Manley Brown, Trustee elect of the Third Ward was absent from this meeting.

Continuing their duties as town marshal and deputy marshal are Clarence Rariden and Leonard Horton respectively, who at this time were also given the oaths of their offices by the Clerk-Treasurer.

It was moved by York and seconded by Fields that Paul Michael be appointed Chairman Pro Tem of the Board. Motion carried.

It was moved by Fields and seconded by Thornberry that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooreville, Indiana met in regular session in the Municipal Building on the 6th day of January, 1948 at 7:45 P.M. with all members present with the exception of Manley Brown.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Michael.

The Chairman then announced that the election of a President for the Board of Trustees for the year 1948 was next in order.

Mr. Edward Fields placed the name of Robert York in nomination. This motion was seconded by Mr. Thornberry. Mr. York placed the name of Paul Michael in nomination to which Mr. Michael declined. Mr. Thornberry moved that the nominations be closed. Motion carried. By secret ballot Robert York was elected to serve as the President of the Board of Town Trustees for the year 1948.

President York took the chair.

The minutes of the meeting of January 1, 1948 were read and approved as read.

President York then appointed the following committees:

The matter of the selection of an Attorney for the Town was brought up at this time. The motion as made by Byron Thornberry was that Gilbert Butler be retained to serve as the Attorney for the year 1948. This motion seconded by Michael was carried.

It was moved that the acceptance of the appointment of Clarence Rariden who took his Oath of Office January 1, 1948 be affirmed now. It was moved by Thornberry and seconded by Fields that the appointment of Marshal and Fire Chief Rariden be accepted. Motion carried.

Likewise the appointment of Leonard Horton as Deputy Marshal of the Town of Mooreville was accepted by a motion made by Fields and seconded by Thornberry and seconded thus.

It was moved by Thornberry and seconded by Fields that Earl Morgan be appointed Sexton of the Cemetery for the year 1948. The motion carried.

Attorney Butler next gave a suggestion to the Board that the Clerk-Treasurer might make a calendar of events known to her for the coming year and give them to President York.

A discussion followed on the operations of the local Fire Department and from this discussion a motion arose by Thornberry that the President of the Board of Trustees call a meeting with the Trustee of Brown Twp. and his advisory Board to decide on the question as to whether the Town and Twp firetruck would be allowed outside the limits of Brown Township. The firemen were to be present at this meeting also. Pres. York set the date of the meeting as January 20th, and instructed the Clerk-Treas. to issue letters to the Trustee, Board Members and Firemen of this meeting, to be held in the municipal Building at 6:30 P.M. on the date of the 20th of January, 1948.

At the same time the mention was made of the need for a city dump and each member pledged himself to give this matter careful consideration and each try to find a suitable place for it.

The matter of garbage collection was made. Mr. Michael stated that Horton Stanley who has previously conducted the collections wished to continue if it be satisfactory with the Board of Trustees. It was decided that Mr. Stanley be granted the permission to collect the garbage as per usual.

A suggestion was brought forth that the office rooms of the Clerk-Treas.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooreville, Indiana, met in regular session in the Municipal Building on the 3rd day of February, 1948 with all members responding to roll call. Attorney Butler was also present.

Minutes of the meetings of January 6th, and 20th were read and approved after a correction concerning the preparation of the new Clerk-Treasurer's office were made to the January 6th meeting minutes, thus reading that Manley Brown was to resume the responsibility of securing the office equipment.

At this time Mr. Manley Brown was given the oath of his office as Trustee of the Third Ward, by the Clerk-Treasurer, since Mr. Brown was unable to be present at the called meeting of January 1, 1948.

Next the Treasurer's report was given showing a total of all funds to be \$13,375.09 as of January 31, 1948. It was moved and seconded that the report be accepted as read. Motion carried.

A representative from the American Legion was present with a request for permission to use the Town Park for the purpose of sponsoring a carnival on the dates of June 23-26 of this year. A discussion followed and it was decided that the Board of Trustees grant the Legion permission to use the Park on these dates with the provision they assume any and all expenses pertaining to the conducting of the carnival. This decision made in the form of a motion by Michael and seconded by Thornberry.

Next Mr. Elmer Weddle representing the Mooreville-Indianapolis-Vincennes Coach Lines appeared before the Board asking that they give consideration to the revision of an Ordinance made in the Fall of 1947 which caused their busses to be re-routed through Town and caused them to cut heavy traffic twice and to thus alter their schedules from time to time. His request was for a method other than the one stated in the Ordinance, which would allow them to come directly through town. It was decided that the decision on this matter would be settled at the March meeting and the petition which accompanied Mr. Weddle's request be made a portion of these minutes.

