"An ORDINANCE declaring it unlawful to exhibit or cause to be exhibited by any person, firm or corporation or body of individuals Prize Fight Pictures or Films in the Town of Mooresville and declaring an emergency.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, Morgan County, Indiana., that it shall be unlawful for any person, firm, corporation or body of individuals to exhibit or cause to be exhibited, for gain directly or indirectly, any pictures films or reproduction of same, of any prize fight, in the Town of Mooresville.

Section 2. Any person, firm, corporation or body of individuals violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$10.00 for each and every violation thereof.

Section 3. Whereas an emergency exists whereby the immediate operation of this Ordinance is required, the same shall take effect as soon as proclamation is made thereof by the Marshall under order of this Board of Trustees by reading same at the Town Hall door and posting copies thereof in three public places in each of the wards of said town.

NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS

It shall be unlawful for any person or persons, firm or corporation to obstruct any street or alley in the Town of Mooresville by the placing or allowing to be placed thereon or across said street or alley, any building, shed or structure of any kind or description, or anything that will interfere with the free use of said street or alley by the public, PROVIDED, that in the making of any improvements on any street or alley, or property abutting thereon, upon a due showing thereof in writing filed with the Town Clerk of said Town, permission may be granted by said Clerk, for a definite length of time, to said applicant to temporarily use so much of the street as may be necessary during the construction of said improvements, and any and all obstruction so placed in any street or alley shall be so placed as to be the least dangerous to the free use of the said highway and shall be properly marked at night with red lights, which lights shall remain lighted during the entire night.

Section 2. Any person or persons, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine in the sum of ten (\$10.) dollars for each and every offense thereof, and each day's violation shall constitute a separate and additional offence.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, and publication once each week for two consecutive weeks in the Mooresville Times, a newspaper of general circulation, printed and published in the Town of Mooresville, Indiana.

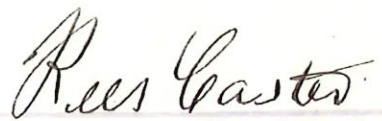

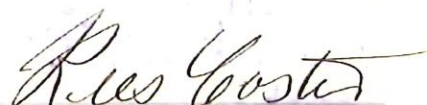

"GENERAL ORDINANCE # _____

An Ordinance defining the Duties of the Town Marshall of the Town of Mooresville.

BE IT ORDAINED By the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, Indiana, that :

Section 1. It shall be the duty of the Marshall to execute the orders of the Trustees as may be given from time to time, and to enforce the by-laws and ordinances of said Town of Mooresville, and the laws of the State of Indiana, as come within his authority.

Section 2. The Marshall shall perform the duties of Street Commissioner. He shall look after the streets and alleys of said town, enforcing all ordinances relative thereto. He shall keep all crossings cleaned off reasonably well in bad weather. He shall ascertain at least once each week, whether all ditches under his care are kept open, and see to it that they are so kept open unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Trustees. He shall not permit rubbish or filth to be thrown or placed in alleys or streets. All of the above, said Marshall is to do, including small jobs of work pertaining to same, at no additional expense to said town, other than his salary as Marshall.

Section 3. It shall be the duty of the Marshall to hire no man to work for said town, who is not able to do a good day's work, and such man or men are not to be employed without first consulting with the trustees in reference to same, and knowing the price to be paid per day.

Section 4. The Marshall supervise all street work, such as working out tax or repairing the Streets, etc., and the Marshall shall require each and every man so working to do a full day's ^{work}, according to law. Such Marshall in so far as possible shall be present and superintend such work (under the direction of the Trustees.)

Section 5. The Marshall turn all accounts due the town over to the Treasurer for collection. He shall give all orders and bills for work done, and material furnished for the Town to the Clerk of said Town of Mooresville.

Section 6. It shall be the duty of the Marshall to be present at each meeting of the Board of Trustees, and to make a report as to work done by him, and as to where other work is necessary to be done for said town, as pertains to his duties.

Section 7. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.

Adopted by the Board of Trustees this 7th day of March 1911.

"That alley crossings for cement walk on South side of East Main Street be the same as shown on profile, or as the New survey is now staked. That the alley crossings on the North side of East Main street be placed as per the present location of such alleys as marked by the Town Marshall, and that the profile for said walk the contractors are hereby instructed to change to conform thereto."

The following Ordinance was unanimously passed:

"AN ORDINANCE fixing the license fee to be paid to the Town of Mooresville, by all persons, firms or corporations, hereinafter requiring license from the Board of Commissioners in Morgan County, Indiana, and from all other persons, firms or corporations, to sell intoxicating liquors in the Town of Mooresville, or within two miles of the corporate limits thereof, as provided by the Act of 1911, approved March 4" 1911.

