February 7, 1967

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met Tuesday February 7, 1967 at 7:30 P.M. with trustees Keith, Bain, Dye, Moore, Farmer and attorney Wehrle present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Discussion on the ditch on Bolton Ave. followed with no decision made. Bain and Farmer suggested calling Ray House in to discuss off-street parking.

Keith reported that he had contacted Mr. Wilson, Hoosier Water Company, about the price of \$4600 for a water line to the sanitation plant. This amount is for an eight inch line. Mr. Wilson is willing to discuss this with the Board and will contact Keith later.

It was reported that the fire hydrant at the Veneer Plant had been fenced in and the gate locked. Keller informed the Board there is a key to this on the FWD fire truck.

Farmer said he had checked the trees at Mrs. Millers' on South Jefferson St., but no action to be taken at this time.

Bob Dunn was present and presented five property owners' names who are outside the town limits and are connected to the town sewer. They were Rev. Russell Rees, Jerry Davee, Howard Pritchard, Delbert Bowers and Mr. Wells. Only two of the five are the original owners and until these people are contacted, no action will be taken.

Dunn asked about acceptance of Delwood Drive. Bain asked him what had been done on Westwood Drive to remedy conditions that were not accepted before. Dunn stated he had cleaned out north end of Goose Creek and extended the ditch, cleaned out the storm sewer and will replace several sections of sidewalk on Westwood Drive when the weather permits. The intersection is still not ground down as he can't locate a machine for this yet, but it will be done. The Board reminded him of a manhole that stuck up above the sidewalk that hadn't been changed and Dunn agreed to lower it. The two lots where the washing was occurring have been sodded.

Johnson asked Dunn about the infiltration test, Dunn said they tested from the manhole south on Delwood and on west. When asked about some defective tile he received, he said none of this was used and the tile company replaced all that was defective. Johnson informed the Board there was 400 or 500 feet of sewer he didn't want to accept and wouldn't go along with. Dunn stated he wanted to know exactly what he was supposed to do and that he was willing to co-operate with the town on everything within reason. Board agreed that the ordinance should be followed and that was what Dunn would have to go by.

Keith stated the Board wanted to do some checking on Delwood Drive before accepting and would let him know.

Dunn also asked Board's considering annexing area, north of County Line Rd. He has an option on this ground and wants to build.

Ways of collecting delinquent sewer bills was discussed. Mr. Wehrle advised the Board they could bring suit in J.P. Court against those who owed less than \$500. To have sewer committee meeting later to discuss this further.

Resolution read certifying Citizens Bank as public depository for the town for a two year period. Motion to adopt resolution made by Farmer, second by Dye. Motion carried.

Dr. Whitney, representing the Optimist Club, asked the Board to act as co-sponsors of the bike rodeo and judging contest when the club has their Bike Safety Week Campaign in April. The Board would act as judges, run bike parade etc. He also asked if bicycles could be licensed at this time. Farmer made a motion that the Board co-operate with the Optimist Club in sponsoring this campaign and if at all possible to license at the same time, second by Dye. Motion carried. The police are to work with the club on licensing the bicycles.

Mrs. Walter C. LaMasters' appointment to the Library Board was recommended on a motion by Farmer, second by Dye. Motion carried.

Farmer reported Robert Nevins did not wish to serve on the Plan Commission and made a motion to appoint Richard Horner, rep., for a term of three years, second by Dye. Motion carried.

A recommendation to remove the one-way alley behind Tom Baker Motors from the West library alley to Jefferson Street and change ~~xx~~ back to two way traffic

was heard. Bain made a motion to this effect, second by Farmer. Carried.

A motion was made by Bain to have an ordinance written for "No Parking At Any Time" on the north side of Fair Lane from Edgewood To Westbrook. Second by Dye. Carried.

Farmer made a motion to pay claims, second by Dye. Motion carried.

Bain brought up parking problem at Newby School on Memorial Drive. Teachers and help park on north side creating parking hazard when parents pick up children. Clerk to write letter to Supt. Curry asking school's co-operation.

Farmer reported on fire meeting. Reported 1000ft. of hose needed and also reported the policy of sending police to fires first has been changed. The procedure Indianapolis Power and Light Co. uses on fire calls was discussed. The Board felt it took too long for a man to come from Indianapolis to disconnect electricity during a fire and IP&L has been asked to change this and send a local man to fires. Farmer is to check on getting a fire radio monitor for Glenn Smoot.

Use of a credit card at Enco discussed.

Johnson reported the need for a utility bed for the sanitation truck after the loss of sever tools and pieces of equipment. Prices were discussed but no action taken.

