

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met Tuesday January 2, 1968 with trustees Denny, Heshelman, Stevens, Horner, and Moore present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved on a motion by Stevens, second by Denny. Motion carried.

Election of chairman and vice-chairman were held with Horner elected chairman and Denny as vice-chairman.

Horner thanked all town employees for coming to the meeting and read a list of committees. The new board members were then introduced to the employees. When employees were asked if they had any questions, Biviano brought up the question of how long police department would have to work with only three radio operators. Horner informed him he should go through proper committee and that this would be resolved at a later date. Employees were instructed to go to committee heads with any questions they might have and they would take care of it from there.

The following appointments were made:

The following bids on the police cars were presented and opened:

Vestal Motor Company bid \$2,286.09 less \$500.09 trade-in for a net difference of \$1,786.00. Optional power steering offered for \$68.40 additional. Wilcher Ford bid \$3,103.85 less \$1,213.85 trade-in for a net difference of \$1,890.00.

The meeting was then closed to the public and members of the press asked to leave the room while the bids were being discussed. After discussion, the public was asked to return and Moore made a motion to accept Vestal's bid of \$1,786.00, second by Heshelman. Motion carried.

Denny made a motion to pay claims, second by Stevens. Motion carried.

Discussion followed on asking people who have complaints or problems to notify members of the Board through the Clerk-Treasurer at least a week ahead in order to be placed on the agenda. Those notifying the Board ahead of time would be taken care of first. Mr. Adams of Mooresville Times agreed to write an article on this in his paper.

No further business appearing before the Board, Heshelman made a motion to adjourn to meet in continued session January 16, 1968. Second by Stevens. Motion carried.

January 16, 1968

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met in continued session Tuesday January 16, 1968 at 7:30 P.M. Present were trustees Denny, Heshelman, Stevens, Moore, Horner and attorney Bill Fisher.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved on a motion by Denny, second by Stevens. Motion carried.

Heshelman reported the Plan Commission would like to present names of George Worland, replacing Dick Horner and Earl Magenheimer, replacing Wade Roberson, for appointment to the Plan Commission. Denny made a motion to accept Plan Commission recommendation on these appointments as read, second by Stevens. Motion carried.

Stevens reported the Sanitation Committee had been to the disposal plant and had discussed the problems at the plant. Also discussed Bob Johnson's driving the school bus and stated Johnson had already given notice to the school that he would no longer drive a bus for them. Stevens suggested raising Johnson's salary to \$630 per month for six months, then review the situation and work from there. Johnson's assistant's salary also discussed, but Stevens felt the committee should talk to the assistant before next meeting before doing anything about his salary. After this discussion, Stevens made a motion to raise salary of Disposal Plant Superintendant to \$630 per month, effective immediately, second by Heshelman. Motion carried.

Heshelman reported on the Fire Department next. He stated the firemen were wanting a raise in pay. He recommended raising pay when making out budget

for next year.

Chief Wasson asked about an auxiliary police department to help the present marshals. Moore asked to wait until next meeting before making any decision on this.

Dr. Whitney asked to use the corner lot for Boy Scouts to use for display purposes during Scout week in February. Also representing the Optimist Club, he stated the club was interested in bicycle licensing and safety inspection and also that the Optimist Club would be willing to handle the administration part of this if the town has any law pertaining to this situation. Attorney was asked to draw up an ordinance to this effect. Whitney said they might be able to provide a model licensing ordinance from Optimist International. Attorney to get this to see if any changes to be made for it to pertain to Mooresville.

After this discussion, Horner made a motion to allow Boy Scouts to use the corner lot, second by Heshelman. Motion carried.

J. W. Shearer reported a girl had fallen into a catch basin at Carl's Crystal Flash^{which} Carl's men had removed the lid. Attorney asked to notify them in writing to stop removing this lid.

Denny reported he would like an ordinance banning semis and large trucks with the exception of making deliveries, from all streets in town except on designated state highways going through town. Attorney to work on this before next meeting.

Dr. Whitney stated he understood police cars had no first aid kits. He then introduced Lewis Peipenbrink, manager of Hook Drugs, and Chester Freeland, manager of Value Plus Drugstore who then presented the police with a commercial type first aid kit for each car.

Denny brought up the ordinance on cutting streets and sidewalks. Attorney felt a warning letter with a copy of the ordinance attached should be sent to each utility. Denny also stated he felt a penalty should be attached if water leaks are not repaired in a reasonable length of time after notification.

Horner reappointed David Loudermilk as Building Inspector for the Plan Commission.

Discussion on expanding sewers and disposal plant followed. Horner asked Mr. Fisher if we could borrow money from a bank. Mr. Fisher stated he could find no statute governing this.

Annexation of North Indiana Street and installing sewer line before county resurfaces the street was discussed. It was decided to investigate further and defer until next meeting.

Attorney reported on ordinance covering junk automobiles and stated he thought it wise to consider an ordinance covering all types of junk instead of just cars. He is to work on this further.

Attorney Fisher read laws governing a town court, and stated that we would need to figure a budget and how much activity there is in the town that would involve a town court. Police committee, and chief to work with attorney to come to a decision.

Horner reported some repairs need to be done to the municipal building and asked about the Cumulative Capital Improvement Fund and how to go about spending it.

A letter was read from Wm. Wehrle in regard to a lawsuit filed against the town by Benjamin Mendenhall, stating the suit had been dismissed for failure of plaintiffs to file amended complaint after court had sustained his motion to make more specific. This ends this piece of litigation successfully for the Town of Mooresville.

Denny made a motion to pay the claims, second by Moore. Motion carried.

Horner complimented the street department on the fine job they did during the heavy snow.

Heshelman reported he had had a call from the school officials on sidewalk situation at the school property. He said this had been discussed at a Plan Commission meeting and it had been decided to wait until they could meet with the attorney.

No further business appearing before the Board, Stevens made a motion to adjourn, second by Heshelman. Motion carried.

February 6, 1968

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met Tuesday February 6, 1968 at 7:30 P.M. with trustees Moore, Denny, Stevens, Horner, Heshelman and Attorney Fisher present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved, on a motion by Denny, second by Stevens.

Stevens brought up problem of excess surface water causing plant to be shut down for three days recently. After discussion, the attorney suggested running ordinance prohibiting downspouts being hooked into sanitary sewers in newspaper for two weeks in fairness to citizens. Stevens made a motion to republish the ordinance and giving notice of two weeks to comply with ordinance, second by Heshelman. Motion carried.

