

November 4, 2025

The Mooresville Town Council met in regular session on November 4, 2025, at 6:30 pm at the Mooresville Government Center.

Council members present were Tom Warthen, Greg Swinney, Jeff Cook, Josh Brown, and Kirk Witt. Attorney Reid Dickerson was also present.

Tom Warthen gave the invocation and called the meeting to order.

Approval of Minutes from the October 21, 2025, meeting – Councilman Brown motioned to approve the minutes as written, seconded by Councilman Witt. Motion carried 5-0.

Unfinished Business- Public hearing for Confirmatory Resolution 22-2025 regarding the real property tax abatement for Builders FirstSource. There were no public comments.

Councilman Brown motioned to close the public hearing, seconded by Councilman Witt. Motion carried 5-0.

Councilman Swinney motioned to approve Resolution 22-2025 for the real property tax abatement for Builders FirstSource, seconded by Councilman Brown. Motion carried 5-0.

Public hearing for Confirmatory Resolution 23-2025 regarding the personal property tax abatement for Builders FirstSource. There were no public comments.

Councilman Brown motioned to close the public hearing, seconded by Councilman Witt. Motion carried 5-0.

Councilman Swinney motioned to approve Resolution 23-2025 for the personal property tax abatement for Builders FirstSource, seconded by Councilman Brown. Motion carried 5-0.

New Business – Resolution 24-2025 authorizes the transfer of funds in support of the Community Crossing Grant, a 75/25 matching grant.

Councilman Brown made a motion to approve the transfer of \$135,961.14 from the MVH Restricted Fund #2203 to the Local Road and Bridge Matching Grant Fund #4500, seconded by Councilman Witt. Motion carried 5-0.

Department Head Reports – Phil Cornelius highlighted the Halloween Hike, which attracted approximately 1,400 children, with high school volunteers participating.

Mr. Cornelius appeared before the council to request approval to apply for the Indiana Department of Health Bicycle & Pedestrian Master Plan Grant.

This grant opportunity, administered through the Division of Nutrition and Physical Activity, will provide up to \$20,000 in funding (with a local match) to help Mooresville develop a community-wide Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan. The plan will serve as a blueprint for improving connectivity, accessibility, and safety across our community—linking Echo Hollow Park to Pioneer Park and creating accessible routes connecting all five Mooresville parks to the Main Street Trail, Mooresville High School, Mooresville Public Library, Boys & Girls Club, and more.

Councilman Cook motioned to approve the application process and name Councilman Warthen the signatory, seconded by Councilman Witt. Motion carried 5-0.

During the last meeting, Chief Buckner had a question about funds to pay for the Motorola service agreement. Councilman Warthen updated the council that there are funds to pay half out of the clerk's service agreement budget line item and half out of the police budget line item. There were no questions or concerns from the council members.

Legal Counsel – There were none.


Public Comments- There were none.


