

ORDINANCE NO. A. 1936.

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING MONIES FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING THE EXPENSES OF THE SEVERAL DEPARTMENTS OF THE CIVIL TOWN OF MOORESVILLE, INDIANA, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 1936, AND ENDING DECEMBER 31, 1936.

WHEREAS, it is necessary to curtail the expenditures of the Town of Mooresville, Indiana, for the year 1936 due to the action of the County Board of Tax Adjustment, and in anticipation of the amount of monies to be received for the year 1936,

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, Indiana,

SECTION 1. That for the expenses for the Town Government and its institutions for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1936, the following sums of money are hereby appropriated and ordered set aside out of the funds herein named and for the purposes herein specified; such sums herein appropriated shall be held to include and fix the salaries of the persons or officers therein named for the fiscal year 1936.

SECTION 2. That for said fiscal year there is hereby appropriated out of the General Fund of Said Town, the following:

SECTION 3. That for said fiscal year there is hereby appropriated out of the street fund of said Town, the following:

SECTION 4. That for said fiscal year therei is hereby appropriated out of the Bond Fund of said Town , the following:

SECTION 5. This ordinance shall be construed to be amendatory and of supplemental to an ordinance passed and adopted by the Town Board on the 20th day of August, 1935, and shall expire on the 31st day of December, 1936, and all ordinance in conflict herewith or hereby suspended during the exi stance of this ordinance. It being the intent of this ordinance that it shall supercede any and all ordinances heretofore adopted, governing the appropriations for the year of 1936.

SECTION 6. WHEREAS, an emergency exists for the immediate taking effect of this ordinance, the same shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.

Mooresville, Indiana, January 7, 1936.

Board of Trustees met in regular session with all members present. Chairman Wilson called the meeting to order. The election of a President for the Board of Trustees for 1936 was next in order.

It was moved by Cox and seconded by Sage that Wilson be nominated. Moved by Cox and seconded by Sage that nomination be closed. Wilson being the only member nominated, was declared elected by acclamation.

The minutes of January 1st meeting was read and approved as read. Moved by Cox and seconded by Sage that written Report of Treasurer be accepted. Motion carried.

Motion made by Cox and seconded by Bellows that Charles H. Foley be nominated as attorney for a period of One year and salary to be \$8.00 per meeting night as per call by Board and as no other nominations were made, Foley was elected by acclamation, and it was moved by Cox and seconded by Sage that Clerk-Treasurer notify Attorney Foley of same and request him to be present next meeting night. Motion carried.

The President then appointed the following Committees:

Cemetery - - - - -	Sage and Antrim.

President Wilson appointed Bellows and Sage as an auditing Committee to meet at their convenience and audit the Treasurer's Book for year 1935, and report at next meeting.

The Clerk-Treasurer then read the following ordinance:  
(Ordinance NO. A. 1936 attached)

By unanimous consent of the Board an emergency was declared for the passage of said ordinance. It was moved by Cox that said ordinance be placed upon its passage. Seconded by Bellows. Motion carried. It was moved by Cox that said ordinance be adopted, Seconded by Sage and Roll Call was called. Antrim - Aye, Bellows - Aye, Sage - Aye, Cox - Aye. Ordinance Adopted.

President Wilson spoke of some kind of a Binder for filing ordinances and by consent of Board, ordered Clerk-Treasurer to purchase binder and that meeting be called in the near future for revising of old ordinance file.

President Wilson asked that Clerk-Treasurer report next meeting night on amount of outstanding Main Sewer bonds of Town of Mooresville. The Board requested that Clerk-Treasurer get information as to cost and date of publication of a later Edition of Town and Cities Law Book.

Moved by Antrim that Marshall be instructed to get prices on brick to be used on sewer and report back to Board. Seconded by Cox. Motion carried.

Moved by Cox and seconded by Bellows that Clerk-Treasurer be instructed to give an order to Myron McKinley for 8 Manhole Rings and covers. Motion carried.

Marshall Reported that he had prices of sewer jacks from Columbia Construction Co., and by consent of Board Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to give order for same.