Attorney Fisher read copy of letter sent to Carl's Crystal Flash asking them to stop removing catch basin lid.

Letters to utilities concerning street cuts read. Earl Helton of Hoosier Water Co. stated he felt things should be done right and that he would cooperate 100%. Helton asked about after hours cuts or on holidays. He is to notify radio operator and he will enter this into radio log. Helton is to come to Clerk's office the next business day to make proper application. During winter or fall months when weather is not suitable, proper patching to be done at first opportunity during good weather. Street Commissioner is to approve all cuts after repaired before final acceptance.

Heshelman, representing Fire Dept., asked what could be used besides blue lights on firemen private cars to get through traffic. Blue lights do not seem to be sufficient. Attorney to check into this for next meeting.

Heshelman also stated he felt there was a need for flashers at railroad crossing at Carlisle Street and Indpls. Road. He is to contact railroad about this.

Ordinance #1-1968 entitled "An Ordinance Restricting the Use of Town Streets by Trucks of Certain Sizes" read, the rules for reading three times were suspended, and the ordinance passed on a motion by Denny, second by Stevens. Motion carried.

Attorney presented Ordinance #2-1968 entitled "An Ordinance Increasing Salary of Sewer Plant Superintendant" to be read. Rules for reading three times suspended and Stevens made a motion to adopt Ordinance #2-1968, second by Denny. Motion carried.

Two hour parking ordinance discussed. Board felt this ordinance should be enforced and a notice published in paper. All employees of town asked to park cars in parking lot instead of on street.

Denny asked if there was an ordinance regulating height of fences, shrubbery, etc. Horner recommended appealing to people rather than writing an ordinance. To work on this later.

Heshelman suggested replacing some stop signs with yield signs. Study to be made by Street Department Chairman and Police Committee Chairman and a report given at next meeting.

Dog situation discussed. Horner proposed that Fisher draw up an ordinance stating any dog running free, could be caught by any citizen who would then bring it to police station to be held for 24 hours. If not claimed, dogs would be turned over to County Dog Warden. Attorney to check on this for next meeting.

A letter from Park Board Chairman was read recommending appointment of Wendell Trogon to replace Newall Hall whose term has expired. Horner made a motion to appoint Trogon to Park Board, second by Heshelman. Motion carried.

Ordinance #3-1968 entitled "An Ordinance Transferring Certain Monies from Sewer Operating Fund to Sinking Fund" read. Stevens made a motion to adopt Ordinance #3-1968, second by Moore. Motion carried.

Petition on Sale Barn read again. After discussion, Heshelman made a motion to turn matter over to County Health Officer, second by Stevens. Motion carried. Attorney to write letter notifying them to connect to sewer.

Denny asked about animals being kept in town. This was deferred until next meeting.

Attorney reported on Town Court. Costs are set by statute. Town receives \$10 docket fee, \$10 to prosecuting attorney, \$2.00 to Commission of Motor Vehicles and 25¢ goes to town clerk for General Fund. Judge is appointed by Board until next election. Expenses for year would run approximately \$7,000.00. Denny made a motion to proceed with Town Court at all possible speed, second by Stevens. Motion carried.

Stevens made a motion to pay claims, second by Heshelman. Motion carried.

Salaries of radio operators discussed. To check into this further.

No further business appearing before the Board, Denny made a motion to adjourn to meet in continued session February 20, second by Stevens. Motion carried.

Gentlemen:

Several months ago I made a request that sidewalks be built with curbs on North Monroe Street, on both sides; on Carlisle Street on both sides; and North Indiana Street.

It was respectfully requested that the Barrett law be used to build walks and property owners be billed to pay for the walks. This method was used in the Morgan addition, Romine addition, and in the Dunn addition property owners paid for walks in the price of their property.

It has been pointed out that a state law regarding school property (28-6410, sub section 3) permits school corporations to build sidewalks on school property.

It has also been respectfully pointed out that Postal Manual Regulation 155-1 concerning foot mail carriers requires that houses be numbered, streets named, streets surfaced and there will be good continuous sidewalks. The last item has been waived in some areas of the town. It is respectfully requested that the federal requirements be incorporated in codes for Mooreville.

It was also pointed out that a letter must be written to the State Highway Commission requesting permission to build sidewalks on North Monroe Street, indicating the specifications. It is respectfully requested that this permission be asked for by the planning commission and town board.

I will appreciate that this letter be made a part of your records, showing that such request has been made to these boards. Your consideration will be appreciated.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met in continued session Tuesday February 20, 1968 at 7:30 P.M. with trustees Denny, Heshelman, Moore, Horner, Stevens and Attorney Fisher present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved on a motion by Heshelman, second by Denny.

Heshelman reported on Plan Commission meeting and presented Docket #1-2-1A to 1C-68 recommending rezoning of Ralph R. and Ralph Thomas Storm property for apartments. After discussion, Stevens made a motion to approve recommendation of Plan Commission to reclassify from 1a to 1c with the stipulation that Mr. Storm present ordinance at next board meeting, second by Moore. Motion carried. Clerk to notify applicants of above action and send copy to the Plan Commission.

Discussion followed on two hour parking ordinance with Chief Wasson stating that Mr. Moore and the Assistant Chief did not feel the ordinance should be enforced on complaints by some of the merchants. Heshelman made a motion to carry over to next meeting, second by Denny. Motion carried.

Bob Keller was present to ask for consideration of a 3-way liquor license ordinance. Ordinance #4-1968 entitled "An Ordinance Consenting That Liquor Retailers' Permit May Be Issued" read. Rule for reading an ordinance three times suspended and ordinance passed on a motion by Denny, second by Stevens. Motion carried.

Ordinance #5-1968 entitled "Establishing a Town Court" read and adopted on a motion by Stevens, second by Heshelman. Motion carried. The rules for reading an ordinance three times were suspended on the above ordinance. After ordinance was adopted, Horner then appointed Keith Wade as Town Judge to serve until the next town election.

The dog problem was discussed next. Denny suggested asked one of the veterinarians if some arrangement could be made with them taking care of the dogs which had been caught. Attorney to work on an ordinance for this situation.

Animal ordinance discussed next. Heshelman made a motion to check into this further before doing anything, second by Moore. Motion carried.

Receiving late statements from some merchants discussed. It was suggested that the clerk send letters to businesses not complying with our wishes to have a statement each month. Moore made a motion to notify merchants the town does business with that if bills aren't turned in by end of each month, the town would discontinue business with them. Second by Heshelman. Motion carried.