No further business appearing before the Board, Farmer made a motion to adjourn to meet in continued session February 21, second by Dye. Motion carried.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and corrected as follows: Farmer made a motion to delete from the February 7 minutes the resolution certifying Citizens Bank as Public Depository, second by Moore. Motion carried.

Farmer made a motion to adopt the resolution certifying Citizens Bank to act as depository for public funds, second by Bain. Motion carried.

Bain to have tree trimmer out of Indianapolis to give prices on doing work for the town.

March 21, 1967

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The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met Tuesday, March 21, 1967 at 7:30 P.M. with trustees Bain, Moore, Farmer, Keith and Dye present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Parking problem at school discussed. Bain reported teachers didn't mind the town making a loading zone on Memorial Dr. Traffic problems at Village shopping center brought up. Lack of stop signs discussed and decided to check with Wehrle on this.

Bain made a motion to post loading zone signs at Newby School to read "No Parking from 7:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M. Except Saturday and Sunday" for distance of 80 ft., second by Farmer. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Bain to confirm the appointment of J. W. Shearer as Street Commissioner effective March 16, second by Farmer. Motion carried.

A report from Keith on the County Dog Resolution was heard. He said the people would have to pen the dogs up then the dog warden picks them up. Possibility of hiring dog catcher discussed but since no funds are available now, to wait and include in 1968 budget.

Representatives from American Legion presented a flag to the town for the Municipal Building.

Ordinance #1-1967 entitled "Fixing Salaries for Elected Town Officials" read and rules for reading three times suspended. Motion to adopt ordinance made by Farmer, second by Bain. Motion carried.

Farmer reported there was no money appropriated to buy 1,000 ft. of hose needed by the fire department. FWD needs major tune-up and is using oil. Farmer to call FWD service to get estimate on this.

Farmer read revised informal bid on rewiring fire house. Pygman Electric bid \$175 with town furnishing tubes for lights, \$215 with tubes. Tom Hicks bid \$345 and \$375. Dye made motion to accept Pygman's bid of \$175, second by Farmer. Motion carried.

Bain made motion to advertise for street bids to be opened April 18, second by Farmer. Motion carried. Clerk instructed to advertise.

Dye stated there would be a sewer meeting Tuesday March 28 to take care of various problems.

RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN BOARD
OF THE TOWN OF MOORESVILLE, INDIANA

WHEREAS, on the 6th day of July, 1965, the Town Board of the town of Mooresville, Indiana, entered into a franchise with Community Teleception, Inc. granting said Community Teleception, Inc. the right to construct a community antenna television system in the town of Mooresville, Indiana; and

WHEREAS, Community Teleception, Inc. has proceeded to secure ways and means of financing and constructing a CATV system in the town of Mooresville, Indiana; and

WHEREAS, Community Teleception, Inc. has already secured pole agreements for installation of said CATV system in the town of Mooresville, Indiana; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Communications Commission has asserted jurisdiction over certain market areas of the United States as far as CATV is concerned; and

WHEREAS, Community Teleception, Inc. has entered into negotiations with General Electric Cablevision Corporation to bring about the financing and construction of a community antenna television system for the town of Mooresville, Indiana; and

WHEREAS, Community Teleception, Inc. now proposes to assign the franchise heretofore granted by the Town Board of the town of Mooresville to General Electric Cablevision Corporation; and

WHEREAS, Community Teleception, Inc. desires that certain minor changes be made in the franchise heretofore granted to it.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Town Board of the town of Mooresville, Indiana, that:

1. That Community Teleception, Inc. be permitted to assign the franchise heretofore granted to it on July 6, 1965, to General Electric Cablevision Corporation.

2. That the franchise agreement heretofore entered into on July 6, 1965, be modified to incorporate the following changes:

(a). The period of the franchise shall be for 25 years rather than 20 years, as stated in Section 1.

(b). Paragraph 2 of Section 4 shall be modified in that the Town Board of Mooresville shall not have the right to require General Electric Cablevision Corporation to place its conductors underground unless the utility which is then permitting General Electric Cablevision Corporation to use its facilities and poles is also required to go underground.

(c). Section 7B shall be modified so that the first sentence shall read "An installation charge of \$14.90 for the first TV set will be made."

(d). Section 12 shall be modified, beginning at the sixth line where the words "effective date of this franchise" shall be stricken and added in their place "activation of the system in Marion County most nearly adjacent to Mooresville."