John O'Connor was heard next with a complaint of the unsanitary condition caused by his neighbor who was housing chickens near the back door of Mr. O'Connor's Apartments. The Board's suggestion to Mr. O'Connor was to settle this matter without the aid of the Town Trustees since almost 2/3 of the citizen's of Mooreville were the owners of chickens and the enforcing the Ordinance would be next to impossible at this time on the complaint of only one person.

The matter of parking which has been going on in front of the Post office was brought to the attention of the Board. The Postmaster stated that the mail trucks had been failing to stop regularly at the Postoffice owing to this parking condition. Marshal Rariden was instructed to see that some signs were erected showing the non-allowance of parking in this zone and to issue tickets to all who did so after the erection of these signs.

Resolution No. 1 of the Town of Mooreville, Indiana for the year 1948 giving President Robert York authority to place his signature on the Federal Works Agency application for \$1,000.00 payable to the Town for the sewer project was given second reading. It was moved by Michael and seconded by Thornberry that the Resolution No. 1 be adopted and placed upon its passage. The Resolution was passed for signatures of the Board Members.

Attorney Butler was instructed to prepare an Ordinance on parallel parking on North Indiana Street on the east side of the street from Main street north after a discussion of the Board on the possibilities for accidents as the old method now in use of heading to the curb is practiced.

The question of the town dump was again brought up, but to date no site for such has been found.

Joe Stout was present to present a complaint on the poor condition of the street next to the curb in the front of his property caused by the opening of a sewer from the property adjoining his on the east and also a complaint on the broken sidewalk in this same vicinity caused by the construction of the new house. The Board made note of these conditions and instructed the Clerk-Treasurer to issue a letter to Mrs. Ernestine Brackney owner of the property in question asking that she give attention to the above.

Next the claims were presented and it was moved by Fields and seconded by Michael that all claims be allowed as read and warrants drawn from the Treasury for the same. The claims as read were:

ORDINANCE NO. 1 1948
Town of Mooresville

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING PARKING UPON CERTAIN
STREETS OF THE TOWN OF MOORESVILLE, INDIANA
AND FIXING PENALTIES THEREFOR.

Section I

Be It Ordained by the Town Board of the Town of Mooresville that by reason of the congestion of parking upon certain of the streets of said Town, it has become impossible for the vehicles engaged in the movement of the United States mails to secure parking facilities within a reasonable distance of the United States Post Office of the Town of Mooresville and the interest of the public welfare causes the need for the establishment of a reserve parking area within the proximity of said Post Office for the use of such vehicles.

Section II

An Ordinance Regulating Parking Upon Certain Streets Of The Town Of Mooresville, Indiana, And Fixing Penalties Therefor.

Section I

Be It Ordained by the Town Board of the Town of Mooresville that by reason of the congestion of parking upon certain of the streets of said Town, it has become impossible for the vehicles engaged in the movement of the United States mails to secure parking facilities within a reasonable distance of the United States Post Office of the Town of Mooresville and the interest of the public welfare causes the need for the establishment of a reserve parking area within the proximity of said Post Office for the use of such vehicles.

Myron Rose and Roy Newby presented a complaint next on the very poor condition of the alley between Northeast St. and Bolton Ave. They stated that it was impossible and that they were unable to get to their property and requested some gravel to be put in the alley. The street committee stated that a survey had been made of the town streets and alleys and that this alley was one in particular which would be given attention immediately.

Irvin Antrim inquired as to the advisability of entering the town main sewer line from his property in the Hallam Addition by the way of the Comer Sewer line or by going back from his property to the alley at the rear of the Antrim property. The Board stated this matter to be of a personal responsibility and the parties involved should settle this problem.

Ordinance No. 1 of the Town of Mooreville, Indiana, entitled "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING PARKING UPON CERTAIN STREETS OF THE TOWN OF MOOREVILLE, INDIANA, AND FIXING PENALTIES THEREFOR." was given first reading and it was moved by Thornberry and seconded by Michael that the Ordinance be adopted. This motion was carried.