The study on stop signs to be continued until next meeting.

Denny made a motion to pay claims, second by Moore. Motion carried.

Stevens brought up the sanitation department having sludge hauled away at a cost of nearly \$2,000.00 last year. He stated he had found a good used truck for around \$2500.00. Since the amount is over \$2,000.00 bids are to be advertised on a motion by Stevens, second by Denny. Motion carried.

No further business appearing before the Board, Heshelman made a motion to adjourn, second by Moore. Motion carried.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved on a motion by Stevens, second by Heshelman.

Representatives of the Girl Scouts were present to push the Girl Scout Cooky Sale and pictures of the Board receiving cookies were taken.

A letter from Chief Wasson on the two hour parking ordinance was read, stating he felt it should not be enforced and the signs should be removed. Comments from the Board members followed. Heshelman made a motion to leave the signs up and enforce upon request, second by Denny. Motion carried.

Fisher read Ordinance #6-1968 entitled "An Ordinance Regulating Dogs". Heshelman made a motion to adopt Ordinance #6-1968 and to make plans for a dog pound immediately, second by Moore. Motion carried.

Study committee on stop signs had no report and have decided to wait until nicer weather so a thorough study could be made.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met Tuesday March 19, 1968 at 7:30 P.M. with trustees Horner, Stevens, Heshelman, Moore and attorney Fisher present.

The minutes of the previous meeting read and corrected on a motion by Stevens, second by Heshelman. Motion carried.

The financial report showed a balance in all town funds of \$72,261.83, Sewage Operating Fund, \$77,121.14, Sewage Sinking Fund \$29,161.19.

Fisher read a letter from Morgan County Plan Commission.

Fisher read Ordinance #8-1968 entitled "An Ordinance Regulating Vehicles and Major Appliances on Property Within Town of Mooresville", and also Ord. #9-1968 entitled "An Ordinance Regulating the Maintenance of Property." The rules for reading three times were suspended and the ordinances passed on a motion by Heshelman, second by Stevens. Motion carried.

Bids on a used 2½ ton truck opened. J. L. Shoffner entered a bid of \$2500 on a 1956 International 2½ ton truck. A. W. Tutewiler bid \$1950 a 1956 Rio with a 1962 engine. After discussion on the use the truck had had, Stevens made a motion to accept Shoffner's bid of \$2500 for a 1956 International, second by Moore. Motion carried.

In a report from the committee on studying need for stop signs, Moore stated Chief Wasson had a list but it was not available for the meeting.

Stevens reported of being approached by owner of Gray's Restaurant on connecting to sewer south of town. They would run the line and put in a lift station. After discussing whether or not this area should be annexed to the town, the matter was deferred until next meeting.

Fisher reported he and Keith Wade were to go to the State Board of Accounts March 20 to seek information on setting up our Town Court.

A copy of the Plainfield Bicycle Licensing Ordinance was shown to the Board, possible to be used as a model for an ordinance for Mooresville. This was given to the attorney for research and preparation of an ordinance and deferred until next meeting.

Mr. Curry of Mooresville Consolidated School Corporation spoke concerning the need for a sidewalk on W. Carlisle St. and stated the school board would cooperate on providing this, but would need cost estimates. School Board is now willing to help the town construct an 8' asphalt or concrete sidewalk on a 50-50 basis from N. Indiana Street to existing sidewalk on W. Carlisle, approximately 1260' in length.

At this time everyone was asked to leave the room except representatives of school and trustees. Mr. Adams of Mooresville Times stated he felt no secret meetings should be held. Attorney Fisher stated he felt the Board could go into executive session anytime it wanted to and the room was cleared.

Discussion on Barrett Law followed with Mr. Fisher stating he had checked with the Attorney General's office and also Mr. Kappes, attorney for the school and is not clear whether this would apply to a school or not. Mr. Curry pointed out that if Barrett Law is used, the sidewalk would have to be built on town right of way, the ditch filled in and tiled and would be much more expensive. Several tentative prices were mentioned but could not be used as definite figures.

The meeting was then reopened to the public, after which Mr. Curry stated the position of the school board. The school will provide land for an 8' sidewalk from N. Indiana St. west to existing sidewalk and share 50% of cost of sidewalk and bridges and other necessary appurtenances. They will also be willing to prepare specifications and necessary bidding on this project. Heshelman made a motion to accept school's proposal and to start work as soon as specs are ready, second by Moore. Motion carried. Heshelman was appointed to work with them on this and the attorneys are to draw up an agreement.

Ben Rush was present to discuss junk ordinance. He asked if he could work out an agreement with the town on getting rid of junk cars. He asked the town to furnish a place for him to cut cars and also to burn seats. Horner appointed Stevens to work with Fisher on researching this and also about purchasing ground adjoining sewage plant to be used for several purposes. Board is to discuss further and Mr. Rush asked to come to next meeting.

Discussion on dog pound and possible locations for this followed but no action taken.

Heshelman made a motion to pay claims, second by Stevens. Motion carried.

Horner reported he had received a call from Dick Hendricks, Civil Defense representative, asking for a civil defense unit controlled by the town but under coordination of the county.

A letter from Gams and Moore was read, verifying our letter asking for additional plans and estimates on sewer line on N. Indiana and also the cost of study would be deducted from total cost if they were awarded contract.

Conditions at the Sale Barn discussed and Horner asked Mr. Fisher to take necessary steps to get this cleaned up. Clerk also to write letter to owners advising them to connect to the sewer.

No further business appearing before the Board, Moore made a motion to adjourn, second by Stevens. Motion carried.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met Tuesday April 2, 1968 at 7:30 P.M. Present were trustees Denny, Heshelman, Moore, Horner and attorney Fisher.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved on a motion by Denny, second by Moore.

Robert Kennedy, architect, was present to discuss improvement of Munici-

pal Building. Mr. Kennedy stated it would probably take most of Cumulative Capital Improvement Fund just to renovate present building and that the Board should solve financial part first. Since we are at a point where we should decide whether we're going to really expand or just remodel within present building, we would need an architect firm to supervise any major work done. Horner asked if the building could house private offices to help pay for building, then later on the building would house only governmental offices. Mr. Kennedy stated he did not know if municipalities could do this, but that we should have a real estate analyst come in and advise us if we need this type of office space and how much revenue per square foot we could get, etc.

