The treasurers report for February was read and approved.

Trustee Apple reported for the committee that it had investigated the complaints that offensive sewage was being deposited in the drain tile which empties into Clay street south of Hick Jackson's livery barn and had found the source of such sewage and had served the necessary notice for the abatement of the nuisance.

Upon motion of W. H. Henderson, seconded by J. S. Comer the following Resolution was passed, all members voting in the affirmative:

" Whereas, Carnegie Corporation of New York has agreed to furnish \$10000.00 to the Town of Mooreville and Brown Township, Morgan County, Indiana, to erect a FREE PUBLIC LIBRARY BUILDING, on condition that said Town of Mooreville and Brown Township shall themselves pledge by resolution of town trustees and township advisory board to support a free Public Library, at a cost of not less than \$1000.00 a year, and Provide a suitable site for said building: now therefore, BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Trustees of Mooreville Ind. that said Mooreville, Ind., jointly accept said donation, and does hereby pledge itself to comply with the requirements of said CARNEGIE CORPORATION OF NEW YORK.

RESOLVED, that it will furnish a suitable site for said BUILDING, and will maintain a FREE PUBLIC LIBRARY in said Building when erected, at a cost of not less than \$550.00 a year. Said building to be erected on lot No. 4, Block No 3, in the Town of Mooreville Indiana.

RESOLVED, that an ANNUAL LEVY shall hereafter be made upon the taxable property of Mooreville Indiana sufficient in amount to comply with the above requirements.

Your petitioners assign as reasons why said territory should be annexed to said town, the following:

1. That the persons residing in said territory have all the advantages of the town government and its various institutions and ought to share its burdens.
2. That the present corporate limits surround said territory on two sides.
3. That the present corporate limits are very irregular, while the above described territory, when brought into the town limits, will make the same straight and uniform on the Southwest side of said town.
4. That the public health and convenience requires that said territory should be under the jurisdiction of said town, that the same may be properly drained by substantial surface drainage and sewerage.
5. That the owners of said territory now have the advantages of water, improved streets and sidewalks, and electric lights along public streets between said territory and the business part of town, without paying anything therefor, and pay no taxes into the town treasury to maintain said public utilities.
6. That the owners of the property, constituting said territory, have fire protection, which is furnished and maintained by said town, without paying anything therefor.
7. That the owners of the property, constituting said territory, have the advantages of police protection and school privileges, without paying anything therefor.
8. That the said town needs additional revenue with which to maintain its schools and provide adequate means for the protection of its citizens and the prevention of fires.
9. That the said territory sought to be annexed has no public way of ingress to or egress from said town, except over and along the streets of said town, which are used by the owners of the ground constituting said territory, without paying anything for their maintenance.

10. That the land contained in said territory is greatly enhanced in value by reason of its proximity to said town.

11. That the inhabitants of said territory and the persons and corporations, who own the same enjoy all or many of the privileges of living within the said town without paying any taxes therefor, although their lands are largely increased in value by reason of their proximity to said town.

12. That said territory requires police surveillance, which can be better secured by municipal control.

13. That there are at present, streets and alleys in said town that have no outlet, but end at the corporate limits as now existing, and cannot be extended through any of said territory when needed and none can be procured, however much they may be needed by the public, and however much they may be of public utility and benefit.

Wherefore, said petitioners pray that your honorable body order, adjudge and decree that said territory be annexed to and incorporated within the corporate limits of said town of Mooresville and that the boundary lines and the jurisdiction of said town be extended over said territory as above described.

"AN ORDINANCE requiring peddlers, hucksters and hawkers to pay a license fee to the Town of Mooresville, Indiana, providing penalties for the violation thereof and for publication.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, Morgan County, Indiana, that it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to peddle any goods, wares or merchandise, whatsoever, by wholesale or detail, in or along the streets or alleys of the Town of Mooresville, Indiana, without first procuring a license so to do from the Town Clerk of said Town of Mooresville, as hereinafter provided. One person may take out any number of licenses in his own name, but a separate license fee shall be paid for each person employed by or acting for any one engaged in the business of peddling in said Town.

Every person who goes from house to house, or from one part of the public streets to another, in a vehicle or on foot, or with a push cart, offering for sale any goods, wares, merchandice, fruit, candies, poultry, produce or other articles, shall be deemed a peddler within the meaning of this ordinance, and the word peddler shall include hucksters, hawkers, and itinerant dealers as commonly used, and shall include also any person going about said Town on foot or otherwise, taking orders for, or selling any kind of goods, wares or merchandice by sample or otherwise to be afterwards delivered. provided, however, That nothing herein shall be construed to apply to drummers selling goods by sample to resident merchants, or to any person selling produce of his own raising or newspapers or to persons or corporations wholesaling or jobbing to merchants of said town.

Section II. Peddlers license shall be as follows, to wit: For foot peddlers using a one horse wagon, buggy, cart or push cart, the sum of one dollar (\$1.00) per day for one day; three dollars (\$3.00) per week for one week; Five dollars (\$5.00) per month for one month, and Twelve (\$12.00) dollars per year for one year.

For peddlers using a two horse wagon or vehicle, the sum of Two dollars (\$2.00) per day for one day; Four dollars (\$4.00) per week for one week; Six dollars (\$6.00) per month for one month, and Fifteen dollars (\$15.00) per year for one year. Provided, that the above named license fee shall apply to each person with each wagon or other vehicle or push cart.

Section III. All such license shall bear the date of issue, the time for which issued and the fee paid therefor, and for what and to whom issued.

Section IV. Every person desiring to procure a peddler's license shall pay to the Clerk of said Town the requisite sum, above stated, upon the payment of which it shall be the duty of the Clerk of said Town to issue said license to the person so paying therefor.

Section V. Any person, firm or corporation violating the requirements of this Ordinance, as to the payment of a license fee and taking out of a license, shall be fined in any sum not exceeding \$10.00 and each day's violation shall constitute a separate offense.

Section VI. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and publication for two consecutive weeks in the Mooresville Times, a weekly newspaper published in the

Mr. Henderson introduced the following ordinance:

"An ordinance to prohibit animals from running at large."

Section One. Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of Mooresville, that it shall be unlawful for any person owning or having the control or custody of any horse, mare, gelding, jack, jennet or mule, or any cow, heifer, bull, bullock, or steer, or any hog, sheep, or goat, to allow, suffer, or permit the same to run at large within said town, and any person violating any provision of this section, shall upon conviction thereof, be fined in any sum not to exceed \$5.00.

Section Two. It shall be the duty of the marshal of the said town by himself or deputy, to take up any animals of any description whatever, found running at large, contrary to the provisions of this ordinance, and forthwith confine the same in some pound or safe inclosure in the said town, and within twenty-four hours thereafter, notify the owner, or person having control of the same, if he or she be known to the said officer.

Section Three. It shall be the duty of the marshal at the expiration of two days to advertise the said animals, if unredeemed, for sale by giving ten days notice, if any animal, of the time and place, by posting up written or printed notices in five public places of the said town, one of which shall be posted at the council chamber, describing each animal so taken up with reasonable certainty, and at the expiration of the said time, he shall sell the same for cash at public auction to the highest bidder, and immediately pay over the proceeds, less the fees, costs, and expenses hereafter provided for, to the treasurer of the said town, and take his receipt for the same, and report his action in the premises to the Town Board at the next regular meeting thereof.

Section Four. Any money derived from the sale, except the fees, costs and expenses of the taking up, keeping, and sale of said animals, as in this ordinance provided for, shall be paid over to the owner or owners of the said animals, provided a demand is made upon the Town Board for the same within sixty days from the date of sale, otherwise the said money shall become the property of the town, and go into its general fund.

Section Five. It shall be the duty of the marshal to turn over to the owner or owners thereof, any animals taken up under the provisions of this ordinance, upon demand made at any time after the same have been taken up and before the sale thereof, provided he or she shall pay to the said marshal his fees for taking up and advertising the same, together with all costs and expenses for keeping the said animals as herein-after provided.

Section Six. The marshal shall be allowed and shall receive as a fee for each hog, sheep, or goat seventy five cents; and for each and for each animal of any kind not mentioned in this section, two dollars; and the additional sum of twenty-five cents for posting all of the said notices, and all the expenses of keeping the said animals taken up by him or his deputy as aforesaid, to be paid to him by the owner or owners thereof, before the same shall be released, or turned over, if claimed before sale, and in the event of a sale, then to be retained by him out of the proceeds thereof.

Section Seven. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage and publication for two weeks in the Mooresville Times.