Mr. Randolph Address representing the F. E. Gooding Amusement Co. was heard next stating the conditions upon which the Gooding Amusement desired to make in furnishing the rides for the coming Old Settlers Picnic this year. Mr. Address carried with him a contract for signatures stating six locations would be furnished for the sum of \$425.00 electricity included. The bid of James Chanos who had previously served the Old Settlers was for \$350.00 and after a very lengthy discussion the contract of Mr. Address was accepted and passed for signatures. The Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to inform Mr. Chanos of the rejection of his offer.

The minutes of the meeting of March 2nd, 1948 were read and approved after an insertion was made to them concerning the visit made by the Board members to a Council Meeting of the City of Martinsville during which different parking meters were shown. As the previous minutes herein will read, our Town Board is interested in trying the parking meter system in Mooresville.

The report of the Treasurer was given next which showed a total of all funds to be \$11,848.04. It was moved by Thornberry and seconded by Fields that the report be accepted as read.

Elza Perry and Ellis Chownings were present with a complaint of surplus water rising into their basements and they were inquiring as to what the Town could do to remedy their situation. Due to the inadequacy of the sewers in that vicinity the Board stated that there was no immediate possibility of taking care of their problem, and additional sewer lines would have to be built to relieve the South Street residents.

Frank Davenport, Chester Edwards and Paul Swisher were present with a problem. Mr. Davenport stated his business of a proposed dump to be placed on his newly purchased property bordering the Town property line on the west. Mr. Edwards and Mr. Swisher were present to protest the establishing of such a dump. The street committee reported that they secured the services of the Lawrence Lumber Co. to remove the dead tree from the front of the Harley Richardson property for the sum of \$10.00 and the Board instructed the St. Committee to have Mr. Lawrence remove the tree.

Next the appointment of a school board member was brought up, the term of Walter Smitherman expiring as of the 1st day of August, 1948. The Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to issue letters to the persons owning these properties, and ask if these conditions could be remedied as soon as possible.

Marshal Rariden reported the east septic tank in very great need of repair as a wall 55 ft. long had caved in. The Board requested the clerk-Treasurer to write letters to 5 different contractors asking for estimates on repairing the septic tank.

Marshal Rariden also reported the street department had requested the markings on the curbs should be re-painted and there was no yellow paint available. The Board instructed the Clerk-Treasurer to order 5 gals. of yellow street paint.

The claims were read next and it was moved by Michael and seconded by Fields that all claims be allowed as read and the Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to issue warrants for the claims as long as funds were available. The Clerk-Treasurer reports that the town will have to wait for the Treas. and Auditor of Morgan County to distribute the 1st collections of taxes for 1948 before the Town of Mooresville will have funds enough to cover the expenses pertaining to the General Fund for the month of May, 1948. The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, Indiana met in regular session on Tuesday July 6, 1948 in the Municipal Building with all members and the Attorney present. The meeting time was 8 P.M.

The minutes of the meeting of June 1st were read and it was moved by brown and seconded by Michael that the minutes be accepted as read.

There was no Treasurer's report given at this time due to questions concerning an overpayment of funds to the Clerk-Treasurer from the County Auditor during the distribution of taxes during the month of June. The Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to inquire of the State Board of Accounts as to the proper method of handling the overpayment which should have been made to the Trustee of Brown Township instead of the Clerk-Treasurer.

There were several complaints brought before the Board by different citizens. Walter Thompson and Goldie Harvey were protesting against the nuisances arising from Kelley's in their vicinity, Richard Diebel was presenting a proposal for a zoning ordinance so as to protect properties in the Morgan Addition from having any business buildings built in their locality, Lewis Marsh had a drainage problem in the front of his property, and Clyde Harvey and Harley Richardson proposed the idea that a curb be built by all the property owners from Indiana St. west on Harrison St. to the first alley, and the Town assume the responsibility of grading and toping the street to the curb. No decisive action was taken on any of the matters however each committee covering the above problems was to look into each situation and make each case as agreeable as is possible.

A representative from the Red Comet Co. which deals in fire fighting equipment was heard next and his showing was a tetrachloride bomb for smothering fires which were made of glass and for hand use. The price of

these bombs were \$33.00 per doz. The Board was interested in such, but tabled the idea for awhile due to shortage of funds for this purpose.

The bid from Clyde and Wayne Ferguson on the wiring of the park grounds for Old Settlers was opened, it being the only one submitted and acceptance was made to the Fergusons for the sum of \$100.00.