Mr. Fisher reported he and Mr. Wade had been to the State Board of Accounts and have ideas and a list of forms on how to set up a town court. He said it would take approximately \$1,000 to get the forms and to get it started. He also said the Board should be considering providing facilities for the town court.

Mr. Fisher is to bring the bicycle ordinance to the next meeting.

Conditions at the Sale Barn discussed again. Fisher has talked to the State Board of Health who said they might come to the Sale Barn to investigate these conditions. Horner read a sample notice to violators of junk ordinance, after which Mr. Fisher suggested some changes.

Bob Johnson reported he knew of a man who might be interested in picking up and storing dogs. Horner suggested maybe combining janitor work on building and dog pound since neither job would be full time. Heshelman and Denny appointed to contact Floyd Spoon about this, to discuss pay, etc.

Purchase of ground near Sewage Plant discussed, but since Stevens was not present, this was deferred to next meeting.

The attached resolution on the sidewalk was read.

Denny stated he was not present at previous meeting but had objections to sharing cost of sidewalk with the school and also objected to using asphalt over concrete. Said asphalt needed traffic that it would not get being used as a sidewalk. He also asked how many churches, etc. we would share the cost of sidewalks with since we were setting a precedent. Denny stated he was not in favor of doing this at all.

After more discussion, Heshelman made a motion to adopt resolution as written, second by Moore. Motion carried with 2 ayes and 1 no.

Agreement for Construction of Sidewalk read. Heshelman made a motion to accept agreement, second by Moore. Motion carried with 2 ayes and 1 no.

A letter from Garns and Moore read and study and report presented to the Board. This was deferred to a later date to give Board a chance to study plans and figures.

Mr. Ben Rush present to find out about junk cars. Board couldn't give him an answer until we see about purchasing additional ground at the Sewage Plant. Mr. Rush to work with J. W. Shearer on this and to use the dump to cut up cars for now, with no more than three cars in the dump at a time. This is for cars picked up in town in violation of junk ordinance.

Letter of resignation from Jerry Wasson as Chief Marshal read, effective April 1. Horner asked that the room be cleared to discuss this situation. After discussion, public asked to come back in and Moore recommended Jesse Swinney be appointed Chief Marshal. A motion was made by Moore to appoint Jesse Swinney Chief Marshal and to vote by secret ballot. Second by Denny. Motion carried. Results of secret ballot were 3 yes, 0 no. Horner called Swinney in and informed him of appointment. Ass't. Chief to be appointed at a later date.

Barbara Corrice was present concerning sidewalk conditions, and presented a petition requesting sidewalks be built where there are none.

RESOLUTION

TOWN OF MOORESVILLE

WHEREAS, Mooresville Consolidated School Corporation (hereinafter referred to as "School") and Town of Mooresville (hereinafter referred to as "Town") desire to construct an eight-foot sidewalk along the southern-most part of the School's property from the School's west property line to the west line of Indiana Street, which property is located immediately north of, and adjacent to, Carlisle Street, Mooresville, Morgan County, Indiana, and

WHEREAS, School and Town feel that such a sidewalk would be beneficial to the interests, and for the needs, of both parties, therefore:



The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met Tuesday April 16, 1968 at 7:30 P.M. with Trustees Denny, Stevens, Moore, Heshelman, Horner and Attorney Fisher present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved on a motion by Denny, second by Stevens.

The Financial Report showed a balance in all town funds of \$69,561.89, Sewage Operating Fund \$83,157.85 and Sewage Sinking Fund \$29,111.19.

Discussion on dog pound next, how to pay, whether to deputize the dog catcher or not. Discussed paying man \$1.00 minimum per dog picked up.

Stevens reported B. F. Jones was to appraise the land next to Sewage Plant then contact the owner.

No report has been received from Garns and Moore yet on North Indiana Street sewer.

Heshelman reported the Plan Commission requested letters be sent notifying property owners of zoning changes when Board acts.

Heshelman made a motion to enforce junk and trash ordinance through police reports, second by Denny. Motion carried. Swinney to notify all police to check for violations and report to clerk so letter can be mailed.

Denny asked if the street department could paint out three parking spaces at North Indiana & Washington Streets. Said cars parked to corner blocked the vision at the intersection. Instructed to proceed as he sees fit.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met Monday May 6, 1968 at 7:30 P.M. with trustees Denny, Moore, Heshelman, Horner, Stevens and attorney Fisher present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved on a motion by Denny, second by Stevens.

Bids on Street Repair were opened as follows:

Horner reported he had contacted the architect, and should have a report by next meeting.

A letter from the school concerning the sidewalk on Carlisle Street read containing proposal and specifications. Stevens felt local contractors should be used and that bids should be let. After discussion, Denny made a motion to approve specifications for sidewalk as written, second by Heshelman. Contracts to be signed only after all board members had read them.

Denny stated he would like for Indiana Bell Telephone Co. to repair sidewalk and install a culvert the same size as culverts on each side of opening to their parking lot on West South Street which would be 12". Also had a report that a utility easement had deep ruts which were made by telephone company. This was off Hadley Street parallel to Indiana Street. Board will give approval for Maple Lane plans when this repair work is done to satisfaction of Denny and Shearer.

Stevens reported a letter had been mailed to Mills Farm manager in regard to appraisal of property adjoining the sanitation plant. This land was appraised at \$400 per acre. He also stated he was waiting for a reply to this letter.

Al June, representing Morgan County Civil Defense presented information on city halls from Washington, D. C. to refer to in our remodeling program. He also asked the Board to consider giving C.D. space for one emergency vehicle and a communications center. Also asked Board to consider building fall-out shelter in basement of Municipal Building.

A letter from Morgan County Board of Health regarding Mooresville Sale Barn read and filed for future use.

A letter from Civil Defense Communications Officer regarding co-ordination of tornado warnings over entire county read and filed.

Bernard Hudson, representing Methodist Church requested financial assistance on sidewalk repair at church to be included in their step remodeling program. Felt this sidewalk repair should be done at the same time as steps. Will have cost estimate right away on this repair to give to Denny for study.

Ordinance #11-1968 entitled "Additional Appropriations" read and rule for reading three times suspended. Stevens made a motion to adopt ordinance, second by Denny. Motion carried. Notice to Taxpayers to be published immediately.

Rebecca Hardin stated Council of Clubs would like to have a community calendar in the municipal building, also asked to have a meeting May 20 in building and would like to have a representative from the Board attend. Stevens to attend meeting along with Horner.