Be it Ordained by the Voard of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, Indiana, that

Section 1. Every person, firm or corporation, who shall hereinafter procure from the Board of Commissioners of Morgan County Indiana, a license to sell, barter or give away for any purpose or gain, any spiritous, vinclius or malt liquors in any quantity less than a quart at a time, in the Town of Mooresville, or within two miles of the corporate limits thereof, shall before he shall be permitted to sell, barter or give away any intoxicating liquors in the said town of Mooresville, or within two miles of the corporate limits thereof, pay the Treasurer of the Town of Mooresville, for the general use and benefit of said town, the sum of Three Hundred dollars (\$300.), which said sum of three hundred (\$300) dollars, shall be the annual license fee to be charged in addition to the sum now required by law to be paid in to the school fund of said County.

On payment of the said three hundred (\$300) dollars, such applicant shall present the Town Clerk of said town his receipt therefor, with his said license therefor granted him by the Board of Commissioners. Said Town Clerk shall thereupon issue to said applicant, a license to sell intoxicating liquors, as specified in the said license theretofore granted by the said Board of Commissioners.

Section 2. Said Town Clerk shall keep a register of the names of all persons receiving from said town such license, with the date issued, and the expiration of same, which said date of expiration shall be the same as that fixed in said license so granted by the Board of Commissioners. Also the number and the street or location where such person conducts said business.

Section 3. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this order, shall be subject to a fine in the sum of ten dollars (\$10) for each and every offense thereof, and each day's violation shall constitute a separate and additional offense.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall be in full force and

effect from and after its passage and publication once each week for two consecutive weeks, in the Mooresville Times, a newspaper of general circulation, printed and published in the Town of Mooresville.

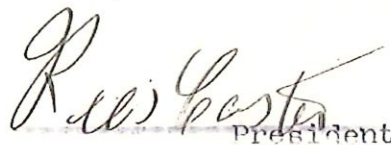

"AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR TAPPING DRAINS AND MAKING CONNECTIONS THEREWITH, AND THE USE THEREOF.

Section 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF BLOOMSBURG, IND., that no connection shall be made with any public sewer or drain, and no ditch or excavation made across any street, or on any alley or street in said Town for the purpose of connecting with any sewer or drain without the written permission of the Board of Trustees of said Town; and any connections made into any public sewer or drain or any ditching across on any alley or street for the purpose of making any such connection, shall subject the person or persons making the same, and the owners of the property directing it, to a penalty of not exceeding Twenty dollars or conviction before any Court of competent jurisdiction, and each day that any person shall, without such permission continue to use such drain, shall be considered a separate offense.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person in the possession of premises into which a pipe or other connection with a public sewer or drain has been laid or made to allow or permit the placing, throwing, depositing or draining into any such sewer or drain, any animal refuse from water closets, slops from kitchen, garbage, dead animals or other foul or unsanitary material.

Any person violating any of the provisions of this section, shall upon conviction be fined in any sum not exceeding Twenty dollars, and each day this section is violated shall constitute a separate offense.

AN ORDINANCE.

An ordinance requiring every proprietor, of a pool room to obtain license and pay a fee therefor, and repealing all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict therewith.

Section 1.

Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, Indiana, that it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to conduct, manage or operate a Pool Room in the Town of Mooresville without first procuring from the Town Clerk a license so to do, which license shall be paid to the Town Clerk as follows: for conducting, operating or maintaining any pool room, the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250) per annum, payable in advance for each and every pool table used or placed in any such room.

Section 2.

The license shall state the place where, and the person, firm or corporation by whom same shall be conducted, and any person, firm or corporation engaging in the same without license shall be fined in any sum not more than twenty dollars (\$20), and not less than five dollars (\$5), and each day of operation without license shall constitute a separate offense.

Section 3.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby expressly repealed.

Section 4.

Emergency. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.

Section 2. That any person included in the provisions of this Ordinance desiring to use the streets of said Town, shall pay to the Clerk of said Town for each vehicle or automobile the license fee as herein provided, when said Clerk shall issue a license for said vehicle or automobile.

It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to use any automobile or vehicle included in the provisions of this ordinance, for hire upon the streets of said Town without first procuring a license as herein provided.

Section 3. Any person, or persons violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction, be fined in any sum not exceeding Twenty five dollars.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication once each week for two consecutive weeks in the Mooreville Times.