Next the bid estimates for repairing the wall of the septic tank east and south of the park grounds were opened. The bid of Mr. Orval Templeton being the only one was read as \$750.00 with the wall repaired 5 ft. high or \$450.00 with the wall only 3 ft. high. Clerk-Treasurer instructed to write Mr. Templeton that the Board favored his estimate, but that an additional appropriation will have to be had before any work can be started.

The question of weed cutting was brought up and the Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to issue two letters to citizens requesting weed be cut on their vacant lots.

The minutes of the meetings of July 6th and 20th were read. It was moved by Michael and seconded by Fields that the minutes be accepted as read. Motion carried.

Next the Treasurer's report was given showing a balance of all funds to be \$. It was moved by Brown and seconded by Michael that the report be acceptable. Motion carried.

Ralph R. Storm appeared before Board with two problems. He stated that the driveway into the newly purchased American Legion Building was on their property direct and in reality the drive was supposed to be an alley of the Town which passed by the Building, but during a period of time had grown over with brush and the drive being pushed onto the Legion property. Mr. Storm stated further that the Legion would like to have the alley graded in its natural place. The Board stated that they would see to having this done just as soon as possible. Also Mr. Storm stated that a large grader had been contracted for to use at the new Memorial Field at the School and after the completion of the work there, an agreement between land owners north and east of Morgan st. for the opening of Carter Street north of Morgan St. to be so done at their own expense and the proposal of Mr. Storm's was that the Town furnish the gravel for North Carter Street after the grading project, since this would be of considerable benefit to the town. After some discussion it was moved by Michael and seconded by Brown that the Town assume the graveling expense after the grading had been done by the citizens interested.

Two Ordinances were drawn up as results of complaints made by citizens with respect to parking of motor vehicles on the streets of Mooresville.

Attention was called to the nuisance created to the businesses uptown by the parking of cattle trucks in the front of thier stores. The Ordinance made on this will prohibit these trucks from parking uptown and will call thus for a block each way from the center of town. Another need was cited to give some businesses entrance to their buildings on Saturdays by changing the parking situation of vehicles during the Community Sale. Hereafter Franklin St. is to have no parking on the west side of the street from Main St. to Washington St. Main St. is to remain clear on the north side of the street from Franklin St. east to the Indianapolis Rd. and Washington St. is to have no parking on the south side of the street from Franklin St. west to the first alley west of Franklin St.

The American Legion had brought the idea before the Board that the Town was in the need of purchasing a new flag for use above the Municipal Building, so it was moved by Michael and seconded by Brown that a new flag be purchased. This motion was carried.

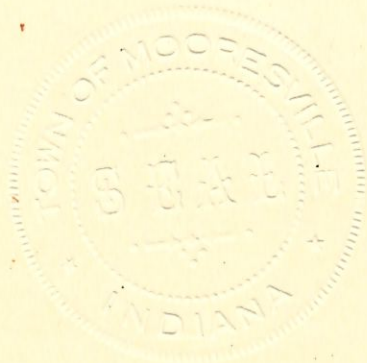

At this time a trial Ordinance was read and discussed concerning the possibility of the appointing of a city health inspector for the inspecting of farms which would be selling milk in the near future to the Gregory Creamery on West Harrison St. The action on the Ordinance was tabled until another meeting during which time investigation on different matters arising from this Ordinance and its affects would be delved into more discussion to come at the next meeting of the Board.

Arthur Lusty and Phillip Johnson were present in behalf of the Memorial Ass'n. They stated several plans which they wished to put into effect next spring and wished to inquire if the Board would be able to aid in surfacing the east end of Kelley St. which leads to Memorial Field. The Board stated to Mr. Lusty and Mr. Johnson that a street repair program would be started in the early months of 1949 and if it were possible they would help with the surfacing of a portion of Kelley St.

Next the claims were read. It was moved by Brown and seconded by Michael that all claims be allowed as read and warrants drawn from the Treasury for same. The Clerk-Treasurer stated that some of the bills would have to be carried over until probably sometime during the month of December, since some of the appropriations for certain funds were exhausted and would have to await action from the Board of Tax Commissioners on Ordinance No. 5 which will be described in the following paragraph. 

The Board in the presence of both representatives did not feel that the contract for installation should be awarded at this meeting and decided that the decision would be made final in a meeting or continued session on the 14th of December at which time each meter company would be notified of whatever action was taken by the Board.

" AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE PRODUCTION, TRANSPORTATION, PROCESSING, HANDLING, SAMPLING, EXAMINATION, GRADING, LABELING, RE-GRADING, AND SALE OF MILK AND MILK PRODUCTS, THE INSPECTION OF DAIRY HERDS, DAIRIES, AND MILK PLANTS; THE ISSUING AND REVOCATION OF PERMITS, THE PLACARDING OF RESTAURANTS AND OTHER ESTABLISHMENTS SERVING MILK AND/OR MILK PRODUCTS AND THE FIXING OF PENALTIES.

Section 1.

The health officers of the Town of Mooresville shall have supervision over the production, transportation, processing, handling, sampling, examination, grading, regrading, labeling, and sale of all milk and milk products sold for ultimate consumption within the Town of Mooresville, Indiana, or its police jurisdiction, the inspection of dairy herds, dairies, and milk plants; the issuing and revocation of permits to milk producers and distributors and the placarding of restaurants and other establishments serving milk or milk products.

Section 1 (a).

The Health Officer of the Town of Mooresville in the performance of his duties under Section 1. of this ordinance, shall adopt as the standard to be followed the provisions in paragraph HDP 4G entitled "Certified Milk Identity" and paragraph HDP 4H entitled "Grade A Milk and Milk Products" of a regulation of the Indiana State Board of Health duly passed on September 13, 1945 and filed with the Secretary of State on October 18, 1945, entitled "Regulations Relating to Dairy Products, including Definitions and Standards of Identity." For the purpose of interpreting the aforesaid requirements, the unabridged form of Public Health Bulletin No. 220 entitled "The 1939 edition of the Milk Ordinance and Code recommended by the U.S. Public Health Service", shall be placed on file in the office of the Town Clerk-Treasurer for public inspection.

Section 2.

The sale of adulterated, misbranded, or ungraded milk or milk products prohibited. No person shall within the Town of Mooresville, Indiana or its police jurisdiction, produce, sell, offer, or expose for sale, or have in possession with intent to sell, any milk or milk product which is adulterated, misbranded, or ungraded. It shall be unlawful for any person, elsewhere than in a private home, to have in possession any adulterated, misbranded, or ungraded milk or milk product.

Section 3.

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation to bring into or receive into the Town of Mooresville, or its police jurisdiction for sale or to sell, or offer for sale therein, or to have in storage where milk or milk products are sold or served, any milk or milk products defined in this ordinance, who does not possess a permit from the Health Officer of the Town of Mooresville, or his authorized representative.

Only a person who complies with the requirements of this ordinance shall be entitled to receive and retain such a permit.

Such a permit may be suspended by the Health Officers or his representative or revoked after an opportunity for a hearing by the Health Officers, or his representative, upon the violation by the holder of any of the terms of this ordinance.

"Permit Fees": The permit fee for the sale or disposal of milk or milk products in the Town of Mooresville shall be as follows:

Every milk plant engaged in the distribution of either certified pasteurized or Grade A pasteurized milk or milk products shall pay to the Town of Mooresville a permit fee of three cents (3¢) per hundredweight for all milk and milk products received as defined in this ordinance, except sweet cream purchased as such for market milk purposes in which case the fee shall be one cent (1¢) per pound butterfat. Any dairy selling direct to another dairy or dairies which purchasing dairy or dairies pay their permit fee on the hundredweight as above set out on the milk so produced shall not be required to pay either of the aforesaid permit fees.

These fees shall be paid to the Town Clerk-Treasurer of the Town of Mooresville and shall be used only for the execution of the provisions of this ordinance. These fees shall be based on the actual net weight of all the milk and milk products received. The original weight sheets shall be made available once each month to the Health Officer or his authorized representative for the determination of this fee. All milk and milk products shall be purchased by weight; the purchase of milk or milk products by measure is prohibited.

Section 4.

From and after twelve months from the date on which this ordinance takes effect, no milk or milk products shall be sold to the final consumer or to restaurants, soda fountains, grocery stores or similar establishments, except Grade A. Pasteurized, Certified Pasteurized milk or milk products as defined in this ordinance, provided that when any milk distributor fails to qualify for one of the above grades, the health officer, or his authorized representative, is authorized to revoke his permit, or in lieu thereof, to degrade his product and ^{not} permit its sale during a temporary period not exceeding thirty (30) days or in emergencies such longer period as he may deem necessary.

Section 5.

Any person, firm, or corporation violating any provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction be punished by fine of not more than \$100.00 or imprisonment in the county jail for not more than 30 days or both, such fine and imprisonment at the discretion of the Court. Each and every violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall constitute a separate offense.