J. W. Shearer informed the Board he couldn't get any response from the railroad or couldn't contact right person to clean ditches along the railroad property. Heshelman made a motion for the attorney to write a letter to the Pennsylvania Railroad to clean out ditches, second by Stevens. Motion carried.

Heshelman asked if there was an ordinance against burning garbage, also asked who gave Bob Dunn permission to place his sign in the triangle at Indpls. Road and Old St. Rd. 67. He read portions of a letter from someone in town who had a high water bill and asked Board of possibility that the man had a leak into the sanitary

sewer causing some of our problem at the plant.

The attorney was asked to bring a sample form for a street cut permit.

Loudermilk reported a camper on Carlisle Street being used as a permanent residence and dumping their waste water into street. He and Chief Swinney had contacted people living in it and gave them 24 hour notice to remove it from street or it would be towed away.

Loudermilk also asked about size of entrances to shopping centers, business, etc. if the Plan Commission should take care of this or an ordinance is needed. Attorney felt the Plan Commission should make recommendation for Board action.

Bob Farmer was present and suggested each driveway to the shopping centers have an in and out drive with a divider in the middle.

Discussion of sewer conditions followed. Stevens made a motion that #1 - Town install new sewer line on Washington Street from N. Monroe to Carter Street at a cost of approximately \$10,000. #2 - repair existing sewers which will eliminate quite a bit of excess water in plant at a cost of approximately \$70,000. #3 - that Bob Johnson be authorized to inspect all repair work. The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooreville met in continued session Tuesday May 21, 1968 at 7:30 P.M. Present were trustees Denny, Stevens, Heshelman, Moore, Horner and attorney Fisher.

The minutes of the previous meeting read and approved on a motion by Stevens, second by Heshelman.

The financial report showed a balance of \$61,428.59 in all funds, \$37,851.23 in Sewage Operating Fund and \$28,861.19 in Sewage Sinking Fund.

Mrs. Hayes, representing Welcome Wagon Club, presented an Indiana state flag to the Board to be flown over town hall.

After discussion, a motion was made by Heshelman to accept Groninger Excavating bid for street repairs, second by Stevens, motion carried.

Discussion followed on whether to appropriate money to hire a dog catcher or to wait until budget is prepared for next year and include it in the 1969 budget. Facilities for this were discussed and it was suggested a garage type building be built at plant to serve several purposes, such as garage space for street and sanitation vehicles with space to work on them. Also dog pens could be built inside this building with a run outside.

Heshelman made a motion to table dog catcher situation until facilities can be provided, second by Denny. Chairman of Bldg. and Grounds to get with Bob Johnson to make a study of type of building needed.

Agreement for Construction of Sidewalk presented by School Board for signature. Denny made a motion to accept agreement, second by Stevens. Motion carried.

Ralph Storm, representing American Legion, presented an American flag to the Board, also to be flown over the town hall.

Bernard Hudson presented cost estimate for sidewalk repair at Methodist Church in the amount of \$553.80. After discussion, Denny made a motion to pay 40% of total cost which would make town's share \$221.52. Second by Heshelman. Motion carried.

A sample street cut permit form will be completed by next meeting for adoption.

Sale Barn again discussed. Attorney asked to seek temporary closing order until the owners comply with Ordinance #6-1959. The time stipulated in certified letter for them to connect to sewer will expire May 24.

It was reported that the camper being used as a permanent residence on Carlisle Street had been removed from the street.

Ordinance #12-1968 entitled "An Ordinance Increasing Salary and Wages of Assistant Sewer Plant Superintendant" presented. Rules for reading three times suspended and ordinance passed on a motion by Stevens, second by Heshelman. Motion carried.

Attorney Fisher stated he felt there was a need to go through ordinances and index them. Possibility of printing a booklet of ordinances and selling them to pay cost of printing discussed. It was suggested town judge go through ordinances and index them since he will need to know all ordinances. Horner to contact Wade about possibility of his doing this.

Plan Commission functions discussed. Board felt trailer ordinances should be updated so Plan Commission could take care of trailer permits. Plan Commission should take care of all rezoning and variances all the way through and only when ordinance conflict occurs would it require board action. Heshelman stated the members of Plan Commission wanted compensation next year.

Trailer applications from Dolphus Brown and F. C. Utterback read. After discussion, Horner made a motion to grant temporary variance on Brown's until ordinances are reconstructed and Plan Commission shall make final decision. Brown has to comply with all ordinances, off street parking, sanitary connections, etc. Second by Heshelman. Motion carried. This is to be in effect until January 1, 1969 then has to be resubmitted to Plan Commission. Mr. Utterback's application was incomplete as to size of trailer, age, etc. When this is completed, it will be considered.

Hearing on Additional Appropriations held next. Clerk presented proofs of publication to Board President who then asked if there were any taxpayers present to object. There being no taxpayers present to object, Heshelman made a motion to accept proofs of publication for filing with rest of papers with county auditor, second by Moore. Motion carried.

Letter from architects read recommending changes and repairs to Municipal Building. After discussion of finances, board decided to make necessary repairs instead of expensive building program. To get estimates from local contractors on roof repair, remodeling rest rooms, rewiring and relocating air conditioner.

A letter from Garns and Moore read containing statement for their services.

Discussion on hiring new police officer followed. More made a motion to hire Wm. Chitwood, second by Stevens, motion carried.

Heshelman made a motion to pay claims, second by Stevens. Motion carried.

There being no further business before the Board, Stevens made a motion to adjourn, second by Heshelman. Motion carried.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met Tuesday June 18, 7:30 P.M. with Trustees Horner, Denny, Stevens, Moore, Heshelman and Attorney Fisher present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved on a motion by Denny, second by Stevens.

Discussed letter from Indiana Rating Bureau concerning needed repairs on fire trucks. Clerk to send letter advising them that cost estimates were being prepared and that necessary repairs would be made as soon as possible.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met Tuesday, July 2, 1968 at 7:30 p.m. with trustees Denny, Moore, Horner, Heshelman, Stevens and Attorney Fisher present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved on a motion by Denny, second by Stevens. Motion carried.

Stuart Ruana, representing Morgan Co. Historical Society, thanked the Board and commended Chief Swinney and Officer Chitwood for their cooperation during the recent Morgan County Historical Tour. He informed the Board that a meeting October 23 at Friendship Hall would spotlight Mooresville with a speaker and program. He asked and received permission to ask Chief Swinney again for help with the crowd at that time.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooreville met in continued session Tuesday July 16, 1968 at 7:30 p.m. with trustees Denny, Moore, Heshelman, Stevens and Attorney Fisher present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The financial report showed a balance of \$106,505.89 in all Town Funds, \$48,431.51 in Sewage Operating Fund and \$28,611.19 in Sewage Sinking Fund.