(e). Under Section 14 the amount of the bond shall be placed at \$10,000.00 until the population of Mooresville reaches 10,000 people and then the bond shall be in the amount of \$20,000.00 when the population exceeds 10,000.

(f). Wherever the words "gross earning" appear in Section 15, they shall be changed to "gross revenue".

May 16, 1967

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met in continued session May 16, 1967. Present were trustees Moore, Keith and Farmer.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The financial report showed a balance of \$71,470.27 in all Town Funds and a balance of \$75,702.21 in Sewage Operating Fund and \$9,811.19 in the Sinking Fund.

Paul Goskie was present on rezoning his property. Harold Hawkins and several residents from that area were present protesting the rezoning. However, since it takes 75% of the Board voting for it and full Board was not present, this matter was deferred until next meeting.

Mrs. Collina and Thomas Howerton complained about no parking ordinance on Fairlane Drive. After discussion Farmer made a motion to table no parking ordinance on Fairlane Drive until Bain is present to review. Second by Moore. Motion carried.

Keith brought up widening of bridge on Bolton Avenue and also covering present ditch to allow for a wider street. This would cost approximately \$500 to \$600. No action taken.

Installation of sidewalk to the new Burger Chef discussed. Farmer felt town should construct walk from West South Street to Burger Chef property. No action taken.

After discussion on air conditioning for offices, Farmer made a motion that we secure adequate air conditioning for meeting room and office area for Sanitation Dept. Second by Moore. Motion carried. Moore to get prices and proceed with this.

Farmer made a motion to pay claims, second by Moore. Motion carried.

No further business appearing before the Board, Farmer made a motion to adjourn, second by Moore. Motion carried.

GENERAL

At the request of the Board of Trustees we have made an interim study covering a part of our services to be provided under Article I-A of our Contract for Engineering Services, Sewage Works Project, Town of Mooresville, Indiana, dated April 18, 1967.

INTERIM STUDY AREA

The feasibility of the Town providing sanitary sewer service to a proposed shopping center and apartment complex to be located on the east side of new S. R. 67 and south of the north line of Morgan County, and its relation to providing future sanitary sewer service for Sections 29 and 30, R2E, T14N and a portion of Section 25, R1E, T14N were studied. The study area is illustrated on Exhibit 1.

ANTICIPATED SEWER LOADINGS

The entire interim study area lies within the East Fork of Whitelick River drainage basin. The proposed shopping center and 176-unit apartment complex may be expected at full development to contribute a peak rate of flow of approximately 140,000 gallons per day of sewage to a sewer system, assuming that the proposed shops within the shopping center will be relatively "dry type" such as the grocery, variety store, discount house, etc. now planned. There naturally is more than one route by which this waste may be conveyed to a point in the existing municipal sewer system as may be noted from Exhibit 2.

To be considered at this point is the fact that a portion of Section 29 and Section 30 not now developed would also drain to the Sikor Creek crossing under new S. R. 67, the same location as would drain the proposed shopping center and apartment complex. The future peak rate of flow for a gravity sanitary sewer system to serve these Sections would be an additional 700,000 gallons per day, assuming 50 percent of the total land area would ultimately be developed into residential one-half acre lots.

The recommended sanitary sewer route and how it will serve ultimate sewer requirements for the interim study area, and further be extended for gravity sewer service to the existing sewage treatment plant site, with sanitary sewer service also provided for Sections 31 and 32, is shown on Exhibit 4.

SEWER ROUTES

The nearest sanitary sewer connections from the proposed shopping center and apartment complex would be somewhere in the Marleywood Estates Sewer System using a lift station and force main shown on Exhibit 2 as Alternates No. 1 and No. 2; however, only the immediate need would be satisfied and would entail future maintenance problems and power costs.

The routes having the most future utility, Alternates No. 3 and No. 4, would provide gravity sanitary sewer service to an existing lift station now serving Marleywood Estates. If increased in size from 8-inches to 10-inches in diameter, the future sanitary sewer requirements for Section 25, R1E, T14N and Sections 29 and 30, R2E, T14N could also be met. Alternate No. 3, however, along new S. R. 67 would require sewer depths as great as 34-feet as may be noted from Exhibit 3. The recommended route

would be Alternate No. 4 connected to the existing lift station.

This lift station can be removed from service at some time in the future and Alternate No. 4 continued by gravity to the existing sewage treatment plant, making additional gravity sewer service available to Sections 31 and 32, R2E, T14N as shown on Exhibit No. 4.

