A Committee consisting of Logan Street, Fred Herzog and James R. Carter was appointed by President to confer with A. B. Balwert and write a contract for street lighting. lished thereof in Mooresville Guide for 2
weeks and a committee of 3 be appointed
to consider said report. The Electric Light
Committee reported they had made a contract
with Mr Balwert and contract was presented
and reads as follows.

" This Agreement entered into this 11th day
of December 1900 by and between Archie B.
Balwert, of Morgan co, State of Indiana and
The Town of Mooresville, of the same place
witnesseth: That the said Archie B. Balwert
for and in consideration of the Covenant of
the said Town of Mooresville, herein after
mentioned, does hereby Covenant and agree
to furnish, for a period of five years, com-
mencing on the first day of January 1901 and
ending on the last day of December - 1905
twelve arc lamps of two thousand candle
power each, for the purpose of lighting the
streets of the said Town of Mooresville, said
lamps to be placed on the following named
streets in said Town, to wit: Washington,
Main, Harrison, High, and South streets.
Said lamps to be suspended at least twenty

L. Wheeler moved we proceed according to law and advertise for bids on the Indiana street side walk in pavement. The Board then adjourned.

The following is a copy of Franchise as read and adopted.

An Ordinance granting Indianapolis & Martinsville Rapid Transit Co, its successors and assigns, the right to construct, maintain and operate a Street railroad across Washington Street, Madison Street and Main Street and intervening alleys in Blocks Thirteen and Six on the original Plat of Woodsville, and along and upon Harrison Street from Madison Street to the city limits on the West; along and upon Madison Street from Main Street to the city limits on the South; in the town of Woodsville Morgan County, Indiana.

Section 1.

Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the town of Woodsville, Indiana, that consent, permission and authority are hereby given, granted and fully vested in Indianapolis and Martinsville Rapid Transit Company, its successors and assigns, to lay, construct, maintain and operate a single or double track street railroad for the transportation of passengers, freight, mail and express, with all the necessary and convenient tracks for turn-outs side-tracks, switches and turntables, in, upon and across Washington Street,

Madison Street and Main Street and intervening alleys in blocks Thirteen and six of the original plat of Muncieville, and along and upon Harrison Street from Madison Street to the City limits on the west; along and upon Madison Street from Main Street to the City limits on the south; or any portion thereof, for a period of fifty (50) years from the date of the passage of this Ordinance, subject to the conditions hereafter mentioned, to wit:—

Section 2.

The motive power of said railroad shall be electricity, to be used in any improved manner, or any other improved motive power other than steam. Said Indianapolis and Martinsville Rapid Transit Company, its successors and assigns, are hereby given and granted permission and full authority to make such use of said Street as shall become necessary to enable it, its successors and assigns, to use electricity or other improved motive power for power purposes, and authority is hereby given, granted and vested in said Indianapolis and Martinsville Rapid Transit Company, its successors and assigns, to construct and maintain such structures and mechanical appliances as shall be reasonably necessary in order to construct, maintain and operate such railroad.

Section 3.

The tracks of said Railroad shall be laid so as to conform to the established grade of the Street and in such manner as to be no unnecessary obstructions to the use of the Street and the passage of wagons and other vehicles over the same;

provided however that the said Indianapolis and Martinsville Rapid Transit Company, its successors and assigns, shall be allowed to make such grading on said Harrison Street where the same is occupied by its tracks as may be necessary to proper construction of its railroad tracks; and provided further that the grade of Harrison Street shall not be changed to exceed two feet and six inches either above or below the present grade at any place, and not to exceed twelve inches at the crossing of Harrison Street and Indiana Street; and when so changed by said transit Co, it shall make the grade of the entire width of said street at the point of such change, conform to the grade so changed by said Company, and pay the expense thereof, and leave the surface of said street in as good condition for travel and the same condition as the same was before the construction of said road.

Section 4.