" WHEREAS; the MOORESVILLE PUBLIC SERVICE COMPANY has succeeded to all the interests of the PUBLIC SERVICE COMPANY, to whom a certain franchise was granted by the Town of Mooreville on the fourth day of February, 1904;

AND WHEREAS, under the terms of said contract it has been furnishing certain public lights for the said Town under the terms and conditions set forth in Section Two of said ordinance;

AND WHEREAS, the said MOORESVILLE PUBLIC SERVICE COMPANY and the Trustees of the Town of Mooreville have mutually agreed upon the modification of the prices and conditions set forth in said original ordinance;

WHEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT that part of Section Two of "An Ordinance Granting the Public Service Company a Franchise for the use of the streets, alleys, avenues, roads and public grounds in the Town of Mooreville for the erection and maintenance of water works, electric light and gas plants, heating plants, and the establishing charges and regulations thereof," passed on the fourth day of February, 1904, relating to electric lighting and described in the first three paragraphs of said Section Two, be amended to read as follows:

"Section 3. It is further ordained that the Mooreville Public Service Company shall furnish to the Town of Mooreville as soon after this date as the same can be reasonably installed; 250-candle power 170 watt nitrogen filled lamps at and for the price of \$42.50 per annum each; lamps to include reflectors. Also 30 100-candle power 70 watt nitrogen filled lamps at and for the price of \$22.00 per annum each; lamps to include reflectors. All lamps are to be lighted every night until midnight and moonlight schedules thereafter, which is approximately 7,000 hours. Payments for such lights to be made in twelve ^{equal} monthly installments on the first day of each month following the service rendered. Lamps are to be installed in first class manner and maintained at the same standard and efficiency as when first installed, natural wear alone excepted, and to be immediately replaced when they become defective or burnt out. All lights are to be suspended in the center of the streets. The Board of Trustees at any time to have the right to install additional lights at the same rate and on the same conditions as hereinbefore set forth."

This amendment shall be accepted by the Mooreville Public Service Company in writing within fifteen days after the passage thereof. Passed July 20th. 1915.

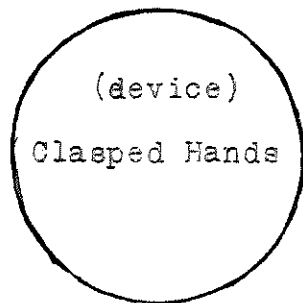

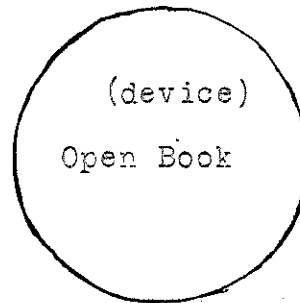

Mr. Bob Millian appeared before the board and complained that a neighbor had plowed the ground between the side walk and the property line for a potato patch; other citizens on the street were maintaining lawns on like spaces of the street and that the potato patch detracted from the appearance of the street. The matter was referred to the committee on streets and alleys.

Mr. Riley Harper also appeared before the board and asked that the alley back of his property be filled with dirt. The matter was referred to Marshal.

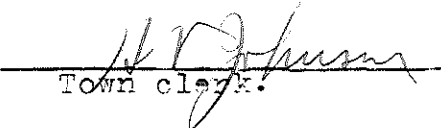

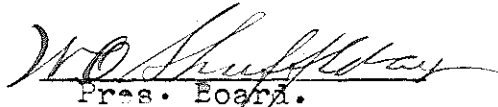

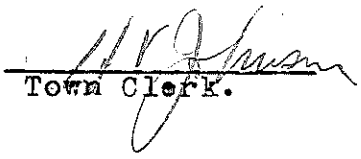

ORDINANCE.

AN ORDINANCE prohibiting the storage, sale discharge or firing of fire works, and other pyrotechnic display, providing penalties for violation of the same, and repealing all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions thereof.

Be it ordained by the council of the town of Mooreville, Indiana, as follows;

Section 1. The discharge, firing or use of all fire crackers, rockets, torpedoes, roman candles, or other fire works or substances designed and intended for pyrotechnic display and of all pistols, canes, cannons or other appliances using blank cartridges or caps containing chlorate of potash mixture or other explosive, is hereby prohibited within the corporate limits of Mooreville, Indiana, or within two miles thereof.

Section 2. The sale of fire works at retail is prohibited, within the corporate limits of the town of Mooreville, Indiana.

Section 3. The storage or sale of fire works at whole sale is prohibited within the corporate limits of the town of Mooreville, Indiana.

Section 4. Any person firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance as regards the sale and storage of fire works shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and be fined not less than ten (10) dollars nor more than twenty five (\$25) dollars for each day neglect of compliance. Provided also that the violation of other sections of this ordinance shall be considered a misdemeanor punishable by a fine not exceeding (\$10) dollars.

Section 5. The chief of the fire department may, at his discretion, remove or have removed, at the owners expense, all stocks of fire works or other combustibles exposed for sale, or held in stock in violation of this ordinance.

Section 6. All ordinances and parts of ordinances inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 7. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and legal publication.
