The following ordinance was presented.

An ordinance authorizing the issuance of street improvement bonds by the Board of Trustees of the town of Mooresville in Morgan County Indiana

1 Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the town of Mooresville in Morgan County Indiana, that there be issued by the Board of trustees of said town pursuant to an act of the legislature of the State of Indiana, in force March 8th 1889, commonly known as the Barrett Law street improvement bonds for the purpose of defraying the costs and expenses of the construction of a cement side walk on the north side of Main Street extending from Indiana to Morrow Street in said town of Mooresville Morgan County Indiana.

- 2 Whereas an emergency exists for the immediate taking effect of this ordinance the same is hereby declared to be in force and effect from and after the passage thereof.

G. R. Seruggs moved that the above ordinance be adopted and placed on file Motion Carried.

The following ordinance was also proposed. Whereas John Bryant is serving as town Marshall of the town of Mooresville in Morgan County Indiana to fill a vacancy in said office occasioned by the resignation of the regularly elected Marshal of said town; and whereas the compensation of the Marshal now allowed is deemed inadequate; therefore be it resolved by the Board of trustees of said town of Mooresville that the said Marshal be allowed the sum of one dollar and fifty cents per day for each and every day he shall be the incumbent of said office of Marshal discharging the duties of said office.

2. Whereas an emergency exists for the immediate taking effect of this resolution the same is hereby declared to be in force and effect from and after its passage and adoption.

G. R. Seruggs moved that the ordinance as above set forth be adopted and placed on file Motion Carried.

G. R. Seruggs also moved that the Board hire E. K. Thomas for one year from the 1st day of February 1904 at Forty Dollars per year Motion Carried.

Mr G. R. Seruggs introduced an ordinance intitled An ordinance granting the Public Service Company a Franchise for the use of the streets, alleys, avenues, roads and public grounds in the town

of Mooresville, for the erection and maintenance of water works, electric light and gas plants heating plants, and establishing charges and regulations thereof;

and moved its adoption and passage.

Pending its consideration Mr. J. S. Comer moved that the Board take a recess until until one o'clock P.M. Thursday February 4th 1904 for the purpose of continuing the consideration of the ordinance. Motion Carried

Thursday February 4th 1904 at one o'clock P.M.
The Board reconvened with the following members present O. G. Warren A. E. Elliott J. S. Comer G. R. Scroggs & L. A. Shanfelt.

The Clerk read the proposed ordinance which is as follows:

Ordinance No. 10.

An ordinance granting the Public Service Company a Franchise for the use of the streets, alleys, avenues, roads and public grounds in the town of Mooresville for the erection and maintenance of water works electric light and gas plants heating plants and establishing charges and regulations thereof.

Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the town of Mooresville Indiana.

Section 1. That consent, permission and authority are hereby given to the Public Service Company, a corporation duly organized under the laws of the State of Indiana to use and occupy the streets, alleys, avenues, roads and public grounds in the town of Mooresville Indiana, for the purpose of laying (over and underground) pipes, conduits and aqueducts, and erecting poles, stringing wires thereon,

and the erecting, constructing and maintaining of any and all mechanical devices necessary for effectuating the objects of said Public Service Company in constructing, maintaining and operating its plants for supplying the town and the inhabitants thereof with water, light, heat, and power for public or private use.

Said consent, permission and authority is granted to said Public Service Company, for a period of fifty (50) years from this date.

Sec. 2.

And it is further ordained that the said grant shall be accepted by the Public Service Company upon the express condition that after March 1st, 1904, said company shall furnish to the town of Mooresville, fifteen (15) public lights, known as fifteen hundred (1500) candle power, and shall maintain lights therein according to the Philadelphia moonlight schedule, (and turned on at twilight,) up to one o'clock each night, at a monthly rate of six dollars and fifty cents (\$6.50) per lamp.

In case that said lights or any of them shall fail to illuminate, a deduction of one fifteenth ($\frac{1}{15}$) of six dollars and fifty cents (\$6.50) shall be made for each night that such lights or light so fail, unless such failure is occasioned by causes beyond the power or control of said company to prevent.

