B. E. Perry tendered his written resignation as Fire Chief. Moved by Cox and Seconded by Antrim that the resignation be accepted. Motion carried.

Moved by Sage and seconded by Antrim that the ditch on the North Side of West Washington Street be made in accordance with the Surveyor's Set up. Motion carried.

Street Commissioner reported there was considerable street patching that needed to be done. - Street Commissioner was instructed to contact Ralph Bray of Monrovia in reference to street Rooter.

Street Commissioner reported that Representative s from the Del Ray Transportation Company and the Vincennes Coach Company met with him and reference to a Bus stoppin Mooresville. The Del Ray Transportation Company agreed to use the space on the West side of Krogers Grocery on N. Indiana Street. The Vincennes CoachCo. objected because their time was limited.

The Board instructed the Street Commissioner to Call Mr. A. H. Moore, to come down and inspect sewer.

Fire Chief reported that he had appointed B. E. Perry, Tod Squires, Clyde Ferguson, S. A. Sellars, Paul Hunt, Forest Rusie, Ezra Fleener and George Elkins, as regular members of the Fire department, Also four deputies; Alden Beal, Wendell Moore, Everett Moore and Howard Allison. The extra members to be called, but to serve only when regular members are not present.

(Meeting of February 2, 1937, continued)

Cemetery Committee reported that they had investigated the tiling on the East side of the Cemetery and were of the opinion that it would take approximately 20 rods of tile for the main drain and 10 rods for branches. It was decided by the Board to defer this till a later date.

An Ordinance prohibiting the Use of White Canes, Except by Pedestrians Wholly or partially blind and providing protection against accidents to such persons and providing for penalties for the Violation Thereof was given first reading.

Attorney Foley reported he had called at the office of the Public Service Commission in reference to the withdrawal of petition for the Rate Hearing of the Town of Mooresville and was advised by the Secretary that it would be necessary to pay the amount of \$400.72 before the petition could be withdrawn. It was decided by the Board that no action be taken at this time.

ORDINANCE NO. 2, 1937.

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE USE OF WHITE CANES  
EXCEPT BY PEDESTRIANS WHOLLY OR PARTIALLY BLIND  
AND PROVIDING PROTECTION AGAINST ACCIDENTS TO  
SUCH PERSONS AND PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES FOR THE  
VIOLATION THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED, By the Board of Trustees of the Town of  
Mooreville,

SECTION I.

That for the purpose of guarding against accidents in  
traffic on the public streets, it shall be unlawful for any  
person, except persons wholly or partially blind, to carry or  
use on the public streets of the Town of Mooreville any canes  
or walking sticks which are white in color, or white with a red  
end or bottom. Such canes or walking sticks may be used on the  
streets and other public places of the ~~Town~~ by persons wholly  
or partially blind, as a means of protecting him, and for the  
purpose of identifying them, by drivers of vehicles, and operators  
of motor driven vehicles, and other pedestrians, with whom they  
come in contact on such streets and public places.

SECTION II.

Any driver of a vehicle, operator of a motor vehicle or  
pedestrian who is not wholly or partially blind, who approaches  
or comes in contact with a person wholly or partially blind,  
carrying a cane or walking stick white in color, or white with  
a red end or bottom, shall immediately come to a full stop and  
take such precautions before proceeding as may be necessary to  
avoid accident or injury, to the person so carrying a white cane  
or walking stick.



SECTION III.

Any person other than a person wholly or partially blind, who shall carry such a cane or walking stick, as described in Section I hereof, contrary to the provisions of this ordinance, or who shall fail to heed the approach of a person so carrying such a white cane or walking stick, or one with a red end or bottom, or who shall fail to come to a stop upon approaching or coming in contact with a person so carrying such a cane or walking stick, or who shall fail to take precautions against accident or injury to such person after coming to a stop as provided for herein, shall upon conviction be fined in any sum not less than Ten (\$10.00) Dollars, and each days violation of this ordinance shall constitute a separate offense.

## — Ordinance No. 2, 1937

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE USE OF WHITE CANES EXCEPT BY PEDESTRIANS WHOLLY OR PARTIALLY BLIND AND PROVIDING PROTECTION AGAINST ACCIDENTS TO SUCH PERSONS AND PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED, By the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooreville,

### SECTION I.

That for the purpose of guarding against accidents in traffic on the public streets, it shall be unlawful for any person, except persons wholly or partially blind, to carry or use on the public streets of the Town of Mooreville any walking sticks which are white in color, or white with a red end or bottom. Such canes or walking stick may be used on the streets and other public places of the Town by persons wholly or partially blind, as a means of protecting him, and for the purpose of identifying them, by drivers of vehicles, and other pedestrians, with whom they come in contact on such streets and public places.

### SECTION II.

And driver of a vehicle, operator of a vehicle or pedestrian who is not wholly or partially blind, who approaches or comes in contact with a person wholly or partially blind, carrying a cane or

... may be necessary to avoid accident or injury, to the person so carrying a white cane or walking stick.

