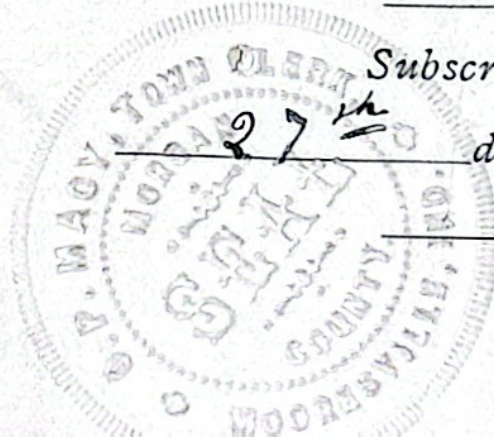

Upon motion of Bradley, seconded by Hadley, that Franchise be accepted as read except the part of Sec 5, beginning as follows.

Provided, however, if after the said Company shall have been in operation, and it shall appear to the stockholders and Board of Directors that said Company can not at such rate maintain said plant in a good and proper condition, and extend its constructions to meet the demands of the public at said rate, then such rates may be changed and increased, but in no case to exceed \$24.00 for business per year and \$18.00 per year for residences. Carried.

The Ordinance as corrected was then read as follows:

Person first

Ordinance No

An ordinance granting the right, privilege and permission to the Mutual Telephone Company of Mooresville, to use and occupy the streets, alleys, avenues, highways and public places in said town for the purpose of erecting and maintaining telephone poles, stringing and maintaining wires thereon for the operation of a telephone system and exchange in said town, and fixing the maximum rates for telephone service to the citizens thereof.

Sec 1 Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Moorville, that said town does hereby authorize and empower The Mutual Telephone Company of Moorville, incorporated its successors and assigns, and by the terms of this ordinance, consent, permission and authority are given, granted and vested in, and unto said, The Mutual Telephone Company of Moorville, the right and privilege to use the streets, alleys, avenues, highways and public places in said town for the purpose of erecting and maintaining telephone poles, stringing and maintaining telephone wires thereon necessary for the use and successful operation of a telephone system and exchange within said town, in consideration of, and subject to the terms, conditions and limitations hereinafter set out.

Sec 2 That all of said poles shall be erected in such places on said streets, alleys, avenues, highways and public places, as may be designated by the Board of Trustees of said town.

Sec 3 That said Company shall restore any and all of said streets, alleys, avenues, highways and public places, in which it may erect poles, to as good condition as they were before the erection thereof.

Sec 4 That said Company shall remove all unnecessary and unused poles and wires when requested by said Board to do so.

Sec 5 The said Company shall not charge, collect or receive a sum exceeding \$8.00 per year for office, business and public houses, and \$12.00 a year for private houses and residences.

The Company shall have the right to require of its patrons monthly payments in advance.

Sec. 6 Upon the written application of any person for a telephone, which is to be located within the corporate limits of said town, the said Telephone Company shall furnish and connect such telephones with its exchange within ninety days after such written application has been filed with said Company, provided, the applicant shall signify in such application, his willingness to comply with the rules of said Company.

Sec. 7 That before said Company shall avail itself of the rights and privileges granted by this ordinance, it shall file with the Board of Trustees of said town, its acceptance in writing signed by the President and Secretary, and attested by the seal of said Company, of all provisions, restrictions, requirements, and regulations thereof.

Sec. 8 The franchise hereby granted to said Company, shall after its acceptance by said Company, be and continue for the term and period of Twenty Five (25) years from and after the taking effect of this Ordinance; provided, that if after the completion and the commencement of the operation of said plant, that there is a failure of said Company to render service to its patrons for the period of sixty consecutive days, it shall authorize said Board to repeal this Ordinance and the franchise hereby granted shall thereby become forfeited to said town.

Sec 9 This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force after the expiration of thirty days from the date of its passage; provided, that within that time, a referendum shall not be demanded as now provided by law; but in the event of such demand being so made, then it shall take effect immediately upon its approval by a majority of the votes cast for and against the same at an election to be held in pursuance of said demand as now provided by law.

Hadley moved, Bradley seconded that ordinance be passed as corrected and read. Motion carried.

The following petition was read before passage of Ordinance as above.

Petition for Franchise.

To the Honorable, The Board of Trustees of the town of Mooresville.