Whenever the street or street crossing is disturbed, obstructed or damaged, by reason of the construction or repair of said railroad, said Indianapolis and Martinsville Rapid Transit Company, its successors and assigns, shall promptly restore the same in as good condition as it was prior to such disturbance, obstruction or damage. In case the grade of any street occupied by said Company is established by order of the Board of Trustees of said town; the said Rapid Transit Company shall change its tracks to conform to such established grade; and whenever the streets occupied by said Company shall by said Board of Trustees be ordered to be improved the said Company shall pay for so much of such improvement as lies between its

tracks and eighteen inches on the outside thereof, provided that no improvement is made upon such streets so occupied by said Company of more expensive material than is used upon other streets on the business portions of said town, and to repair and keep the street between its tracks and for eighteen inches on each side of the tracks in as good condition for use as the residue of its streets or what said track is laid, so far as the same has been made necessary by any act of this Company or by its use or occupation for said road.

Section 5.

The tracks of said street railroad shall be of uniform and standard gauge and shall be laid in the center of said street where it is practicable so to lay them, and where double tracks are laid, the center of such street shall be the center line between such double tracks, and such double tracks shall be laid as near together as safe and practicable.

Section 6.

Said Indianapolis and Martinsville Rapid Transit Company, its successors and assigns, agree to save the town harmless from damage loss or liability occasioned by the construction, maintenance and operation of said street railroad.
continued on page 35.

Section 7.

The rate of fare on any line or route of said railroad shall not exceed five cents (5¢) for each passenger for one (1) continuous trip within the corporate limits of said town, and no charge shall be made for children under six (6) years of age when accompanied by their parents or guardians.

A part of Section 6.

In case any judgment shall be recorded against said town for any injury on account of the acts of said transit Co, said Co agree to pay said judgment provided written notice of such suit has been given by said town to said transit Co upon the filing of said suit, the same shall be conclusive against said Co and it waives all defenses against said judgment as against said town; and provided further that said Co, has been given opportunity to make full defense in such action and to litigate the same through the courts of last resort if so desired.

Section 8.

The right to operate and maintain said street railroad shall extend to the full term of fifty (50) years from the date of the passage of this ordinance.

Section 9.

On the construction of said road, said transit Co, shall place no poles in the center of any street without first obtaining the written consent of said board of Trustees but that the poles for all wires shall be placed on the side of the street, and in such a way as not to occasion unnecessary injury to shade trees and not to be located in front of drive ways or gates adjacent to property owners abutting on the streets.

Section 10.

It is further provided the said Transit Co shall provide a safe and convenient place for the loading and unloading of freight going out of and coming into said town and that such place shall be designated by the board of Trustees at some point on the streets of said town and convenient for use by said Co, and in the future in case the business requires

The same other places may be designated by the Board of Trustees and as agreed upon by the parties hereto.

Section 11.

Said Indianapolis and Martinsville Rapid Transit Company, its successors and assigns, shall commence the construction of said street railroad by the first day of January, 1902, and have the same in operation within one year thereafter, or all rights herein granted shall be forfeited, unless extensions of time be granted by said Board of Trustees.

Section 12.

This Ordinance shall be in force and effect thirty days after its passage and acceptance in writing by said Indianapolis and Martinsville Rapid Transit Company

An Ordinance granting the right, privilege and permission to the Mooreville Telephone Co. to use and occupy the streets, alleys, avenues, highways and public places in said town for the purpose of erecting and maintaining telephone poles, stringing and maintaining telephone wires thereon for the operation of a telephone system and Exchange in said town: Fixing the maximum rates for telephone service to the citizens thereof and to repeal an ordinance upon the same subject passed by the Board on the 3rd day of April 1900.

Sec 1. Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the town of Mooreville, that said town does hereby authorize and empower the Mooreville Telephone Company, incorporated, its successors and assigns and by the terms of this ordinance consent, permission and authority are given, granted and vested in, and unto, said The Mooreville Telephone Company, the right and privilege to use the streets, alleys, avenues, highways, and public places in said town for the purpose of erecting and maintaining telephone poles stringing and and maintaining telephone wires thereon necessary for the use and successful operation of a telephone system and exchange within said town. in consideration of and subject to the terms, conditions and limitations hereinafter set out.

