

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING TO THE INDIANAPOLIS, CLOVERDALE AND TERRE HAUTE TRACTION COMPANY, THE RIGHT TO LOCATE, CONSTRUCT, OWN, MAINTAIN AND OPERATE AN INTERURBAN ELECTRIC RAILROAD IN AND UPON CERTAIN STREETS OF THE TOWN OF MOORESVILLE, MORGAN COUNTY, INDIANA.

SECTION 1. Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, in Morgan county, State of Indiana, that consent, permission and authority be and the same is hereby given and granted unto the Indianapolis, Cloverdale and Terre Haute, Traction company, hereinafter called the grantee, its successors and assigns, to locate, construct, own, maintain and operate a standard guage, single track, street and interurban railroad, with the necessary side tracks, switches, turn-outs, "Y" tracks, poles, wires, and other necessary apparatus, the location of such side tracks, switches, turn-outs, "Y" tracks, etc., to be subject to the approval of the Board of Trustees of said Town; also to erect, construct and use all mechanical appliances and contrivances necessary and suitable to operate the same with the use of electricity as the motive power, including the use of the over-head trolley system, upon, along and over the following named streets in the town of Mooresville, to-wit:

commencing at a point on the west corporation line of the Town of Mooresville at the center of High Street; thence eastward in the center of High Street <sup>to the intersection of High Street</sup> and Indiana Street, thence northward in the center of Indiana Street to the north corporate limits of the Town of Mooresville.

Section 2k All tracks, side-tracks, switches, turn-outs and "Y" tracks shall be so constructed and maintained at all times as not in any way to obstruct or impede the free use of said streets by the public, beyond the extent reasonably necessary for the purposes <sup>of</sup> ~~and~~ construction and operation of said railway.

Section 3. In all cases said company, its successors and assigns, so far and as soon as practicable, upon the completion, change, repair, or improvement of any of the tracks or any part thereof, shall replace any such street and make the same as good and passable for the public as it was before such track or tracts were placed in position, changed, repaired or improved, and this provision shall included <sup>and</sup> alley, street crossings intersected by such tracks; and in case of the failure of said company, its successors or assigns to make such repair within a reasonable time after having been notified to do so by the Board of Trustees, the

Board of Trustees may make such repairs at the expense of said company, its successors, or assigns, and collect all such expense, costs and charges from such company, its successors or assigns.

Section 4. Whenever said company, its successors or assigns, shall construct any part of its railway upon any street or part of a street embraced in the routes above described, which at this time has not been built or improved to establish grade by said city, then, any such track or tracks shall be built as near as practicable to the surface of the street, but when any street or part of street has been built to an established grade by said town, then and in every such case the said company, its successors and assigns shall conform said tracks, switches, side-tracks, turn-outs and "Y" tracks to such established grade, and said ~~city~~, shall, upon reasonable notice at all times by such company, its successors or assigns require the Town Engineer to furnish such grade upon all such streets, and also the center line of all such streets. The said grantee shall pay said Town Engineer for said services.

Section 5. A "T" rail may be used in the construction of any of the tracks laid by said company, its successors or assigns, where such tracks are laid upon a street or part of street not paved with brick, asphalt, stone, concrete, macadam or other firm, durable material; but where such track is laid upon any street or part of street paved with brick, asphalt, stone, concrete, macadam or other firm, durable material, the form of the rail may be determined by the Board of Trustees of the Town, and the track therein shall be laid with rails at least five and three-quarters inches in height upon ties laid on a foundation of gravel or broken stone concrete, so that the top of said rails shall be flush with the pavement on the outside; and said company, its successors or assigns, shall remove and replace its tracks when the street is being paved, so as not to unnecessarily delay the street contractor in his work, and all ties used in the construction of any tracks shall be laid and at all times kept and maintained at such a depth as not to be exposed above the surface of the street or interfere in any way with the public travel, beyond the extent

reasonably necessary for the purpose of constructing and operating said road.

Section 6. If at any time said company, its successors or assigns, shall build its track upon any street or part of street upon any other than the established grade on such street or part of street, then, whenever said Town shall cause said street to be improved to an established grade, the company, its successors or assigns, shall be required, at its own expense, to change its said track so as to conform to the established grade of said street or part of street.