Denny reported street repair crew would begin street repair this week.

Denny asked if there were any objections to Garms and Moore specifications. Since there were none, the notice to bidders to be published and bids to be let on September 3 for sewer project.

Robert Farmer presented traffic lay-out for Old Settlers. The plan was accepted by the police and the trustees.

Condition at the old mill discussed. It was decided the open scale pit was a safety hazard and something should be done to take care of this.

Condition at town dump discussed. Area at dump to be blacktopped for storage of salt and sand. Mr. Rush asked to complete the commitments he now has, then hold up until further notice on his car cutting set-up.

Resignation read from Alan Hornaday. Motion by Stevens to accept resignation, second by Moore. Motion carried. Moore made a motion to hire Donald Byers, second by Heshelman. Motion carried.

A letter from Stevenson, Kendall & Stevenson was read stating that \$300 had been left to the cemetery from the Nettie R. Day estate.

M. O. Shrake told of being bitten by a dog at Allen's Body Shop. Dog tied on long chain that would extend into street. This is to be checked into and possibly send letter.

Discussion on copy machines followed. Stevens made a motion to leave it up to clerk's discretion which machine to buy at a cost of approximately \$300.00., second by Heshelman. Motion carried.

Ordinance #¹⁵14-1968 entitled "Ordinance Regulating Obstructions on Private Property read. Heshelman made a motion to suspend rules for reading three times and to adopt Ordinance #¹⁵14-1968 with a \$10.00 per day fine, second by Stevens. Motion carried.

Heshelman reported Mr. Curry was at Plan Commission meeting to inform them the school had an option on 20 acres adjoining town to build a 24 room school building. Discussion followed.

Rebecca Hardin complained about large rock on Ralph Storm drive into his property. Stated it was hard to walk on. Board to check into this.

Litter Containers discussed. Stevens made a motion for the street department to empty containers on public streets, second by Moore. Motion carried. This was in conjunction with a letter received from the litter container company.

The Clerk-Treasurer presented to the Board proof of publication to taxpayers of the additional appropriation hearing. There being no taxpayers present to be heard a motion was made by Stevens and seconded by Heshelman that the ordinance and proof of public notice be filed with the County Auditor.

Heshelman made a motion to pay claims, second by Stevens. Motion carried.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met Tuesday August 6, 1968 at 7:30 p.m. with Trustees Denny, Heshelman, Moore, Horner, Stevens and Attorney Fisher present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved on a motion by Heshelman, second by Moore. Motion carried.

Mr. Fisher asked if Roy Rushing Trailer Court had been blacktopped yet to comply with his letter and was informed Mr. Rushing had done so.

Mr. Fisher reported he had checked with the State Board of Accounts on the town's bonding power and had found out the town does have bonding power to buy the water company if the trustees wanted to.

Denny reported he had called Farm Bureau and they had already boarded up the scale pits and cut the weeds around the old mill.

Heshelman informed the Board that Rick Harris was present working on his Boy Scout Citizenship and Community Badge.

Charles Hollon was present protesting trucks cutting into his property from the alley on the east side of his property. The property owner on the east side of him had had his property surveyed and his property line extends into existing alley. A post had been driven into the center of the alley representing his southwest property line. Mr. Hollon asked for someone to measure his property from his west stakes to point at alley where his line should be. Shearer to do this immediately.

Ben Rush informed the Board that Smitherman would lease property behind Hatchery for cutting up cars. He was informed the Town was in no position to lease property. Rush said he would lease the property if the Board would stand behind him complaint-wise. Mr. Rush was then asked the advisability of leaving oxygen tanks and gas tanks out in the open at the dump. He agreed it was dangerous and would discontinue this practice. After some discussion, the Board agreed to let Mr. Rush continue operating at the dump for the time being.

At this point, Horner called for a short executive meeting and asked everyone to leave except Chief Swinney. Horner then asked Swinney who was to enforce the bank lane parking and also about employees parking in Town lot. Since both of these matters had been taken care of at the last meeting there was very little discussion and the meeting was opened to the public again.

Fisher reported he had checked with Keith Wade on compiling ordinances and that they were willing to work two evenings a week until completed but felt they should be reimbursed for this as it might take as many as five weeks. Ordinances would be compiled into booklet form and offered for sale. Board agreed it would be worthwhile to have this done. Heshelman made a motion that Fisher and Wade compile ordinances into book form to be sold and to reimburse them from sale of books. Second by Moore. Motion carried.

Floyd Schanz, John Barber and A. J. Schanz, Sr. were present to discuss with Board about possible sale of ground (old Freeman property) to town for a park. The price of \$35,000 for 7.35 acres was mentioned. Since this is actually a matter for the Park Board, no action was taken.

Discussion followed after Horner asked about creating an ordinance restricting burning of trash. Stevens made a motion to have Fisher check on what other towns do, second by Denny. Motion carried.

Buying the Water Company was discussed next and Mr. Fisher asked to check into all phases of condemnation, etc.

Loudermilk presented a sketch of proposed repair and addition to the Town Hall. Horner asked for Board's approval to relocate fire siren and radio antennae. Moore made a motion to allow Loudermilk to move siren and antennae and to proceed with the addition to the building, second by Stevens. Motion carried.

Heshelman made a motion to pay claims, second by Denny. Motion carried.

Horner asked Board's opinion about running water into the cemetery and the possibility of building a shelter house. No action taken.

No further business appearing before the Board, Heshelman made a motion to adjourn to meet in continued session August 20, second by Denny. Motion carried.

October 1, 1968

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met Tuesday October 1, 1968 at 7:30 p.m. Trustees present were Denny, Stevens, Moore and Heshelman.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved on a motion by Stevens, second by Heshelman.

Denny reported he had a price of approximately \$400 for a snow plow for Street Department.

Arthur Stanley of Indpls. Rd. complained about dogs running loose and told the Board how Plainfield takes care of their dog situation by cooperating with the local veterinarians. After some discussion, Stevens agreed to contact Dr. Sowers about the possibility of his working with the town on the dog problem.

Ralph Storm, Paul Michael, Jim Quillen and Jack McGuire were present on behalf of

their automatic car wash businesses. Mr. Storm stated they had all been contacted by the County Board of Health about their drains from the car washes not being connected to the sanitary sewer. He said the State Board of Health had been contacted and they would be glad to come down and explain why these drains can and should be connected to the sewer. Said the State Board of Health classifies the water and detergent from the car washes as sewage.

