MOORESVILLE POLICE COMMISSION MINUTES

These are the Minutes of the regularly scheduled meeting of the Mooresville Police Commission held at the Mooresville Police Department on December 16, 2021.

MEMBERS PRESENT: Fred Settle, Ernie Wilson, Christopher Hobbick

ALSO PRESENT: Chief Kevin Julian, Officer Brock Chipman, Attorney Charles Braun, Braxton Hughes

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 PM.

Christopher Hobbick made a motion to accept the minutes from the October meeting. Ernie Wilson seconded. No discussion. Motion passed unanimously.

Christopher Hobbick made a motion to accept the minutes from the November meeting. Ernie Wilson seconded. No discussion. Motion passed unanimously.

No old business for the police commission.

Chief Julian advised that the Bill of Rights that had been tabled at the last meeting was complete. Chief Julian stated that the most recent copy had been given to all the commissioners for their review. There was some discussion between Chief Julian and Attorney Braun. Commissioner Wilson made a motion to accept the Bill of Rights as written. Commissioner Hobbick seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

Attorney Braun presented the Police Commission with his bill for the work that was done on the revision of the Bill of Rights. Commissioner Wilson made a motion to accept and pay the bill from the attorney. Commissioner Hobbick seconded. No discussion. Motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Hobbick told the Police Commission that he has asked that an email address for each commissioner be given to them by the Town of Mooresville. He stated that it was more appropriate for the commission to not use their personal emails. Chief Julian stated that the commission was given email addresses from the Town since they are town employees (@mooreville.in.gov) but he was looking into giving them an email address from the department (@pd.mooreville.in.gov).

Commissioner Hobbick told the Police Commission that he would like to have past information regarding the commission available to all commissioners, those who are on the commission now

and any future commissioners. Chief Julian stated that he is working with Steve to get this done so that they would have access to it.

Commissioner Hobbick told the Police Commission about a program that is currently being utilized by all police departments in Hendricks County. Commissioner Hobbick stated that he spoke with Avon Police Department about the program called AWARE. The program is a de-escalation and mental health awareness initiative created by law enforcement for all first responders. There is a list of eligible disorders listed in the program and a medial form must be completed. Each person signed up for the program will receive a sticker, in which they can place on their car or home. Commissioner Hobbick stated that he has reached out in an attempt to try and get this program at the police department. The program director has advised that they are working on a way right now to expand the program.

Attorney Braun presented the Police Commission with his yearly invoice for 2022. Commissioner Wilson made a motion to pay the invoice. Commission Hobbick seconded. No discussion. Motion passed unanimously.


Braxton Hughes, a citizen in the audience, spoke to the Police Commission about the K9 program. There was a discussion between the commissioners and Mr. Hughes.



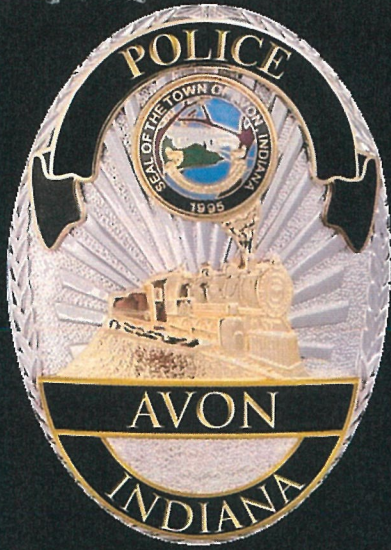