Antrim reported the purchase of Lumber at \$15.00 per M from Bergen & Bergen.

Clerk-Treasurer instructed to get information from State Board of Accounts in regard to manner of handling funds of new sewer construction.

Charles Bailey appeared before the Board in regard to an ordinance as to the loading and unloading of coal from cars, and the Board instructed Clerk-Treasurer to look up the ordinance and report finding to Marshall.

It was reported that Forrest Rusie had made application for re-instatement on the Fire Department and Board referred same to Fire Chief Perry.



Marshall reported that E. K. Lindley had asked that an Assessment of \$3.00 be returned to him on Cemetery lot that he had purchased with perpetual upkeep. Board instructed Mr. Lindley to file claim for same.

Cox reported that as approximately \$545.00 had been spent during past year for labor at Cemetery that the Sexton should be employed on yearly basis.

It was then moved by Cox that Omer Carlisle be employed at \$60.00 per month as Sexton of Cemetery, beginning January 15, 1936. Seconded by Sage. Motion carried.

Moved by Cox that Clerk-treasurer give notice to John B. Shrake (now Sexton) that his time as sexton of cemetery expires January 15, 1936. Seconded by Antrim. Motion carried.

Moved by Cox and seconded by Bellows that Nightwatchman Switz time expires February 3, 1936. Motion carried.

Mr. Terrell of the Crawfordsville Foundry, Crawfordsville, Indiana, appeared before Board and exhibited a nozzle for attaching to fire hose for cleaning of sewers at a cost of \$32.50 and explained its usage.

Moved by Antrim that if agreeable with Mr. Terrell, nozzle be left until next month on trial and if proven satisfactory to be purchased by Town. Seconded by Cox. Motion carried. Board instructed Clyde Ferguson to try the nozzle and report to board.

W. D. Anderson proposed to sell Roll Top Desk and a table that is now in the Marshall's office to the Town for \$5.00. Moved by Cox and seconded by Bellows that purchase be made. Motion carried.

Mooreville, Indiana, January 13, 1936.

The Board of Trustees met in Special Session in response to Notice duly sent each member; pertaining to sewer project and any other business that might come before the Board. All members were present. The misunderstanding as to the ordering of 8 manhole covers and rings was discussed and the Board instructed Clerk-Treasurer to purchase 6 manhole covers and rings from Halton Searce Lumber Company at \$13.00 each together with \$4.18 freight and an additional 2 to be ordered from Myron McKinley through the C. & G. Foundry.

In regard to purchasing Steps needed, same was referred to Sewer Committee, with power to act.

Board instructed Clerk-Treasurer to deposit money paid by Lot owners into an account as R. S. Moon, Trustee Sewer Account and pay claims as passed and allowed by Board.

In regard to root cutter, it was moved by Antrim and seconded by Bellows that same be returned to Mr. Terrell. Motion carried.

Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to request Jake Mann to remove brick and other material from Cemetery lot where mausoleum was started.

John Shrake appeared before board and delivered maps and records to Board. It was moved by Antrim and seconded by Bellows that a vote of Thanks be extended to John Shrake for his services as sexton and for records and maps. Motion carried.

Moved by Sage and seconded by Cox that a Vote of Thanks be extended to the Citizens Bank for the clock donated, to Mr. Milhon for repairs made and to R. Aldrich for finishing clock. Motion carried.

Mr. Hadley appeared before the Board in reference to the bad condition of side walk on Washington Street and asked that when such improvements are made by Town, that this sidewalk be given consideration.



Attorney Foley reported that he had investigated suit now filed against County Auditor by Town and that he had filed a new suit and asked permission to dismiss old suit. Permission was given.

Attorney Foley was instructed by board to prepare an ordinance on Garbage Disposal for the Town. Also a New Cemetery ordinance.

In the matter of appointment of a Nightwatch, applications were received from John Switz and Earl Morgan, each presenting a petition in support of their application. It was moved by Antrim and seconded by Bellows that Switz continue as Nightwatch until farther notice. Motion carried.