EXISTING LIFT STATION CAPACITY

The Marleywood Estates station now has one pump having a 50 gallon per minute, or 72,000 gallons per day capacity. Marleywood Estates, when all 55 platted lots are developed, should have a peak sewer loading of about 75,000 gallons per day. However, there is space to put another equal or larger pump in the station, which could accommodate another 100,000 gallons per day peak sewage loadings from the proposed shopping center and apartment complex, representing approximately 70 percent development in about two years, according to the developers stated plans. The 6-inch force main from the station could accommodate up to 500,000 gallons per day sewage flow; however, the existing municipal system into which it discharges would not have this capacity available. At this time it would appear that the interceptor sewer from the existing lift station to the sewage treatment plant should be constructed.

SEWAGE TREATMENT PLANT CAPACITY

A detailed analysis of the plant capacity is deferred until the balance of the sewerage works study is completed. The current rated capacity is 500,000 gallons per day, average dry weather flow. Present wet weather average flows are about 450,000 gallons per day. It is obvious therefore

that before the full use of the proposed sewer can be realized, it will be necessary to consider means of relieving the treatment facilities, either by additions or by taking corrective measures in reducing surface and ground water infiltration into the system.

COST DATA

For the purpose of comparison and as a guide to the Board, the following construction cost data for the various alternate sewer routes are presented in the following Table No. 1.

To these construction costs should be added certain non-construction costs, such as engineering, legal administrative, etc. which can add between 15 - 20 percent to the construction cost for actual project costs.

