The condition of the Parking Meters was Next discussed. Einfeldt moved and Gibbs seconded that as had been done before, Officer Horton be designated as meter repair man. All others are to leave the repair work to him. *Carries.*

A letter from Prosser Co. and one from Moore & Heger concerning bids were read, given proper attention and filed. No action taken.

A letter from Leland Jessup, representing the Citizen's Committee, and the answer from the Board were read and filed.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met in regular session February 3, 1959 at the Municipal Building. The meeting was called to order at 6:30 C S T. All members and their attorney answered roll call.

The minutes of the two previous meetings ^{were read} and were declared approved. The financial statement showed a balance in the Town Funds to be \$38,110.07 and the Library Funds to be \$7,021.06.

Ordinance # 2-1959 was given 2nd and 3rd readings.

Hawkins moved and Asbury seconded to suspend rules and ~~pass~~ ^{be read} Carried. unanimously. Gibbs moved and Einfeldt seconded it be passed on third reading. Carried.

Mr Gordon from Clyde E Williams was present with some more information on the map of the Town. Since he did not have some of the necessary information, he will mail the exact prices to us. He quoted a price of \$717.30 without controls and \$842.30 with controls.

The Clerk-Treasurer was given permission to sign Gooding's contract for Old Settlers by a motion by Gibbs and a second by Einfeldt.

A letter from Mr & Mrs Fred Beall and Mrs Sarolta Loudermilk, in which they requested that their names be removed from the sewer remonstrance, was read and filed. They gave as their reason for this action that undue influence was used.

A letter from H.D. Coleman, in which he commended the Board on their stand on the sewer project, was read. He enclosed statements from both Plainfield and Brownsburg showing their true status on similar projects. They will be filed. The sewer situation was discussed but since another meeting has been set for this, no action was taken.

A number of names on petitions was submitted, for a plan commission. No action was taken on this.

The question of burning trash in the Cemetery was brought to the attention of the Board. Asbury moved and Einfeldt seconded that no more than was absolutely necessary be burned and that the amount that was burned be attended until destroyed. Carried.

Gibbs moved and Hawkins seconded to advertise for bids for resurfacing streets. Carried.

Mike Forrester was selected to replace Wm. Altman on the Recreation Committee.

On the question of cutting Harrison Street at Madison, it was suggested that Mr. Adams give the Board a letter stating the procedure especially in replacing the street. He will be so informed.

Mr. Charles *Lee* of the Dual Parking Meter Co. had talked with the Board previous to opening, showing the meter operated manually. He quoted a price of \$39.90 per meter with trade in of old mechanism. Since new meters are needed Hawkins moved and Einfeldt seconded to buy twenty five. Carried.

The Board of Trustees met in continued session Feb.24 at the Municipi~~l~~ Building at 6;30 C.S.T.All members and Mr.Fulford were present.

Wm.Kendall,Street Commissioner,reported on the sewer north of E.Washington street.Since the ground is so wet,it was agreed to leave further work on this until better weather.

M.O.Shrake was heard regarding parking on State Road 67 near his property in Glendale.This was taken under advisement.He also asked if something could be done about the alley near his home on Jefferson Street.

Leland Jessup and other members of the executive committee of the Citizen's Committee and presented a letter to the Board as follows;

To the Town of Mooreville;
Gentlemen;

In order to avoid future misunderstanding and further delay in the sewer improvement program,we desire to set forth our ideas of the compromise agreement which was reached in joint session with the town Board on February in the office of Mr.~~Her~~Robert Dunn.

1.The services of Moore & Heger are to be terminated unconditionally.They are to have no further part in the sewer program either active or advisory.

2. The selection of a new engineer or engineering firm, will be made jointly by the Town Board ^{and the executive Committee of the} Citizen's Committee for Good Government. The choice must be acceptable to both the Town Board and the Citizen's Committee.