Moved by Bellows and seconded by Sage that Clerk-Treasurer be authorized to purchase a new minute book, ordinance binder and other supplies as needed. Motion carried.

Board instructed Clerk-Treasurer to purchase a used typewriter.

Mooreville, Indiana, March 3, 1936.

Board of Trustees met in regular session, all members present.

Minutes of the meeting of February 4th were read and approved as read. Written report of Treasurer was approved.

A letter addressed to Charles H. Foley, from the Public Service Commission, was read, in regard to the appraisal and audit of properties in Mooreville, stating that said appraisal and audit was not completed. Attorney was instructed to follow up correspondence.

Committee on sewers reported that work on sewer project is progressing satisfactorily. W. D. Anderson asked that Town furnish a pump for use at sewer project. Same referred to sewer committee with power to act. In regard to claim of \$100.00 of A. H. Moore, Engineer on Sewer project, the Board instructed the Clerk-Treasurer to write Mr. Moore in regard to same, ascertaining by whom he was employed.

Cemetery Committee reported that work done in cemetery is satisfactory, and Section Carlisle reported that bricks had been removed from around mausoleum. In the matter of removing mausoleum base, it was moved by Cox and seconded by Bellows that the Clerk-Treasurer contact Albert Buckner, and if it can be removed by him for \$35.00, to inform him to proceed with the work.

A proposal from W. H. Rusie was presented to the Board, that for the sum of \$38.50, that he would remove plaster, furnish all labor and material from replastering building at Cemetery. Moved by Cox that Rusie's offer be accepted. Motion was lost for want of second. By consent of the Board matter was carried over to next meeting.

Ordinance B 1936, "An ordinance creating fund to be known as "Permanent Maintenance Fund" for the cemetery of the Town of Mooreville and providing for the making of mortgage loans therefrom," was given first reading.

The members of School Board appeared before the Board and reported that the School Town and the Township would not have sufficient funds with which to complete High School Annex, that the Public Works Administration had allocated funds for said project and under present estimates the School Board would require and estimated \$5,000.00 of additional funds and requests Town Board to take such steps as are necessary in order that the Town might furnish this sum for the purpose of assisting in the construction of the School Building in Mooreville. That it was necessary to make a promissory statement to the effect that the good faith of the Board was pledged to secure said additional sum of money, for the use of the P.W.A. in the next few days. Mrs. Vernon, Mr. Caldwell and members of the School Board spoke in favor of it.

Mooresville, Indiana, April 7, 1936.

The Board of Trustees met in regular session with all members present. The Minutes of meeting of March 3rd and continued session of March 4th, were read and approved as read. The written report of the Treasurer was approved.

Mr. A. H. Moore being present stated that a new revised plat of the Town could be made for approximately \$60.00. The Board decided to meet at a later date to decide on same.

As to the loose brick on the west side of Morgan Lodge No. 211, <sup>Building</sup> the Marshall reported that he had taken the matter up with the Trustees of the Lodge, but had not received any further report from them.

W. D. Anderson reported that Mrs. Chandler had objected to new sewer system being laid in alley by her property. As no record was found of the alley having been vacated, Mr. Anderson was instructed to proceed with sewer project.

The Street Committee reported that Mr. Ralph Neal offered \$2.00 for two T irons on East Washington Street and had agreed to repair street after removing them. Board instructed Marshall to let him remove them and see that street was properly repaired.

Motion was made by Cox and seconded by Antrim that Clerk be instructed to write the Union Telephone Company, requesting them to place telephone wires underground beginning at Broad Alley to the first alley south of High Street. Motion carried.

Marshall reported that several complaints had been made about the length of time that it requires the Stop and Go sign to change.

Board instructed Marshall to repaint the Parking Space signs.

The Board instructed the Clerk-Treasurer to write the following property owners and ask that side walks in front of those properties to be properly repaired. Same to be done under instruction of Street Commissioner Aldrich. Mrs. Matthews' side walk in front of Post Office. Motion made by Bellows and Seconded by Cox that policies be accepted. Motion carried.