### SECTION III.

Any person other than a person wholly or partially blind, who shall carry such a cane or walking stick, as described in Section I hereof, contrary to the provisions of this ordinance, or who shall fail to heed the approach of a person so carrying such a white cane or walking stick, or one with a red bottom, or who shall fail to come to a stop upon approaching or coming in contact with a person so carrying such a cane or walking stick, or who shall fail to take precautions against accident or injury to such person after coming to a stop as provided for herein, shall upon conviction be fined in any sum not less than Ten (\$10.00) Dollars, and each days violation of this ordinance shall constitute a separate offense.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 6, 1937

AN ORDINANCE DECLARING IT TO BE UNLAWFUL TO MAINTAIN AN APPROACH, DRIVE, OR ENTRANCE ACROSS ANY PUBLIC SIDEWALK, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

Section 1.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, that it shall be unlawful to have or maintain any approach, drive, or entrance across any public sidewalk of the Town of Mooresville, without having first secured a permit as hereinafter provided.

Section 2.

Any person desiring to maintain an approach, drive, or entrance across any public sidewalk in the Town of Mooresville, shall make an application to the Board of Trustees at any regular meeting of the Board.

If said Board of Trustees shall approve the same, they shall cause to be executed to said applicant a certificate thereof ~~executed~~ by the Clerk-Treasurer.

Section 3.

Any approach, drive, or entrance to any garage, service station, barn, shop, or place of business, where the same crosses the public sidewalk, shall be not more than 30 feet in width.

Section 4.

If more than one approach to any property across a public sidewalk shall be deemed to be needed by an applicant, the same shall be approved by the Board of Trustees as hereinbefore provided, but there shall be a pedestrian safety island of at least 18 feet radius placed between such approaches.

Section 5.

All permits for approaches, entrances, or drives across a public sidewalk of the Town of Mooresville shall be granted in the manner hereinbefore provided.

AN ORDINANCE DECLARING IT TO BE UNLAWFUL TO MAINTAIN AN APPROACH, DRIVE, OR ENTRANCE ACROSS ANY PUBLIC SIDEWALK, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

Section 1.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooreville, that it shall be unlawful to have or maintain any approach, drive, or entrance across any public sidewalk of the Town of Mooreville, without having first secured a permit as hereinafter provided.

Section 2.

Any person desiring to maintain an approach, drive, or entrance across any public sidewalk in the Town of Mooreville shall make an application to the Board of Trustees at any regular meeting of the Board.

If said Board of Trustees shall approve the same, they shall cause to be executed to said applicant a certificate thereof countersigned by the Clerk-Treasurer.

Section 3.

Any approach, drive, or entrance to any garage, service station, barn, shop, or place of business, where the same crosses the public sidewalk, shall be not more than 30 feet in width.

Section 4.

If more than one approach to any property across a public sidewalk shall be deemed to be needed by an applicant, the same shall be approved by the Board of Trustees as hereinafter provided, but there shall be a pedestrian safety island of at least 6 feet radius placed between such approaches.

Section 5.

All permits for approaches, entrances, or drives across a public sidewalk of the Town of Mooreville shall be granted in the manner hereinafter provided.

Section 6.

All approaches, drives, or entrances now in use across the sidewalks of the Town of Mooresville shall be made to conform to the requirements of this ordinance from and after its passage, and taking effect thereof.

Section 7.

All approaches, drives, or entrances across the public sidewalks shall be constructed at the expense of the adjoining property owner and shall be of concrete 8 inches in thickness. The mixture of the same shall consist of one part cement, 2 parts sand, and 4 parts gravel.

Section 8.

This ordinance is deemed to be necessary to the rights and safety of the citizens of Mooresville, and for the free and safe use of the public sidewalks in said Town of Mooresville.





An Ordinance Declaring It To Be Unlawful to Maintain an Approach, Drive, or Entrance Across Any Public Sidewalk, and Providing a Penalty For the Violation Thereof.

Ordinance Number 6, 1937

#### Section 1.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, that it shall be unlawful to have or maintain any approach, drive, or entrance across any public sidewalk of the Town of Mooresville, without having first secured a permit as herein-after provided.

#### Section 2.

Any person desiring to maintain an approach, drive, or entrance across any public sidewalk in the Town of Mooresville, shall make an application to the Board of Trustees at any regular meeting of the Board.

If said Board of Trustees shall approve the same, they shall cause to be executed to said applicant a certificate thereof by the Clerk-Treasurer.

#### Section 3.

Any approach, drive, or entrance to any garage, service station, barn, shop, or place of business, where the same crosses the public sidewalk, shall be not more than 30 feet in width.

#### Section 4.

If more than one approach to any property across a public sidewalk shall be deemed to be needed by an applicant, the same shall be approved by the Board of Trustees as herein-before provided, but there shall be a pedestrian safety island of at least 8 feet radius placed between such approaches.




