January 20, 1970

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met in continued session January 20, 1970 with trustees Denny, Stevens, Horner, Heshelman, and attorney Corey present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved on a motion by Heshelman, second by Horner.

The financial report showed balances in funds as follows: Town Funds: \$81,715.71, Sewage Operating Fund: \$67,116.59, Sinking Fund: \$34,436.19.

Reorganization of Sanitation Department followed: Denny stated the Sanitation Department had been joined with the Street Department to avoid unnecessary expense and duplication of work. Stevens made a motion to combine Street and sanitation departments, second by Horner. Motion carried.

Stevens made a motion to discharge Robert Johnson as Superintendent of Sewage Plant, second by Heshelman. Motion carried unanimously.

Denny then stated that the Plant would be under the supervision of Rex Simmons, and the sanitary sewers and storm sewers under the supervision of J. W. Shearer.

Stevens made a motion to pay the Park Department for the radio in the Sanitation truck, second by Horner. Motion carried.

Norma Kays stated she had a sewer problem, that they could not find the lateral to their rental property, at 10 North Drive. J. Shearer to check into this.

Ralph Lett, representing several people present, asked who would replace Johnson and was told Rex Simmons would replace him. He asked what qualifications Mr. Simmons had for the job, and also Mr. Shearer for the job he was to have. He also asked for a copy of the sewer ordinance and was assured that he could study the ordinance anytime he wanted to during office hours. He stated the people were interested in the tax situation on the sewer situation and asked about a reduction in rates and was advised a study was being made of the rates. After asking about the men meeting the State Board of Health requirements, the Board stated they felt the men met the requirements at this time. He also asked about some money being spent for engineering firms and showed the Board a letter from American Pipe Services which had been sent to Mr. Johnson.

Heshelman made a motion to pay claims, second by Horner. Motion carried.

Mary Hubbard asked about the condition of West Harrison Street and if anything could be done about the street being higher than the sidewalk and was told it is a bad situation and the Board would like to correct it and maybe could at a later date.

No further business appearing before the Board, Horner made a motion to adjourn, second by Heshelman. Motion carried.

Heshelman made a motion to reopen meeting, but the motion failed for lack of a second.

February 3, 1970

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met Tuesday February 3, 1970 at 7:30 P.M. with trustees Denny, Stevens, Heshelman, Horner, Moore and Attorney Corey present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved on a motion by Heshelman, second by Stevens.

Specifications for 1970 police car were presented by Moore and the Board agreed to advertise for bids to be opened March 3, 1970.

Since several people were present, Denny asked if anyone had anything to say.

James Robinson stated the people were interested in good government and had come to observe the meeting.

Jack Callahan stated he thought it was fine to join both street department and sanitation department and since the Board had let Mr. Johnson go for economical reasons, why did Mooresville have the highest paid attorney in Indiana?

Discussion followed.

Bob Dunn stated his petition for rezoning of 8 acres on Indpls. Rd. had been tabled and asked the Board to act on it. He stated it had been approved by the Plan Commission and that whatever is done will be done with approval of State Board of Health, that the lift station would be maintained by the owner of apartments and that it was possible that he would go to a private sewage plant instead of connecting to the sewer. He also stated it would take him 8 or 9 months to get started on the project.

Pete Robinson stated the Plan Commission had okayed the rezoning with the stipulation that nothing be done until the sewer situation is corrected.

Murray Stanley asked how many units he would be building, which is approximately 100 units. He also asked about emergency annexation and was told the work emergency is used in most ordinances. He also stated that Indpls. Rd. was narrow and intersection at old 67 is very bad and should we add 100 units of apartments to this traffic. He felt there was a lack of planning and suggested we hold up everything until all things are straightened out. He felt the town needs industry before residential building.

Becky Hardin suggested Mr. Dunn should include a wide road to State Road 67 to relieve the traffic situation on Indianapolis Road.

A question arose as to the correctness of the Plan Commission vote and Mr. Stanley felt if there was a question the Board should deny the petition or have Mr. Dunn reapply at a later date.

February 3, 1970 minutes continued:

Delmar Heaton of Indpls. Road told the Board if Mr. Dunn builds these apartments, another 200,000 gallon of sewage would be dumped into creek.

Mr. Callahan asked to have the standards raised before rezoning is granted.