Moved by Cox and seconded by Sage that seven (7) men instead of eight (8) men be used on Fire Department. Fire chief Perry to designate same. Motion carried.

Glover Nelson, Agent of State Automobile Insurance Company, appeared before the Board in reference to Liability and Property Damage on Fire truck, at a cost of \$58.00 per year. The Board delayed same until next meeting night.

Fire Chief Perry reported that fifty (50) feet of the Town's fire hose had been loaned and not returned. Marshall was instructed to have same returned.

Park Committee reported that the work in park of removing trees was being done. Clerk Treasurer reported several inquiries had been received in reference to exclusive privileges on concessions at Old Settlers' Picnic and for furnishing entertainment. Board delayed all action on picnic until a later date.

It was moved by Antrim and seconded by Cox that the bid of \$39.50 received from Wm. H. Rusie for removing plaster, furnishing all materials and replastering, with white coat finish on building at Cemetery be accepted. Motion carried.



Clerk-Treasurer was instructed by Board to issue Ira Marley duplicate Cemetery Deed for Lot 4, Block ~~1~~ <sup>10</sup> as requested by Mr. Marley.

The request of George Killian to purchase South one-half Lot 51, Block 5 in Cemetery at price which he gave for north one-half of \$28.00 was refused.

An ordinance entitled "An ordinance creating fund to be known as "Permanent Maintenance Fund" for the Cemetery of the Town of Mooresville and providing for the making of mortgage loans therefrom and prescribing certain duties of the Clerk-Treasurer in connection therewith and providing for certain charges and fees and the sale of lots in said Cemetery," was given second reading. It was moved by Cox and seconded by Sage that the ordinance be placed upon its passage. Motion carried. It was moved by Cox and seconded by Bellows that the ordinance be adopted. Motion carried. Roll Call Vote: - Antrim - Aye, Bellows - Aye, Sage - Aye, Cox - Aye. The ordinance is now presented to President Wilson for his approval and signature and is hereby made a part of this record.

Ordinance C 1936 "An Ordinance providing for the removal of the Garbage from within the corporate limits of the Town of Mooresville, and defining garbage and providing penalty for the violation thereof," was given first reading.

Motion was made by Antrim and seconded by Cox that Clerk-Treasurer purchase 1 Mace and 1 Twister for Marshall. Motion carried.

Attorney Foley reported that Wm. A. Cox had been appointed Justice of Peace for Brown Township, ~~Mooresville~~ by the Board of County Commissioners, and the Board instructed the Clerk-Treasurer to inform Mr. Cox to qualify for the appointment.

AN ORDINANCE CREATING FUND TO BE KNOWN AS

Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of

SECTION I

That there is hereby created a fund to be known as "Permanent Maintenance Fund" for the permanent maintenance, repair, care and upkeep of the Cemetery now owned by the Town of Mooreville, said fund to consist of the following:

A. Fifty per cent (50%) of the proceeds derived from the sale of lots within such cemetery, the income from which shall be added to and become a part of said fund from time to time.

B. Any gifts, donations, bequests, or devises of money or property, real or personal, or any interest or income derived therefrom, Provided that if any gifts, donations, bequests, or devises of property or money, real or personal, is given or made from the use of a particular lot or plot of ground the same shall be equal to fifty per cent (50%) of the sale price of said lot. Then, in such event the income therefrom shall be used for the upkeep and maintenance of such particular lot or plot of ground only and for no other purpose. If said gift, donation, bequest, or devise, as aforesaid, be in a less amount the same shall go into said fund, generally.

Provided, However, the lots heretofore sold shall not be included in those to receive permanent maintenance, repair, and upkeep, unless and until the owners thereof, or some person on their behalf,

And Provided Further, that the principal of said fund shall never be depleted. The income therefrom can only be used for the purpose as hereinabove set out in this Section.

#### SECTION II

Except as otherwise provided in this ordinance, it shall be the duty of the Clerk-Treasurer to keep said fund and any accretion there- to on deposit in an authorized depository of the Town until such time as said funds shall become sufficient to justify the loaning of the same, as hereafter provided.