Mr. Storm asked permission to hook to sanitary sewers to comply with County and State Board of Health. In the discussion which followed this request, Jim Quillen stated he had sold car washes all over the U.S. and Mooresville was the only place car washes could not be connected to the sewer. He said all car washes have grease traps and can have a second grease trap in drain before anything enters into sewer.

Mr. Michael informed the Board their car wash was not connected to the storm sewer, that only an overflow was connected which is just now being used.

Stevens stated if the State Board of Health says car washes have to be connected to sanitary sewer, then the Town should cooperate.

Denny suggested Mr. Johnson meet with representative from State Board of Health and come to an agreement by next meeting.

A letter from Indiana Bell Telephone requesting permission to make an opening on Crestwood Drive at Rose Lane to replace buried cable was read. Heshelman made a motion to grant permission to Indiana Bell for this work. Second by Stevens. Motion carried.

A proposed ordinance restricting all future trailer permits was presented and read. Heshelman explained what the Plan Commission wanted to do and then made a motion to accept this ordinance prohibiting future issuance of trailer permits. The motion died for lack of a second.

Stevens made a motion to have the attorney rewrite trailer restriction ordinance, second by Moore. Motion carried. It was felt trailer permits should be issued to existing trailer sites but not issued to any new sites in the future.

Stricken from minutes on motion made at Oct. 15, 1968 meeting.
An application for a trailer permit from George Terrell was presented. After discussion on who actually issued permits and studying existing ordinances, Heshelman made a motion to give Mr. Terrell a permit to set a trailer behind the Shell Station on Indpls. Rd., second by Stevens. Motion carried.

Heshelman reported the fire truck going to a fire at Shopping Center with one of the town employees driving who is not a fireman. After discussion, Heshelman made a motion to not allow any fire truck to be used for cleaning out sewers and to be used only for fires, second by Stevens. Motion carried.

It was reported a 16" sewer tile was being installed along North Indiana Street at the school property to drain new athletic field. Denny to check with school since Board felt tile is not large enough to drain all the surface water.

Moore presented prices for a small tractor to be used at the Cemetery with a mower, snow plow and dumpcart. It was decided to get the 10 HP tractor for \$1102.11 on a motion by Stevens, second by Moore. Motion carried.

Ordinance #16-1968 on "Additional Appropriations" was read and passed on a motion by Heshelman, second by Stevens. Motion carried. Notice to be published in Mooresville Times and posted in three public places of hearing to be held October 15.

Clerk informed Board the U. S. Treasury Bills had matured. Stevens made a motion to reinvest money in U. S. Treasury Bills, second by Moore. Motion carried.

Discussion on room addition followed. Loudermilk asked about ^{pouring} ~~parking~~ floor. Stevens made a motion to allow Loudermilk to pour concrete floor without conduit for electric heat, second by Moore. Motion carried.

Heshelman made a motion to pay claims, second by Moore. Motion carried.

No further business appearing before the Board, Stevens made a motion to adjourn to meet in continued session October 15. Second by Moore. Motion carried.

October 15, 1968

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met in continued session October 15, 1968 at 7:30 p.m. with Trustees Denny, Stevens, Horner, Moore and Heshelman present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and on a motion by Heshelman the paragraph stating the Board had granted a trailer permit to George Terrell, was struck from the minutes. Second by Denny. A motion was made by Denny to accept

the minutes as corrected, second by Moore.

Stevens reported he had not had a chance to contact Dr. Sowers on the dog situation.

Stevens reported that car washes had to have a tank installed to be used before the waste goes into sanitary sewer and also has to have a manhole in order to clean it. He also stated the need for an ordinance allowing Sanitation Department to inspect this.

Horner proposed to ask David Loudermilk if he would consider letting the Board get another contractor on the building annex since he is so busy. It was agreed the roof need to be repaired immediately, and also the fire house roof was damaged by the hail and needs repair. Board decided to leave these items to the discretion of Moore and Horner.

Denny reported the contractor at the new school building had installed a 15" tile between a 36" and 30" tile at the school property. He stated he had talked to the school superintendant and that he had said he would bring it up at the next School Board meeting.

Bob Dunn and Gil Aplanalp were present with more plans of proposed annexation of the 52 acres across the county line. Mr. Dunn had presented the plans to the Plan Commission October 14 and Mr. Worland had stated the Plan Commission would be willing to work with everyone involved if the area is annexed. Mr. Dunn said his company would build approximately 35 homes per year and it would take about 3 years to complete this project. This area would have multiple dwellings, a church, nursing home, medical clinic, light industry and two price ranges of homes.

Stevens reported he had talked with Mr. Moore of Garms and Moore and that he had reported that if we had no surface water seepage, the sewer could handle more homes. Dunn said he had his engineers study flows, and that the surface water was not coming from his development, at least not a measurable amount. He felt the plant should be expanded to meet his needs.

Horner said he felt Dunn's plans should be accepted by Plan Commission first. Dunn asked for an annexation ordinance to be passed, that he had given the Board ample time to study the situation. Horner then asked for a motion to accept annexation, providing the Plan Commission and the attorney approves such a move. Since the attorney was not present, Stevens felt nothing should be done on this until such time the attorney is present to advise the Board.

After discussion, Stevens made a motion for the Plan Commission and attorney to work on a study of this annexation and also the legal aspects and for the Board to meet with the Plan Commission. Dunn asked for the motion to be reworded since he wanted to know if the Board was willing to annex or not. Stevens then reworded the motion to read: A motion was made for the Plan Commission and attorney to work on a study of this annexation and also the legal aspects and for the Board to meet with the Plan Commission and if all details are worked out favorably, then he would be willing to annex the area. Second by Moore. The Chairman then broke the tie vote/when the motion, two voted in favor of the motion and two voted against and the motion carried.

George Worland reported Lewis Peipenbrink and Lewis Marsh had resigned from the Plan Commission and presented a letter of recommendation for the Board to appoint John Crose, Rep. from Marleywoods, to replace Lewis Peipenbrink. Mr. Worland asked to know the remaining terms of the various members. Heshelman made a motion to accept resignations of Peipenbrink and Marsh and to appoint John Crose, second by Denny. Mr. Worland then asked the Board and the public attending the meeting to attend the Plan Commission meeting November 11.