After discussion ended, Horner made a motion to act on recommendation of Plan Commission to approve rezoning and that the ~~building~~^{plans} meet all standards, specifications and codes from the State Board of Health before Mr. Dunn is allowed to start building. The plans, in detail, are to be on file with both Boards and that Mr. Dunn agrees to maintain lift station and his own sewers. Second by Stevens. Motion carried unanimously.

Jerry Mayfield, Sweetwood Drive, stated he had had all kinds of trouble and that Mr. Dunn had always fixed whatever trouble he had and he felt if the standards were like they should be, Mr. Dunn would have abided by them.

In other business, Mr. Murray Keys asked to reopen the Mooresville Sale Barn which had been closed by the County Board of Health previously. Mr. Corey is to talk with him on this.

Jeffery Mayfield asked for an amendment to the no parking to take effect soon on Sweetwood Drive. He asked for evening, and Saturday and Sunday parking since there is not enough room for everyone to park in their drives. The Board is to study this situation.

Pete Robinson asked Board's opinion of parking on planter strip and was told not to since there was an ordinance prohibiting this.

Heshelman made a motion to pay claims, second by Moore. Motion carried.

No further business appearing before the Board, Stevens made a motion to adjourn to meet in continued session February 17, 1970, second by Horner. Motion carried.

February 17, 1970

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met in continued session Tuesday February 17, 1970 at 7:30 P.M. with trustees Denny, Stevens, Heshelman, Moore and Attorney Corey present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved on a motion by Stevens, second by Moore.

Heshelman made a motion to remove "No Parking" on Sweetwood Drive, second by Moore. Motion carried.

Stevens made a motion to create a snow emergency ~~xxxx~~ ordinance, second by Heshelman. Motion carried.

The Financial Report showed the following balances: Town: \$78,199.01, Sewage Operating Fund: \$74,694.36, Sewage Sinking Fund: \$14,461.19.

Stevens reported on a meeting with Henry B. Steeg representative. Stevens made a motion to write Steeg to proceed with drawings on levee, second by Heshelman. Motion carried.

Corey reported the amount of land needed for the levee would be $4\frac{1}{2}$ acres to 5 acres instead of original 14 acres proposed previously.

Stevens reported Harold Copeland had asked for a loading zone near the Pure Oil Station. No action taken.

Stevens made a motion to send letters on all delinquent sewer bills over three months, second by Heshelman. Motion carried.

A letter from the Hoosier Water Company read about the rural fire departments using water from fire hydrants.

Ralph Storm was present to ask for a variance on ground next to Kentucky Colonel Carry-Out. Opal Meo asked about drainage of water from this proposed parking lot and asked if it would drain into the alley. Mr. Storm stated he wanted the street department to work with the blacktop people on drainage. J. Shearer stated he felt the water should drain into East South Street.

February 17, 1970 minutes continued:

Stevens made a motion to grant variance, second by Moore. Motion carried.

The Board is to get specifications on sidewalks to Mr. Storm so they can be replaced.

Mrs. Meo asked about Mr. Storm's incinerator at the Dairy Queen. He stated he would have to move the incinerator farther away from the store onto the property he is acquiring.

John Moore was present and asked if the Plan Commission had given the Board a resolution on his rezoning and was told the Board had not received anything from the Plan Commission on this matter.

Stevens made a motion to adopt Ordinance #1-1970 entitled "An Ordinance Amending Zoning Ordinance", second by Moore. Motion carried. This ordinance rezones property of Bob Dunn on Indianapolis Road.

Stevens made a motion to pass Ordinance #2-1970 entitled "A Salary Ordinance Amending the Salary Ordinance #16-1969 Dated December 23, 1969, etc." Second by Heshelman. Motion carried.

Max Hahn asked if there were to be changes in the sewer rates and Denny stated there might be changes in the business rates but not in the residential rates.

Heshelman made a motion to pay claims, second by Moore. Motion carried.

No further business appearing before the Board, Stevens made a motion to adjourn, second by Heshelman. Motion carried.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met in continued session Tuesday March 17, 1970 at 7:30 P.M. with trustees Horner, Stevens, Moore, Heshelman and Attorney Corey present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved on a motion by Horner, second by Stevens, motion carried.