Section. 6

It shall be the duty of the Town Board of the Town of Mooresville to appoint such sanitary police and inspectors with the approval of the Health Officer and State Board of Health, and such clerical employees as may be necessary for the enforcement of this ordinance. Such sanitary police and inspectors shall be the authorized representatives of the Health Officer to perform such duties of inspection and reports as may be necessary for the full enforcement of this ordinance.

Such sanitary police and inspectors shall be persons well qualified for the performance of said duties on the basis of the State merit system in force at their time of their employment.

Section. 7

The salary of such inspector shall be fixed by the ^{Board of Trustees} ~~Common~~ Council of the Town of Mooresville and in no event to exceed the amount derived from the permit fees above set out less the necessary operating expenses and there is hereby created a special fund to be known as the milk fund, and proceeds

of such fund to be used only and solely for the carrying out of the provisions of this ordinance.

Section. 8

Any person, firm or corporation having a permit issued by another city or town and paying a like permit fee goes toward the payment of salary of the inspector shall be exempt from paying such permit fee.

Section. 9

If any section, subdivision or clause of this ordinance shall be held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.

Section. 10

All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect on and after its passage and legal advertising.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooreville, Indiana met in regular session of continuancy on the 14th day of December, 1948 for the purpose of taking up matters for the signatures of the parking meter contract and the reading of a milk ordinance. All members were present with the exception of Manley Brown. Also present at this meeting was Mr. Tomlinson, a representative of the State Board of Health who gave quite an extensive talk on pointers for making a good milk ordinance and the enforcing of the ordinance. Mr. Tomlinson carefully read each section of the ordinance of the Town's prepared by Attorney Butler and said that it met all requirements of the State Board of Health.

At this time Ordinance No. 7 of the Town of Mooreville entitled "An Ordinance To Regulate The Production, Transportation, Processing, Handling, Sampling, Examination, Grading, Labeling, Re-Grading, and Sale of Milk and Milk Products, the Inspection of Dairy Herds, Dairies, and Milk Plants; the Issuing and Revocation of Permits, the Placarding of Restaurants and Other Establishments serving Milk or Milk Products and the Fixing of Penalties." was given first reading. It was moved by Thornberry and seconded by Fields that the Ordinance be passed. Motion carried. It was further moved by Fields and seconded by Thornberry that the rules be suspended owing to an emergency existing in the case of the local creamery wishing to be in operation by the first of 1949, and the Ordinance to be passed and adopted. This motion carried unanimously in the affirmative by roll call of all Board Members.

Next the parking meter question was brought up. A slight discussion followed and it was moved by Michael and seconded by Thornberry that the Board accept the offer and proposition of the Dual Parking Meter Co. This motion Carried. The Clerk-Treasurer was instructed thus to notify the Star-Lite Meter Co. of Indianapolis representing the Duncan Meter, and the Dual Co. of the action taken by the Board. No contract was signed at this time. Attorney Butler was to examine the contract before signatures were applied, but the Dual Co. was to be notified of their award.

Business being completed for the evening, it was moved by Michael and seconded by Fields that the meeting adjourn in continued session until the 28th day of December at which time all matters pertaining to closing business for 1948 would be taken up. This motion carried.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooreville, Indiana met in continued session in the Municipal Building at 8 P.M. on the 28th day of December, 1948 for the purpose of closing business for 1948. The parking meter matter was once again resumed, but the decision of the Board was not to sign the contract for purchasing until a definite number of meters was agreed upon and at this time the Board was not ready to say since the representative of the State Highway Department had not been able to help with the location of the placing of the meters yet. The Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to write Mr. Wilkin of the Dual Meter Co. and inform him of the above information.

The question of allowing claims was the next item. The following claims were read and it was moved and seconded by Thornberry and Fields respectively that all claims be allowed as read with the exception of a claim presented by the Mooreville Times for the publishing of the Milk Ordinance. This bill was not allowed at this time since payment for this would have to be taken from a newly created fund known as the Milk Fund, but would not become active until after Jan. 1, 1949. All other claims were allowed as read. Motion carried.

The Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to write the Federal Works Agency an inquiry as to the correct procedure for renewing the loan made to the Town to pay partially for plans and specifications for a new sewer works in Mooresville.

Paul Michael served as President Pro Tem during the meeting in the absence of Mr. York, the President.

All business being completed at this time, It was moved by Thornberry and seconded by Fields that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
