to sign said application form for and on behalf of the Board of Town Trustees as Chairman and representative of said Board; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if a federal grant for the sewer construction project is made pursuant to the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, then the Town of Mooresville will pay the remaining costs of the approved project, and that the Town will provide proper and efficient operation and maintenance of the approved project after completion of the construction thereof.

Gentlemen:

We, the undersigned, seek your co-operation by herewith submitting to you a proposal which we deem a step in the right direction towards the improvements and betterments and safety factors for the town of Mooresville.

1. whereby an annual date be set by the town board, for example, May 1 of each year to promote an annual clean up.

2. between June 10 and June 20 each year an annual weed mowing period.

By setting the 2 above dates, the public would be educated to look forward to such an event and we feel that this system would eliminate a lot of lost motion and would clear the town board of many gripes.

3. We also feel that there are a very few people and property owners in the town who are responsible for certain menaces or unsightly conditions that could be removed, such as:

a. It is a known fact that Walter Merriman is responsible for permitting an old truck bed and heavy equipment to be stored and parked on the street on West Washington Street.

b. Brownie Latta is responsible for permitting and using the entire corner and street for the purpose of storing farm implements on W. Main and Jefferson Streets. Also he maintains a junk yard lot for the purpose of storing junked farm implements on what is known as the Kenley and Farmer lot at the corner of Harrison and Monroe Streets. Mr. Latta could beautify this corner by fencing it and could create a safety element by moving the equipment back from the corner so a clear view of approaching traffic could be had.

c. The Thompson junk yard is a very unsightly scene as the addition to the north or anyone approaching the town of Mooresville has to see this junk yard. This could be cured by a fence similar to the one at the Martin junk yard.

d. The Mendenhall corner which we understand is no longer in the corporation creates a hazard and an unsightly approach.

e. Dillon Haworth has an old shack of a building that could be removed without harming his property.

f. We also feel that Highway 67, being the approach from the new highway when it is completed, should be beautified to make this approach as attractive as possible. It would be an investment for the town as well as the business men and citizens of the community.

It is not the intention of the undersigned to create any ill feelings or any hardship on any of the above mentioned property owners but in order to have a better, cleaner and more attractive town, these are matters that could be corrected and be of benefit to every citizen of the community.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooreville met in regular session at 6:30 C.S.T. December 2, 1958. All members and Mr. Fulford, their attorney answered roll call. Opening prayer was by Reverend Insley of the Baptist Church.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and after one correction were declared approved. Financial report showed a balance in all funds to be \$30,397.07.

The matter of new lights for the offices was the first on the list. Gibbs moved and Hawkins seconded that new ones be installed by Harold Weddle. Carried.

The bids for gasoline for the next year were opened. Carl's Service and Allison's were the only bidders. The bids were taken under ~~advice~~ advisement. Gibbs and Einfeldt were appointed to study the bids and clarify certain aspects.

William Potter, Acting fire chief, was next heard. He requested the Department join the Morgan County Fire Association. He pointed out the advantages of belonging to this organization. Einfeldt moved and Asbury seconded they join the Association. Carried. He next asked for two more men as several of the members work out of town and one or two are unable to work at the present time. Mr. Adams will run a notice of this need in the paper. Mr. Potter spoke of the need for some new hose. Hawkins moved and Asbury seconded to buy the hose. Carried. Mr. Potter also told of the difficulty of outsiders getting in the way at a fire. Einfeldt moved and Hawkins seconded that Mr. Potter and Charles Nelson be appointed Deputy Marshals with power to arrest any violator at a fire. Carried. Both were subsequently sworn in as Deputies.

Four of the five men who had complained of an officer's conduct appeared and were asked to tell their side of the story. These were Orville Kekler, Thomas Bain, Carl Spoon and John Maxwell. When it was explained to them that the officer in question was trying to get a charge of drunken driving instead of a ~~very~~ minor charge, they seemed satisfied.

W.J. Neal of the School Board appeared with a problem concerning the sewers in connection with the new School building. He was concerned that if the sewer was stopped, the school would be left in a bad spot with no sewage disposal. Quite a discussion followed but no action could be taken.

Nominations were now declared open for Chairman of the Board for the ensuing year. Gibbs moved and Asbury seconded that Roberson be retained as Chairman. Since there were no other nominations Hawkins moved and Einfeldt seconded the nominations be closed and Roberson was declared elected.