The Town Board recognizes that a substantial number of citizens have signed a petition in favor of a referendum for a Fifth Class City. The Board has no official position on whether the Town of Mooresville should become a city, but it does believe that anytime the citizens wish to vote on a matter of this importance they should be allowed to do so. The town will not however, yield to intimidation by a limited group who threaten a lawsuit should the Board not agree to pass a resolution to put the referendum on the May 5th primary and, in effect, deprive the citizens from giving full consideration of the affects of a Fifth Class City on the Town of Mooresville.

For this reason, the Board is passing a resolution that the referendum for having a vote on Fifth Class City status be put on the November 1971 ballot. In this way, any interested citizens or groups can make themselves heard, hold meetings and do what they wish to explore the advantages and disadvantages of Mooresville becoming a Fifth Class City. The Town Board and does feel that it is not in the best interest of Mooresville to rush into a vote on a matter of such importance when nothing is lost by allowing the citizens to intelligently analyze the merits of a Fifth Class City for the Town of Mooresville. The Town Board feels that anyone who would wish to rush this vote, after this matter has been discussed with no action for many years, does so with their own interests in mind and not with the interests of Mooresville as a whole. It must be determined whether or not a Fifth Class City is right for the Town of Mooresville, not in theory but in practice.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met Tuesday May 5, 1970 at 7:30 P.M. with trustees Moore, Truax, Summerlot, Heshelman and attorney Lind present.

The minutes were read and approved.

Mr. Summerlot reported that Mrs. Richard Rogers of 45 Crestwood Drive had complained of a sewage problem that they have had for some time. J. Shearer to check on this problem again.

A man asked about the trailer on East High Street that was moved in. The attorney is to check the ordinance on trailer permits and take care of the problem.

May 5, 1970 minutes continued:

Mrs. Elma Shrake asked about having some dirt put in the planter strip at her house at 125 E. Main. She said the alley is higher than her lot and causes water to stand at spots. J. Shearer is to check this and try to take care of it.

Mr. Dalton

~~XXXXXXXX~~ was present and asked about the variance at the Sale Barn. The Board decided that due to the fact that the Board has new members and a new attorney, they would prefer to wait until everyone has a chance to study the situation.

Joe Thompson, of Oxford Chemicals, who supply chemicals for the street and sewage departments reported that some products are just sitting at the plant and have not been used. Some of these products can be used at the plant and he also said that everything needed is at the plant, but not being used properly. He felt we needed deodorant blocks to keep odor down during the summer months. The Board asked Mr. Thompson to write what we need and recommend how it is to be used.

Mr. Summerlot asked the attorney about the referendum. Mr. Lind stated that the Board could allow Mr. Robinson to get the petition back to the Board with the certification from the County Clerk that is has 1/3 registered voters and could then legally change resolution for a referendum in 1971 to 1970. He said the Board could check the petition to see if it is in order and if it is, the referendum could be held in fall of 1970.

Mr. Truax asked about maps of the Town. George Worland showed Board new map showing outlying areas of Mooresville.

A report was made on the meeting with the Park Board. The Park Board wants to purchase 105 acres at \$1500 per acre. This would be done ^{IN PART} with Federal funds through HUD program. The Park Board wants to know if the Town Board is agreeable to a bond issue for the park program.

Pete Robinson asked if we needed 100 acres for a park. He objected to buying so much ground and asked if 15¢ would take care of the tax rate. Don Kouns, chairman of the Park Board then stated they did not know what the tax rate would be, that this was in the future and they did not have the correct figures.

Truax made a motion to accept report of Park Board favourably by consent, and to instruct them to proceed to investigate possible park development, subject to suitable financing. Second by Summerlot. Motion carried.

Truax made a motion to reinvest \$70,000.00 in U. S. Treasury Bills that had matured previously, second by Summerlot. Motion carried.

Moore made a motion to pay claims, second by Truax. Motion carried.

No further business appearing before the Board, Moore made a motion to adjourn to meet in continued session May 19, 1970, second by Truax. Motion carried.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met in continued session Tuesday May 19, 1970 at 7:30 p.m. with trustees Heshelman, Moore Truax and Summerlot present. Attorney Lind was also present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and corrected.

The Financial Report showed balances as follows: Town Funds: \$84,150.73, Sewage Operating Fund: 114,212.99 and Sewage Sinking Fund: \$9,886.19.

Mr. Thompson of A & E Engineering brought plans and specifications for the North Indiana Street sewer project.