Mr. Worland also reported on the annexation proceedings to even up the town limits. It seems the county records are from 4 to 7 years behind and the plats are not up to date. The attorney had told him this area could be annexed by Metes and Bounds and that Delbert Hobson could do this. It was suggested we use the County Surveyor.

Mr. Worland asked if the Board had struck paragraph granting the trailer permit to Mr. Terrell from the minutes and was told it had been and Mr. Horner cited a resolution passed which is recorded in the May minutes. Denny asked if there had been any objections to the trailer from the adjoining property owners. Worland stated there had not been objections to his knowledge. It was decided that the Plan Commission should review this situation and their decision would be final.

Ordinance entitled "Ordinance Prohibiting Future Issuing of Trailer Permits on New Sites" was read. Mr. Heshelman stated he had not presented the ordinance and preferred it be held until next meeting.

Heshelman read and rules and regulations for Fire Department and made a motion to adopt these rules and regulation, second by Moore. Motion carried.

The following resolution was read and adopted on a motion by Stevens, second by Denny. Motion carried.

WHEREAS, Indiana towns and cities have acquired important responsibilities involving spending and collecting much public money, the hiring and coordinating of many employees of varied skills in different departments, and must carry on a big and complex business operation, and

WHEREAS, no other business would be expected to operate such an enterprise without skilled management, and

WHEREAS, Indiana law forbids towns to hire any kind of manager, and restricts cities to the management skills of mayors elected under conditions and salary restrictions that usually preclude the possibility of a full time, skilled city manager,

It is hereby resolved by the Mooresville Town Board that the Indiana legislature, in the interests of efficient municipal operation, permit towns and cities at their own discretion to hire capable managers to run their business functions. Just as school districts, county plan commissions, and other public bodies are allowed to hire the best management talent available for their important public responsibilities, so should towns and cities be allowed similar rights in getting good town or city management.

The clerk then presented proof of publication and posting to the Board Chairman who then asked if there were any taxpayers present to be heard on the matter of Additional Appropriation. There being no taxpayers present, a motion was made by Denny to approve proof of publication and posting and make it part of the record and to be filed with the County Auditor, second by Moore. Motion carried.

Denny made a motion to pay claims, second by Stevens. Motion carried.

No further business appearing before the Board, Heshelman made a motion to adjourn, second by Stevens. Motion carried.

November 6, 1968

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met Tuesday November 6, 1968 with trustees Denny, Moore, Horner, Stevens and Heshelman present. Attorney Fisher was also present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved on a motion by Heshelman, second by Denny.

Horner reported he had contacted Horace and Charles Bain on the roof repair but they had given no estimate of cost yet.

Mr. Curry, Supt. of Schools and Kenneth Tapp, President of the School Board, spoke concerning the drain tile at school property. They stated it had been engineered again and according to the architect's specs, a 15" tile would carry any drainage. They also said if the 15" tile doesn't work, it will be changed by the school or contractor. Denny agreed to leave it, and if it does not work it will have to be changed. Mr. Curry stated this would be done. Mr. Tapp stated the school board wanted to cooperate with the Town and Mr. Curry said if the Board had any questions any time, to feel free to come to school board meetings.

Mr. Fisher reported he had contacted the Hoosier Water Company and that they (a) do not want to sell the water company and (b) that they had means to provide water to Dunn's proposed addition. Mr. Fisher also stated there were many problems to consider on the annexation of Dunn's 52 acres and that he is to meet with the attorney at Clermont which is half in Marion County and half in Hendricks County. He is to have more information by next meeting.

Stevens reported the Washington St. sewer project completed and had been inspected by the engineers, who said it was one of the best jobs they had ever seen. The Town is to pay all but 10% of the total cost to the contractor at this time.

Stevens also reported that two car washes have been connected to the sanitary sewer but we need an ordinance revising rates for laundries and car washes.

Horner asked if Stevens had heard from Mrs. Justin on the property near the disposal plant. Stevens reported he hadn't heard anything which led him to believe she didn't want to sell. Mr. Fisher is to call her.

Heshelman reported the Fire Department had inspected several businesses and would be sending out letters to business owners to correct any violations.

Patrick Taylor, attorney representing Mr. Trusty who was struck by train asked for the Board to do something about getting a flasher at the intersection at Indpls. Road and Carlisle Street and that he had found the town could pass an ordinance forcing the railroad to install a flasher. He also presented a blank petition to Board requesting this be done. Horner stated he felt there was a need for flashers at this crossing and South Street. Denny said we need one at Washington Street also. Mr. Fisher was asked if the Street Department could put up stop signs at these crossings and was advised this would be legal. Heshelman stated he felt stop signs should be held up until the flasher ordinance is passed and railroad notified.

Mr. Taylor to write petition by end of week designating all crossings that need flashers and present signed papers to the Board. Someone from the Board is to contact Mr. Taylor about the crossings needing flashers.

A letter was read from Hendricks County Plan Commission attorneys stating they felt if Mooresville annexed into Hendricks County, Mooresville should adopt zoning ordinance and building code of Hendricks County.


Denny made a motion to pay claims, second by Heshelman. Motion carried.

Stevens made a motion to reinvest \$70,000.00 in U. S. Treasury Bills from the Sewage Operating Fund after the clerk advised the Board of the maturity of the previous U. S. Treasury Bills. Second by Denny. Motion carried.


No further business appearing before the Board, Heshelman made a motion to adjourn to meet in continued session November 19, second by Moore. Motion carried.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met in continued session
November 19, 1968 at 7:30 p.m. with trustees Horner, Denny, Moore, Heshelman, Stevens

and Attorney Fisher present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved on a motion by Stevens, second by Heshelman.

Patrick Taylor, attorney, presented signed petitions containing 500 signatures asking for an ordinance to provide flasher signal at Indianapolis Road and other crossings which the Board felt signals were needed.

Mr. Fisher presented to the Board an ordinance to this effect. Horner read Ordinance #17-1968 entitled "An Ordinance Requiring Installation of Flasher Signal". The rules for reading three times were suspended and Denny made a motion to adopt the ordinance with \$100 per day fine, second by Heshelman. Motion carried.

A letter from the Plan Commission concerning Wake-Up Oil Co. petition to rezone was read. The letter recommended passing an ordinance to rezone from 1A to 2E. Mr. Fisher stated the trailer on the property was to be removed by May 31. Since there was no ordinance presented with the recommendation, Denny made a motion to approve rezoning to be effective when the ordinance is presented and approved. Second by Moore. Motion carried.
