

Public Service Company or the Town of Mooresville as provided in ordinance after fifty (50) years #10, and this Ordinance shall be null and void from the 4th day of February 1904 or whenever fifteen (15) subscribers receive service from said water main herein described for a period of one year.

This grant shall be in force whenever the written acceptance of the said Public Service Company shall have been filed with the Clerk of the Town of Mooresville.

Minutes of previous meeting read and approved.

Mr. John E. Bayless, Election Inspector appeared before the Board and verified the count of ballots of Saturday's election, whereupon Mr. Wm. H. Henderson was duly seated as Trustee from Third Ward.

Upon motion of Addison Sellers, seconded by Amos Stafford, Board ordered the Marshall to enforce the State law relative to the Town Park as regards the pasturing of cattle etc., therein.

Board ordered our Town Attorney to legally proceed to have necessary papers prepared relative to Addition of territory to the corporation as per recent surveys.

Marshall was instructed to carry out provisions of an Ordinance relative to explosives being used on the 4th July.

Upon motion of Amos Stafford, seconded by Addison Sellers, Board proceeded to the election of member of School Board. By consent vote to be had by written ballot, and chair appointed Town Clerk to act as Clerk and Marshall and Treasurer as Tellers.
