January 5, 1965

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met January 5, 1965 at 7:30 P.M. Present were Trustees Dye, Keith, Bain and attorney Wehrle.

The minutes of two previous meetings were read and approved.

John McGuire of Automotive Armature, spokesman for a group of citizens protesting the opening of a tavern on Indpls. Road in the building formerly occupied by Bryan and Adams Market, asked that the Board vote "no" if anyone appeared before them asking for permission to open such an establishment. He stated that a petition had been circulated and that they had obtained over 100 signatures. Mr. Wehrle advised the group that the Board would have to pass an ordinance to the effect that liquor could be served in the corporation and that so far they had no reason to pass such an ordinance since no one had requested it.

The clerk treasurer mentioned that the 90 day bills would mature the latter part of January before the next meeting. After some discussion, Keith made a motion to reinvest in 90 day government bills, second by Bain. Motion carried.

The billing clerk's salary was discussed next. The Board agreed the pay was inadequate for the amount of work involved. Mr. Dye is to check with her on the amount of social security she receives to see if it would pay her to stop it if her salary is increased.

Bain stated he had been contacted by the County Highway Department in regard to two bridges at the edge of town on old St. Rd. #67. It takes the county trucks quite some time to get to these bridges during slick weather and they asked if the town could take care of sanding them. Board agreed that it would benefit people of Mooresville if this was done quickly and Mr. Bain is to check what arrangements can be made with the county.

Mr. Dye announced the following committee appointments for 1965: Street Dept. - Cecil Bain and William Holmes. Sewer Dept. - Robert Farmer with all members of the Board as vice chairmen. Police Dept. - Norman Keith and Cecil Bain. Bldg. & Grounds, Cemetery - William Holmes and Norman Keith. Richard Keller was reappointed Fire Chief and Forest Rusie, assistant fire chief. Other appointments are to be made later. Mr. Wehrle was reappointed town attorney on a motion by Bain, second by Keith.

Discussion on condition of cemetery records followed. Clerk was instructed to contact Lula Mae Buckner in regard to working on these records and bringing maps up to date.

Condition of fire hydrants was mentioned. Mr. Wehrle recommended the fire department check all hydrants periodically and give report to water company.

A motion to pay the claims was made by Keith, second by Bain.

After some discussion, a motion was made by Keith to pay accrued rent on the barn rented for the storage of equipment in the amount of \$20.00. Second by Bain.

No further business appearing, Keith made a motion to adjourn, second by Bain.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met February 2, 1965 at 7:30 p.m. Present were Trustees Keith, Farmer, Holmes and Bain.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The financial statement showed a balance in all funds of \$50,613.02 and a balance of \$72,982.62 in the Sewage Fund.

A letter was read from Assessor Leland Jessup requesting use of the Town Hall for assessment purposes. Bain made a motion to grant permission for this, second by Farmer. Motion carried.

Discussion followed on delinquent sewer payments and also on low charge for laundries. Farmer is to check with Mr. Wehrle to see what action can be taken to enforce payment of sewer bills. Farmer also mentioned the need for a truck at the sewage plant and suggested buying a used truck. He is to check into this possibility.

Building committee reported prices had been obtained on lowering ceilings and installing acoustical tile in the two offices and corridor. Holmes made a motion to have the low bidder of \$210, Louis Linder & Son, Camby, do the work. Second by Farmer. Motion carried.

The possibility of having a dog pound was discussed. This was taken under advisement by the police committee.

An application from Martinsville Cab Co. to operate taxi service in Mooresville was read. A motion to approve application was made by Farmer, second by Holmes. Motion carried.

Farmer made a motion to pay the claims, second by Bain. Motion carried.

The street committee reported the following jobs had been done: Removal of snow during snowstorm, erection of barricades at Goose Creek on Hadley Street and Park Drive, and installation of new floor in foot bridge over Goose Creek. Street committee asked for resolution to make ordinance to establish no parking on south side of Memorial Drive from North Monroe Street to West Street and no parking on the west side of Maple Lane from St. Clair Street to Center Drive. Farmer seconded resolution. Clerk to notify attorney to draw up ordinance.

The police committee reported two marshals are to start to school conducted by City of Indianapolis sometime this month. Police car problem was discussed. Keith stated he felt the cars should be traded more often since repair bills are running so high and one car had almost quit running altogether. No action was taken.

It was mentioned that someone wished to purchase town's coin counter and sorter. Clerk to find out when these items were purchased and the cost before a price is set.

No further business appearing before the Board, Holmes made a motion to adjourn, second by Farmer. Motion carried.

March 2, 1965

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met March 2, 1965 at 7:30 P.M. Present were Trustees Dye, Bain, Keith, Farmer, Holmes and attorney Wehrle.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The financial statement showed a balance of \$45,066.01 in all funds and a balance of \$76,944.89 in the sewer fund.