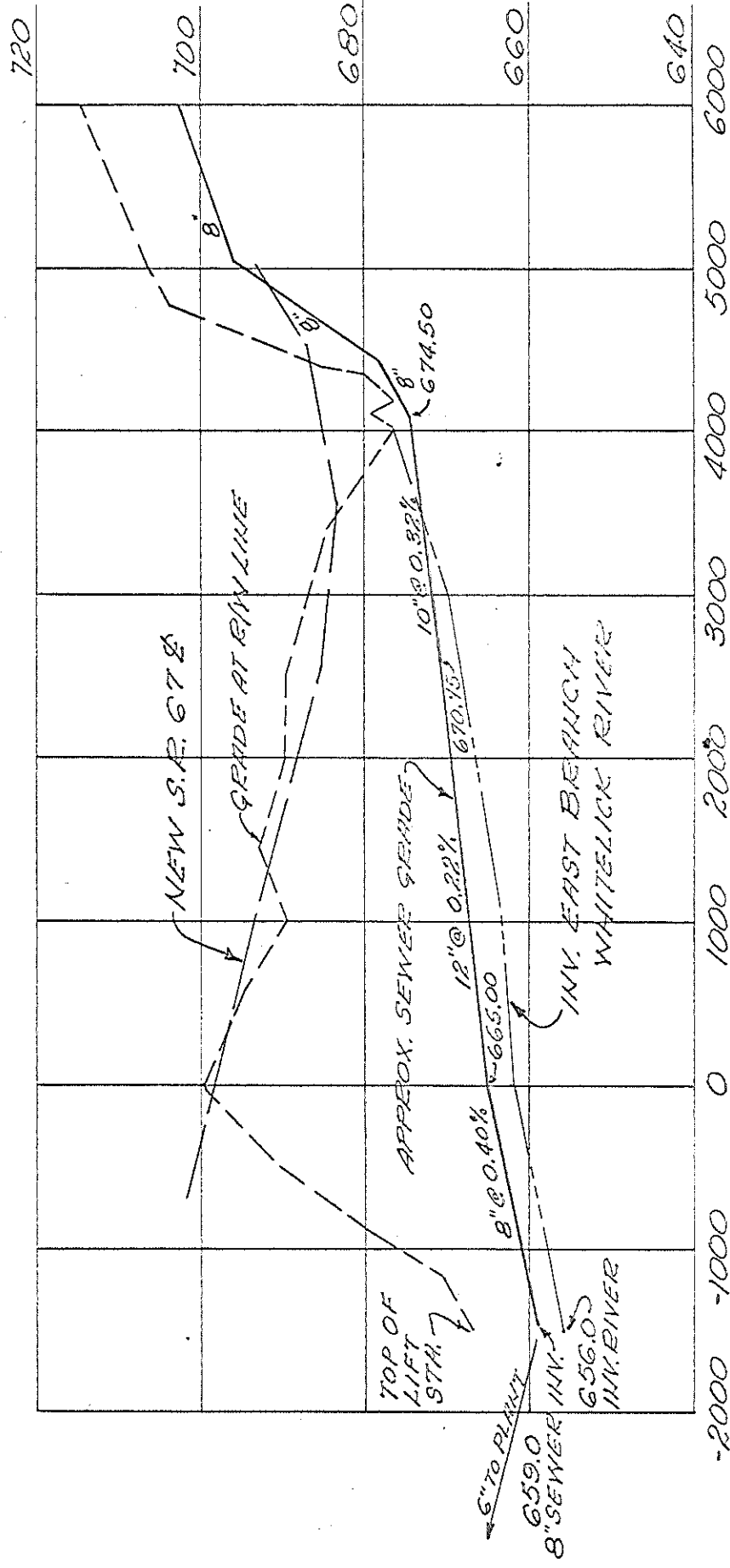
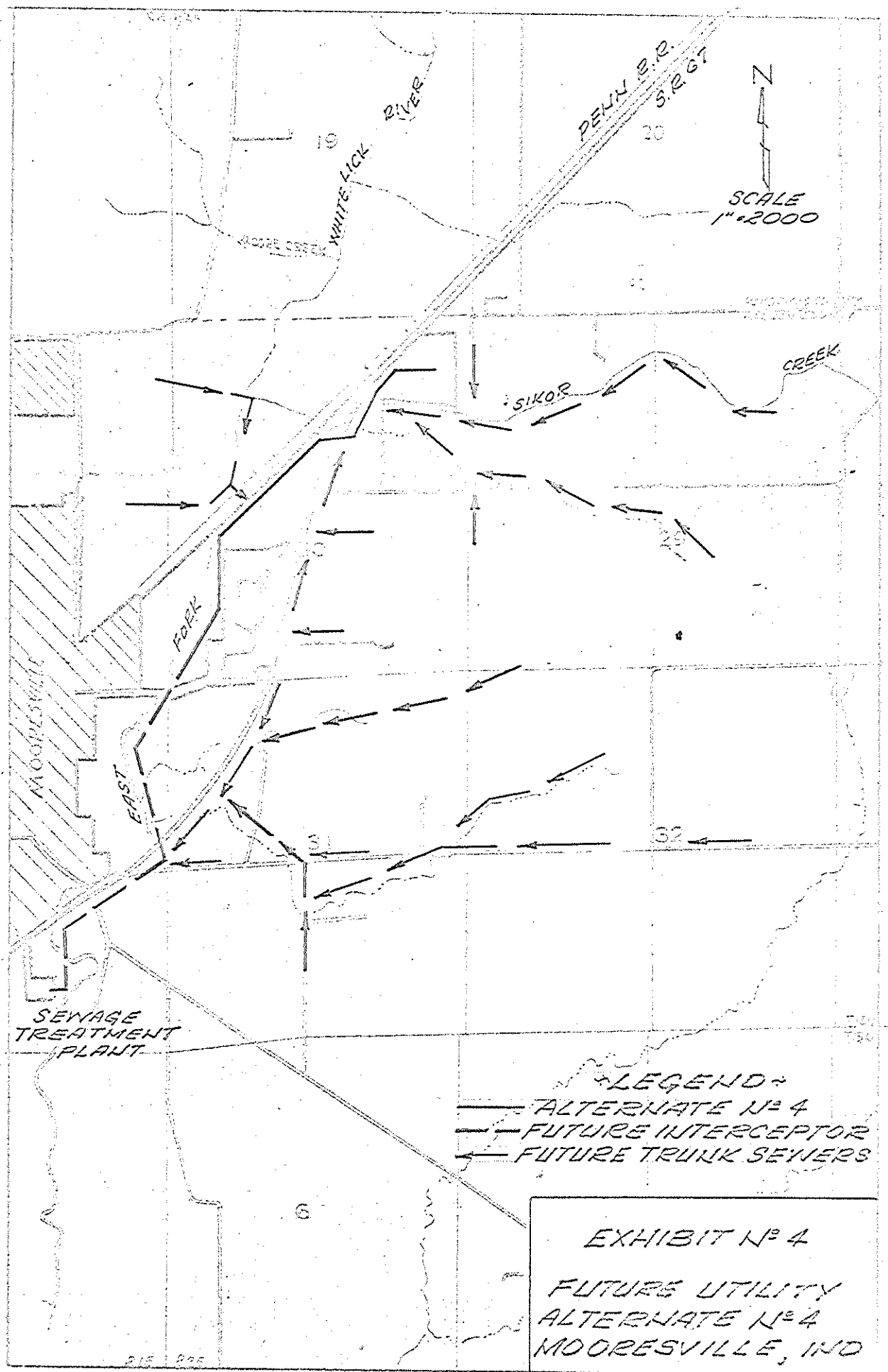


EXHIBIT N-3