#### SECTION III

Whenever said fund shall have accumulated to a sufficient amount to justify the loaning of the same upon mortgage security, it shall be the duty of the Clerk to receive applications for such loans, and to loan the same upon first mortgage security upon the terms and conditions, as hereinafter provided.

#### SECTION IV

It shall be the duty of the Clerk to publish by newspaper advertisement, the cost not to exceed \$1.50, the amount of money on hands to the credit of said fund subject to the loan in all cases where there is \$1000.00 in such fund to be loaned. He shall also at all times keep posted upon the bulletin board in the Municipal Building the amount of money in said fund subject to loan.



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#### SECTION V

Such loans shall be made by the Permanent Maintenance Fund Board which shall consist ex officio of the Clerk and the President of the Board of Trustees and one person who shall be appointed for a term of two years by the Board of Trustees. The appointment by the Board of Trustees shall be so made that not more than two members of the Permanent Maintenance Fund Board will at any time be adherents to the same political party. The Board shall inform itself of the value of the real estate offered in the mortgage and be satisfied of the validity of the title thereto. Every person applying for a loan shall produce and furnish the necessary title papers, and an abstract of title, which shall be examined and approved by the Town Attorney, and which shall show to the satisfaction of the Town Attorney and the Board, a good and sufficient title in fee simple without encumbrances, not derived from the sale for taxes.

#### SECTION VI

Applicant for a loan for a part of said Permanent Maintenance Fund shall make an oath that there is no encumbrances or better claim to his knowledge, and the Abstract of title presented by him is, as he believes, a true one.

#### SECTION VII

It is hereby made the duty of the Board of Trustees at their first regular session after the taking effect of this act to appoint three reputable free holders, any two of whom without concurrence of the third may act as Permanent Maintenance Fund appraisers. Such appraisers shall be selected with reference to their knowledge of real estate values in and about the Town of Mooresville, It shall be the duty of said appraisers to make all appraisements of lands upon oath as required in this ordinance. Said appraisers, or any



#### SECTION V

And incase any of such appraisers is at any time disqualified, by reason of their kinship or interest, from acting, the appraisement shall be made by the other appraisers who in case of disagreement shall select a third appraiser. Said appraisers shall receive as compensation the fees hereinafter provided.

#### SECTION VIII

Said appraisers, being first duly sworn or affirmed, shall examine and appraise such land and sign and give to the applicant a certificate setting forth the fair cash value of the land at the time without taking into consideration perishable improvements.

#### SECTION IX

In making such loans, preference shall be given to the inhabitants of the Town of Mooresville.

#### SECTION X

The principal of all the money belonging to the Permanent Maintenance Fund hereafter loaned shall bear interest at the rate of 5% per annum, payable semi-annually from the date of the loan.

#### SECTION XI

The amount loaned to any one person, corporation, firm or individual, from said Permanent Maintenance Fund shall not exceed the sum of \$ 2,500.00 .

#### SECTION XII

The sum loaned shall not exceed one-half of the assessed value of the premises proposed to be mortgaged, as such premises were last assessed for the purpose of taxation. In all cases where perishable improvements upon real estate are accepted as a part of the security for any such loan, the real estate and perishable improvements shall



of them, may be removed and new ones appointed by said Board at any regular or special session. And in case any of such appraisers is at any time disqualified, by reason of their kinship or interest, from acting, the appointment shall be made by the other appraisers who in case of disqualification shall select a third appraiser. Said appraisers shall receive no compensation the fees hereinafter provided.

#### SECTION VIII

Said appraisers, being first duly sworn or affirmed, shall examine and appraise such land and give to the applicant a certificate setting forth the fair cash value of the land at the time without taking into consideration probable improvements.

#### SECTION IX

In making such loans, preference shall be given to the inhabitants of the Town of Northville.

#### SECTION X

The principal of all the money belonging to the Permanent Maintenance Fund hereafter loaned shall bear interest at the rate of 5% per annum, payable semi-annually from the date of the loan.