Sec. 2. That all of said poles shall be erected in such places on said streets, alleys, avenues, highways and public places, as may be designated by the Board of Trustees of said Town.

Sec. 3. That said Company shall restore any and all of said streets, alleys, avenues, highways and public places in which it may erect poles, to as good condition as they were before the erection thereof.

Sec. 4. That said Company shall remove all unnecessary and unused poles and wires when requested by said Board so to do.

Sec. 5. That said Company shall not charge collect or receive as rental for the use of phones and service, a sum exceeding \$24.00 per year for offices, business and public houses, and \$18.00 per year for private houses and residences.

Sec. 6. Upon the written application of any person for a telephone, which is to be located within the corporate limits of said Town, the said Telephone Company shall furnish and connect such telephone with its exchange within sixty days after such written application has been filed with said Company, Provided: The applicant shall signify in such application, his willingness to comply with the rules of said Company.

Sec. 7. Be it further ordained by the Board of Trustees of said Town: That all and singular the acts and proceedings done and taken by said the Mooresville Telephone Company under and by virtue of the provisions of an Ordinance passed by said Board

of trustees on the 3rd day of April 1900. Together with the acts of said Board in relation thereto are hereby ratified, confirmed and approved and said ordinance is hereby repealed.

Sec. 8. That before said Company shall avail itself of the rights and privileges granted by this Ordinance, it shall file with the Board of Trustees of said Town, its acceptance in writing signed by the President and Secretary and attested by the seal of said Company, of all the provisions, restrictions requirements and regulations thereof.

Sec. 9. The Franchise hereby granted to said Company shall, after its acceptance by said Company be and continue for the term and period of twenty one years from and after the taking effect of this Ordinance: Provided, that the failure of said Company to render efficient service to its patrons for the period of sixty consecutive days, shall authorize said Board to repeal this ordinance and the franchise hereby granted shall thereby become forfeited to said town.

Sec. 10. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force after the expiration of thirty days from the date of its passage: Provided: that, within that time, a referendum shall not be demanded, as now provided by law: but in the event of such demand being so made, then it shall take effect immediately upon its approval by a majority of the votes cast for and against the same at an election to be held in pursuance of said demand as now provided by law.

AN ORDINANCE granting the right, privilege and permission to The Mooresville Telephone Company to use and occupy the public places in said town for erecting and maintaining telephone poles,

stringing and maintaining thereon for the operation of a Telephone system and Exchange in said Town; Fixing the maximum rates for telephone service to the Citizens thereof, and to repeal the same on the same subject.

Section 1. That the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, that said town does hereby authorize and empower The Mooresville Telephone Company, incorporated, its successors and assigns, and by the terms of this ordinance consent, permission and authority are given, granted and vested in, and unto, said The Mooresville Telephone Company, the right and privilege to use the streets, alleys, avenues, highways and public places in said town for the purpose of erecting and maintaining telephone poles, stringing and maintaining telephone wires thereon necessary for the use and successful operation of a telephone system and Exchange within said Town, in consideration of and subject to the terms, conditions and limitations hereinafter set forth.

Section 3. That said Company shall restore any and all of said streets, alleys, avenues, highways and public places in which it may erect poles, to as good condition as they were before the erection thereof.

Section 4. That said Company shall remove all unnecessary and unused poles and wires when requested by said Board so to do.

Section 5. That said Company shall not charge, collect or receive as rental for the use of Phones and service, a sum exceeding \$24.00 per year for offices, business and public houses, and \$18.00 per year for private houses and residences.

Section 6. Upon the written application of any person for a telephone, which is to be located within the corporate limits of said Town, the said Telephone Company shall furnish and connect such telephone with its Exchange within ninety days after such written application has been filed with said Company. Provided: the applicant shall signify, in such application, his willingness to comply with the rules of said Company.