And it is further made the duty of said company to furnish additional public lights as above defined, (over and above fifteen in number) for a rental of five dollars and seventy five cents (\$5.75), each lamp per month, if such additional lamps are required by the Board of Trustees of the town of Mooresville, and the same to be supplied continually thereafter.

And it is further conditioned and agreed that the

acceptance of this grant by the Public Service Company obligates it to furnish the town of Mooresville with at least twenty five (25) fire hydrants, to be located by the town Board, each supplied with places for attaching two nozzles for the rental of which, said company by its acceptance of this grant, agrees to accept from the town of Mooresville a rental of forty Dollars \$40.00 for each hydrant per annum, payable in twelve (12) monthly installments, during each year continuing thereafter, and that said obligation shall be binding from the installation of the water works plant of said company.

And further that the Public Service Company shall in cases of fire (on notice from the head of the town fire department) blow its whistles, or display electric signals as fire alarms and also on his notice turn on a direct pressure of water as soon as possible.

And it is further made the duty of the Public Service Company to furnish additional fire hydrants as above described (over and above twenty five (25) in number) for a rental of thirty five dollars (\$35.00) for each hydrant per annum, when such hydrants are ordered by the Board of trustees of the town of Mooresville, such rental to be payable in equal monthly installments said hydrants are to be located by the town Board.

Sec. 3. The town of Mooresville shall be saved harmless by the Public Service Company from any damages which may accrue to it or to any person or persons firm or corporation, or which may in any way arise or grow out of the exercise by said Public Service Company of the privileges hereby granted in this franchise.

And to pay any judgment or damages that may

- but recovered against said town on account of the acts or negligence of said Public Service Company.
- Sec. 4. Said Public Service Company shall be allowed the right of free contract with the citizens of the town of Mooresville for heat, light, power and water, but all contracts made by the Public Service Company for like services, amounts or quantities, under like terms of measurements or payments, as to time set shall be equal and no discrimination or favor shall be shown to one person over another.
- Sec. 5. Said Public Service Company is required to commence work upon its plants within six (6) months from the date of this grant, and continuously prosecute said work with diligence, and is required to have all the same completed except additional extensions, within eighteen (18) months from this date, and except the plant for heating, which may be completed in two (2) years from the date of passage of this ordinance.
- Sec. 6. Where said Public Services Company makes use of any street, alley, avenue, or public ground within the town of Mooresville, it is obligated to restore the same in as good condition as before constructing therein to meet the approval of the President of the Board of Trustees of the town of Mooresville, and in case of failure to do so on notice of the town Board, said Board may have the same done and charge the same to said company, and may retain the amount thereof from any money which may be payable to said company by said town.
- Sec. 7. It is further ordained as a condition of this grant, that at the expiration of twenty (20) years from the date of its passage, if the qualified voters of the town of Mooresville express a desire by a majority vote on popular ballot, to take over own and operate the works and plants of said Public Service Company,

the town authorities may so acquire the same, when legally so empowered to do, by paying an agreed purchase price which shall not exceed one hundred and fifteen (115) per cent of the costs of the plants, and such town may have access to the books and papers of said company with a view of ascertaining such costs and if said parties are unable to agree upon such valuation, then the same shall be submitted to arbitration as follows: Each party shall choose one arbitrator and if they fail to agree, then the Judge of the Circuit Court of Morgan County, State of Indiana, shall have the power to choose the third arbitrator, any two of whom may make an award, which shall be binding on both parties, and said company shall be obliged to accept the amount of such award.

Sec. 8. This grant of authority is hereby given by the town of Mooresville and accepted on the part of said Public Service Company, upon the express conditions that said company will keep and perform the obligations herein provided, and in case of failure to perform the obligations herein imposed, the rights of said company under this ordinance shall cease.