It was mentioned that the map of the town should be framed and hung in the meeting room. Bain agreed to see about having it framed.

Richard Thompson, representing property owners in the north end of town, stated that during the heavy snowfalls recently, some streets were not opened at all. Highland Drive was given as an example. Trustees agreed this was a problem, and pointed out the equipment and manpower the town has is inadequate but to buy snow equipment to be used so little was not feasible.

B. J. Allman asked if everyone wasn't supposed to be hooked to the sewer and told of a situation on Harlan Drive. Sewer committee is to have a meeting in near future to get these problems straightened out by summer.

Farmer made a motion to have lights at Newby Building and Christian Church removed. Keith seconded. Motion carried. Clerk instructed to notify those involved of the changes.

Newell Hall, chairman of the Park Board, asked about putting furnaces in the town park and if the deed to the park stipulated no open fires. Clerk to look up document to see what stipulations were made on park ground.

Keith made a motion to appoint Mike Burford to Park Board to replace outgoing member. Second by Bain. Motion carried.

Farmer made a motion to appoint Charles McGuire to Zoning Board to replace Clair Cook, whose term has expired. Holmes seconded. Motion carried. Dye reappointed Keith to the Zoning Board.

The trustees accepted a proposal by the State Highway Dept. to erect "No Parking" signs from Lockerbie Street west 2660 feet.

Discussion on the swimming pool plans and figures followed. Newell Hall explained the function of the group trying to raise funds.

Ordinance #1-1965 prohibiting parking on the south side of Memorial Drive from North Monroe Street to West Street and also on the west side of Maple Lane from St. Clair Street to Center Drive was read. Keith made a motion to adopt ordinance #1-1965 as read, second by Bain. Motion carried.

Farmer made a motion to pay claims, second by Bain. Motion carried.

Dye presented written policy for vacations and sick leave for all appointed employees. Farmer moved to accept resolution as statement of policy as follows: All employees with more than six (6) months and less than one (1) year seniority shall have five (5) working days sick leave and five (5) days vacation for which he or she shall receive regular salary. All employees with one (1) year or more seniority shall have ten (10) working days vacation and ten (10) working days sick leave for which he or she shall receive regular salary.

It shall be at the discretion of the Board of Trustees to grant additional time off if circumstances warrant. Keith seconded. Motion carried.

Keith made a motion to accept a resolution from Citizens Bank stating that it is a public depository, second by Farmer. Motion carried.

March 2, 1965 minutes cont'd.

Prices were presented on new police cars and discussion followed. It was decided to apply for an additional appropriation in the event it was agreeable to purchase a new car.

Ordinance #2-1965 on Additional Appropriations was read. Keith made a motion to adopt this ordinance. Bain seconded. Motion carried.

Dye appointed Holmes, chairman and Keith, vice-chairman of the newly created Fire Department Committee.

No further business appearing before the Board, Farmer made a motion to adjourn, second by Keith. Motion carried.

April 6, 1965

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met April 6, 1965 at 7:30 P.M. Present were Trustees Dye, Farmer, Bain, Keith, Holmes and attorney Wehrle.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The financial report showed a balance of \$40,501.64 in all town funds and a balance in the sewer fund of \$85,026.66.

A large group of mothers were present protesting the reported child molestings at school recently. The women were assured the police were watching the schools and could be there in a matter of minutes if needed. It was suggested the group attend the next school board meeting to find out what steps are being taken in the school.

A group of people protesting the raising of rabbits, pigeons, chickens, etc. in large numbers, were present. Since this problem could be a health hazard the Board agreed to have an ordinance drawn up to take care of this. Mr. Wehrle asked to provide this ordinance for next meeting.

Hayes and Whitehurst asked for and received permission to operate ice cream trucks in town this summer. Clerk instructed to send letters to these individuals.

Discussion followed on Area Planning being introduced in this county. Ned Beck of I.U. was present to explain this plan. No decision was made at this time.

Holmes made a motion, Keith seconded to let the Fire Dept. burn the pile of debris left from burned house on West Harrison Street. Motion carried.

Farmer made a motion to pay claims, Keith seconded. Motion carried.

Farmer reported Sewer Dept. has a power driven sewer tape being demonstrated. A motion was made by Farmer to purchase this machine for a price of \$1350. Second by Holmes. Motion carried.

After discussion on condition of police cars, Keith presented prices on repair work. Board decided to have the Ford overhauled.

The financial report showed a balance of \$64,679.62 in all funds and a balance of \$71,505.13 in the Sewer Fund.