Jerry Sheeley, of Marathon Oil Co., was present to see what procedure to go through on curb cuts at the new Marathon service station site. Sidewalks at this location were discussed also. Mr. Truax made a motion to allow the building permit subject to the construction of sidewalks on both streets and subject to obtaining subsequent cut permits if necessary. Second by Summerlot. Motion carried.

Fred Redeker stated that the State Board of Health had mandated the Lions Club to put in sewers for trailers at Old Settlers last year. Kappa Kappa Sigma Sorority had pledged \$500 to help pay for the sewers and the Lions Club would pay the balance. Mr. Redeker asked the Board to sign agreement with the Lions Club. Moore made a motion to execute the agreement with the Lions Club, second by Summerlot. Motion carried.

Mrs. Elma Shrake complained about water running on sidewalk at her property and about the high curbs in front of her house.

Maps for the Plan Commission~~er~~ discussed and Mr. Lind suggested we wait for a few weeks to look at zoning situation and to find the different areas of zoning. Mr. Truax suggested we give Plan Commission plans to work with them on this map.

Labeco had requested no parking on the south side of their building from Penn Central Railroad to Madison Street. No action taken. A 4 way stop in the alley between E. Main and E. Washington Streets and making it one way was also discussed.

J. Shearer asked permission to put sidewalk from W. High to Crest Cleaners. Mr. Truax to check with property owner to see if we have the right of way for a walk.

Truax made a motion we get bids on roof repair on the fire house, second by Summerlot. Motion carried.

Heshelman appointed Summerlot to serve on the Plan Commission the remainder of this year.

June 2, 1970

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met Tuesday June 2, 1970 at 7:30 p.m. with trustees Heshelman, Moore, Summerlot, Truax and attorneys Lind and Lawson present.

Heshelman appointed Warren Franklin, Ward 3, to replace Mitchell Denny as trustee. Mr. Franklin was then sworn in by the Clerk-Treasurer.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Mr. Lett complained of the high approach to the alley between 47 and 51 E. High Street which causes the oil pans to drag as cars drive up the approach. He explained this could cause difficulty later on as people had complained to him about the situation.

Mary Hubbard said someone had informed her that the alley from Monroe Street west had been closed by the Town Board sometime in the past. The Board assured her this had not been done to their knowledge and she would have been notified if this had occurred.

Mrs. Ruth Allen presented certification from the County Clerk on the petitions for fifth class city status. This was referred to the attorneys for study.

M. O. Shrake stated he would like to see the cemetery use the dirt to better advantage. He said some graves were standing in water and complained about trucks delivering monuments knocking over markers. This is to be investigated.

Summerlot informed the Board of a seminar June 9 and 10 that Rex Simmons wanted to attend and Summerlot felt the Town should pay costs for this. Moore made a motion to send Simmons to seminar at Lafayette and the town pay expenses, second by Truax. Motion carried.

Summerlot also reported that he felt a simple solution to take care of excess water to some degree at the plant would be to increase size of motors and decrease size of impellers. He said there was a pump that could be converted for this at a cost of \$493.14. This would include a new motor and rebuilt pump. Summerlot made a motion to have pump rebuilt and buy a new motor, second by Moore. Motion carried.

Truax reported he had checked the parking situation at Labeco and felt there should be no parking as they had requested. He also reported we should make the alley between E. Main St. and E. Washington one way north and install stop signs in the alley.

Truax also had checked on the sidewalk on South Indiana at West High. Since there is no sidewalk to connect to, he felt there should be a sidewalk started on the south side and come north.

Heshelman appointed the following to the Board of Zoning Appeals: William Ooley, David Loudermilk and Joseph Vaughn. Two members are to be appointed by the Plan Commission.

Annexation and sewer project discussed. The attorney pointed out that the street and sidewalk can be extended to the town limits only but the sewer could extend beyond the town limits. The attorneys are to study this project and advise later.

Truax made a motion to retain Melvin Linds firm, second by Franklin. Motion carried.

The Park Board had recommended the appointment of Arthur Raney to Park Board to fill vacancy created by resignation of Owen Garrett whose term would have expired December 31, 1970. Heshelman made this appointment.

Heshelman appointed Mrs. Jean Henderson to Plan Commission to fill term of Earl Magenheimer who had resigned.

A letter from Plan Commission recommending the Board reject the request for rezoning on Lot 6, at 54 E. High Street. They recommended the petitioner apply for a variance. Summerlot made a motion to accept recommendation of Plan Commission to reject rezoning request. Second by Truax. Motion carried.