3. The new engineer or engineering firm is to have contractual authority and instruction to scrutinize the plans, specifications and bids of the Moore & Heger proposed system, for the purpose of seeking more economical construction, maintenance and operation. This scrutiny is to include, and such provision is to be made clear in the contract, the present Imhoff Tank system, to determine ^{whether} it may be overhauled, rebuilt, enlarged, or additional facilities added to it, at a cost which would not be prohibitive, and result in yearly savings of great magnitude to the community. The Town Board must agree to accept whatever changes in present plans may be recommended by the new engineers if such changes will result in material savings to the community.

4. The Citizen's Committee is agreeable to a flat rate plan on a reasonable monthly basis with a connection fee not to exceed \$100.00.

Upon complete fulfilment of the conditions above set forth, the Citizen's Committee will petition the Morgan County Court to withdraw the remonstrance now pending in that Court. It must be here state that the Executive Committee has no responsibility for any action which might be taken by those who expressed a desire to keep the remonstrance in force. We do affirm the wish of our Committee that no action will be taken which is not in accord with the expressed desires of the majority who have voted to remove the remonstrance. v

We desire this communication to be read into the Town records and to become a permanent part thereof.

The Board of Trustees met in regular session March 3rd at 6:30 C.S.T. at the Municipal Building. All members and their attorney were present.

The minutes of four previous meetings were read and declared approved. The financial statement showed a balance in Town funds to be \$35,220.14 and in the Library Fund to be \$6,176.54.

Chairman Roberson presented a request asking that a Company be allowed to make a survey prior to asking for a franchise to run natural gas into the Town. This will be investigated further.

Mr. Bill Rogers reported concerning the sewer outlet on their property which was clogged. He said it had been cleaned out.

Al Tutewiler was present to ask about truck traffic on Washington Street. He was told that this affected mostly heavily loaded trucks from Construction Companies.

Concerning the sewer north of Washington Street which had been causing trouble, Robert Dunn said he would repair it and the Town could pay him when convenient.

The ordering of street signs was left to the Street Committee.

Hawkins moved and Einfeldt seconded to buy four shields and two name strips for the Police Car. Carried.

Richard Squires appeared concerning the aerial map of Mooreville. He asked to be considered in this project as he felt he could save some money. He was advised that he might ~~try~~ work on this.

Mr. Fulford reported on some investigations on the sewer progress. He suggested that it would be best to have a C.P.A. work with them on rates etc.

The J C C 's have requested the privilege of holding a fish fry on the corner of Indiana and Main Streets on May 9th. Einfeldt moved and Asbury seconded they be allowed to have this. Carried.

The Street bids were opened next. Shumaker Bros., North Side Paving, Roadways, Hartman Bros. Ralph Rogers Co., and F.S. Grady were the bidders. Due to the slight differences in some of the bids, they were taken under advisement until a later meeting.

Mr. L.I. Couch and Mr. Haller, Engineers conferred with the Board on the sewer project. Gibbs moved and Einfeldt seconded they be accepted as Enginners to replace Moore & Heger. Carried.

Hawkins moved and Asbury seconded to retain Mr. Shelton ss A. C.P.A. to work with Mr. Fulford on details.

Hawkins moved and Asbury seconded to direct Mr. Fulford to prepare a letter of intent. Carried.

Filling the vacancy in the Police Force was the next item to be considered. Chief Poe was called to sit in on this. It was explained to him that he was to have complete charge of the force with the exception of hiring and discharging, which would be done with the approval of the Board. After studying the applications for the position, Einfeldt moved and Hawkins seconded that Harold Kenworthy be accepted on a ninety day probationary period. Carried.

Einfeldt moved and Hawkins seconded the permission be granted. Carried. Other complaints will be handled as soon as possible. The question of the hydrants in the Dunn eighth addition will be turned over to the new Board, as were the gas bids.

Richard Squires reported that he had been unable to finish the aerial maps, but that he intended to do this on his own in the spring after which he would have maps available to the Town at considerable saving.

Einfeldt moved and Gibbs seconded to give Mr. Roberson a vote of thanks for his efficient work as Chairman. Carried. Ralph then expressed his appreciation for the cooperation he had received and for the pleasure of working with the Board.