Mrs. Ray Ulrey, representing Council of Clubs, asked if there was an ordinance on cleaning alleys and cutting weeds. She was advised there is an ordinance on weeds in effect but no ordinance on trash and rubbish in alleys, that this was more or less up to the property owners. December 21, 1965

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met Tuesday, December 21, 1965 with Trustees Dye, Farmer, Bain and Holmes present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Mr. Dye said Art Lusty had requested a tree removed by the new bank building as some limbs had blown onto the building. Board *agreed to top* the tree but not to cut it down, *with no cost to town.*

Police car bids were opened with Tom Baker Motors bid of \$1,559.00 and Wilcher Ford Sales bid of \$1,435.30. Bain made a motion to accept Wilcher Ford Sales bid of \$1,435.30, second by Farmer. Motion carried.

A complaint about Chief Kenworthy using profane language in the presence of several women was heard. After much discussion no action was taken.

Bob Gregory, County Council member, was present to correct a statement made in the paper that it would take 20¢ tax rate to raise \$19,000.00 for the Area Planning program. Gregory said only 3¢ was needed to raise this amount. Discussion followed in which Mr. Dye stated he was definitely against Mooresville participating in this program.

Ordinance #14-1965 entitled "An Ordinance Fixing Salaries and Wages for Employees and Officials" was read and adopted on a motion by Farmer, second by Bain. Motion carried.

Discussion followed on replacement of sewer on Bolton Avenue and Northeast Street. An estimate of \$600.00 for approximately 160 feet of sewer laid was presented.

Clerk was instructed to advertise for gasoline bids to be opened January 4, 1966.

Farmer made a motion to confirm the letter of December 10, 1965 to Morgan County Plan Commission notifying them of Mooresville's entrance into 701 program. Second by Holmes. Motion carried.

A letter from Bonita Marley, Acting Librarian, was read, stating term of Lawson Lawrence expires December 31, 1965. Farmer made a motion to reappoint Lawrence to serve another four year term, second by Holmes. Motion carried.

After reading a letter from the Mooresville Merchants Corporation, Farmer made a motion to authorize them to put containers of Lance peanuts in the Police Room lobby. Second by Holmes. Motion carried.

Farmer made a motion to pay the claims, second by Bain. Motion carried.

January 4, 1966

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville met Tuesday, January 4, 1966 at 7:30 P.M. Present were Trustees Dye, Keith, Holmes, Farmer, Bain and Attorney Wehrle.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read with the following corrections: Board did not agree to top tree at the new Bank, merely gave authorization to Mr. Lusty to do this with no cost to the town.

Reorganization of the Board followed. Mr. Dye opened nominations for chairman. Holmes nominated Farmer, second by Bain. Bain made motion that the nominations be closed, second by Holmes. Motion carried. Nominations for Vice Chairman were then opened. Keith nominated Bain, second by Dye. Holmes made a motion nominations be closed, second by Keith. Motion carried. Farmer then took over the meeting, stated a meeting would be held January 11 to appoint new committees and all other officers.

A representative of the Boy Scouts was present requesting permission to use the town lot to camp out and have a display for Boy Scout Week, February 7-13. Keith made a motion to grant permission, second by Holmes. Motion carried.

Ordinance #1-1966 entitled "An Ordinance Amending an Ordinance to Rezone Certain Land Within Town of Mooresville" was read. This ordinance would rezone East 40 ft. of Lot 27 and 10 ft. off West side of Lot 26 in Trogden Addition from Zone 1-Res. (a) to Zone 1-Res. (c) to allow multiple dwelling. Keith stated the Plan Commission recommended this be rezoned. A motion was made by Keith to rezone this ground, second by Dye. Motion carried.

Gas bids were opened with S & W D-X bidding .03¢ per gallon less than pump price for D-X Boron and .03¢ less than pump price for D-X Regular at time of delivery. Dye made a motion to accept this bid, second by Keith. Motion carried.

A letter from Leland Jessup was read stating that two plots of land are not on record at Martinsville. Mr. Wehrle is to check on this.

Discussion followed on putting in some new sewer on Bolton Avenue. A bid of \$3.75 per foot given for approximately 160 ft. by Don Swirney. Bain made a motion to accept the bid, second by Keith. Motion carried.

Building an all-purpose storage building was discussed but no definite plans are being made at the present time.

A need for a new billing machine was discussed but Mr. Wehrle suggested that other towns and utilities be contacted to see what type of billing procedure they have. Prices of new machines were discussed but no action taken.

Holmes made a motion to pay the claims, second by Bain. Motion carried.

Bain reported the bank had asked that the present light in the alley be changed to mercury vapor. The bank will install one at the entrance to the bank at North Indiana Street at their expense and also maintain it.

A need for a sidewalk to Valley View Shopping Center and methods of getting one built was discussed.