Section 7. Said company, its successors or assigns, may take up or ~~enter~~ <sup>remove</sup> any track or lay it down on any other street upon the permission which may hereafter be granted it by said Town for that purpose, but shall put the vacated street in as good condition for travel for the general public as it was immediately before such track was laid; and in case of laying, relaying or repairing its tracks, said company, its successors or assigns, shall put the street in as good condition as it was before said laying, relaying or repairing was done; or when said company, its successors or assigns shall occupy any street or a part of street that has been improved by said Town by paving with gravel or

other material, said company, its successors or assigns, shall improve or repair all that portion of such street lying between the ends of the ties of its track or tracks and shall keep the same in as good repair as the rest of the street, all to the satisfaction of the Board of Trustees of the Town, and at all times maintain the track in such condition so that the rails and ties of said track shall not interfere with the public travel of said streets more than is reasonably necessary to operate said railroad and not to interfere with the crossing of or driving upon, said tracks by vehicles, and when said company, its successors or assigns, shall occupy any street or part of the street that has been or shall be improved by said Town by paving with stone, brick, asphalt, concrete or other firm durable material as said Town may designate, said company, its successors or assigns, shall improve or repair all that portion of such street lying between the rails of the track and for a distance of eighteen inches on the outside of each of the rails and shall keep the same in as good repair as the rest of the street, and on the failure of the said company, its successors or assigns, to improve or repair such part of street after reasonable notice to it by said Town so to do, then

said Town may make or cause to be made such improvements or repairs at the expense of the company, its successors or assigns.

Section 8. Said company, its successors or assigns, are hereby granted the right to construct, maintain and operate said railroad on such route and over and across all bridges and railroad tracks on said route and the right of way along the tracks, as hereinbefore given, as fully as said town can grant the same for the uses and purposes expressed in this contract.

Section 9. The rate of fare on any line or route of railroad of the company within the corporate limits of said Town shall not exceed five cents for each passenger for one continuous passage in the same direction, for any distance within the limits of said <sup>Town.</sup> ~~city~~. Provided, however, that the Town Marshal and police officers employed by the said Town, with badge exposed and while in the discharge of their official duties shall have the right and permission to ride on the cars of the said grantees free of charge in said Town, and provided, further that passengers paying fare into Mooresville, from any point outside of said Town, as also

passengers paying fare from Mooresville to any point outside of said Town on said railroad, shall not be required to pay fare at a rate of more than two cents a mile for each mile traveled between such points. Provided, that said company its successors or assigns, shall not be required to accept any fare less than five cents for one continuous trip. Provided, further, that the rate of fare on such line of railroad shall never exceed the sum of five cents for any school children in Brown Township, Morgan County, Indiana, while traveling to or from school, in either the Town of Mooresville or Brown Township.

Section 10. Any person may carry on the lap any hand bag or other parcel, that may be so carried without inconvenience to other passengers. Children under six years of age carried on the lap of any parent or any other person in charge of them, shall be entitled to ride free.

Section 11. All trunks, bundles, boxes or other articles carried upon the floor or platform on any passenger car may be carried at the option of the company, its successors or assigns, upon such terms and conditions as it may prescribe. Said company, its successors and assigns, shall have the right to transport over its railroad passengers

mail, express matter and freight but the Board of Trustees of said Town shall have the right by ordinance to adopt and enforce all such rules, regulations and restrictions, as it may deem proper for the government of said company, its successors and assigns, in the carrying of freight in separate cars operated for that purpose over said railroad or any part thereof within the limits of said Town. Provided, however, that the freight rate, to be charged by said company on freight carried into or out of said Town of Mooresville shall not exceed seventy-five per cent of the tariff rate now in force on steam railroads running into said Town. Provided, further that freight trains ~~may~~<sup>ing</sup> consist of more than one car shall not be run over said route in said Town.

Section 12. Said company, its successors or assigns shall set their poles for stringing their wires against the curb line outside of such curb and next to the side walks, or as the Board of Trustees shall direct, and so as not to interfere unnecessarily with private property rights and other proper uses of the street. Said company, its successors and assigns, shall use iron poles on all of said route within said corporate limits, and all poles shall be so placed as to give free access to property. If it becomes necessary at any time to have any of said poles moved, the

Board of Trustees of said Town may cause the same to be moved at the expense of the company, its successors or assigns and in setting the same such poles shall be well filled round and tamped firmly into the ground so that the same shall be and remain perpendicular, as nearly as practicable, and so as not to obstruct the drainage, and the town shall have the right to use free of charge any or all poles erected by the company under this ordinance, for the stringing of wires and for other necessary purposes.

Section 13. The guy poles at turning points shall be well anchored. The guy wires shall not come within less than ten (10) feet of the surface of the ground and shall be so placed as not to obstruct free passage or travel. All cross wires shall be suspended not less than eighteen (18) feet above the surface of the ground, except where necessary to pass under bridges or other obstructions. The poles and lines herein contemplated shall be so constructed, and maintained as not to interfere with the use and operation of any existing telegraph, telephone, fire alarm or electric light wires in said Town beyond the extent reasonably necessary for the construction and operation of such railroad.

Section 14. Said company, its successors or assigns shall equip and at all times maintain its said railway with good modern cars, provided with proper appliances for operating the same, so as to provide for the comfort and safety of the passengers.

Section 15. Said company, its successors or assigns, shall be liable for and save harmless the Town of Mooresville from all legal and consequential damages, which may be sustained by any person or property, by reason of the carelessness or negligence or want of ordinary care, or by reason of misconduct of any of its agents, servants or employees, in the course of their employment in the construction or operation of said railroad.

Section 16. Said company, its successors or assigns, whenever it becomes necessary, shall be required to take up and relay any portion of its tracks, for the purpose of putting in, taking up or repairing any street, sewer, water or gas pipe or service connections, and the same shall be done at the expense of the company, its successors or assigns, when such improvement or repair is, being done at the expense of the Town or at the expense of the abutting property owners, or by special assessment against property, but when such taking up or relaying of said company's tracks shall be made necessary from any cause or for any purpose, other than as

hereinabove provided, then such taking up and relaying of said tracks shall be done by said company, its successors or assigns, upon reasonable notice and demand therefor by the Town, and the reasonable and actual cost of the same shall be paid to said company, its successors or assigns, in such way as said Town shall provide, or as shall be agreed upon.

Section 17. Nothing contained in this contract shall be construed, so as to take away from the Board of Trustees of said Town, the exclusive power now exercised over the streets, highways and avenues, within its corporate limits.

Section 18. The cars of the company shall be run in said Town, in accordance with the following rules and regulations:-

First. Such cars may be run at a rate of speed of eight miles per hour, in the business portion, and ten miles per hour in the residence portion of such city.

Second. Such cars shall not <sup>be</sup> stopped on any cross walks or in front of any intersecting street, except to avoid collision with or damage or injury to persons or property, or to take on or let off passengers; and in taking on and letting off passengers at such point, cars shall be stopped at the cross walk on the farther side of

the street, so as not to impede travel on any such cross walk or street, more than necessary, but said cars may stop at any point, between any two intersecting streets. Provided, that all passenger cars except limited cars, shall stop upon signal, at all crossings, to take on or let off passengers, and limited cars shall stop at three points within the corporate limits, said stops to be designated by the Board of Trustees, on signal, to take on or let off passengers.

Third. The conductor or employees of the company, its successors or assigns, in the operation of said railway shall use care and diligence to prevent injury to persons or property.

Fourth. In case of fire, the cars shall be stopped when so ordered by the Town Marshall or other proper officer.

Fifth. The said company, its successors or assigns shall provide headlights and keep them lighted after dark on all cars, and shall provide and maintain street lights at all crossings along the route of its tracks within the corporate limits said lights to be the same as the lights furnished at street crossings by the Town of Mooresville. Said company shall give signal by sounding a gong whenever overtaking or about to overtake a any person or vehicle crossing or driving on or across said railway company's tracks or approaching any street intersecting.

section 19. Said town shall have the right at any time to construct, or authorize the construction of, any sewer or other public improvement, in, along, and across any streets, alleys or public places occupied by the tracks of said grantee, without being liable to said grantee for any damage or delay it may suffer because of the proper and reasonable construction of such sewer, or other public improvement.

section 19 1/2.

Said company shall maintain, at all times, a passenger station and ticket office, said passenger station shall be provided with a good waiting room or rooms with seats for the public and said station shall also be provided with two separate toilet rooms or water closets, one for males and the other for females.

Said station shall be located at some point designated by the Board of Trustees of said Town, and said station shall be kept open each day from a time fifteen minutes before the first regular car leaves Mooresville and the last regular or special car leaves Mooresville.

Station of all regular passenger trains.

Section 22.

As a condition of the vesting of the rights and privileges granted, said station, its structure and equipment, shall remain the responsibility of the railroad company for the duration of the term of the franchise. The town shall be responsible for the maintenance of the station and its equipment, including the cleaning and painting of the station building and the station platform, and for the repair and maintenance of the station and its equipment, including the cleaning and painting of the station building and the station platform, and for the repair and maintenance of the station and its equipment, including the cleaning and painting of the station building and the station platform.

Section 20. In consideration of the rights and privileges herein granted, said company shall maintain a good and adequate system of railway service over its tracks in said town, and to run its own cars, or the cars of other companies operating on said tracks under contract, upon such reasonable and regular time schedule as the grantee may adopt; provided, that said grantee shall run at least five local cars each way daily between the hours of five A.M. and nine P.M.

Section 21. Said grantee shall keep posted at all times in its passenger station or waiting room, a bulletin giving the time of arrival at, and departure from, said station of all regular passenger trains.

Section 22. As a condition of the vesting of the rights and privileges granted, said grantee its successors and assigns, shall begin the construction of said railroad within twelve months from the date of acceptance by said grantee and shall complete said railroad and have its cars regularly running and operating over the same within two years from and after the said date of acceptance: provided, that whenever said grantee tears up any street or any parts

thereof, for the purpose of laying track, the laying of said track shall be completed and the street or part of street shall be restored in as good condition as the remainder of said street within three months from the time said work was begun.

Section 23. The grantee, its successors or assigns shall at least ten days before the commencement of the work of construction of said railroad, within said town, file with the Town Clerk of said Town, its bond to be approved by the Board of Trustees of said Town in the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2000.00) Dollars conditioned upon its faithful and prompt compliance with the terms and conditions of this ordinance and to protect said town against all loss for failure therein, and to protect and secure harmless said Town from all loss by the negligence or unskillful use or management of said railway, as well in the construction as in the operation thereof, and if said bond shall not be so filed, said grantee, its successors or assigns shall have no right to construct said railway under this ordinance.

Section 24. The Town reserves the right to grant a franchise, either for street or interurban railway purposes over the streets named in this ordinance to any other street or interurban railway company at any time before the actual

construction of this railway on the streets has been begun in good faith by the grantee herein, its successors or assigns. Provided, however, that in case a franchise should be granted to any other person, persons, or company for a street railway or interurban railway over the streets named in this contract or any part thereof, for street railway or interurban railway purposes, such franchise shall provided that the grantee herein has complied with the terms of this contract, provided herein for the grantee herein, to perform, be granted upon conditions that said Indianapolis, Cloverdale and Terre Haute Traction company, its successors or assigns shall have the privilege of, using the track so constructed by such other person, persons or company for the use of its powers in said Town, such use to be upon such terms and conditions, as may be mutually agreed upon by the owner of such franchise and said Indianapolis, Cloverdale and Terre Haute Traction company, its successors or assigns or upon such just and equitable terms and condition as may be lawfully determined.

Section 25. The rights herein granted shall extend and be in force for a period of fifty (50) years from the date of acceptance of this ordinance by said grantee.

Section 26. As a condition to the vesting of the rights and privileges granted by this ordinance, said grantee, its successors or assigns, shall within sixty, days after the passage of this ordinance, file with the Town Clerk of the Town of Mooresville a written acceptance of the provisions of this ordinance. If said grantee, its successors or assigns fail to commence the construction of said railroad within twelve months from the date of said acceptance and fail to build its tracks and operate its cars as herein provided along said route herein described within two years from the acceptance of this franchise by the grantee all the rights and privileges hereby granted shall lapse and be at an end and the Board of Trustees of said Town shall have the right thereafter to declare this Ordinance null and void. If, under the terms of this ordinance, <sup>said grantee</sup> fails to construct a track over any street or part of street at the expiration of two years from the date of acceptance of this ordinance, then said grantee, its successors or assigns shall forfeit all the rights and privileges hereby granted it on said street or streets or part of said street or streets, and the Board of Trustees of said Town shall have the right thereafter to declare this ordinance null and void as to the street or part of street where said grantee, its successors or assigns fail to construct a track.

