ORDINANCE FOR APPROPRIATION.

SEC. NO. 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY The Board of Trustees of the Town of Moorasville, Indiana, that for the expenses of the town government and its institutions for the year ending December 31, 1920, the ~~sum-~~ following sums of money are hereby appropriated and ordered set apart out of the several funds herein named and for the purpose herein specified, subject to the laws governing the same. Such sums herein appropriated shall be held to ~~otherwise-expressly-~~ include all expenditures authorized to be made during the year, unless otherwise expressly stipulated and provided for by law.

Mooresville, Ind. November 4, 1919.

Board met in regular session, with all members present except Macy. Minutes of the last meeting read, and approved as read. Treasurer's report read and approved.

The Committee appointed to see the Morgantown Packing Company in regard to the refuse from their factory reported that they had not seen the officers of the company, and the committee was continued.

The Superintendent of the Cemetery came before the Board and made a statement that he had made a mistake and had sold a part of a lot that had previously been sold to another person, Lou Whitlow; and as a compromise he had to give Lou Whitlow the sum of \$50.00. Moved by Rusie and seconded by Wade that the Board concur in the action of the superintendent.

Levi Ballard appeared before the board on behalf of Mrs. Amanda Greeson and asked that the alley on West the South side of West South Street lying immediately East of the Greeson brick house, and so much of West South Street, as originally platted, as is now occupied by Mrs. Greeson as a lawn adjacent to her house, be vacated. Mr. J. S. Comer said that a number of years ago when Mr. Wm. Greeson owned said property he gave the town sufficient ground on the north to change street, and the Town was to vacate the said alley and the part of the street mentioned above; that he, Mr. Comer was a member of the Board at that time but that the town never fulfilled its part of the agreement, while Mr. Greeson did. Town attorney instructed to make an investigation of the law on the subject and to make his report at the next regular meeting.

Messrs. Couch and Lydy appeared before the Board and asked that a street light be placed at Lockerbie and High Streets. They also asked what steps could be taken to secured a cement side walk on the East side of Lockerbie street. Continued until the next regular meeting.

John O. Smith, Inspector of the Town Elecection held on the 4th. day of November, 1919, filed his report as provided by law, which said report shows, and Mr. John. O. Smith, inspector, declared the following named men elected:
