Meeting postponed until February 8, 1966 due to heavy snow.

February 8, 1966

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met Tuesday, February 8, 1966 at 7:30 P.M. Present were Trustees Dye, Keith, Bain, Farmer and attorney Wehrle.

Mr. McGuire of Automotive Armature was present to ask town to close the alley from Bridge Street south to first alley running east and west. Mr. Wehrle advised Mr. McGuire of a statute covering this and that it would have to be petitioned through Morgan County Circuit Court.

At the request of Mrs. Isabelle Riggan, the trustees proclaimed the week of February 13, "National Beauty Salon Week".

A letter from Herschel Coleman was read concerning inspection for fire hazards in the downtown area. After discussion, the trustees decided to ask the fire department to make a fire inspection.

A letter from Hoosier Water Co. was read stating fire hydrants had been taken care of with the exception of a couple. It was also suggested the town dump be filled in, graded and seeded to better the neighborhood. It was agreed to look around for a suitable location to use as a dump.

Discussion on investment program followed. Mr. Wehrle stated there was no restriction on investments of surplus funds. The following resolution was made: It is unanimously resolved that the clerk-treasurer is hereby authorized to invest an amount not to exceed \$70,000.00 in 90 day government treasury bills. This amount to be taken from the Sewer Operating Fund.

Sewer Connections and fees were discussed and the ordinance read to determine ways of correcting some things which haven't handled properly.

Dye made a motion to pay the claims, second by Keith. Motion carried.

A letter from the State Highway Dept. was read in regard to our letter written to them concerning hazardous intersections in town. The trustees were informed consideration is being given lights for illumination at the north and south intersections of 67- By-Pass.

Farmer stated a representative from Indpls. Power & Light would be at a future board meeting to present a proposal on changing present street lights to mercury vapor.

No further business appearing before the Board, Keith made a motion to adjourn, second by Dye. Motion carried.

March 1, 1966

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met Tuesday March 1, 1966 at 7:30 p.m. Present were Trustees Dye, Farmer, Bain and Keith.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Robert Courtney of Indianapolis Power and Light Co. presented a proposal on changing the present street lighting to mercury vapor at a cost of approximately \$1,650 more per year for twice as much light. Bain made a motion to change 21 lights on metal poles to 400 watt mercury vapor. Also 17-6,000 lumen and 47-2,500 lumen overhead lights to 175 watt mercury vapor lights for an additional \$575.50 per year. Second by Dye. Motion carried. A letter is to be sent to IP&LCO authorizing this change.

A motion to pay the bills was made by Bain. Second by Dye. Motion carried.

The clerk was instructed to advertise for bids on street repairs to be opened April 5, 1966 at 8:00 P.M.

Installation of a culvert at the new school was discussed. Clerk to write letter to school officials advising that the school is to furnish and install a culvert to provide drainage on West Carlisle St.

Prices on tree trimming discussed. Matney Tree Service had asked set price of \$50.00 per tree for cutting or trimming. It was decided to have trees cut or trimmed according to the individual job.

Bain reported he had found a garage for street and sanitation departments for storage and work space at \$30.00 per month. Bain made a motion to rent storage space on East Washington Street from Norma Griggs, second by Keith. Motion carried.

Keith made a motion to appoint Donald Kouns, (Dem.) to the Park Board to replace Wendell Roberson whose term expired December 31, 1965. Second by Bain. Motion carried.

After discussion Bain made a motion to increase price of grave spaces to \$100.00 per space, second by Keith. Motion carried.

Bain made a motion to increase grave opening fee from \$35.00 to \$50.00, second by Keith. Motion carried.

No further business appearing before the Board, Keith made a motion to adjourn, second by Bain. Motion carried.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met Tuesday, April 5, 1966 at 7:30 P.M. Present were trustees Dye, Keith, Farmer, Bain, Holmes and attorney Wehrle.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The financial report shows a balance in all funds of \$67,740.54, a balance of \$26,253.03 in Sewage Operating Fund, a balance of \$21,286.19 in Sinking Fund and \$108,731.40 invested in 90 day government treasury bills.

Elmer Hofstetter was present to ask permission to operate a Mr. Softee ice cream truck. He was informed the Board is in the process of having an ordinance drawn up to require a permit for this. Clerk instructed to send him a letter giving temporary permission to operate until the ordinance is ready.

A summons was presented on vacating alley on Bridge St., requested by John McGuire. There was discussion on how much easement the town should have before the following resolution was made: The attorney is to notify Mr. McGuire that the town offers no objections to vacate but reserves the right to a sixteen foot utility strip.

Bids on street repair were opened at 8:00 P.M. Bids were presented by Roadways, Inc. and Ralph Rogers and Company. After discussion, Dye made a motion to accept Ralph Rogers and Company bid since it was the lower bid. Second by Bain. Motion carried.

Earl Helton of Hoosier Water Company asked again what the town is going to do about the dump problem. An incinerator was discussed but no action taken.

The curfew ordinance was reviewed. Since the ordinance does not indicate blowing the siren, it was decided to discontinue blowing the curfew siren every evening.

A tornado alert was discussed. A meeting is to be held April 12 with all fire chiefs served by the Mooresville police radio system and the civil defense to discuss this.

School annexation discussed. Keith made a motion to start annexation proceedings for the school property now located outside the town limits. Second by Bain. Motion carried.

Fire Chief Keller asked for more money to be paid to man maintaining fire trucks. Since the man is putting in several hours per month and keeping the trucks in excellent condition, Holmes made a motion to increase truck maintenance pay from \$5.00 to \$10.00 per month. Second by Bain. Motion carried.

April 26, at 7:30 P.M. was set for a meeting of the Sewer Committee to discuss various problems concerning the Sanitation Department.

A recommendation was received from the Plan Commission to rezone an estimated .269 acres for Browns Regal Market #2 from Zone 1A (Residential) to Zone 2F (Business and Commercial). This is a portion of Block 28 in Moores Third Addition. A motion to accept this recommendation was made by Bain, second by Keith. Motion carried.

A motion to pay the claims was made by Bain, second by Keith. Motion carried.

No further business appearing before the Board, Bain made a motion to adjourn to meet in continued session April 19, second by Keith. Motion carried.

EXCERPTS FROM MINUTES
OF MEETING OF BOARD OF TRUSTEES
OF

MOORESVILLE CONSOLIDATED SCHOOL CORPORATION

September 23, 1965

The first order of business was a joint conference with the members of the Town Board of the Town of Mooresville for the purpose of discussing the construction of a storm sewer to provide drainage for the Junior High School building presently under construction. Present for the Town Board were:

W. H. Dye, President
Norman Keith, Vice President
Robert Farmer
William Holmes
Cecil Bain

It was reported that the school had run a 21-inch sewer to a manhole at the north boundary line of its property lying on the north side of Carlisle. In order to connect the 21-inch sewer to existing sewer lines, it would be necessary to run approximately 550 feet to the nearest connection point. The subject of the discussion concerned whether or not the sewer could be constructed and who would bear the cost thereof. Mr. Ray Haller, representing the architects of the school corporation, indicated that in their opinion a 21-inch connection would be sufficient for this purpose.

The Town Board reported that they had taken informal bids for the construction of this sewer and had ascertained that Mr. Swinney would construct a 21-inch sewer for a price of \$4,350.00. His bid was reported to be the lowest of three estimating estimates. The Town Board proposed that the Town of Mooresville and Mooresville Consolidated School Corporation share this cost. The Town Board proposed to pay the sum of \$2,550.00, if the school corporation would pay the sum of \$1,800.00.

The two boards then engaged in a protracted discussion regarding the manner in which this might be accomplished. Among the plans considered was the plan of having the Town Board establish the specifications for the project and then having the entire project, then appropriate additional funds necessary to be its share, showing in its appropriation authorization the fact that the school corporation would contribute \$1,800.00 to this cost. They also considered a contractual engagement directly with the contractor so that each party would only pay its share of the cost direct to the contractor. Representatives of the School Board pointed out that since the cost did not exceed \$2,000.00, they were not required to advertise for bids on their share of the contract, and that it was probably sufficient appropriation available to pay for this construction as an incident to the Junior High School construction program. Mr. Kappes then suggested that the boards merely agree upon the plan and leave it to the attorneys for the respective boards, after consulting with the Board of accounts, to work out the mechanical procedure to be accomplished.