The undersigned, your petitioner herein, would respectfully represent that the undersigned, The Mutual Telephone Company of Mooresville, has been duly organized and incorporated under the laws of the State of Indiana, and are authorized to construct and operate a telephone plant in the town of Mooresville, Indiana, and towns and counties adjacent thereto, and are desirous of doing so, and already have a large number of subscribers for telephones and for the stock of said Company.

That it is not the purpose of the organizers to organized a money making corporation for investment and profit, but that the sole purpose is for the public good, and to secure the best service possible for the least amount of money to the individual telephone patrons. To bring the same within the reach of all of the lowest price consistent with good service and the greatest number of patrons possible.

That the Company is therefore a Mutual Company with a large number of stockholders and a small

amount for each individual stockholders.

Therefore the undersigned ask for a franchise from the town of Mooresville authorizing this Company to construct and operate a telephone plant and under the terms herein proposed.

WHEREAS, It having been made to appear, by the report of the Treasurer of the Town of Mooresville, that the Town of Mooresville is indebted on account of notes, warrants and floating debts outstanding to an amount in excess of Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars, which is the only indebtedness of the Town of Mooresville, Indiana, and

FURTHER, It being made to appear, from the report of B. R. Johnson, Auditor of Morgan County, State of Indiana, that the assessed valuation of the Town of Mooresville is \$513,440.00.

NOW, THEREFORE, Be it resolved, by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, Indiana, that an issue of bonds of the Town of Mooresville for Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars, with interest coupons attached, payable semi-annually, said bonds to be dated October 1, 1905, and to run for a period of Twenty (20) years, principal and interest to be payable at the office of the Treasurer of the Town of Mooresville, in Mooresville, Indiana, said interest coupons to fall due on the first days of April and October of each year, said bonds to be of the denomination, of Five Hundred (\$500) Dollars each, and bearing the rate of four (4) per centum interest per annum, payable semi-annually, and shall be sold at not less than par value. And that the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville are obligated, and shall add to the tax duplicate of the said Town annually a levy of nine (9) cents on the \$100. tax valuation, for the purpose of paying the semi-annual interest of said bonds; and also to provide a sinking fund for the liquidation of the principal thereof when it shall become due, which sinking fund, together with the interest, income or profit thereon, shall be applied solely to the payment of such bonds. The interest coupons on such bonds shall be receivable in payment of taxes due the Town of Mooresville. And, in furtherance of the above resolution, the following ordinance was introduced, entitled:

AN ORDINANCE Authorizing the Issuance of Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars of Bonds, by the Town of Mooresville, Indiana, bearing Interest at the Rate of 4 per centum per annum, payable semi-annually, and providing for a levy of taxes to create funds for the purpose of paying the interest thereon, and of liquidating the principal when the same becomes due.

Section 1. BE IT ORDAINED, by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, Indiana, that said Town authorize the issuance and sale of Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars of its bonds for the purpose of funding or refunding the indebtedness of said

Town, reducing the rate of interest thereon, extending the time of payment, and cancelling so much thereof as may be due, or shall hereafter become due; that such bonds shall bear the rate of four (4) per centum interest per annum, payable semi-annually on the first days of April and October of each year, and the principal of said bonds shall be payable on October 1, 1925, and that both principal and interest shall be payable as they become due at the office of the Town Treasurer of Mooresville, Indiana. Said bonds shall be of the denomination of Five Hundred (\$500) Dollars each. And that said bonds and coupons thereof shall be authenticated and evidenced by the signature of the President of the Town Board and attested by the Town Clerk, and sealed with the corporate seal of the Town of Mooresville; provided always that the Town of Mooresville reserves to itself the right to redeem and cancel any or all of said bonds at any time after October 1, 1910, by giving thirty (30) days' notice, in writing, to the holders thereof, of such intention to redeem and cancel, and depositing the principal and interest then due on such bonds, in some bank in the Town of Mooresville, Indiana, for the payment thereof, after which notice said interest on such bonds shall cease.

Section 2. The bonds above provided for in this ordinance shall be sold by the Town Clerk and the Town Treasurer for cash, at public sale, to the highest bidder, at not less than par value, which sale shall be held in the rooms of the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, Indiana, after notice of such sale has been given by publication for two successive weeks in the Mooresville Times, a newspaper of general circulation, published in said Town, which notice shall state fully the terms, the time, and the place of such sale.

Section 3. An emergency is hereby declared to exist for the immediate taking effect of hereof, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.