#### SECTION XI

The amount loaned to any one person, corporation, firm or individual, from said Permanent Maintenance Fund shall not exceed the sum of \$2,500.00.

#### SECTION XII

The sum loaned shall not exceed one-half of the assessed value of the premises proposed to be mortgaged, or such greater were first assessed for the purpose of taxation. In all cases where probable improvements upon real estate are accepted as a part of the security for any such loan, the real estate and probable improvements shall



be appraised separately, and there shall be procured by the borrower a policy, or policies, of fire and toronado insurance issued by a company, or companies, duly authorized by the Commissioner of Insurance to do business in this State, and <sup>deliver</sup> such policy, or policies, of insurance to the Clerk and shall keep such improvements ~~insured~~ in the matter, aforesaid, during the time that such loan is in force. The mortgage securing such loan shall contain the provision that such insurance shall be procured and kept in force as above provided. Upon the failure of the borrower to do so, the Clerk shall procure such insurance and the premium, or premiums, there~~for~~, shall be part of the debts secured by said mortgage, bearing the same rate of interest as the mortgage debt. And the further provision that such mortgage may, upon such default by such borrower, be foreclosed; such insurance shall in all cases be for a sum equivalent to 66 2/3% of the appraised value of such portion of such perishable improvements as is accepted as security for any such loan.

#### SECTION XIII

No loan shall be made for a longer term than five years, and any borrower of said funds shall have the right to pay not less than 10% of any sum loaned to him at the end of any year during the maturing of said loan, and shall not be required to pay any interest thereafter on such sum paid.

#### SECTION XIV

All forms to be used in the carrying out of this ordinance shall be secured at the expense of the Permanent Maintenance Fund, and shall be prepared by the Clerk upon the advise and with the assistance of the Town Attorney.

#### SECTION XV

The Clerk shall cause such mortgages to be recorded immediately.







#### SECTION XVI

All loans paid, and all interest paid, shall be to the Clerk-Treasurer, and his receipt shall be given to the payor and he shall make the proper entries upon his books.

#### SECTION XVII

Whenever the amount due on any mortgage shall be paid, together with the interest accrued thereon, the Clerk-Treasurer's receipt therefor shall be filed in the proper record, and the Clerk shall endorse on the note and mortgage that the payment has been fully satisfied, and surrender the same to the person entitled thereto, and release the same upon the record of mortgages in the Recorder's office.

#### SECTION XVIII

On the failure to pay any installment of interest when the same becomes due, the principal sum shall forthwith become due and payable, and the Clerk may proceed to collect the same by suit and foreclosure; and he may also by suit recover possession of the mortgaged premises before sale.

#### SECTION XIX

The following fees shall be paid in cases of mortgages for loan:

To each appraiser	\$ .50
For recording the mortgage	1.00
For drawing mortgage	1.00
For making borrower's affidavit	.10
For examination of title by Town Attorney	3.00

which said fees shall be paid by the borrower or retained from the amount of money loaned by the Clerk.

#### SECTION XX

The sale price of said lots shall be, and is hereby fixed as follows: For one full Lot, \$150.00; for one-half of one Lot, \$80.00; for one-fourth of one Lot, \$45.00; one single Lot for one grave only in a Section to be designated by the Town Board



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2.00	For examination of title by Town Attorney

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or Cemetery Committee, \$15.00.

The price for grave openings shall be, and is hereby fixed as follows: Adult graves for vault, \$10.00; adult grave for box \$ 8.00 ; child's grave, \$ 3.00 .

#### SECTION XXI

The undertaker or funeral director in charge of any burial in said cemetery shall be responsible to the Sexton for the payment of all grave openings.

The Clerk-Treasurer shall receive as compensation for his services performed under this and other ordinances governing the regulation of said cemetery a sum equal to 10% of the sale of all lots sold by him upon the payment of the cash or upon payment by promissory notes; and he shall also receive a sum equal to 10% of all the grave openings.

He shall file his claim for said commission, and file the same before the Board as other claims are filed.

He shall receive no commission upon any gift, donation, bequest, or devise of money or property, real or personal, as provided in subsection B. of Section I of this ordinance.