It was, therefore, upon motion by Seth Shields, seconded by Lawrence [unclear], unanimously

RESOLVED, that Mooresville Consolidated School Corporation pay, with respect to the construction of a storm sewer extending from its existing 21-inch storm drain from the High School and Junior High School tracts westwardly along Carlisle Street to the nearest intersecting storm sewer, presently estimated to be a distance of approximately 500 feet more or less, a cost not to exceed One Thousand Eight Hundred Dollars (\$1,800.00) in amount.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the undertaking to pay such sum of money be and the same hereby is conditioned upon the Town of Mooresville undertaking to defray the balance of the cost of construction of such sewer.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that should the cost of construction of the sewer be less than the present cost estimate of Four Thousand Three Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$4,350.00), the contribution to the overall construction cost be reduced proportionately with respect to each of the parties to the construction project.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the manner of appropriating and paying for such construction project be investigated and determined upon by the attorneys for the respective boards, after consultation with the State Board of Accounts.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met Tuesday June 7, 1966 at 7:30 P.M. Present were trustees Farmer, Bain, Keith, Holmes, Dye and attorney Wahrle.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

A request for rezoning from B. R. Mendenhall was heard to rezone lots 4, 5, and 6, Block 14, Moore's Second Addition from 1a to 2f. A recommendation from the Zoning Board to approve this rezoning was read and a motion to approve was made by Keith, second by Holmes. Motion carried.

Ordinance #5-1966 entitled "An Ordinance Amending an Ordinance Creating Zoning Control" was read. The rules for reading an ordinance three times were suspended and the ordinance passed on a motion by Holmes, second by Dye. Motion carried.

Ordinance #6-1966 entitled "An Ordinance Amending an Ordinance Creating Zoning Control" was read. Rules for reading three times suspended and ordinance passed on a motion by Holmes, second by Dye. Motion carried. This is for rezoning lot #5, Block 16, Moore's Second Addition from 1a to 2a, Professional Use. A letter from Zoning Board recommended acceptance.

Ordinance #7-1966 entitled "An Ordinance Amending an Ordinance Creating Zoning Control" was read to rezone lot #37, Hadley's Second Addition from 1a to 2a.

June 7, 1966 minutes cont'd.

Professional. Rules for reading three times suspended and ordinance adopted on a motion by Bain with the exception that off-street parking be provided. Second by Keith. Motion carried.

A bid submitted by Glover's Janitorial Service to clean municipal building in the amount of \$195 first month, \$140 per month after. After discussion, a motion to accept this bid was made by Holmes, second by Bain. Motion carried.

A request from Zoning Board was read requesting permission to park a house trailer at Norman D. York property. Holmes made a motion not to accept application since this is not a hardship case. Second by Bain. Motion carried.

A letter from the Zoning Board was read stating William Abbott and James Miller had resigned due to not having legal representation and due to a change in his working hours, Charles McGuire also had resigned. The following people were appointed to serve on the Zoning Board: Harold R. Nevins, 582 Arlington Drive - Rep., Lewis Piepenbrink, 439 Tulip Drive - Rep., Lewis R. Marsh, 133 W. Washington - Dem. and Ray Selwa, 761 Maple Lane - Dem.

A letter from Zoning Board was read stating that Richard Horner had requested a trailer permit for his property. This request was sent back to the Zoning Board since the Board felt Horner should rezone.

A motion to pay claims was made by Holmes, second by Bain. Motion carried.

Permission was requested by Indiana Bell Telephone Company to remove the sidewalk on South Street from Indiana Street to State Road #144, approximately 2150 feet. This work is necessary to replace underground conduit. The surface is to be replaced by the telephone company upon completion of project. Holmes made a motion to accept proposal, second by Bain. Motion carried.

The need for a new billing machine by the sewage department was discussed. This is to be taken up at the next meeting after some figures on new machines have been obtained.

Bob Johnson asked that a stop sign be erected at Park Drive and South Street and also at the veneer plant entrance. Also asked for reduced speed to protect children at the park.

No further business appearing before the Board, Keith made a motion to adjourn to meet in continued session June 28, second by Holmes. Motion carried.

Bain made a motion that three street lights be installed, one on Lockerbie, one at East South and State Road #114, and one on West South Street. Second by Keith. Motion carried.



No further business appearing before the Board, Keith made a motion to adjourn to meet in continued session August 16. Second by Bain. Motion carried.


