Health Ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE PROTECTING THE PUBLIC HEALTH; DEFINING THE DUTIES OF THE TOWN HEALTH OFFICER AND TOWN MARSHAL; DIRECTING THE ABATEMENT OF NUISANCES AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES.

SECTION 1. Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, State of North Carolina, That it shall be unlawful for any person, persons, company or corporation to erect, construct, cause, permit, keep or maintain within the limits of said town anything whatsoever which is injurious to health, or indecent or offensive to the senses of any inhabitants of said town or any obstructions to the free use of property by any such inhabitants, and any person or persons, company or corporation maintaining any nuisance above referred to is hereby declared to be the author and maintainer of a nuisance.

SECTION 2. It shall be unlawful for any person, directly or through any member of his family or any employe or for any company or corporation to throw or deposit any dirt, filth, manure, offal, noisome or filthy liquids, carcasses of dead animals, vegetable matter, garbage, ashes, wood shavings, straw, paper, or any kind of refuse matter whatsoever in or upon any street, alley, sidewalk, crosswalk, gutter, or public place of this town. Persons owning or having control of the premises from which any of the before mentioned nuisances are thrown or deposited as aforesaid, shall be deemed to have violated this section.

SECTION 3. It shall be unlawful for any person, directly or through any member of his family or any employe, or for any company or corporation to throw, deposit or in any way place, any manure, rubbish, slops, putrid or unsound vegetable matters, or dead animal of any description or kind or any filth, noisome or unwholesome liquid or substances that are liable to become unwholesome or dangerous, in, into or upon any lot, cellar, premises, or common and it shall also be unlawful for any rank weeds to be allowed to grow upon any of the private grounds or common of said Town.

SECTION 4. It shall be unlawful for any person to spit upon any sidewalk within the limits of the Town of Mooresville, or upon the floors, steps or entrances of any public building within said town or upon the floors, steps or platform of any railroad station therein.

SECTION 5. It shall be unlawful, within the town of Mooresville to erect, build, maintain, or use in any way, a pigsty or stable for the keeping of any swine, boar, sow or barrow, at a less distance than fifty feet from any dwelling house on the same or any adjoining lot or to keep such a sty or stable in such a manner as to create or cause offensive or noxious smell or odor.

SECTION 6. That each and every tenement house, factory, dwelling house, shop, hotel and occupied building shall be furnished with a suitable privy, the vault of which shall be one which shall be sunk under ground at least six feet deep, and walled up with brick stone or cement, which shall be water tight; and said privy shall at all times be kept so as not to cause unwholesome, noxious or offensive smells.

SECTION 7. All garbage receptacles shall be tightly covered and emptied frequently enough to prevent fermentation and bad odors and garbage receptacles, pig-styes and vaults shall be cleaned, emptied and disinfected, and weeds shall be cut and hauled away at any time upon the written order of the Health Officer said officer shall fix a reasonable time limit in his order when said garbage receptacles, pig-styes or vaults shall be emptied, cleaned and disinfected, and when weeds shall be cut and hauled away and if any owner or lessee, being duly ordered as herein provided, shall fail or refuse to obey said order it shall be the duty of the town marshal upon notice from the health officer to cause the garbage receptacles, pig-styes and vaults, cleaned, emptied and disinfected, or the weeds to be cut and hauled away, and said marshal shall keep an accurate account of the expense thereof, which shall be paid from the town treasury upon the sworn vouchers of the town Marshal, and said expense shall be paid on the property and collected as taxes and turned into the town treasury.

SECTION 8. The Secretary of Health, who is also the town marshal, shall keep an accurate account of the expense thereof, which shall be paid from the town treasury upon the sworn vouchers of the town Marshal, and said expense shall be paid on the property and collected as taxes and turned into the town treasury.

SECTION 9. If a nuisance or any unsanitary condition is found, it shall be the duty of the Town Health Officer, when informed of the existence of the same, to immediately notify the person or persons so offending, in writing, fixing the time limit to abate the nuisance. If such person shall fail or refuse to abate the nuisance within the time specified, it shall be the duty of the Town Marshal upon notice of the Health Officer to cause the same to be abated, keeping an accurate account of the expense thereof, which shall be paid from the town treasury upon the sworn voucher of the town Marshal and said expense shall be a lien on the property, and collected as taxes are collected and turned into the town treasury.

SECTION 10. All cases of cholera, typhoid fever, measles, whooping cough, yellow fever, small pox, diphtheria, membranous croup, scarlet fever, bubonic plague, leprosy, and pulmonary tuberculosis, shall be immediately reported to the Town Health Officer by the attending physician, if any; otherwise by the Town Health Officer to at once impose quarantine by placarding the house where such disease exists, excepting typhoid fever and tuberculosis, for they shall only be reported and recorded but not quarantined. The cards shall not be less than twelve inches square, with the name of the disease thereon in letters not less than two inches in length, and having upon it the following notice:

"All persons are forbidden to leave or enter these premises without special permit from the Health Officer having jurisdiction, and all persons are forbidden to remove or mutilate this card, or to in any way interfere with this quarantine without orders from said Health Officer."

The card shall be posted in a conspicuous place and shall remain there until removed or ordered removed by the Town Health Officer and it shall be a misdemeanor to remove or mutilate said card except by the order of the said Town Health Officer, and all dwellers in the quarantine habitation, or prescribed area shall not leave said habitation or area or break the quarantine, and no one shall enter without the permission of the Health Officer, and all persons shall obey the direction of the Health Officer concerning the care they shall take against carrying infection to others.

SECTION 11. In case of small pox it shall be the duty of the Town Health Officer to isolate the patient in the house in which he or she is found, or in case this is not practicable, in an isolation hotel, established by the town Board of Trustees, and where the patient is unable to compensate physician or nurse, or provide all necessary attendance or food, the expense thereof shall be paid as other town expenses, and those who have been exposed to small pox shall be vaccinated and disinfected in body

and in apparel and given their freedom for ten days, provided they will faithfully promise to report to the Health Officer at the end of ten days from first exposure, to be placed in quarantine until fifteen days from the first exposure have elapsed or until the officer may appoint.

SECTION 12. When visiting persons known to be infected with smallpox, diphtheria and scarlet fever, all physicians and Health Officers shall protect their clothing and their hands before coming in contact with the public. To accomplish this, a linen or rubber coat, with skull cap shall be worn by physicians and health officers when visiting patients afflicted by the disease named, and said linen or rubber coat and skull cap shall be carried in a hand bag or

other approved receptacle and be thoroughly disinfected with formaldehyde. The hands shall be disinfected by washing with antiseptic soap and by applying an effective antiseptic.

SECTION 13. It shall be the duty of the town marshal at all times to aid the town health officer in the work of enforcing this ordinance upon the demand of said Health Officer.

SECTION 14. Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this ordinance upon conviction thereof, shall be fined for each offence in any sum not less than five nor more than twenty-five dollars, and each days violation shall constitute a separate offense.

SECTION 15. As an emergency exists, this ordinance shall be in effect immediately on and after its passage.