Heshelman asked Franklin to serve on Police Committee and also Buildings and Grounds with Moore.

Mr. Lind told of procedure for transferring lot adjacent to the Town Hall to the Fire Department. A motion ^{was made by Truax} to adopt Ordinance #7-1970 ~~amended~~ allowing the Board of Trustees to sell to the Fire Department the vacant lot adjacent to the Town Hall and to proceed with the proper papers, second by Summerlot. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Summerlot to elect Mr. Truax Vice Chairman of the Board of Trustees, second by Moore. Motion carried.

Moore made a motion to pay claims, second by Franklin. Motion carried.

No further business appearing before the Board, Moore made a motion to adjourn to meet in continued session June 16, 1970. Second by Truax. Motion carried.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met Tuesday July 7, 1970 at 7:30 P.M. with trustees Truax, Moore, Summerlot and Franklin present. Present also was Dave Lawson, attorney.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Michael Burford, representing the Park Board, was present about a fence at the ball diamond in the south park. The saw mill had agreed to pay half of cost of fence if the town will agree to close the alley by the saw mill. The attorney explained the procedure for closing an alley and the Board is to check into this situation.

July 21, 1970

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met in continued session July 21, 1970 at 7:30 P.M. with trustees Truax, Summerlot, Heshelman, Moore and Franklin present. Attorneys Lind and Lawson were also present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The financial report showed balances as follows: Town Funds, \$70,175.92, Sewage Operating Fund, \$125,642.26, Sewage Sinking Fund \$8,311.19.

Summerlot informed the Board he felt the Rating Bureau should have a letter as to our intentions. Also we should have a meeting with the Fire Department and Hoosier Water Company. Meeting set for July 30, 1970.

Robert Forrester, representative from Go-Cart Club, asked about having a street race Aug. 8. The Board felt the sponsors should be required to furnish insurance policy with Town of Mooresville as an added insured. After discussion, Truax made a motion to reject request for go cart race because of conflict of dates with the tricycle race. Franklin seconded the motion. Motion carried. The Board is to ask for liability insurance of 100/300,000 Bodily Injury and 50,000 Property Damage and Town named as insured. Mr. Forrester asked if the race could be held the following Saturday which is Aug. 15 and the Board gave consent as long as there is no other conflict for this date and if the club presents the Board with the insurance policy.

The attorney presented their recommendation on the fifth class city petitions. They recommended the Board reject the petitions, with further recommendation that Town Board put before the voters the question of whether they want to become a fifth class city in the fall election.

Truax made a motion to reject petition because of technicalities and that the Board go on record as being opposed to the fifth class city status. Second by Moore. Truax made a motion that the Board go on record as being opposed to changing to a fifth class city. However whereas a number of registered voters have requested that the matter be submitted to the voters that the following resolution be adopted:

Be it resolved that the following question shall be submitted to the voters of Mooresville, Indiana at the General Election November 3, 1970 to-wit: "Shall the Town of Mooresville, Indiana become a city of the Fifth Class?" Second by Moore. Motion carried.

Hearing on Additional Appropriations was held next. Heshelman asked if there were any taxpayers to be heard on this matter. There being no taxpayers to be heard, Summerlot made a motion to adopt ordinance for Additional Appropriations and to file necessary papers with the County Auditor. Second by Moore.

Summerlot reported the Plan Commission is short one member and that Jean Henderson wanted a letter stating when she was appointed and when term will expire. The chairman of the Plan Commission had also asked for a list of members and their terms.

Summerlot made a report on condition of sanitation plant and stated that the plant was over capacity in 1961 and that the County Health Officer was concerned that the final effluent was not as clear as it should be and was polluting the stream. He also stated the school would hook onto system and would further overload the plant. Summerlot felt we should consider enlarging plant rather than proceed with the North Indiana Street sewer project, since it could possibly take as much as two years to complete the addition to the plant.

The Board gave consent for Summerlot to check into this situation further and report later.

It was reported the drive across ditch at Medical Arts needs work where it has washed out underneath. The Board felt that if Dr. Van Bokkelen would furnish materials, the Town would furnish the labor to take care of this situation.

Discussion followed on the condition of the drives at the cemetery but since there are no funds available for this no action could be taken.

Truax made a motion to pay claims, second by Summerlot. Motion carried.

No further business appearing before the Board, Moore made a motion to adjourn, second by Franklin. Motion carried.