#### SECTION XXII

All sales of said lots shall be for cash or upon the following terms: 20% in cash and the balance evidenced by promissory notes in three equal installments due in 90 and 180 days and one year from date of issue, bearing interest at the rate of 6% per annum, waiving relief and providing for attorney fees, such a notes to be approved by the Clerk-Treasurer; and Providing further that if said notes are not paid when due the unused balance of said lot shall revert to the Town of Mooresville and may be resold without notice to the Purchaser. Deeds to said lots shall not be delivered until payment has been made in full in cash for said lots.







#### SECTION XXIII

No Lot in said cemetery shall have a second grave opening made thereon or a monument or marker erected thereon unless, and until, the purchase price has been paid in full in cash.

#### SECTION XXIV

The cemetery committee of the Town Board is hereby charged with the duty, together with the Clerk-Treasurer, to collect the balance of the purchase price on all lots on which payments are in arrears and to make such settlement as in their opinion the circumstances may justify.

PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that such settlements shall not be on such other terms or for a greater length of time than is provided for in the sale of a lot, and if settlement cannot be made the unused part of said lot shall be immediately offered for sale.

#### SECTION XXV

That should moneys accumulate in excess of current operating expenses, the Board may by unanimous consent of the majority of the members of the Board transfer such part of such current operating expense in excess of the amount necessary to operate for the present fiscal year, ~~in~~ which said ~~transfer~~ is made, to the permanent maintenance fund.

#### SECTION XXVI

The Clerk-Treasurer is hereby charged with the duty of keeping the proper books, ledgers, and accounts of said cemetery, and the owners of the lots therein, with such information as may be necessary for a clear understanding of the amount of money on hand, accounts delinquent, and the owners of the lots, and if the same are unknown they shall be so marked, and such other information as may in his judgment be necessary for a clear understanding of the accounts relative to the cemetery.



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The Clerk-Treasurer is hereby charged with the duty of keeping the proper books, ledgers, and accounts of said cemetery, and the owners of the lots therein, with such information as may be necessary for a clear understanding of the amount of money on hand, accounts delinquent, and the owners of the lots, and if the same are unknown they shall be so marked, and such other information as may in his judgment be necessary for a clear understanding of the accounts relative to the cemetery.



SECTION XXVII

That all lots or graves in said cemetery for which there has not been paid an assessment, or which has not been sold with permanent upkeep, or on which there has been no donation as provided in Section I of this ordinance the same shall be marked and shall not receive permanent maintenance repair and upkeep until such time as there shall be sufficient funds in said permanent maintenance fund to care for all lots in said cemetery.

SECTION XXVIII

All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION XXIX

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, as by law provided.

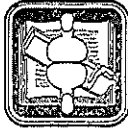

He asked that the Board give consideration to adding 20 additional Street lights at a cost of \$398.00 per year. Same was referred to Street Committee for further investigation.

The matter of use of sewer by the Mooresville Canning Factory was brought up by E. F. Hadley and after same was discussed by Board it was Moved by Cox and Seconded by Sage that the Town has no objection to the operation of the Mooresville Canning factory or the emptying of sewerage into the Town sewer, so long as they comply with the regulations of the State Board of Health in all respects and that Clark-Treasurer be instructed to send copy of minutes to Mooresville Canning Factory. Moved by Cox and Seconded by Antrim that Attorney be instructed to write or go in person to Public Service Commission and withdraw petition of rate hearing now pending of the Town of Mooresville. Motion carried.

Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to notify Del Ray Transportation Company and Indianapolis and Vicennes Coach Company, to send representatives to Mooresville to meet with Street Commissioner to arrange a Bus Stop for their busses while taking on and discharging passengers in Mooresville.

It was reported that when Fire Alarm is sounded the telephone company receives so many calls for information concerning fire, that it interferes with their regular service and asked the co-operation of the Town Board in curbing the number of calls received. The Board instructed the Clerk-Treasurer to contact patrons of the Telephone Company, asking their co-operation with the Company in this matter.
