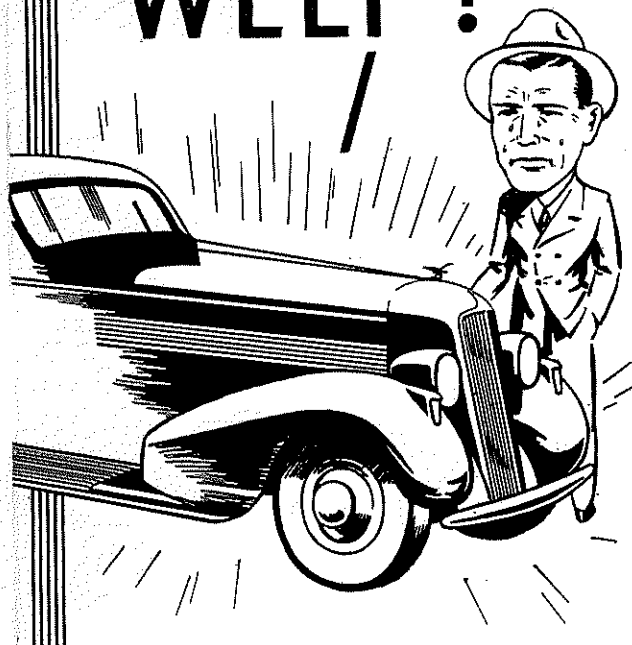

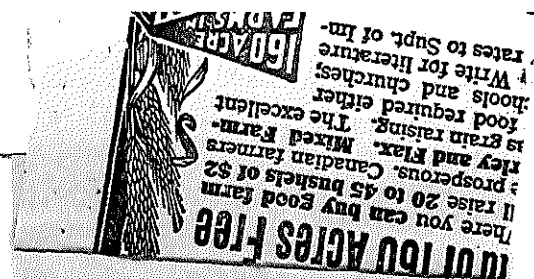

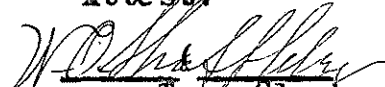

Mr. Rairiden and Mr. Rusie called upon me relative to the control of a cemetery by the town of Mooresville. I beg to advise that Section 8949 Burns' R. S. 1914 authorizes a town to take charge of a public cemetery. In accordance with the provisions of the statute mentioned, the Board of Trustees shall have charge, control, and management of all public cemeteries belonging to such town. It is my understanding that the cemetery in Mooresville has been in the possession of the town for thirty years or more and is now the property of said town, having been committed to the custody of said town in accordance with the laws of the State of Indiana. The Board of Trustees has charge therefore of such cemetery, and of its funds and other property under the laws in force.

I do not see any reason why the cemetery, or its funds, should be turned back into the possession of the lot-owners or original stockholders. The town may continue to manage and control said cemetery according to the provisions of section 8949 Burns' R. S. 1914.
