A bond or bonds shall be issued to the contractor in payment for said work, unless the property owners pay said assessments perore said bond or bonds are issued. Under no circumstances shall the Town of Mooresville be or be held responsible for any sum or sums due from said property owner or owners for said work, or for the collection of the same, or for the payment of any bond, bonds, certificate or certificates issued to said contractor in payment for such work, except for such moneys as shall have been actually received by said Town for the assessments for such improvement.

All proceedings had and work done in the construction of said main sewer and its apprutenances, manner of assessment of property, collection of assessments and issuance of bonds therefor shall be as provided for in an act of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana, entitled "An Act concerning municipal corporations, in matters pertaining to the construction, alteration and maintenance of public drains and sewers, providing for the construction, alteration and maintenance of such sewers and drains in such cities and within four miles thereof, also providing for the assessment of property specially benefited thereby for the payment thereof, in whole or in part, and for the collection of such assessments; repealing all laws and partw of laws in conflict therewith, and declaring an emergency," approved March 6, 1905, and all acts supplementary and amendatory thereto, passed by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana.