Sec. 9 The town of Mooresville reserves to itself the right to determine in what portion of the streets alleys avenues, roads and public grounds, the said company shall place its poles, pipes conduits and access ducts, and in case any public improvements requires the changing of any poles, the same shall be changed by the said company on the order of the Board aforesaid.

Sec. 10. The pipe lines or water mains shall be of sufficient capacity for an ample supply of water to actual consumers along said mains, and if the same shall be insufficient for said purpose, said company shall increase their

capacity or lay additional mains to supplement them and said company shall at all times in case of fire, provide sufficient force and volume of water to throw from such hydrant separately a stream of water to the height of sixty (60) feet.

Provided further that the Board of said trustees shall have the right to order extension of water mains within the limits of said town when there are presented to said Board written subscriptions to become regular consumers, of at least ten (10) persons to the one thousand feet abutting on said main so asked for by said subscribers covering both sides.

Said company shall at all times keep its hydrants in such condition that they may be used and not frozen, and the mains all laid under frost lines and kept free for the continuous flow of water.

Sec. 11. This grant shall not be in force until after its written acceptance by the said Public Service Company shall have been filed with the Clerk of the town of Mooresville, and unless said acceptance herein provided for shall be executed and filed with the Clerk of the town of Mooresville as aforesaid, within sixty (60) days from the date of the passage hereof, then this ordinance shall be null and void.

Sec 1. Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, that a Volunteer Fire Department shall be, and is hereby established. And that said fire department shall be organized on the following basis; it shall consist of two companies with an maximum

memberships of 25 men each. Persons shall be eligible to membership from the ages of 18 to 45. Each company shall be officered by a Captain, 1st and 2nd Lieutenants, and the command of the entire fire department shall be vested in a Fire Marshall, who shall be elected annually by the Board of Trustees.

Sec 2. The Fire Marshall shall have full authority and control over the Fire Department of the town; he shall see that all fire apparatus is kept in good order, and properly stored when not in use; he shall see that the fire department has had regular times for drill and practice, and shall be in perfect discipline.

Sec 3. The Captains of each company shall have control over each their respective company under the directions and orders of the Fire Marshall. In the event of the absence of the Fire Marshall, the senior captain shall assume and perform his duties, and in the event of the absence of the Fire Marshall and the senior captain the junior captain shall assume the discharge of the duties of the Fire Marshall. The Fire Marshall and Captains, shall each, while in the discharge of their duties, and while actively engaged in the extinguishing of a fire, and while on drills, have full police powers, and during such times are constituted police officers.

Sec 4. The Fire Marshall and Captains of company's, shall by virtue of their appointment by Fire Wardens and shall have power to enter into and examine all buildings and premises in the town for the purpose of inspecting the fire hazards, and it shall be his or their duty to

abate any extreme fire hazard which might occasion great danger, and they shall report to the Board of Trustees all places which they may consider unsafe, which might be the immediate cause of fire.

Sec 5. The Fire Marshall shall have full command over all officers and members of the fire department during the progress of a fire, and over all other persons who may be present at such fire, and shall cause all ordinances, rules and regulations respecting the control of fire and the operations of the fire department to be observed; and it shall be his duty together with the assistance of the officers of the company's to enforce strict discipline over the members of the fire department.

Sec 6. It shall be the duty of the officers and members of the Fire Department to respond immediately when an alarm of fire is given, and go into action to extinguish the fire and prevent a conflagration. All members shall remain under the orders of their respective officers until released from service by the Fire Marshall. No member shall wear any uniform of the fire department except while on duty or on drill. In case any member desires to resign, he shall give one month's notice of his intention.

Sec 7. Any officer or member of the town Fire Department, who shall wilfully violate any of the provisions of this ordinance, or any rule or regulation of the by laws pertaining to the government of the department, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

Sec 7 The said New Long Distance Telephone Company shall certify its written acceptance of the provisions of this ordinance, it shall be in full force and effect after its passage and its written ten (10) days from date, from and after which acceptance, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect.

Sec 8 Whereas an emergency exists for the immediately taking effect of this ordinance it shall be in full force and effect after its passage and its acceptance by the said New Long Distance Telephone Company.

An ordinance regulating the water works during ^{the}
and prescribing penalties for violation thereof.

Sec 1. Be it ordained by the Board of trustees of the
Town of Mooresville Indiana that it shall
be unlawful for any person or persons to
open any public hydrants, street or yard
sprinklers or fire plugs or turn any public stop
cocks, or in any way or manner injure or
interfere with the water source or other
apparatus belonging to the Public Service
Company from the time an alarm of fire is
first sounded, until the signal of "fire out." is
given by the Fire Department, excepting under
the directions of the Fire Marshall, or by order
from the officers of the Public Service Company.

Sec 2. Any person or persons violating the provisions
of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof,
be fined in any sum not exceeding one
hundred Dollars.

The following ordinance was taken

An ordinance prohibiting the change, alterations or extension of service and other pipes connecting with the water mains of the Public Service Company without the consent of said Company also prohibiting the furnishing or using of water by persons not entitled to the same of water furnished by said Company and to prevent the reopening or reconnection of the water supplied by said Company when the same has been discontinued without the consent of said Company and fixing a penalty for its violation &c.

Sec 1. Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the town of Mooresville N.C., that it is hereby declared to be unlawful for any person to in any manner whatever, change, extend or alter any service or other pipe, of any kind, used in any residence, business block, public or private place connecting with the water mains of the Public Service Company, so as to in any wise increase or lessen the supply of water furnished by said Company without first procuring from said Company written permission to make such change, extension or alteration.

Sec 2. That it is hereby declared to be unlawful for any tenant occupant or other person, in any building or place whatever, where water is supplied by the Public Service Company to furnish or permit to be taken and used by any person who is not entitled to the use of such water, the water furnished by the Public Service Company, and that no person shall be entitled to the use of such water who is not an occupant of a place or premises that is not regularly furnished with water supply under contract with said Company; and further that it is hereby declared to be unlawful for any person or persons to take and use or cause or permit the same to be taken

and used for his or their benefit, or for the use or benefit of his or their families, the water furnished by the Public Service Company unless such person or persons are the tenants or occupants of premises supplied with water under contract with said Company.

Sec. 3. That it is hereby declared to be unlawful for any person to reconnect or reopen the pipes supplying the water furnished by the Public Service Company, in any case whatever, where such supply of water has been discontinued without first procuring from said Company written permission to make such reconnection or reopening.

Sec. 4. Any person violating any provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction, be fined in any sum of not less than five dollars nor more than one hundred dollars for each offence.

An Ordinance requiring all Steam Railroads, Rapid Transit Railroads, Electric Railroads and Inter-Urban Railroads, running through, or through the incorporated town of Mooresville, Indiana., to keep and maintain streets at all crossings of said "Railroad Company's with the public streets in said town, prescribing the kind of lights to be maintained by said Company's, the period for which such light shall be maintained, the manner of enforcing this ordinance, the penalties for the violation thereof, and declaring an emergency.

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Section 1

Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the incorporated town of Mooresville, in Morgan County, Indiana, that it is deemed necessary for the safety and protection of the citizens of said town aforesaid that street lights be kept and maintained at the crossings of all public streets in said town where such streets are intersected by any Railroad, steam Railroad, Electric Railroad, Rapid Transit Railroad, Street Railroad or Inter-Urban Railroad, and that at the present time it is necessary for the safety of the citizens of said town that such lights shall be at once erected, constructed and placed in operation and use at the crossing of the following streets where same is intersected by what is known as the Indianapolis and Vincennes, railroad, to-wit: East South Street, East Harrison Street, East High Street, and East Main Street, and that it is also necessary for the safety of the citizens of said town aforesaid that lights be also erected, constructed and placed in operation and use at the crossings of the following streets where the same are intersected by what is known as the Indianapolis and Martinsville Rapid Transit Company's Railroad, to-wit: Jefferson Street, Indiana Street, Clay Street, and Washington Street. all said streets being in said town of Mooresville, Indiana.