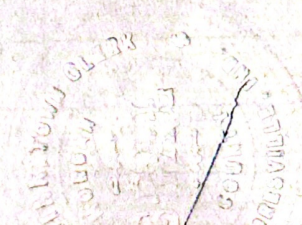

All Ordinances requiring peddlers, hucksters and hawkers to pay a license fee to the Town of Mooresville, Indiana, providing penalties for the violation thereof and for publication.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, Morgan County, Indiana, that it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to peddle any goods, wares or merchandise whatsoever, by wholesale or retail, in or along the streets or alleys of the Town of Mooresville, Indiana, without first procuring ~~the~~ license so to do, from the Town Clerk of said Town of Mooresville, as hereinafter provided. One person may take out any number of licenses in his own name, but a separate license fee shall be paid for each person employed by or acting for any one engaged in the business of peddling in said town.

Every person who goes from house to house, or from one part of the public streets to another, in a vehicle or on foot, or without a push cart, offering for sale any goods, wares merchandise, fruit, candies, poultry, produce or other article, shall be deemed a peddler within the meaning of this Ordinance, and the word peddler shall include hucksters, "hawkers" and "itinerant dealers" as commonly used, and shall include also any person going about said town on foot or otherwise, taking orders for or selling any kind of goods, wares or merchandise by sample <sup>or otherwise</sup> to be afterward delivered. Provided, however, that nothing herein shall be construed to apply to drummers selling goods by sample to resident merchants.

Section 2. Peddlers license shall be as follows, to-wit:

For foot peddlers using any one horse wagon, buggy or cart, or push cart, the sum of one (\$1.00) Dollar per day; for peddlers using any two horse wagon or two horse vehicle the sum of two (\$2.00) dollars per day. Provided, that in each of such instances the above named license fee shall apply to one person or peddler only, and \$1.00 extra shall be paid for each person, more than one, in each instance where vehicles are used by such peddlers.

Section 3. All such licenses shall bear the date of issue, the time for which issued and the fee paid therefor, and for what and to whom issued.

Section 4. The foregoing provisions shall not be construed as to apply to any person selling produce of his or her own raising, nor to persons selling newspapers.

Section 5. Every person desiring to procure a peddlers license shall pay to the clerk of said Town the requisite sum, above stated, upon the payment of which it shall be the duty of the clerk of said Town to issue said license to the person or persons so paying therefor.

Section 6. Any person, firm or corporation violating the requirements of this Ordinance, as to the paying of a license fee and taking out of a license, shall be fined in any sum not exceeding \$10.00 and each day's violation shall constitute a separate offense.

Section 7. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and publication for two consecutive weeks in the Mooresville Times, a weekly newspaper published in the Town of Mooresville, Indiana.

An Ordinance requiring cafe or lunch wagon owners and owners of refreshment wagons sellings by station upon the Streets of the Town of Mooresville, Indiana, to pay a license fee therefor, to the said Town of Mooresville, regulating certain matters connected with such business, providing penalties for the violation thereof and for publication.

Section I. Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, Indiana, that it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to conduct or sell by station, upon any street of the Town of Mooresville, Indiana, any cafe or lunch wagon or refreshment wagon, for the selling of lunch or refreshments, without first procuring a license from the clerk of said Town of Mooresville, Indiana, as hereinafter provided.

Section II. Any such person, firm or corporation so selling by station, lunch or refreshments from any such wagon shall place such wagon or wagons at street crossings as near the curb line of the street, as possible, and in such position as to leave the cross walks and alleys free from obstruction and to cause the least possible obstruction of the street and the free access thereof. It shall also be the duty of any such person, firm or corporation to keep any such wagon, so owned or operated by it or them, well lighted, after nightfall, so that the presence and position of said wagon may be easily seen by any person traveling upon the street or walks, in proximity thereto.

Section III. No such person, firm or corporation, shall operate or run any such cafe or lunch or refreshment wagon, upon any ~~side~~ <sup>corner</sup> of street crossings more than two successive nights, and no license, issued by the Clerk of said Town of Mooresville, as hereinafter provided, shall grant or give ~~permission~~ <sup>privilege</sup> to any such person, firm or corporation, so selling by station to have the preference or exclusive right to any certain or designated location or locations over any others.

Section IV. No person, firm or corporation shall sell from any lunch, cafe or refreshment wagon, after procuring a location therefor, at any hours other than from 4 o'clock P.M. to 12 o'clock midnight,

Provided, That this restriction shall not apply to public holidays and days in which horse shows, circuses, rallies or street fairs are being held in said Town.

Sec.V. Every person, firm or corporation desiring to procure a license to operate any cafe, lunch or refreshment wagon by station shall pay to the Clerk of the Town of Mooresville, the sum of two dollars per month or twenty-four dollars per year for each year for each wagon, upon the payment of which the said Clerk shall issue the license for the time the same is paid. No fee less than two dollars shall be accepted. Said license shall state the time or period for which issued, the fee paid therefor, for what and to whom issued and shall bear the date of its issue and the expiration thereof.

Provided, That no license shall be deemed to permit selling from alley or alley crossings.

Section VI. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the terms or provisions of this Ordinance shall be fined in any sum not exceeding Ten Dollars and each days violation thereof shall be deemed a separate offense.

For conducting, operating or maintaining any pool room the sum of One Hundred (\$100.) dollars per annum, payable in advance for each and every pool table used or placed in any such room.

For conducting or operating any box ball alley, or bowling alley the sum of One Hundred (\$100.) dollars per alley per annum, payable in advance.

Section 2. The license for any of the above named occupations or places of amusement shall state the place where and the person, firm or corporation by whom the same shall be conducted, and any person, firm or corporation engaging in the same without license shall be fined in any sum not exceeding Twenty dollars and not less than Five Dollars, and each day of operation without a license shall constitute a separate offense.

Section 3. All Ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 4. EMERGENCY. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately from and after its passage.

" An Ordinance providing for the extension of the water main by the Public Service Company to the part of the Town of Mooresville north and east of the corner of Main and Franklin streets and the placing of two fire hydrants therein, and providing the rate of payment to be made therefor by the Town of Mooresville, in lieu of the number of subscribers required under the franchise of the Public Service Company, and providing the manner of its acceptance.

WHEREAS the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, Indiana deem it necessary for the public safety that fire protection should be extended to the part of said Town north and east of the corner of Main and Franklin streets, and,

WHEREAS it will be necessary for the Public Service Company to extend its water mains 1500 feet in order to furnish the desired fire protection, and,

WHEREAS the Board of Trustees has been unable to obtain the written subscriptions from fifteen persons abutting on said proposed main as required by the franchise granted to the Public Service Company by ordinance passed by the Board of Trustees on the 4th day of February 1904, Therefore,

Be it Ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mooresville, Indiana, as follows:

The Board of Trustees for and on behalf of the Town of Mooresville in consideration that the Public Service Company extend a four-inch water main from the corner of Franklin and Main street, thence east on Main street to the first alley east of Franklin Street: thence north in said alley to the intersection of said alley with Bridge street and in further consideration that said Public Service Company furnish two fire hydrants, one at the terminus of said extension and one at the corner of the alley and Washington street, agrees to pay said Public Service Company the sum of eighty (80) dollars, per year for each of said fire hydrants, provided that the Town of Mooresville shall receive as credit on said amount the sum of six (\$6.00) dollars for each and every subscriber obtaining

service directly from the water main herein described, this to include any person or persons whose property does not abutt along the street or alley along which said water main is laid who shall have the right to lay their own main or water pipe to the said water main hereinbefore described, and the said Public Service Company shall and will make such connections to the said water main and shall make no charge for so connecting such main or pipes, and the person or persons causing such main or pipe to be laid connecting with such water main, shall <sup>be</sup> considered direct subscribers under this ordinance.

But, in the event that the pipe or water main contemplated by such persons shall exceed five hundred feet in length, it is understood that such pipe or main so laid by such person or persons shall be four inches in diameter, and at the junction of such pipe or main with such water main as hereinbefore described, there shall be a valve so as to enable the water to be shut off from such pipe or main in case repairs, alterations or extensions of such pipe or main are necessary. But in any event, however, without regard to the number of such subscribers on said main the Town of Mooresville, Ind shall pay not less than \$35.00 for each of said fire hydrants and said sum of \$35.00 shall be the minimum rate hereunder for each of said hydrants as provided in an ordinance passed by the Board of Trustees of said Town on the 4th day of February 1904.

It is understood that should the Public Service Company extend branch water mains from said watermain herein described the subscribers obtaining service from said branch water mains or any or all of them shall not be considered as subscribers obtaining service from the water main herein described.

The Town of Mooresville shall pay the amount herein specified in the manner provided in Ordinance #10 passed by the Board of Trustees on the 4th day of February 1904.

This Ordinance shall not in any way affect the rights of either the
