The Board of Trustees met in regular session January 5, 1960, at 7:30 P.M.D.S.T. All members and their attorney, Mr. Littell were present. The meeting was called to order by Chairman Newcomer and the opening prayer was by Trustee Holmes.

The minutes of the previous meetings were read and declared approved. The financial statement showed a balance in the Town funds to be \$ 38,680.29 and the Library to be \$ 7,469.21. Sparks moved and Farmer seconded the report be approved. Carried.

The Chairman asked for a motion to use Robert's rules of order. Holmes moved and Farmer seconded this request. Carried.

A few reports on sewers and street conditions were given.

The gas bids were next. They were all very close but since the Board felt it should be passed around, Sparks moved and Farmer seconded the bid be awarded to S.&W.D X. Carried.

A notice from the State Board of Health saying they had approved the sewer in Dunn's eighth addition was read. It will be filed.

The newly purchased bonds for the Cemetery Permanent Maintenance Fund were presented to the Board. The amount was \$ 1500.00

Mr. Bean, who has resigned as inspector on the sewer job, said he would help out until a replacement could be found. He would stay a few days. He made a further report on the progress.

After a discussion on the streets, it was decided to get priced on stone from a few places. Also to have a representative from Vogel and the engineers down at the next meeting. Jim Miller and William Cole were interviewed for a short time on street and sewer work.

State Highway reported they had repaired the culvert on Harlen Dr.

Chairman Newcomer named the following committees;

Street--Farmer, Holmes.

Cem. Harris, Sparks.

Parks & Bldgs-Holmes, Harris.

Recreation- Sparks, Farmer.

The Janitor will be expected to put in fourteen hours a week on the Building work which will include mowing lawn in summer. He will be paid \$ 1.00 per hour.

Wm. Kendall was named street Commissioner, and Chief Marshal, Elmer Poe.

Ordinance # 1 governing salaries for employees for the coming was read. Sparks moved and Holmes seconded it be adopted. Carried.

Ordinance # 2 titled "AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A CHIEF MARSHAL AND DELEGATING CERTAIN DUTIES TO THE CHIEF MARSHAL" was read. Harris moved and Farmer seconded to adopt. Carried.

The matter of a Fire Chief was deferred.

A few other matters were discussed but cannot be settled until it is established definitely what is to be done with the road through the Town.

Officials from Vogel Construction Co. and Mr. Haller of the Engineers were present to hear problems of the Board and of the Citizens of the Town on the sewers. After quite a discussion, and explanations of why certain things were done all seemed to be settled satisfactorily. A letter from Mooresville Welding Shop on this situation was read and will be filed.

Due to the illness of the present Fire Chief, W.N. Potter was appointed to replace him. He will be requested to come to the meetings for instructions.

The question of a separate treasurer for the Library Board was discussed and referred to the President of the Library Board.

Mr. Littell, in answer to a letter from Mr. Couch concerning insurance carried by Buesching Bros., says in his opinion they are not carrying the right insurance. He will investigate. He will also check Vogel's insurance.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and by motion by Sparks and a second by Farmer were declared approved. The financial statement showed a balance in all funds to be \$ 41,317.23. The Library was same as last report.

Walter Riggan read a proclamation declaring February 7th to 13th as Boy Scout week. Sparks moved and Holmes seconded to recognize this proclamation. Carried.

Mr. Don Kiser and Mr. Grosskopf of the Indiana Bell Phone Co. were present to answer any questions which might arise when we go to dial. They explained the equipment needed and showed how fire calls could be handled. No action was taken. They would appreciate any being informed of any action taken at the special meeting.

Mr. Fred Beall asked what procedure to take to be connected to the new sewer. Mr. Couch will check the situation.

A letter from Myron McKinley was read. He wanted to know about a street from his property through part of Highland Meadows. Mr. Newcomer will answer that the consensus of the Board that it is a personal matter between him and Mr. Dunn.

Several locations were given to Mr. Couch to investigate.

An ordinance titled AN ORDINANCE CONSENTING THAT LIQUOR RETAILER'S PERMITS MAY BE ISSUED TO APPLICANTS OTHERWISE DULY QUALIFIED, UNDER THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF INDIANA. was given first reading.

Wm. Cole and C. Galloway were next heard. They asked if the land north of Town known as the Ray Moon land were developed, would they be allowed to tie on to the Town sewer. The legal aspect of this will be investigated.

A letter from the manager of the Ritz Theatre was read announcing he was closing the show February 10th.

A letter from Gooding Amusement Co. saying there was a conflict in dates for Old Settlers and suggesting a change of date. The Clerk Treasurer will write trying to come to an agreement.

A communication from the State in which they noted just what they had returned to the Town was presented. Mr. Littell will write them concerning the stop lights and also the replacing the meters.

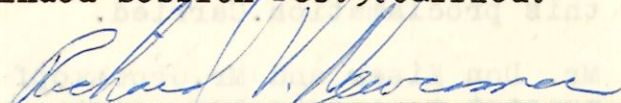

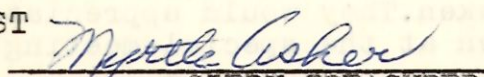

Applicants for superintendent of Sewage Works were interviewed. Each was given time and decision deferred until later in the evening.

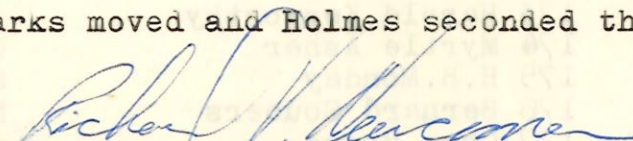
Representatives from both the Town and Township Fire Departments were present and all points of a merger were discussed. Several things will be settled and a final agreement will be reached later.

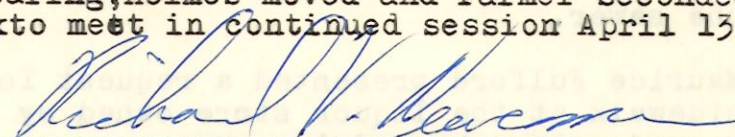
The Board feels there is a definite need for a cool water supply in the building. Harris moved and Holmes seconded that a water collar be bought. Carried.

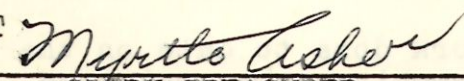

A letter from the Bell Telephone Co. was read in which they ^{named} ~~named~~ the locations of the cuts in the streets they wished to make. No action was taken.

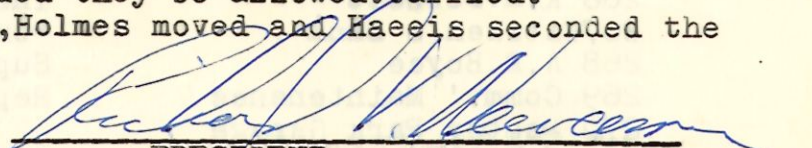
The parking at Armstrong's was turned to street committee and the cemetery situation to the cemetery committee. The merchant police question was left to Chief Poe's discretion.
